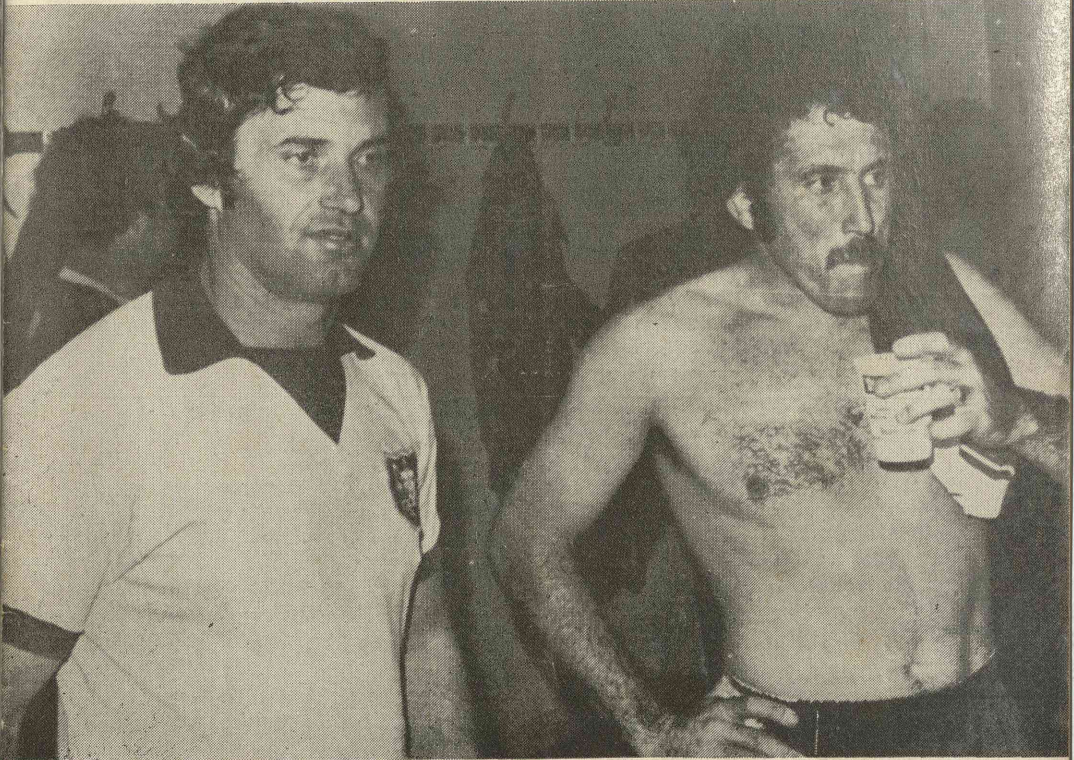

Dear Sir,

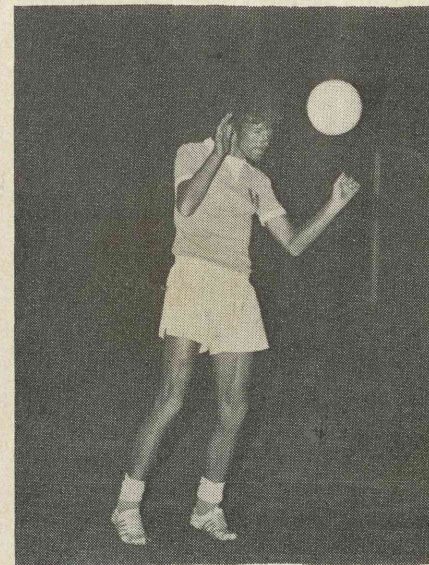

A lot of 50-50 decisions have gone to the visiting team. All I ask is that the referees try and be as impartial as possible — and that means giving the Queensland teams a fair go.

The Coach's Viewpoint

Moves for Midfielders

IN modern day football midfield players are regarded as the work-horses of the team.

If a team's midfield is not functioning effectively in attack and defence, then added pressures will be placed on the front runners or the rear defenders.

From an attacking point of view it is accepted that a midfielder must have the ability to receive and control balls from any angle, any height and at any given speed.

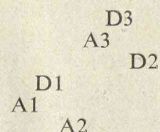
He must also be able to distribute the ball with pin-point accuracy to feet or into space and be able to shoot on target when the occasion arises.

However, one of the more important

assets of the midfielder (and one of the most ignored) is the ability to make runs into advanced positions in front of the ball.

This can best be achieved by intelligent overlapping on the flanks. In FIG 1 the left winger (A) has the ball and is forcing D1 inside, thereby creating space down the left flank.

In this situation, A2 can run behind A1, down the touchline and receive the ball behind the defence. As he starts to make his run, striker A4 should 'clear the space' by making a 'flat run' across the face of the goal ready to attack an expected cross from A2. (see fig. 2).

The decision as to whether A2 is given the ball depends on A1 maintaining his vision and watching how D2 reacts to the run of A2.

If D2 covers the run by marking A2 tightly, then A1 is left with a one versus one and should take this man on. If D2 covers D1, then A2 can have the ball.

I believe that these types of runs from behind the ball are more productive as the player (A2) can cross the ball first time because he is always facing goal.

Usually A1 would give the ball to A3 (in Fig 1) who would then have the problem of turning to face his defender. However it is no good players just being told to overlap. They must be allowed to practise the move many times.

Repeating good habits is the keynote to success in coaching and in playing.

STARS WHO WILL SHINE FOREVER

JOHN CHARLES

THE most illustrious Welshman of all time, a giant in stature — and in his incredible all-round ability. He joined Leeds United as a shy 15 year-old from Swansea, developed as a powerful centre-half and later an even greater centre-forward. In the 1953-54 season he set a United record with 42 goals in 39 Division Two games, but in 1957 moved to Juventus for a fee of £65,000, achieving enormous success and the Italian Footballer of the Year award. He returned to Leeds in 1962, went back to play for Roma but in 1963 joined his brother Mel with Cardiff City, where he ended his first-class career. Since then he has managed several non-League clubs but "Gentle Giant" John Charles will never be forgotten.

League appearances — Leeds United 308 (154 goals); Cardiff City 67 (19); Total — 375 (171).

For Wales — 38 caps (1950-65) playing at centre-half, centre-forward, inside right and left; 15 goals.

SIR STANLEY MATTHEWS

HE was a legend in his own lifetime, a right-wing genius whose very appearance could add thousands to the gate. For a generation his natural ball talents, mesmeric body swerve and bewildering

speed off the mark proved a nightmare to opposing defenders.

Son of a boxer he played for England in 1929 as a weedy, tiny Staffordshire schoolboy and joined Stoke City's ground-staff. His move to Blackpool in 1947 brought stormy protests from Stoke fans but in 1961 he made a rapturous return to his former club and inspired the side's promotion back into Division One. He played his last League game for The

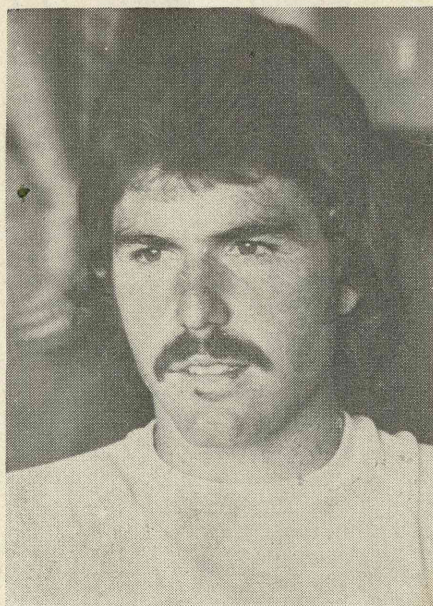
ALAN MAHER: goalkeeper — The No. 2 keeper in the Australian team behind Todd Clarke and was on the bench against New Zealand in Sydney last weekend. Seen here two seasons back playing for Australia against Glasgow Rangers.

GARY MARSDEN: Marconi's reserve goalkeeper. A New South Wales under 17 junior player and one of the club's local products.

BARRY JONES: Local born player and one of the key men in the Marconi backline.

PAUL DEGNEY: Another member of the defence who has come up through the clubs junior ranks.

IVO PRSKALO: Has been playing for Marconi for the last two seasons and was signed after touring Australia with Yugoslav club Velez Mostar. One of the team's leading defenders.



ERNIE CAMPBELL (Marconi)

LES HUCKER: Played as a defender with Auburn and Hakoah before joining Marconi. Formerly a South African and has been here for 10 years.

RAY RICHARDS: Former Queensland midfield player who needs no introduction to the local crowds. A great crowd-pleaser and an aggressive competitor.

STEWART SELVAGE: Local born midfield player, who coach Rasic rates as the best in that position for the club this year. Was obtained from Yugal-Prague on a free transfer.

GARY BYRNE: Midfield member of the current Australian side and comes here fresh from the team's outstanding win over New Zealand.

ERNIE CAMPBELL: Top striker who has represented Australia but is not available for national team this season "for his own reasons". One of the players to watch.

PETER SHARNE: Young striker with a great record in Sydney football and is another of Marconi's band of local products.

ALBERTO MARIANI: Another of the team's productive front-runners, who has also come up through the junior ranks.

RAUL CARRIZO: Former Argentinian who played with Marconi before spell with Pan Hellenic (Sydney Olympic). Now in his second season back with Marconi. Dangerous striker from any range.

JIM ROONEY: Brilliant midfield player, who is member of the national side and also Marconi captain. The type of player who can swing a game on his own. Has extensive international experience.

STUART ROBERTSON: Yet another local product and usually plays in one of the fullback positions.

BRISBANE CITY PEN PICTURES

OSVALDO BORZI: State goalkeeper and obviously one of City's trump cards for this match. Very safe with plenty of courage under pressure.

KIM WISHART: Playing on loan from St. Helens and this State keeper of last season will probably be on the bench. Won't let supporters down however if he gets his chance.

IAN RATHMELL: Tough little right or left fullback with a flair for attack down the flanks. Very fit and will tackle all day.

PETER TOKESI: Strapping young centre half who is facing up to the biggest test of his short but successful career. Tackles with great strength and very good in the air.

PETER NIELSEN: One of the most experienced players in Queensland and can be used in either left fullback or attacking midfield position.

KARL HERDLE: One of the surprise packets of the City squad after transferring to City this season. Solid player and not afraid of getting into the heavy work.

BARRY O'TOOLE: Has been a regular member of the defence since coming up from Melbourne and looks a good acquisition to the right fullback berth.

FRANK PIMBLETT: Has not been here for long after being signed from Aston Villa this year. Well built midfield player who will play major role in City's League campaign.

LARRY GAFFNEY: So far has been one of most notable signings. Pre-season trial form has been outstanding and doing some great work in the midfield.

BRIAN KIBBEY: Consistent midfield player who has represented the State and his past experience will be a big asset for City.

KEVIN CALDWELL: Hard running striker who should not be over-awed by

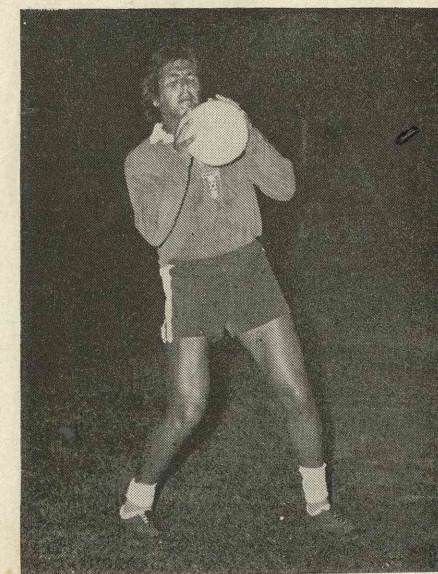
the Sydney competition because of his experience for the State against a number of overseas teams.

IAN JOHNSTON: A lot of City supporters will be pinning their hopes on this player who has had a great club career. Capable of turning the fortunes of a match in seconds and will bear watching.

WILLIE CONNER: Probably the favourite with City supporters. Very deceptive striker with great ball control and clever jinking runs, which can unsettle the best of defences.

JACOB SHANEE: Former Israeli international who was due to arrive this week and obviously will be a great asset.

JOHN COYNE: Has had very little time to acclimatise but showed good touches in recent trial game appearance. Has had extensive experience in America's national league and should be a powerful force.
