VIC MARSHALL REPORTS ON 2A DIVISION

Well, as mooted over the past few weeks the team to beat is the one who travelled to South Coast to pick up another six goals, and that is the Bay-siders Wynnum.

In their last three games they have scored twenty nine goals and conceded nil. They have gained three points off each of the two previous top teams to go one point clear on the premiership ladder.

In this weeks game after a scrappy start Nigel Cairns accepted a Don Jones pass to open the scoring. Frank Sowden did likewise for 2-0 and five minutes later made it three before the break.

On the resumption Eddie Wilkins converted a penalty. Frank Sowden headed his way to a hat trick and Don Jones made it 6-0 with a brilliant solo run and the best shot of the match.

Next week Wynnum have the home game against Mitchelton and it's all up to the Greens if they want to have any chance at all of keeping their prospects alive.

In their game this week Mitchie may already have fritted away their last opportunity to join the big league when their shot shy forwards, apart from a couple of valiant efforts by Frank Gorman, again left them goalless for the second time in three weeks.

What a frustration for the back line, in fact the whole team, to now find themselves trailing the masterful Wynnum by a point and not having tasted defeat since the first match of the season.

Still, there is no excuse when a team constantly carries the ball to within twenty yards of the posts and just as consistently beats themselves through nobody taking the initiative in the all important shot at goals.

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In this game Merton defended well with Grubber Melville solid as a rock at centre half.

They broke away on a few occasions and one wonders how one of their shots missed after appearing to hit the inside of the post.

Peter Dalhaus also pulled off a brilliant diving save late in the game but in general attack Mitchelton had the edge if they would only learn to finish their movements off.

Mt. Gravatt in a very tight tussle met the Gap at the latters home ground and a very see saw first half saw neither team with an advantage as neither defence was successfully breached.

Midway through the second stanza Mike Elliott chipped a free across the goal mouth from the left side and Michael Quinn complimented the pass by nodding it in for what turned out to be the only goal of the match.

Craig Dickson broke through on a couple of occasions however the keepers task was made much easier by finding himself directly in the flight path when the ball was despatched.

This win now gives Mt. Gravatt a psychological advantage in so much as even though they are trailing Mitchie a point they have a game in hand against them.

Newmarket and Budapest met at the formers ground and no doubt the locals were chasing a win to consolidate their second Division status although with a game in hand and a three point lead over Souths and with four to spare over Hellenic their relegation problems at this stage are very remote.

However their first goal came after twenty minutes when Garbo Berka sliced the defence with a perfectly timed pass and Noel Wrigley finished the move with a placement.

This was to be the only first half goal. Newmarket retaliated by despatching a free from outside the box to level. Within a couple of minutes Dennis Lister hit a free kick from thirty yards out and an injured Richard Tatters could not handle it cleanly and Walter Hoffman despatched the rebound for 2-1 Budapest.

Noel Wrigley scored again and at 3-1 it looked fairly safe for the visitors.

Newmarket hit the upright and the crossbar in the last couple of minutes however on the overall opportunities and run of play Budapest would have been unlucky to lose.

I thought Graham Gillis had a very good game at right back for the winners.

Taringa had the home game against Germania and the latter required an outright to draw level on the points table.

A comparative newcomer to Taringa's top team Glen Davis made the opposition task a little tougher by scoring early.

Germania came back and levelled the score only to see young Glen Davis pass to Alan Dobinson who made no mistake for Taringa to lead by the odd goal at the half way mark.

In the second half it was again a Glen Davis pass converted by Frank Speare on this occasion and at 3-1 Germania were really stretching to pull back the lead.

After putting pressure on the blues they were finally rewarded when a back pass misfired and they scored their second goal. Mel Swindells and Milo Mesip netted for the losers.

However, it was all in vain and Taringa held on for a 3-2 win.

In a somewhat farcical game the Jekyll and Hyde team Hellenic met Annerley at Perry Park and apparently this is the weekend they don't shape up as well. In fact from the half way mark they found themselves short of the required number and Annerley consequently found the back of the net with regular monotony against their nine opponents.

Unfortunately I am unable to nominate the scorers however at 9-0 it was an easy afternoon's sport for Annerley and a nice old boost to their goal average.

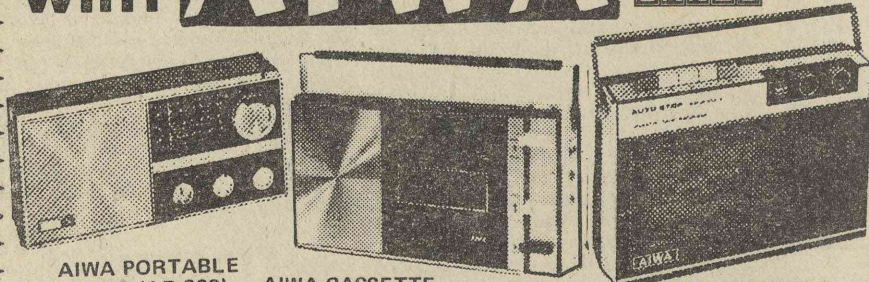

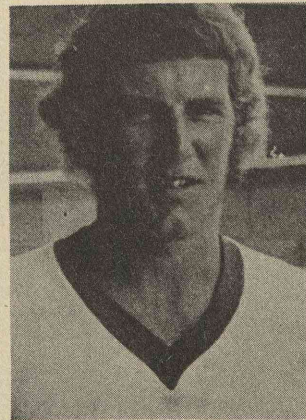
Ritchie Wilson had a good match

HELLENIC v. AZZURRI - Resounding 3-0 win to Hellenic. Can't see this happening on Sunday.

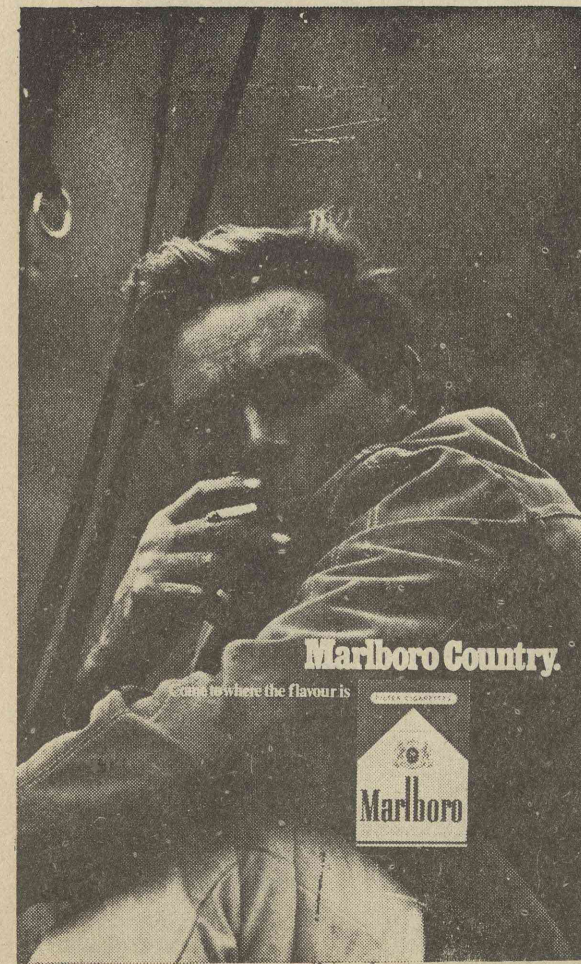
