National PSL Roundup

WHAT - A - START!

CANBERRA — Two goals in the last eight minutes — one a penalty — gave Brisbane Lions a deserved 4-2 victory over Canberra City at Bruce Stadium.

And long will Brisbane's second half substitute. Alan Hughes remember the

1980 season's opening game.

It was his 82nd minute header that broke the deadlock and gave Brisbane a 3-2 lead.

Then, with just five minutes remaining, Canberra's John Brown fouled Tommy MacGregor in the area and from the spot defender Alan Niven found the net.

Canberra can blame two errors for their defeat. The first — in the 24th min-- followed a misunderstanding between Canberra goalkeeper, Steve Hosz-owski and defender Harry Williams and ended with Williams heading into his own goal.

The second error came 13 minutes later when Canberra forward Tony Brennan spread-eagled his own defence with a mis-

directed back pass. Hard running Brisbane striker Mark McNaughton gathered the loose ball, drew Hoszowski and then chipped the ball into the corner of the net.

But Canberra came back strongly and just four minutes from the interval skipper John O'Shea scored a well deserved goal after challenging two defenders and finally trickling the ball past an unsighted Brisbane goalkeeper Nigel Lownds.

Just nine minutes after the interval Canberra's centre-forward Sebastian Giampolo scored the best goal of the game to put Canberra level.

Canberra were then on top but failed to find the net again and when Hughes, who placed John Reid in the 72nd minute rose and headed home the tie-breaking goal just eight minutes from time, it sealed victory for Brisbane.

It was a fast and thoroughly entertaining game and a fine start to the 1980 season by Brisbane Lions.

REPAYING FEE

SYDNEY - Leichhardt winger Phil O'Connor proved the bargain buy of the year as he annihilated Adelaide City's defence in his team's 2-1 Philips League win at Lambert Park.

O'Connor had earlier moved from St. George to Leichhardt for the \$7,000 dollar fee stipulated in his contract.

His first match produced a valuable down payment against the low fee.

After 14 minutes play Leichhardt striker Tony Morsello flicked the ball on for O'Connor to break along the left and cut in to score with an unstoppable drive.

He appeared to be on the way to another goal in the 34th minute after a quick lead up by Brian O'Donnell and Morsello.

However, Adelaide City goalkeeper Peter Marshall produced the save of the match to turn the ball around the post in full flight.

John Bradley, brought out from Dundee by new Leichhardt coach Willie Wallace, provided Leichhardt's second goal in the 57th minute.

Adelaide City's stand-in striker Jim Muir failed to head away a free kick, and the compact form of Bradley materialised in a fine position to head in the goal.

Although two first round points delighted Leichhardt, the teaming rain dampened the attendance down to a modest

Much of the ground work for Leichhardt's win was laid by stopper Jim Dempsey.

Newly appointed to the captaincy relinquished by Peter Wilson, Dempsey found the heavy conditions completely to his liking. On the day Adelaide City produced very little.

We didn't get a shot in during the first half, whereas Leichhardt could have been two or three ahead," said Adelaide City coach Rale Rasic.

Adelaide City lifted their spirits for a while after the interval but it was not until the 81st minute that they found the

Striker John Nyskohus broke, the Leichhardt defence failed to cover Jim Muir, and the big fellow cleanly sidefooted the ball home.

MELBOURNE — A tiring South Melbourne survived Heidelberg United's late onslaught to escape with a scoreless draw in their first round Philips Soccer League match at Middle Park.

Heidelberg strikers Jamie Paton and Gary Cole cut loose in the last 10 minutes and came within a whisker of winning the game.

A free kick by Cole in the 82nd minute crashed against the cross-bar and an Continual rain made the playing surface treacherous but once in front Sydney City controlled the game and never looked in danger of defeat.

Sydney City went to an early lead in the seventh minute with a move started by Joe Watson, who was a thorn in the side of the Marconi defence for the entire 90 minutes, with his clever footwork and speed.

Three quick passess involving three players moved the ball to the far post and Murray Barnes nodded it down for Terry Smith to finish off from close range.

Sixty seconds later Eddie Krncevic missed an easy opportunity to equalise after picking up a bad back pass by Ian Bruce, when he shot wide of an open goal.

Krncevic had two more good shots within the next five minutes but Marconi were finding no drive or control from the mid-field, which was dominated by Sydney City.

Roberto Vieri fought a lone battle in this area for Marconi without assistonce and consequently his forwards were starved of the ball for almost the entire match.


Marconi goalkeeper Alan Maher was constantly in action as Barnes, Smith and new boy Ken Boden probed away at the goal and with luck Sydney City could have gone further ahead before the interval. Due to injury, Smith was replaced for the second half by Jim Patikas, who was playing his first senior game but the Sydney City attack still functioned efficiently and with purpose.

In the 56th minute, Maher was impeded by one of his own defence when jumping for a cross ball and Boden hammered home a left-foot drive to register his first goal for his new club.

Sydney City eased off the pressure with the game well in their grasp but, despite this, Marconi never applied pressure or showed that they could break through the well organised Sydney City defence. Although Krncevic flicked home a consolation goal for Marconi in the 88th minute they will need to improve their game considerably if they are to retain their championship this year.

BOBBY STRIKES

13th March, 1980

SYDNEY — Former England and Manchester United star Bobby Charlton led Blacktown City to a convincing 4-2 victory over St. George at the Gabbie Stadium.

Blacktown were playing their first game in the Philips Soccer League with Charlton making his only guest appearance for the club. The game, played in drizzling rain, was only six minutes old when Charlton ran through onto a cross from Carlos Ortega to beat Don Smith in the St. George goal.

The old master showed some patches of real class and in his last kick of the match he scored another goal, which the referee disallowed.

Contrary to predictions, Blacktown will be a force in the Philips League if they can produce the form they showed in this initial encounter.

The more experienced St. George were only in the game for about fifteen minutes soon after the interval when they produced some good football.

For the rest of the game Blacktown was in complete control and had the opposition struggling in defence.

Stunned by the early goal, St. George went into action but had to wait until the 29th minute before Peter Beggs equalised with a header from close range.

However, in a five minute burst of superb football just before half time City scored two quick goals which completely staggered St. George.

In the 40th minute Alan Fisher capitalised on a defensive mistake, pouncing on a bad back pass, to score and regain the lead for City.

Four minutes later a move started by Ricky Hormazabal ended with a well taken goal by Paul Wilkinson to give City a 3-1 lead at half time.

After the break St. George put more purpose into their game and had City on the run for a short period when Dave McIntosh made it 3-2 with a close range goal after a shot by Peter Beggs in the 69th minute.

However, City regained control and four minutes later Dave Harding put the seal on the result with an excellent goal from fifteen metres.

BIG COL IS TOPS

LAST week we revealed that Brisbane City's George Potter was Queensland's longest serving PSL player after playing for Brisbane Lions in the first two years of the League and City in 1979. Larry Gaffney was actually City's most selected player with 76 appearances.

But the Lions player to have made most appearances is former Socceroo Col Bennett, who has played in 72 matches. That is the same amount as Jim Hermiston, but 20 of those games were for Brisbane City in 1977.

Since the PSL began, Lions have used a total of 40 players (not counting the first match just completed this season) and the figures are as follows: Amounts are full matches, with substitutions in brackets.

South Melbourne have used 44 players in three years and players to have more than 30 appearances are Chris Kalafatidis, Jack Reilly, Peter Ollerton, Margaritis Hagegmenouil, Billy Rogers, Duncan Cummings, Stuart Baxter, George Campbell, George Christopoulos, Alun Evans, Bertie Lutton. The most famous player to wear South Melbourne colours of course was Malcolm MacDonald, who made three appearances in 1977.

Mareeba United Touring Islands

CAIRNS — Mareeba's state league soccer players left last week for a short tour of the Solomons and Papua New Guinea.

Mareeba United chairman, Mr. Alf Moriconi, said a party of 17 players, three officials and 15 supporters left on Friday for Honiara.

Mr. Moriconi said the team would have six matches spread over the 12 days of the tour.

In Honiara, they would play two games against club teams and two against the Solomons national teams.

They could then move on to Port Moresby where there would be one game against the national team and one against top club Germania.

Mr. Moriconi said the tour had been arranged in an atempt to bring the team to a peak early in the season.

"It is impossible to get strong competition in the north and to bring a team from Brisbane for a trial match would set us back \$4,000 a time," Mr. Moriconi said.

The Solomons' tour would cost about \$8,000 but this could be expected to be defrayed by gate receipts.

Mr. Moriconi said the standard of soccer in the Solomons and Papua New Guinea was very high.

Last year's state league champions, Grange Thistle, made a similar tour.

Mareeba United has played two trial matches so far this season for two easy wins against local teams.

Mareeba entered the state league competition last year with high hopes but found the opposition too hot, finishing seventh out of the 10 teams.

They scored four wins and four draws, the best performances being a 1-all draw with top Brisbane club, Southside Eagles and a 5-1 victory against Saint George, another Brisbane team.

LESSONS

Alf Moriconi says the lessons of last year have been well learnt and the team and the club as a whole will be going into this season with full knowledge of what they are up against.

Ivor Schofield has been consolidated as playing coach and a number of new players have been introduced in key positions.

Mareeba supporters can look forward to nine state league matches during the season with the possibility of Ampol Cup matches, also to be played at Mareeba.

TODAY'S OPPONENTS

SOUTH MELBOURNE opened up their 1980 PSL campaign with a scoreless draw against arch rivals Heidelberg United at Middle Park last Sunday. And coach John Margaritis fielded a slightly different lineup from what had probably been expected.

Peter Laumets as anticipated was in goal and new signing from Frankston City, Vince Bannon was the right fullback. But Margaritis experimented by playing usual midfielder Bertie Lutton at left-back, allowing Alan Davidson to play in the midfield. From all reports the move was successful.

Former Wolves central defender Frank Munro was not included in the defence, the middle two positions being occupied by 17-year-old Steve Blair and Arthur Xanthopoulos. Blair recently returned from the Oceania tournament in New Caledonia and had an outstanding match against Heidel-

berg. Xanthopoulos only returned to the side this season after missing last year because of study commitments.

With Davidson pushed forward from leftback, South Melbourne's midfield comprised his fellow youth international team-mate George Christopoulos and the experienced Billy Rogers. The three front runners were predictable — George Campbell, Alun Evans and Branko Buljevic, who played with Heidelberg last year. Duncan Cummings made a comeback after a long injury and training layoff and was the only substitute used against Heidelberg.

The other likely reserves this week against Lions will be defender Chris Kalafatidis, strikers Steve Kakantonis and Mendo Ristovski and reserve keeper Lou Tsigaris. It is rumoured that Munro may not play many matches this season.

LAST weekend, Thistle took their State League and South East League teams to Tamworth. The Northern NSW Federation is commencing a State League competition this year and one of the inaugural competing teams is Tamworth City.

This side comprises players from around the Tamworth district and is partly sponsored by the Tamworth Workers Club. It was the secretary of the Club, Brian Perrin who contacted Thistle with a view to trailing their team and George Pagan was only too delighted to accept. The players and officials, with a handful of supporters, left late Friday afternoon and due to the usual weekend traffic problems did not arrive in Tamworth until 3.30 a.m. on Saturday.

I don't think anybody had more than 4½ hours sleep before arising and studying the local terrain. The matches were scheduled for the Showground at 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. State Leaguers at least had an extra hour or two to wake up and partake of some lunch, whereas the earlier players in the main missed out on breakfast also. The playing surface was reasonably flat, not ideal for on the ground football, with a reasonable grass surface. Tamworth is experiencing a drought at present.

The opposition in this game was an RSL club team who had won the NSW amateur under-19 competition the previous year. Thistle won the match 4-0, scoring twice in each half. Daddy Cool Lazenby and John Paterson, who were both coming back from injuries were two of the "youngsters" in the first game. Up and coming goalkeeper Greg Marshall was confident and handled everything that came his way well and two other genuine youngies, Keith Marsh and Garth Moloney, scorers of the first two goals, also showed they will be knocking on State League doors before very long.


In the main game, coaches Pagan and Buesnel felt they could experiment a little to see if the younger players could cope with a full 90 minutes of the higher grade. As a result both Ross Swan and David Whyte were given the nod and both had strong matches. The game marked the appearance of the three Solomon Islands lads playing together for the first time. The score ended up 3-1 in Thistle's favour, with Wilson Maelaua scoring twice and Ben Sokeni the other. Tamworth City held Thistle scoreless in the first half with a disciplined display of defence. Many of their players showed

some good touches but the finishing often let them down. It's early days and that should improve when the League begins.

The League consists of teams from Newcastle, Coffs Harbour, Armidale, Grafton and of course Tamworth. After seeing their football I'm sure they will do very well in the venture, and judging by the vocal support of the locals, should be very hard to beat at home. Tamworth's goals came with 10 minutes left when they punished the tiring visitors (temperature was 33 degrees) for some square and very lax defence.

That night all of the Thistle party was entertained by the Worker's Club at dinner, with a cabaret in the auditorium, plus of course the one-armed money earners. The club is a magnificent structure and we unfortunately in Queensland can only dream while the political powers that be sit with their collective heads in the clouds. The return trip was made in daylight and the big excitement came at Armidale, where we stopped for lunch. FOURTH MILLION MAN

LONDON — Norwich City forward Kevin Reeves travelled to Manchester this week, to discuss his proposed transfer from Norwich to Manchester City that could make him Britain's fourth one million sterling (two million dollars Australian) footballer.

England international Reeves, 22, who stands to make around 50,000 sterling (100,000 dollars Australian) from his share of the move to Manchester City, will discuss the terms of his contract with the Club's general manager Tony Book, before having a medical as prelude to signing.

Book, who was confident all would go through in time for Reeves to make his debut at home to F.A. Cup holders Arsenal this Saturday.

"It is significant signing for us and I feel it could be the making of some of our earlier buys," added Book, referring to the three million sterling (six million dollars Aust.) worth of deals City have already featured in since last season.

Manchester City chairman Peter Swales said: "There seem to be no problems to the deal now. It is just up to the player and Tony Book to iron out the personal details."

Both Norwich City and Manchester City are in the English Football League's First Division.

SORROW FOR "OSSIE & RICKY"

LONDON — Argentine World Cup duo Ricardo Villa and Osvaldo Ardiles, who have done so much to revive Tottenham Hotspur's fortunes over the past two seasons, will forever look back in anguish on last week's Football Association (F.A.) Cup sixth round 1-0 defeat by Liverpool.

An uncharacteristic mistake by Ardiles in the 37th minute led to Liverpool's Terry McDermott scoring the only goal, while Villa missed 73 minutes of the action after being injured.

He was hurt in a fifth minute tackle with Graeme Souness and although he limped back into the fray he was eventually substituted by John Pratt in the 17th minute.

Watford chairman, pop singer Elton John, listened to a commentary of his club's game with Arsenal on a telephone in his Los Angeles hotel in the United States.

But Frank Stapleton ruined John's day by scoring both goals in Arsenal's 2-1 win.

Malcolm Poskett's 80th minute reply came too late to save Watford.

Everton joined their Liverpool neighbours in the semi-finals with a surprise 2-1 home win over Ipswich Town.

Ipswich had previously gone 16 games without defeat and scored a resounding 4-0 victory in a League game on the same ground last month.

But Everton, forced to field a makeshift team due to the suspensions of Trevor Ross and Asa Hartford, shrugged off their indifferent form of recent weeks.

Former England international strikers Bob Latchford and Brian Kidd shot Everton into a 2-0 lead before substitute Kevin Beattie pulled one back near the end.

London club West Ham completed the semi-final line-up after a dramatic 89th minute penalty winner. With the game seemingly headed for a goalless draw and a replay, Scottish midfielder Raymond Stewart scored from the spot.

Kevin Reeves scored in his final match for Norwich City in the English League first division 2-2 draw against Brighton. Reeves moved to Manchester City in a one million sterling (about two million Australian dollars) transfer last Monday.

Leeds United's Derek Parlane, making his debut after his 200,000 sterling (about 400,000 Australian dollars) transfer from Scottish club Glasgow Rangers, scored the second goal in his side's 2-0 home win over Southhampton.

In the third division, Argentine Pedro Verde earned Sheffield United a point by scoring on his debut in the 1-1 draw at Millwall.

Fastest goal of the day went to Ian Robins of fourth division Huddersfield, who scored after just 32 seconds in his side's 4-0 win at York.

Berwick Rangers, who pulled off a shock Scottish Football Association Cup win over Glasgow Rangers 13 years ago, nearly staged a repeat performance against Hibernian in the fifth round.

The First Division club dominated their Premier League opponents but just could not grab the all-important goal.

The game finished 0-0 leaving Berwick in with a chance in the replay in Edinburgh.

The other three ties all went according to form, Rangers beating First Division Hearts 6-1 and Aberdeen scoring a 2-1 success at Partick,

Celtic, fresh from their 2-0 midweek win over Real Madrid of Spain in the European Champions' Cup, reached the semi-finals with a similar score against Morton.




