BEST AND BRUSASCO SEE

Visiting soccer legend George Best and Queensland Soccer Federation president Ald. Ian Brusasco seem an unlikely pair, but the two are on the same wavelength in their approaches to some problems within the game.

Ald. Brusasco last week raised a few evebrows when he called for change within the game to make it more appealing to the Australian public. He suggested the offside law be abolished and even ventured as far as to say goalkeepers should be deleted from a soccer team.

Many of the critics dismissed the suggestions as "yet another weird idea from Perry Park".

But then three days later, at the George Best press conference, the Irishman, who has played soccer in more than a dozen countries around the world, wholeheartedly supported Ald. Brusasco's remarks.

"That's the problem with football at the moment, too many people are scared of change," Best said.

"They have changed the offside rule in America and I think it is a great success. People should go ahead and try something new. If it doesn't work you can always go back to the old way. And what have you lost?"

Best, again like Brusasco, was critical of the lack of personalities in the game at the moment. He labelled English soccer as boring because there were no great players that prompted fans to travel miles to see.

"There are several players in England at the moment who are very, very close to being great, but they just don't have that little bit extra which makes them

special," Best said.
Ald. Brusasco, in his address to the Queensland Press Club, told the packed luncheon, while there were no personalities in soccer, the players were there to be developed if Australians would only stop calling them "wogs playing soccer."

"The others have their Raudonikis', their Jesualenko's and their Pilecki's but as

soon as there is mention of our Youth players like Incantalupo or Patikas they are called wogs playing soccer."

"These kids have broader Australian accents than I have. You talk to them. They are Australians and they want to be known as Australians," Ald. Brusasco

Ald. Brusasco had high praise for the -Youth team in his address and after highlighting its performances in the Havelange tournament and the 2-1 win over Scotland, he called the players "sport-

ing heroes".
"They are sporting heroes — we in Australia like sporting heroes - we should hail them," he said.

But Ald. Brusasco's most surprising revelations came when he talked about changing the rules and his intention to nominate for the Australian presidency if the opportunity arose. But at the same time he was very critical of the National League and gave Brisbane City an underhanded serve when he criticised clubs for spending money on developing facilities rather than developing players.

"Sure the National League has produced better players and the standard of the game has improved, but it has not won the public. And let's face it, entertainment and the public is what we're

all about," he said.
"We need more scoring. So what if they have to pick the ball out of the net 35 times. An 18-17 result is better than 1-0. That way the crowd will cheer 35 times instead of once."

"The purists will hate me, but the purists hate one-day cricket. It's a contrived thing, but it's a boom success. What's stopping soccer doing likewise?"

On the ASF presidency, Ald. Brusasco said he would not stand against Sir Arthur George but if the position became vacant he would be a contender.

"If Sir Arthur chose to stand down and that could happen in the very near future - my name would go up as a candidate," he said.

"Sir Arthur is 68 or 69 or even older I think, and he may be thinking of

retiring. If that happens I am available to take his place," Ald. Brusasco said.

And if that happens — with their mutual outlook on the future of the game — one wonders whether Brusasco will make Best his righthand man?

BIG DAY FOR VIRGINIA

Third Division club Virginia United is set for its biggest day ever when it stages the Daihatsu soccer Fun Day at Albert Bishop Park this Sunday.

Weeks of work have gone into preparations for the gala day which will include not only two senior matches but carnivals in three junior age groups.

The club's under 7's, under 9's and under 12's will host teams in exciting carnival competitions which will be forerunners to the big Sixth Division and Third Division clashes against Booval Stars at 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. respectively.

The Daihatsu Fun Day gets under way at 11.30 a.m. and will include a guest appearance by Minister for Health and local member, Brian Austin.

In addition to the feast of soccer on show, Virginia officials have organised many rides and stalls to add to the Fun Day carnival atmosphere. Players and spectators alike can test their skill on the golf putting stall at halftime or indulge in the barbecue or cold refreshments stand.

The Daihatsu Fun Day is set to be the biggest ever in the relatively short history of Virginia United Soccer Club. The club was formed only in 1970 but already is working towards completing its clubhouse and by next season should have its system of floodlighting installed.

The club's senior teams presently train at Kedron Park but that hasn't proved to be a setbcak and both sides, especially the first team are among the most competitive in their divisions.

The club's Third Division side under the astute coaching of Englishman John

Flood was until the recent Big Wet sitting on top of its division. Although now in third place, the team has several games in hand which if they win — as Flood confidently expects - they will resume their rightful place on top of the league.

Flood, who was previously with Redcliffe Police Youth Club and North Star, is of a number at Virginia who are former North Star members.

Goalkeeper May MacDonald, rightback Neil Sullivan, leftback Neil Kirk and forward Neil Macklin have spent some time at the neighbouring Premier League

But Virginia by no means has relied solely on recruiting from North Star and in addition to grooming its own talent it has signed several overseas imports.

Keith Hornsey, Danny Todd, Bob Baker and Tom Brooks are recent inclusions from Great Britain while Wayne Rowlands and Bob Munro have played nearly all their careers at Virginia.

But the key player in the Virginia side is their skilful captain and central midfielder Bob Brockwell who with speedy leading scorer Dave McNally has featured in many of the side's victories this season.

Other playesr who help bolster the squad include Trevor Lloyd, Gary Macklin, Peter Howman and Owen Monaghan while the club's Junior Colts side is shaping to be a fine team which should eventually maintain Virginia's upward climb.

The British Championship - the end of season competition between the Home nations, is tottering on its last legs and appears destined to be switched to a two yearly event. Crowd figures last season show that apart from the England-Scotland clash, the championship is a fizzer. Only 24,000 people watched England play Wales at Wembley in February, the lowest ever Wembley international attendance. The English and Scottish Associations are pushing to retain their yearly fixture but play the other home nations only in years in which there is no World Cup or European Championship. The minor countries though have protested bitterly that the championship is their financial lifeblood and any switch could have disastrous effects.

6th July, 1983

Former Brisbane Lions guest player Alan Sunderland was sent off during Arsenal's third and final match of their Indonesian tour last month. Arsenal were beaten 2-0 by Niac Mitra, the Indonesian champions, with Sunderland's dismissal coming 10 minutes from the end after a clash with an opponent.

Crystal Palace is trying to sign former Leeds and Manchester United striker Joe Jordan. Jordan currently is playing with AC Milan but the Italian club wants to sign Brazilian Paulo Falcao and if it succeeds will be unable to take up a further one year option on Jordan's contract. Elton John has issued a "hands-off" to other clubs chasing Watford manager Graham Taylor. Taylor is being sought by Sheffield Wednesday to replace Jack Charlton but the Watford chairman issued a statement emphasising that Taylor was under contract and could not be approached.

England midfielder Gordan Cowans signed a three year contract with Aston Villa on his return from the three test series against the Socceroos. Cowans had previously agreed to join Italian club Naples but the deal fell through after a change of control at the club.

Spurs chairman Douglas Alexiou has pledged to make every effort to keep Glenn Hoddle at White Hart Lane "if that is in the best interests of the club".


