



ANNERLEY ANALYSIS

1st DIVISION

Annerley, playing away at Pine Rivers, started this game in more confident fashion than has been the case recently and were knocking the ball around and creating chances or half chances right from the start. A left foot shot from defender, Paul Welsh, was almost rewarded in the 10th minute. The game settled down evenly after a while and our defence suffered some anxious moments, but Brian Barnes and Phil Hall were equal to the task. Our best chance came after 35 minutes when Brian Lampitt broke clear but shot wide with only the keeper to beat. Right on half time Glen Harkness hit the post and the game was scoreless at the interval. With Wayne Cook showing good skills on the left and Nigel Fisher making space for himself on the right we hoped for better rewards in the second half. Five minutes into the second session we were almost caught when the offside trap failed and Pine Rivers shot over the top from close range. Within a minute the trap failed again and the home side scored into an open goal to put us behind. This setback unsettled us and from a free kick outside the box, Ian Steele headed a good goal to make the home side 2-0. We had a good chance to get one back soon after but the keeper blocked the shot. Keeping up the pressure we created some chances and corners but with 10 minutes to go we were still down by those 2 goals. A good chance from well out by John Bridge was our last opportunity and we had to disappointingly accept the loss after promising so much in the first half.

1st DIVISION RESERVE

After starting confidently, Annerley was dismayed in the 5th minute when an attempted clearance by defender Glen Burden went into the net for an own goal. With the game 15 minutes old, Annerley forced a series of corners and went close to scoring, but to no avail. The game continued frustratingly for us until our best move involved Laurie Christensen, Davey Crane and Neil Meurant resulted in a great save from

the Pine Rivers keeper. Although we did not score from this, our players, suddenly realised they could do it and kept the home side under continual pressure. However halftime came with us still behind by that early goal. With the 2nd half only a minute old, Ian Ball had the ball in the net only to have the goal disallowed. Shortly afterwards our keeper, Bret Sue See, put a really long ball down the park to put the home side under pressure but the best we could do was hit the post. Soon after Pine Rivers scored again to put us behind 0-2. Five minutes later we got one back when Ben Boga crossed from the left for Laurie Christensen to head home. With about 20 minutes to go Annerley tried hard for the equaliser with shots by Wes Spark and Davey Crane going wide of the target. With 15 minutes to go we managed to draw level with a headed goal by Laurie Christensen again from a corner. From then on we had most of the play and peppered the home goal from all angles without result. One of the best chances was when Greg Cook headed what looked like the winner but somehow the keeper got his fingertips to it. Final result was a 2-2 draw, but an honourable one for us.

Annerley played away at Rochedale Rovers and at first the home team played very well pushing the ball around giving no hint why they have only 4 points from 5 games. Early in the first half the home side did make a mistake to give us a penalty, but unfortunately, our skipper, John Burgess missed but had the ball into the net from a rebound cross from Brad Halloran only to be disallowed by being offside. Peter Carter showed once again how deadly he is in front of goal by scoring soon after. Tony Gibbs, in his new midfield roll played well in the conditions he likes. The first half showed why we are on top of the table with most players putting their heart into the game. Tom Grice could have scored the goal of the season when a powerful header just missed. During the second half the home team nearly got one back but for

Brad Halloran missed an easy chance by putting it over the net from metres out. Again late in the game, shots were blocked from Peter Carter, Brad Halloran and Tony Gibbs. Michael Hurst is still improving in defence with some excellent head clearances. Alun Evans' form is improving with each game and Errol Anderson was much more solid in defence. MITCHELTON STABLE TALK

PERHAPS we should have looked at the map before we let the Mustangs out on Saturday because their reaction on the pasture on the banks of STABLE SWAMP CREEK was mixed to say the least. The First Division Reserves after 45 minutes of possession and pressure could only find the net once and that was a penalty which Grahame Morey put away. The halftime score was one all and Sunnyside's goal came from about the only shot they had, compared to the opportunities we missed. In the 33rd minute of the 2nd half they went 3-1 up when our defender lost his footing in the soft ground and we had no one there quick enough to back him up. On the day I thought The Gap deserved their 2 points, the play was closer than the scoreline indicates (the game flowed from end to end consistently), but we can and have played better and should take a long look at what we are doing wrong.






