GO SOCCER FORMSCOPE

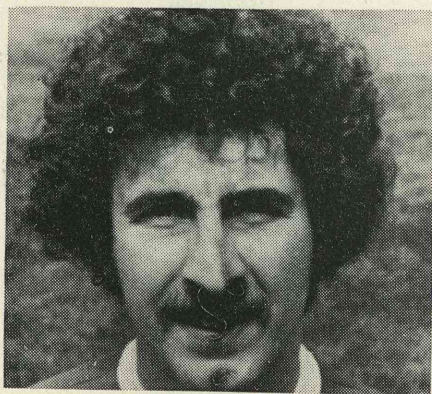
As a different angle on last weekend's local derby between Brisbane City and Brisbane Lions Go Soccer decided to put the Formscope on two players we considered would have an effect on the outcome of the match.

The players we chose were Alan Sunderland and City new signing this season, Bevan Bohan. And the figures the Formscope produced are very interesting.

It becomes obvious that it was definitely a game of two halves. Sunderland and Lions were very much in charge in the first 45 minutes but Bohan and City took control for the second period.

Bohan emerges as the greater work-horse of the two but his error percentage is much higher.

Sunderland's skills are evident in the number of times he beat his marker but it must be alarming for Lions officials to learn that in 90 minutes he managed only four shots at goal, all in the first half. Three of those four were on target.

Bohan's aggressive style also emerges clearly in the figures. It can be seen in the number of tackles he won, the times he beat his marker, the number of balls he won in the air and the number of fouls he gave away.

Overall Bohan was involved in more play but a lot of this work tended to be wasted by periodic errors and overkeenness while Sunderland had a bigger influence on the game in that each time he got the ball he used it intelligently and dangerously.

Our Formscope also revealed that during the match City had nine shots on target compared to Lions' six, and that's why the Gladiators won 3-1.

The Formscope figures for both players are listed below. The figures in brackets are the Formscope tallies at halftime.

INTERSTATE CLASH LIKELY

Queensland almost certainly will play two interstate games next season and there is a possibility we could be pitted against an overseas team.

The interstate matches are to be part of the centenary celebrations of the Queensland Soccer Federation. QSF secretary Alan Vessey revealed to Go Soccer last week that letter proposing the interstate matches had been sent to the New South Wales and Victorian Soccer Federations and both organisations had agreed to the idea "in principle".

The QSF has asked that both states field their strongest sides possible and attempts are now being made, through the Australian Soccer Federation and Philips Soccer League to have the two interstate clashes integrated into the season plan.

This will avoid any problems of clubs not releasing players because of PSL commitments.

The QSF is confident though that because they have applied so early for the matches they could get a favorable response from the two national bodies.

The current proposal is believed to be that the match against Victoria would be on the weekend prior to the commencement of the Philips League and the clash with New South Wales in the middle of the season but again on a weekend.

The New South Wales match would be promoted as the clash with the "Blues" and hopefully gain the interest that other codes do with their interstate games.

As for the international match, QSF officials are currently closely following the progress of several teams now involved in the World Cup and could approach a team from south-east Asia or the Middle East.

They have also not forgotten what a hit the Qatar team was in the world youth championships in Brisbane last year and have not ruled out the possibility they could be invited back.

It has been two years since the full Queensland team played a match and four years since the last interstate clash. Queensland's last appearance was against AC Milan. They drew that match 2-2. Prior to that they beat New Caledonia 2-0 in 1979 and have not lost by more than one goal to a touring overseas side since Sunderland beat the Maroons 6-0 in 1976.

On the interstate scene our last match was a 2-2 draw with New South Wales in 1978. In the six games before that, including one match against Australia, Queensland lost only one game, scoring 19 goals and conceding eight.

Representative football is the highlight of every other football code so it is good to see the QSF making moves to revive it again in Queensland soccer.

THE VALLEYS' ECHO ...

This Sunday at Perry Park Valley Trident clash with Brisbane City in what really is a local derby.

The Blues' Murray Street ground is no more than a stone throw from Spencer Park, the home of City, so this match will decide who can walk around with their heads held high, until the second round at least.

It will be a special match in particular for Valleys keeper Martin Coe as it will be the first fixture against his old club since he came to the Valleys on loan earlier this season. Martin's form has been outstanding this season and he has proved on many occasions this season that he is still one of the best keepers in Australia. Valleys are just glad he is with us and not in the City goal trying to stop the many goals we intend getting this week.

Martin was in good form in our last State League match, against Lions, but was unable to keep out the swift-striking youngsters. The top-of-the-table clash ended with a 2-1 win for the home side. It was a match which only lived up to expectations in the second half.

In a fairly uneven first half, both teams were content to test each other out with Valleys failing to strike the rhythm which characterised their previous performance against Townsville. Neither side looked like championship contenders as the game revolved mainly around a dour midfield struggle for supremacy. Valleys wingers John Kennedy and Frank Mengotti, who had caused so much anguish for Townsville, failed to make an impression against the tight marking and quick tackling of the Lions' backmen. Similarly the Valleys defence, marshalled by "Doog" Melia at the back had little trouble with the Lions strikers.

The second half however was an entirely different ball game.

The Trident men pushed up against the Lions defensive concentration which in turn relied upon quick counter attacks to threaten the Valleys' goal. From one of the breaks Lions scored. Fullback Andy Ogden found space on the right and his cross found the dangerous but apparently unmarked head of Calvin Daunt who had no trouble in finding the net.

Only then did Valleys wake up to the magnitude of their task. Camped virtually in the Lions' half, Valleys launched attack after attack, like some irresistible South Atlantic task force. Time and time again Lions were lucky to survive but when they broke out they looked very dangerous. Finally the weight of the attacks paid off. Frank Mengotti set up an overlapping

With less than 10 minutes to go Valleys looked to have salvaged a well-earned point. They went for broke however and had two points in their sights when disaster struck. Again the move had its genesis on the right flank. Again big Calvin Daunt rose to meet the cross and this time he headed down for Marty Ratcliffe to volley past Martin Coe. There was only three minutes to go — Valleys had deserved more.

Coe could certainly not be faulted for the conceded goals and in fact had dealt effectively all afternoon with the threatening counter-attacks of Daunt and Co. The midfielders again played well with Tom Pike in particular showing some delightful touches. But their constant pressure on the Lions goal often left the backline cruelly exposed. Lions had the speed to take full advantage of this defect.

The SEQL team playing delightful football in patches lacked the overall resilience to contain the determined running and tackling of a youthful Lions side. Without Ian Rathmell from the start, Renato Iovennetti from the fourth minute and Mark Cruse from halftime, the Valleys team sank eventually to a 0-3 defeat. Dean Dnovornivich and Joe Bella at least went down fighting.
