The Young Socceroos last week had a short stopover in San Francisco on their way to Mexico for the world youth championships. They arrived in the middle of the local soccer season and learned that 1983 is indeed one of the most vital years yet for the code in the country.

CRUNCH YEAR AHEAD FOR AMERICAN SOCCER

Interest in the North American Soccer League has waned considerably during the last two seasons, but the creation of Team America and the return of Franz Beckenbauer to New York Cosmos may slow the downtrend in this 17th season.

Team America, with a base in Washington, will operate as a franchise in the league and also provide the nucleus of the U.S. national team. Canada has created a Team Canada, which will operate next season in the NASL out of Montreal.

Dynamo Kiev of the Soviet Union served as the national team of that country for a period in the 1970's, but Team America will operate under entirely different circumstances. Dynamo Kiev owned its players; the Team America players are on loan although Team America pays their salaries in accordance with their contracts with their respective teams.

One illustration of how many people in soccer are working to assure success for team America is the example of Paul Hammond, who shares the goalkeeping duties.

Since Hammond was a free agent and Team America could not sign him to a contract, the players union signed him to a contract and then lent him to Team America.

All players on Team America must be U.S. citizens who have not participated in any World Cup games for other countries. Since clubs such as the Cosmos and Tampa Eay Rowdies have contributed two or more players to Team America, the NASL will allow such teams to field three North American citizens rather than the required four. If a club has one player on Team America, that club must field four citizens.

Team America is the first club in the League since the expansion from 18 to 24 teams in 1978. Influential franchises in the league such as the Cosmos and the Chicago Sting felt that in 1980 — when the league operated with 24 teams — the size of the League should be reduced. There are now 12 franchises after the loss of Edmonton, Jacksonville and Portland, after last season and the inception of Team America.

HOPES WITH FRANZ AND A NEW TEAM

The League has been divided into three divisions of four teams each. The Eastern Division has Chicago, Montreal, the Cosmos and Toronto; the Southern Division has Fort Lauderdale, Tampa Bay, Team America and Tulsa; and the Western Division has Golden Bay(formerly San Jose), San Diego, Seattle and Vancouver.

The regular season of the NASL will end on September 4, with each team having played 30 games, two fewer than each of the previous three seasons. Eight teams will be in the playoffs, the three division winners and five wild-card teams. The Soccer Bowl will be played on October 1 at B.C. Place, a new-domed stadium in Vancouver, British Columbia.

ALL THE NEWS FROM MEXICO

BRAZIL CONFIDENT OF A YOUTH WIN



Brazil will win the world youth championships in Mexico according to its confident coach, Jair Pereira.

'ereira, 36, argues that never before as Brazil sent such a strong string of players to the youth championship as it will this time. Apparently, the reason for it is that league president Giulite Countinho has ruled that winning the Cup is a "Subject of Honour".

In 1977 (Tunisia), 1979 (Japan) and in 1981 (Australia), Brazil failed to go far in the important event. Some attributed this to bad preparation: others to the lack of talented players. In fact, for the Japan event Brazil did not even qualify for the final.

"Some of my players will likely be part of Brazil's 1986 World Cup Team. I could mention Giovanni and Bebeto", said Pereira.

Giovanni Silva, 19 is a veteran of Brazil's youth team that played two years ago in Australia. The diminutive, baby-faced star midfielder of Rio's Vasco Da Gama is an artist with the ball.

Bebeto (Jose Roberto Gama de Oliveira), 19, an inside left is being hailed as the "new Zico". A higher middle-class lad from Salvador, Bahia State, Bebeto never dreamed of becoming a pro-soccer player. His father frequently chased away agents who insisted upon bringing the boy south to play for a big professional team.

Talking about Brazil's main opponents in the World Cup, coach Pereira mentioned the Soviet Union as the team to beat.

"I haven't seen most of the teams, but I can assure you that whoever beats the Soviets has a strong possibility of winning the Cup. I was also impressed with Australia", he said.

TROPHY-HUNTER

Holland's Marco van Basten is aiming to be the successor to Australia's Mark oussas as the winner of the Golden of at the world youth championships for the highest scorer of the tournament.

Koussas won the trophy at the world youth championships in Australia in 1981 and van Basten's chances of winning it in Mexico are excellent according to his 21-year-old Ajax Amsterdam club-mate Wim Kis.

Kist's own talents are so well developed he won the Golden Boot last season as Europe's top goalscorer. But those 34 goals haven't been enough to save his place in the Ajax team from the challenge of van Basten.

Van Basten, just 19, has now taken over from Kist and his 12 goals in 13 games helped take Ajax to the Dutch First Division championship.

Van Basten, who started with a youth team in Utrecht, scored in Holland's 4-0 win over rivals Austria before they came to Mexico. He is so good that national coach Kees Rijvers has already promoted him to Holland's Under-21 national team.

And young van Basten didn't let him down. He scored twice in a 5-0 win over Spain. Now he's set his sights on the USSR, Brazil and Nigeria . . . Holland's first round opponents in Mexico.

The Australian team has been studying a video of the 3-0 win over Mexico in Acapulco last November. Coach Les Scheinflug is confident the video shows how to beat the home nation but he has warned his players to forget the Havelange tournament result when they walk onto the Azteca stadium for the opening match of the world youth championships on June 2.

• Continuing a series on the Premier League captains and coaches. Next week — BRISBANE LIONS.

Grange Thistle coach Jim Baylish is one of the quiet men of Queensland soccer.

The softly spoken Scotsman tends to let his team's results do the talking and so far this season that speaks volumes.

Baylish, 45, a salesman for the Tip Top Bakery, stepped into the breach to help Thistle through a difficult time two seasons ago. And he has been a key figure in helping to steer the club out of troubled waters.

In his first year as first team coach, after being Youth team coach for three years and then coach of the reserve team, Baylish guided Thistle to the First Division double.

And this season the Tangerines look set to figure among the honours of the new Premier League.

Baylish gives all the credit to his players which represent a wide range of youth and experience.

"I firmly believe a coach is only as good as his players and we have some fine players at Thistle — both young and old. But we have also built a strong team spirit which has helped us a lot. Individuals don't count, it is team players that we

want," Baylish said. Baylish, a former Melbourne resident who came to Oueensland five years ago, says Thistle has changed its policy in recent years.

"Previously Thistle tried to buy success but now we are playing youngsters who have come through the club. Players like Garth Moloney, Ross Swan, Gordon Buchanan, Keith Marsh and Glen Archer are perfect examples. The future looks bright for the club," Baylish said.

The one thing that baffles Baylish about Grange Thistle is its lack of a huge following.

"I have never met a team with so much success yet so little support. There are a band of diehard supporters, of whom we are very grateful, but if success breeds support then we should be watched by thousands. Unfortunately we are no he said.

Baylish, who was born in Johnstone, is a former Victorian youth team coach and coached Green Gully Ajax in its first year in the Victorian State League. He also was at Alcona City.

He came to Australia in 1949 and did his senior coaching badge under Eric Worthington in 1974.

Baylish is enthusiastic about the new Premier League and sees the club's old State League rivals, Mount Gravatt and Ipswich as the teams to beat. He believes Ólympic's challenge will fall away.

"Olympic attack too much and are too vulnerable at the back. The other two teams have all-round ability and will be the ones I will be watching and want to beat the most," Baylish said.

Grange Thistle captain John Paterson is a real professional with the interest of young players at heart.

Paterson declined to be interviewed if the story was to be on himself. He wanted some of the young players in the Thistle side to be given their due credit.

"I am only captain because I can shout the loudest," Paterson said.

"We have several experienced players in the side who in their own way are all captains. But it is wrong that the older players should get all the attention.

I can remember when I was a youngster back in Scotland how I felt when the older players got all the credits although we worked just as hard.

"I wouldn't want to do the same to the youngsters at Grange. They do everything I do and should be congratulated for it."

Paterson named his midfield partner Ross Swan as one youngster who in his opinion deserved the highest of accolades.

"He has come on out of sight. He has built his stamina through early morning runs and his performances on the field have proved to be an inspiration to me," Paterson said.

The tough midfielder also named fullbacks Glen Archer and 'Bucky' Buchanan as promising youngsters who had grasped their chance and emerged as regul first teamers.

But there are half a dozen more coming through who will be pushing for first team places soon. The future looks good," Paterson said.

As far as his own future is concerned Paterson says he will continue playing as long as he is enjoying the game.

"You are only as good as your last game and with so many youngsters coming through the pressure is on to keep performing. I would like to win the premiership again this year then after that I can see the team going through a process where more and more youngsters will come into the side."

"Eventually I would imagine one will come through who will take over from me." he said.


