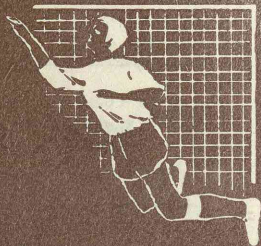

NATIONAL PSL ACTION

West Thrashed

SYDNEY — An emphatic 7-0 thrashing of West Adelaide by Sydney City at the Sydney Athletics Field leaves the Sydney team unbeaten and alone at the top of the Philips League table after five rounds of the competition.

City baptized their new home ground in grand style under the watchful gaze of national team boss Rudi Gutendorf, while a few kilometres away on the other side of Sydney, Heidelberg maintained their strong challenge to City by swamping Leichhardt 5-0.

City's win was a sweet one for coach Eddie Thomson, the 'Pupil', who beat his former 'master' Gerry Chaldi, now the coach of West Adelaide.

West Adelaide's woes were compounded when they lost their powerful midfielder Neil McGachey in the 51st minute after he was sent off by referee Peter Rampley on a tripping charge.

It was McGachey's second caution of the match, and emphasized West Adelaide's frustration at not being able to come to grips with the far superior Sydney team.

Several of the West Adelaide players looked out of their depth and did little to show they are worthy of a Philips League team spot.

Sydney City started the match in whirlwind fashion and after only nine minutes had the ball in the net. West Adelaide's right back Ian McGregor was caught hopelessly out of position and John Stevenson waltzed the ball past Martyn Crook from a Hilton Silva pass to score.

The goal set the tone for the rest of the match, with City moving smoothly and swiftly into attack and West Adelaide struggling to arrange some form of defence.

Sweeper Shraga Topaz and fellow defenders Vic Bozanic, Zoran Maricic and

McGregor had no answer to City's sudden thrusts. City seemed to drop off their pace for a twenty minute spell after the opening goal, but then Kenny Boden weaved his own brand of special magic to inspire his team mates.

Seemingly closetted into the right hand corner of the field by two defenders he swivelled around and sent a perfect cross for Murray Barnes to flick the ball home.

Boden repeated the dose in the 35th minute when he skipped past three lunging tackles to supply Terry Smith with a pass, from which the tall striker calmly scored.

In the second half, West Adelaide's troubles began to multiply. A fourth goal in the 46th minute from Barnes was followed soon after by McGachey's expulsion for his second crude foul of the day. Five minutes later Barnes completed his hat trick when he outjumped Crook to head the ball home from 15 metres.

With the score at 5-0 West Adelaide lost all fight and it rapidly became a matter of how many goals City could score in the closing stages.

As it turned out two more goals were added to the already impressive tally. John Stevenson grabbed his second with a diving header in the 70th minute while Ian Souness scored the seventh goal only minutes after coming on as replacement.

ADELAIDE — Brisbane Lions and Adelaide City fought a tough nil-all draw at Hindmarsh Stadium in Adelaide.

A small crowd saw an action-packed Philips League game marked by the large number of missed opportunities and spectacular saves. Adelaide City dominated the first half but failed to capitalise on its chances and Lion's mistakes.

City struck the cross-bar three times in the first half. After the break, Lions

began an aggressive forward play and kept City keeper Peter Marshall busy for the rest of the match.

Brisbane looked the better side in the second half but nagging defence-work from their opponents kept them scoreless.

Worried Willie

SYDNEY — Leichhardt coach Willie Wallace promised sackings from his team after it was destroyed 5-0 by a magnificent Heidelberg at Lambert Park.

A hat trick from tall Gary Coles and two goals from Jamie Paton, the Heidelberg twin strikers, completed the damage already inflicted by the rest of their team.

Said Wallace: "Our midfie'd gave the ball away, and too many of our players are living on reputations only. Heidelberg gave a magical performance, but they were helped by too many spectators in our team."

Heidelberg did play superlative Soccer from goa keeper Yakka Banovic through leftwinger Andy Bozikas to shut out Leichhardt for the entire 90 minutes.

Leichhardt supporters expected too much of latest Scottish captures Bill Pirie and John McKie, neither of whom had a

settled match. Whilst Heidelberg were sinking five goals in the back of Leichhardt's net and looking like the 1980 champions, Leichhardt only managed 3 worthwhile shots at goal.

The best of them came from midfielder John Bradley in the 38th minute when Heidelberg were already two goals to the good. He hit the underside of the cross bar, the ball rebounded out and Pirie failed with his followed up attempt.

But by this stage Heidelberg were already toying with their opponents.

Cole opened the scoring in the 17th minute when he took possession from Paton, created space outside Leichhardt leftback Mark Pu'len and cut the ball behind Leichhardt goalkeeper Greg Woodhouse in goal. Paton was next, poking the ball under Woodhouse after Jim Tansey and Andy Bozikas had a hand in the build-up.

Just on half time Jim Rooney fed Tansey along the left and the resultant head high cross was dispatched into goal from Cole's towering header.

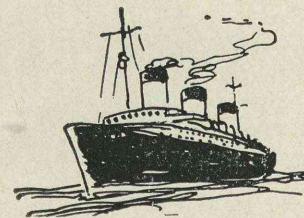
A foul-up between Leichhardt defenders Rod Ske'lern and Peter Wilson gave Cole a gift goal and his hat-trick in the 59th minute. Paton completed the rout by scoring from 10 metres in the 80th minute for the 5-0 scoreline.

GEE, Peter — Date of Birth 16/8/52

Jersey No. 1 Goalkeeper: Australian, represented N.S.W. in both Youth and Seniors, also Queensland rep. and an Australian U/18 rep. Phys.Ed. Teacher who aims to play for Australia in near future.

HUNTLY, Glen — D.O.B. 9/5/61

Jersey No. 2. Defender: Australian, born in Bundaberg. Rep. Bundaberg and Wide Bay to U/15. Rep. Qld. U/15 to U/19 and an Australian Youth rep. Hopes to continue at rep. level to full Australian honours.

APONAS, Mark — D.O.B. 24/8/60

Jersey No. 3. Defender: Australian, an original Grange Thistle junior. Played for both Brisbane and Queensland all ages through to U/19 level.

LAZENBY, Huisdean — D.O.B. 21/11/48

Jersey No. 4. Defender: Scottish, played Scottish senior football since 16, attaining a number of North Scotland representative honours. Has spent most of his Australian career with Grange Thistle. "Man of the Match" in 1979 Grand Final.

FAGAN, Iain — D.O.B. 20/6/54

Jersey No. 5. Defender: Scottish. Has played many positions on the field, best suited in defence. Played number of PSL matches for Brisbane City and Lions prior to joining Thistle, Q'd. Senior representative and Australian U/23 representative.

DOLAN, Steve — D.O.B. 5/1/56

Jersey No. 6. Midfielder: English. Junior career with Souths United, Brisbane, then Merton East and Grange Thistle. Rep. honours long and impressive, including Qld. Jnr. and Snr. and Australian U/23 team. Has played against such teams as Manchester United, Middlesbrough, Republic of China and Wisla Cracow (Poland).

SWAN, Ken — D.O.B. 21/9/60

Jersey No. 7. Midfielder: Australian. Rep. Brisbane and Queensland at all ages, including Australian schoolboys. Ambition to play for Australia at full senior level and he is very capable of doing it.

PATERSON, John — D.O.B. 16/11/50

Jersey No. 8. Midfielder: Scottish. Played full professional football for a number of years in Scotland before moving to New Zealand where he played National League. Sole Australian club is Grange Thistle where he has played and represented for Qld. against N.S.W. and the full Australian team. Missed most of 1979 season through injury.

MANGAN, Ricki — D.O.B. 30/5/58

Jersey No. 9. Australian. Plays midfield or attack with equal success. Previous clubs Western Suburbs and Apia (Sydney) and Lions and Gold Coast City. One of City's top players in 1979. Represented NSW and Australia at U/16 and U/18 level.

POLLOCK, Len — D.O.B. 8/8/51

Jersey No. 10. Striker — Irish. Played junior football in Northern Ireland and his Australian soccer has been played at Frenchville (Rockhampton) and North Brisbane prior to signing on with Grange Thistle.

HILL, Danny — D.O.B. 9/10/57

Jersey No. 11. Forward — Australian. Spent all of his junior football with Redlands United in Brisbane. Has represented at State level for Schoolboys.

WHYTE, David — D.O.B. 17/1/62

Jersey No. 12. Defender. A further player in Thistle's youth squad. Has represented his State at Junior level and Schoolboys. Played a number of matches in full Senior squad pre-season.

MAELAU, Wilson — D.O.B. 29/10/55

Jersey No. 14. Striker. One of Thistle's Solomon Islands representatives. Played for Solomon National Team in Oceania tournaments. Speedy player with quick reflexes. Ambitious to play in the World Cup.

PAGAN, Alistair — D.O.B. 5/5/62

Jersey No. 15. Midfielder — Scottish, the youngest of the squad at 18 years, has represented both Brisbane and his State from U/10 through to U/16. Played many games for Grange Thistle at full senior level.

SWAN, Ross — D.O.B. 24/1/62

Jersey No. 16. Striker — Australian. Another one of Thistle's youth players and giving Grange Thistle the unique position of having two brothers playing in their State League squad. Represented Brisbane and his State at all ages and selected in an Australian U/14 shadow squad.

SOKENI, Ben — D.O.B. 18/3/58

Jersey No. 18. Midfield. Second of Thistle's Solomon Islands national players. Very fast with a powerful shot, but deceptive body movement.

He Was Start Of It All

Most enthusiasts who continually decry the present day relegation of open aggressive play in their Soccer matches in favour of a style which emphasises stultifying defence — the "if they don't score, we can't lose" attitude — will probably be surprised to know that one of the most stylishly creative inside-forwards the game has known was its originator.

He was Charles Buchan, an outstanding and attacking inside-forward who was a master schemer and tactician. He played for England, Sunderland and Arsenal and who, when his playing days ended, became a noted Soccer writer and radio broadcaster.

It was Buchan who devised the plan which produced the stopper centre-half. His ideas were expounded to Herbert Chapman, one of Soccer's most astute managers, when Buchan transferred from Sunderland to Arsenal in 1925. Chapman, who became Arsenal's manager in the same year, developed Buchan's ideas and Arsenal introduced the third-back system to counteract the new offside law and developed the W-M formation.

Charles Buchan, born near Charlton Athletic Club's ground in south-east London in 1891, made his football name with Sunderland after being transferred in 1911 from the Southern League team, Leyton, for the not inconsiderable sum at that time of 1,200 pounds. He made heading the ball something of an exact science rather than a hit-or-miss exercise. He used his height to advantage, always striving to

ATA, Sam — D.O.B. 14/5/55

Jersey No. 19. Defender. Third member of the Solomons contingent and Captain of their national team. Played many international matches in South Pacific Games.

FERGUSON, John — D.O.B. 12/9/54

Jersey No. 20. Goalkeeper — English. Played at many levels in England, both at Schoolboy and senior level. English clubs included Liverpool, Burnley and Wrexham. Has represented both Brisbane and Queensland at junior and senior level.

rise above the ball so he could nod it down.

He was the driving force and scheming power behind Sunderland's League championship success in the 1912-13 season and into the EFA Cup final which the Wear-side team lost, one-nil, to Aston Villa.

It was in that season that Buchan won the first of his six England caps, the last not coming until 1924. Many followers — and not only Sunderland stalwarts — declared that Buchan should have been an automatic choice in England's teams while others claimed he should not be selected since he was much too clever and brilliant to fit in with players of much less ability. That was surely a rare compliment as to his outstanding talents and abilities.

Buchan served with the Grenadier Guards in World War I. He returned to Sunderland but in 1925, was transferred to Arsenal on the surprising terms of 2000 pounds down and 100 pounds for each goal he scored. That brought Sunderland, for which he had scored 212 goals, another 2,100 pounds.

Buchan had been on Arsenal's books 16 years before but left the club in a huff because of a dispute about an expenses claim of 11 shillings.

He captained the Arsenal team to its EFA Cup Final appearance in 1927 and then retired. He died in 1970 after a career as journalist and broadcaster no less distinguished than that he had moulded in his years as a player of great ability and renown.

Kingsridge best players were Ian Mendlesen, Shayne Atkins and their number 8.

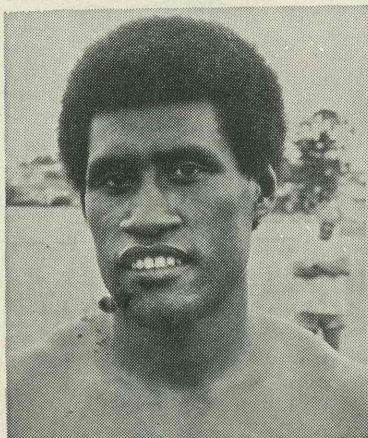

Age: 25

Educated to Senior Certificate standard in High School and attended administration courses at the University of South Pacific in Fiji. Sam was working in the administration section of the Prime Minister's Department in Honiara. Whilst staying in Brisbane Sam is working as a finishing hand in the moulding department of James Hardie & Co., Whinstanes.

Sam was born in the capital of the Solomon Islands, Honiara, which is where he lived prior to coming to Australia. His parents now live in Malaita in the Central Solomons.

His soccer career spans some 14 years and his first trial for the National team was in 1969. His first appearance came at age 17 in 1973 and he has been a permanent member in the side since then. Sam is a defender and plays sweeper for his club, the Kakamora club in Honiara. The club made a visit to Fiji in 1978. In the National team he has toured to Papua New Guinea in 1973 and 1976. The Solomon's National team also participated in the South Pacific Games in Guam in 1975 and in Suva in 1979. A highlight of this last tour was being made Captain of the Solomon Islands National team.

When Sam's playing days are over he hopes to continue in football by coaching the up and coming juniors back in the Solomons.

Upon returning home Sam is going into business for himself on a 30 acre coconut farm he owns on Santa Isabel Island.

After a short spell in hospital and a minor operation on his ankle Peter is now hobbling on crutches with a hoped-for commencement of training within the next 2 weeks.

★ Our major curtain-raiser last Monday saw "Australia" take on the "Rest of the World". We had the stars of yesterday performing on the oval and show their considerable talents. In the Australian side we had such stalwarts as Col Kitching, Graham McMillan, Al Warren, Bluey Smith, Barry Dann, whilst for the "Rest of the World" we had 7 Englishmen, 1 Londoner, 2 Scots and 1 Hungarian, including Syd Tucker, Eric Pattison, Guilio Vincze, Brian Addison, Fred Kingshott. The score finished at a diplomatic 2-2 draw. Goalscorers were Eric Pattison (2) and Graham McMillan (2). Referee for the match was retired 1st Division referee George Harrison and in keeping with the occasion we had two of the keener junior referees in Mark Gilbert and Mrs. Judy Marshall on the lines. What a joy to watch, the talent that abounded in this match, the brain was willing but many times the body failed to respond. A game well worth watching.

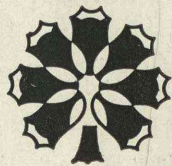

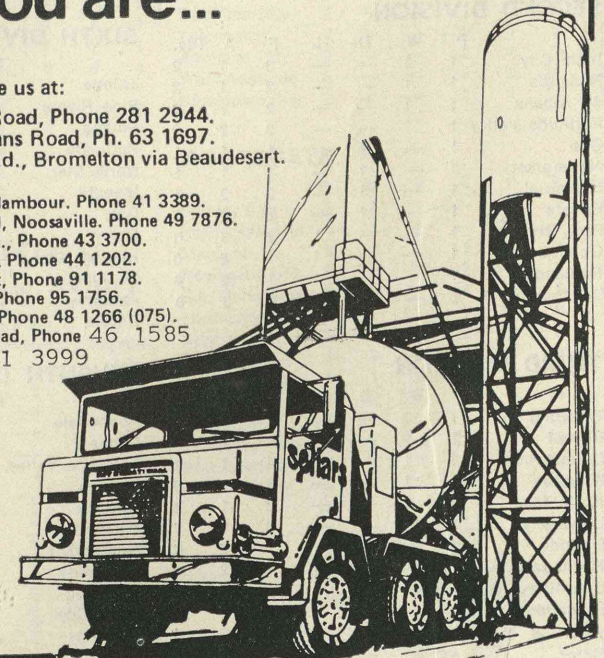
