ON face value, last weekend provided anything but a confidence booster for our entrants in the Philips League, Brisbane City and Lions.

City surrendered very meekly to the tune of 6-1 to St. George last Saturday at Spencer Park, while Lions also went down, but with much more grace 3-0, at Richlands on the following day.

It may be as well to remember that the powerful St. George are being tipped as likely League winners this season, but it also must be remembered that three of their internationals, George Harris, Harry Williams and Doug Utjusenovic, were away with the Australian team.

But defeats like the 6-1 City encountered will do nothing to engender confidence in their supporters, who the club will want to turn up in droves for the first match against Marconi on April 3.

Coach Ian Kesson, with good reasoning, is using these games strictly as trial matches and it is unlikely that up to six players who ran against St. George last week will be in the League squad.

City's imports are still arriving, but they must soon be melded together in future games to develop some sort of team work and understanding. Many are wondering if City in fact have recruited wisely, as supporters are unhappy about the performances produced by some of their new men.

Lions, from all reports, should not be too down-hearted about their effort. In fact they could have finished with something better had Alan Niven not missed that vital penalty in the second half.

Last Sunday proved just how necessary is the presence of Col Bennett in the backline, and there are still a number of well-credentialed imports still to arrive who should plug up any weaknesses in the Lions outfit.

Let's hope the two clubs fare much better in the matches against Hakoah-Eastern Suburbs this weekend.

On the local first division scene, the competition at this stage is developing into a battle royal with teams like St. George, United, Eagles, Richlands and even Wynnum shaping as premiership winning candidates.

St. George particularly, under new coach Derek Mann and manager Gordon Mackie are progressing strongly after their disappointing efforts last season and when Alan Marley returns they will really be a team to beat.

Richlands, Annerley, Bardon and Wynnum can take a bow for the great football they provided last Friday night at Richlands in anything but perfect conditions.

The most pleasing performance in the second round was produced by Jim Binnie and Gibbey Rowan's Bardon side, which threw off the nightmare of their opening 7-1 defeat to turn in a top class football exhibition. They should go on to better things after such an impressive revival.

A LOOK AT THE PHILIPS LEAGUE TEAMS

WE conclude our series on the starters in the Philips League competition, to start on Sunday week, with a look at the four Melbourne entrants.

FOOTSCRAY — The club apparently is aiming at utilising talent already at its disposal rather than searching for overseas players.

Footscray was the first Victorian club to back the idea of a national competition and president Tony Kovac says his team has six or seven players who could match any other man in the country.

But he said it was likely Footscray would obtain three Yugoslav players in the near future.

Money is not a problem as the club is reported to be ready to sign a \$20,000 a year sponsorship deal, and that cash will be used largely to improve ground facilities.

Footscray won the premiership in its first season, 1949, and has gained much success since then. They have been dubbed the Soccer kings of Victoria thanks to 18 premierships, night series and the last three State finals.

Club officials maintain up to 14,000 supporters follow their games every week, so they look like being one of the biggest crowd-pulling teams in the League.

SOUTH MELBOURNE — Another one of the glamour Victorian clubs, South Melbourne also are pinning their hopes on local talent.

President, Sam Papasavas, says the club will be looking at the prospect of importing an overseas guest player in July. The name mentioned is Everton star Duncan McKenzie.

McKenzie wants to come in July, but the main problem will be securing a short term clearance and waiting for Everton's winter commitments in Europe to be decided.

Papasavas believes international players should not be used extensively in an attempt to win the League, but sparingly in an effort initially to bolster publicity for the competition.

The aim is to promote the standard of the game in Australia, according to the South Melbourne president, whose club has strong ties with Melbourne's Greek community.

The club has for some years been one of the strongest in its State and has won the local championship seven times.

FITZROY UNITED — Since it was formed in 1958 as Alexander, Fitzroy has also attracted a big Greek community following and only in the past few seasons has success come its way.

A big shake-up in 1973 led to a dramatic change in administration, new headquarters and a team suddenly comprised largely of imports from Scotland.

Success was instantaneous as the club shot up the League ladder, after previously being regarded as one of the easiest teams to beat.

In 1973, Fitzroy imported Vince Bannon and Ian Gibson from Scotland and the following year signed Vince's brother Pat and George Gillon. In 1975 the club won the State League championship for the first time.

MOOROOLBARK — United, who have had a dramatic rise to fame look like being one of the most exciting clubs in the League.

The Barkers have one of the biggest budgets in Victorian Soccer and this could lead to the importing as guest players of two of the world's greatest players, England and Queen's Park Rangers striker Stan Bowles and George Best.

Club president will be heading for England in May in an attempt to lure the two stars to Australia.

The only drawback which could prevent Bowles from coming is his apparent fear of flying, but officials are confident Best will be here for six weeks after the English season closes.

Players already signed from overseas are Birmingham keeper Paul Wilding, Coventry City midfielder Max Irwin and Irish under 23 international David Ellis.

PETER TOKESI — defender (City). Rugged young centre half who is improving each season. Has gained experience with State team over last few seasons.

ALAN NIVEN — defender (Lions). Classy left fullback who will be key man in Lions' League campaign. Safe under pressure.

LEON WILSON — defender (Lions). Has improved out of sight since making State debut early last year. Very constructive and usually occupies right fullback position.

TONY EDWARDS — defender (St. George). Made the switch from Lions

this year and has scored three goals so far. State captain last year and one of State's most reliable defenders.

IAN LAWRIE — midfielder (Lions). Continues to shine both for State and his club. Tall, strong and aggressive player and very good in the air.

IAIN FAGAN — midfielder (Lions). There hasn't been many State sides chosen in recent years without this player included. Lively, bustling halfback who reads the game well.

ALAN MARSZALECK — midfielder (Eagles). Has played the majority of his football here as centre half but has been in the midfield this year with good success. Very versatile player.

STEVE DOLAN—midfielder (Merton). Incredible that League clubs don't attempt to secure this player rather than search for imports of unknown quality. Regular State team player and making debut as captain.

COLIN KNOTT — midfielder (St. George). Another versatile player who originally made his mark here as a left fullback but lately has been in the middle. Confident player and a former State captain.

KEVIN CALDWELL — striker (City). Usually plays on the right wing and capable of some brilliant performances. Aggression and powerful shot his chief assets.

PAUL LASLO — striker (Lions). Made his debut against China late last year and produced memorable performance. Very mobile in the penalty area and a consistent goalscorer.

JOHN NEALE — striker (Lions). Led his club side in good style last year and won Courier-Mail best and fairest award. Smart mover in the forward line and should be top League player this season.

TONY BRENNAN — striker (Eagles). One of the top personalities of the game here and after staying with his club has already scored four goals in the first two rounds. Has brilliant speed.

RON MILLMAN — striker (Redlands). Has been playing for the State for a long time and can unsettle defences also with his great bursts of speed.

New Faces

THIS week GO SOCCER introduces a series of articles aimed at introducing the new players who will appear before the Brisbane public in the embryo Philips Soccer League.

This week we commence with a Lions player who has been brought from Sydney, Gerry Walker, a midfielder who last year shared with John Watkiss, Sutherland's Player of the Year award.

G.S.—Gerry could you fill us in with some facts about yourself.

G.S.—What brings a man of your obvious experience to Brisbane?

G.W.—My basic motive was a desire to play Philips League. However, always having been an admirer of Les Schienflug and his methods I made enquiries and found he was coaching Brisbane Lions. I then found myself in Brisbane training with the squad and since then have been signed by the club.

G.S.—Gerry, you've been around. How does the set up at Lions compare with other clubs you have played with, excepting the mighty Arsenal that is.

G.W.—Lions are very much ahead of any Sydney club in terms of all round general facilities. This I feel is the first important step along the road to establishing a top class Philips League side.

G.S.—You are obviously impressed by the Richlands complex and just as obviously keen on the methods employed by their full time coach. Are there any areas where you feel the club can improve in its efforts to achieve National standing?

G.W.—Having exhausted possible opposition in Brisbane I feel we must now take on more inter-state competition such as the other Philips League participants. This would enable our players to assess themselves against their future opponents and may have a side effect of motivating players to lift their game. Good or better class opposition always has this effect on teams.

G.S.—Gerry, we at GO SOCCER and most Brisbane soccer fans know Queensland is the Cinderella State in soccer. Having watched (due to injury) Lions valiant effort against St. George how do you feel Lions is going to fare in the Philips League?

G.W.—We are not kidding ourselves at Lions. We know we have a job ahead of us in establishing ourselves in such top class company, but we feel that with three more weeks of preparation before the big kick-off, and a wealth of determination among the staff and players Lions will not let Queensland down in the inaugural year of Philips National League.

G.S.—Thank you Gerry. We at GO SOCCER wish you and all at Richlands every success in your coming task.

The Asian Group Four qualifying tournament for the 1978 World Soccer Cup in Argentina opens here this week with Kuwait favourites to finish ahead of Qatar and Bahrain.

The United Arab Emirates was originally due to send a fourth team but has withdrawn.

Kuwait have won the last four gulf Soccer tournaments and have probably been the best side in the gulf over the past decade.

Meanwhile, Singapore and Hong Kong two of Asia's smallest countries, have the chance to make a big sporting impact when they meet in Singapore on Saturday in the final of the Asian Group One World Cup preliminary tournament.

When the five-nation tournament began nearly two weeks ago, these two teams were considered outsiders in the face of the strong challenges expected from Malaysia and Indonesia.

But Hong Kong made nonsense of such prediction when they crushed Indonesia 4-1 in their opening match. Then Singapore, regarded as mediocre triers without any flair, beat Malaysia 1-0 to set up the most unlikely final.

A 6-0 victory over Columbia lifted Brazil to the top of their World Cup qualifying group and revived their expectations of going through to the finals in Argentina next year.

The Brazilians now meet Paraguay in their final two matches of the South American group one elimination tournament.

Both teams have three points from two games, and Brazil need another three points to make sure of reaching the South American final round, where they would probably face Bolivia and Peru.

The win was a personal victory for Brazil's 39 year old coach Claudio Coutinho, the replacement for Oswaldo Brandao who was held responsible for the team's poor 0-0 draw away to Columbia in their first World Cup match last month.

It also helped rid Brazilian fans of the nightmare that their side, three times world champions, might not make it to Argentina.

In group two, the big surprise is that Uruguay look like going out of the competition in the preliminary rounds.

Bolivia hold a four-point lead in the group, having impressively trounced Venezuela 3-1 away last Sunday.

Group three favourites Peru meet Ecuador at home on Saturday after drawing 1-1 in Quito on February 20. The Peruvians now have two points from two away games with two home matches still to play.
