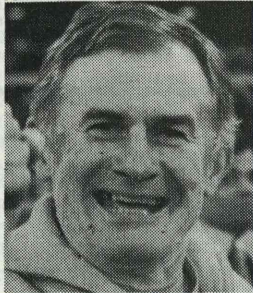

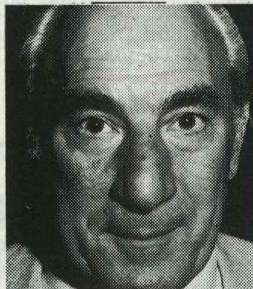

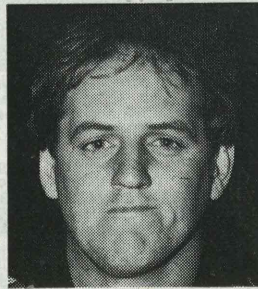

## THE FINAL SHOWDOWN

### NSW TO FACE US FIRST UP

New South Wales will go into the interstate clash against Queensland without the benefit of a trial game together.

When the team arrives in Brisbane on the morning of April 29, it would have had only four training sessions together.

"I don't think a training game would serve any purpose. Most of the NSW team are members of the Australian squad and this match will be only one step in our preparations for the international tournament.

"The result is not as important as is the players getting used to performing together at a higher standard of football," Arok said.

Arok said he was in no way worried about the result NSW might, or might not, get in Brisbane.

"I am not the worrying type. I want to put together a good team which will enable me to look at certain players in certain situations," he said.

Queensland, which took on NSW after four trial games together last season,

## QLD v NSW — APRIL 29

### WISHART MISSES ON A PLAYER 'JUGGLE'

Brisbane City goalkeeper Kim Wishart, the likely Queensland custodian against New South Wales on Sunday week, missed out on the 40-man Australian squad because of a juggling of the conferences.

And Queensland soccer officials could ask national coach Frank Arok to explain his actions when he comes to Perry Park with the NSW team for the return interstate clash.

Arok last week named two squads, one a "Sydney camp", the other a "Melbourne camp". It was obvious one squad was picked from the Sydney-based Australian Conference, and the other from the Melbourne-based National Conference.

But despite the fact Arok openly named 22 from his Conference and only 18 from the other, he managed to more subtly give Sydney two more places by including Canberra players Tony Franken and Frank Farina in the Melbourne camp. Their club Canberra Arrows is in the Australian Conference.

It is obvious Franken took the second goalkeeping place which should have gone to Wishart.

The Young Soccerero keeper had to be switched into the other Conference to allow for the inclusion of Sydney City goalkeeper Tony Pezzano in the Sydney camp.

Queensland, and South Australia, appear to have been given an unfair deal and it seems that QSF president, Ald. Ian Brusasco, was spot on with his criticism of the selection process, saying it constituted a "mockery and a sham".

Furthermore, should Queensland's Danny Wright have to be replaced in the

national squad because of his ankle injury — from where will his replacement come?

Will it be the 41st best player in Australia, or the 19th best from the National Conference or another favourite from the Australian Conference put into the Melbourne camp.

The whole thing has left a bitter taste in the mouths of Queensland officials and players and the Maroons are more determined than ever to repeat their 3-0 victory over New South Wales on April 29.

### STILL A SECOND CHANCE

All hope is not lost for Queensland's national squad rejects and Frank Arok has pledged to come to Brisbane next weekend looking for players to add to his squad.

"I have made it perfectly clear to everyone that the list of players named is not, repeat, not final and there will be players who come in and those who are dropped," Arok said.

With that carrot dangled in front of them, Queensland's players are certain to turn in a tough, fighting performance.

And relations between the two benches could be equally as tense.

Arok last week fired a broadside at Queensland coach Bruce Stowell, claiming one of his six national squad

recommendations was 32-year-old while another two did not qualify residentially for the Australian team.

Stowell, who in fact only nominated five players, was baffled by the attack.

He did not nominate a 32-year-old and sent a covering letter in relation to the non-Australian players suggesting that should they come into consideration, their residency and eligibility could be finalised before the start of the international series.

The old catch-cry says you can please some of the people some of the time, but never all of the people all of the time — and it seems national soccer coaches can do neither.

But they can win approval if they are seen to be going about their job in the right manner.

As far as Queensland is concerned, that has not happened with the selection of the present Australian soccer squad.

No-one is asking for "proportional representation", but just a fair go for Queensland.

If Kim Wishart was playing in Sydney this season, he would have been an automatic choice. No player deserves exclusion from his national team because he is not in the mainstream of the code.

To treat Queensland as "country cousins", as Frank Arok appears to be doing, is to play politics with Australian soccer.

Mr. Arok should have made it his business to get to places like Brisbane, Adelaide and even Perth and see first hand what is available.

The calling of recommendations was little more than a public relations exercise.

It is easy to become emotional and parochial over national team selections, but Queensland cannot have the best Youth team in Australia three years ago and now have only one player worthy of being included in the top 40 in Australia.

Queensland does not want a swag of representatives to match those of the other states. All we want is deserved recognition for our players.

Kim Wishart deserves to be in the Australian squad and hopefully Mr. Arok will acknowledge that fact.

If not, then we are wasting our time supporting the national team, the National League and indeed the Australian Soccer.



## NEW DRAW FOR CUP



For the first time, an "out of the hat" draw will be a feature of this year's Ampol State competition.

The "seeding" of the Cup draw has long been a contentious issue, but was necessary to avoid travelling costs, throughout the State, exceeding the funds of the Tournament.

But under a new format this year, a public draw will apply from the quarter-final stage onwards.

Forty-four teams from all parts of Queensland will play in this season's Cup. That will comprise of 12 teams representing the major provincial centres, the 10 Premier League teams, the 10 Intermediate League teams and the 12 Amateur Division One sides.

And for the first time the Premier and Intermediate League clubs will have to play a qualifying round.

Prizemoney also has been increased this season and Ampol Petroleum (Qld)

Pty Ltd. has increased the first prize by a \$1000 to \$5000.

The new format provides for three country zone winners to move into Round One of the main competition. They will be joined 13 City qualifiers.

The 12 Amateur teams will play off in the first round of the City qualifying to produce six teams which will then be drawn with the 20 semi-professional sides to provide the 13 second round qualifying matches.

"People have been asking for a long time when we are going to have an FA Cup type competition in Queensland. A similar competition could not be staged without losing the statewide concept of the Ampol Cup, but now under the new format we have the best of both worlds.

Go Soccer, in its usual form, will not be published next Wednesday because of the Easter and Anzac Day holidays. Instead, a special Go Soccer interstate match program will be printed and on sale at Perry Park on April 29. The program will contain all the up-to-date points tables and many of the regular Go Soccer features. Go Soccer will return to its normal format, and be available for collection at the usual depots, from Wednesday, May 2.

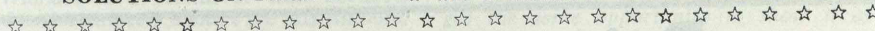

# GO SOCCER ALLSTARS

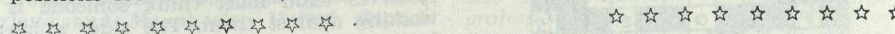
The washout of the first round of Premier League fixtures has allowed National League team players to dominate the rankings of this week's Go Soccer Allstars team.

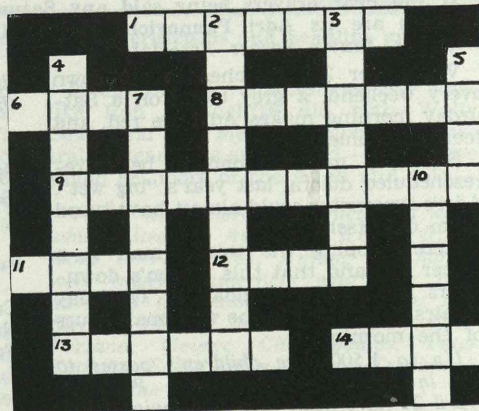
Steve Jackson, Russell Stewart and Jim McDonagh maintained their number one positions from last week, but it was a

tle. The player was seen walking around town with a ball and chain strapped to his ankles.

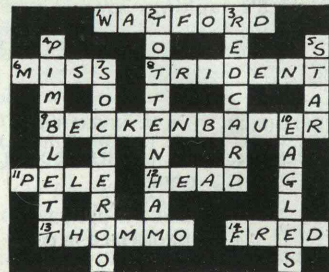

Ian Brusasco has a habit of making hard-hitting criticisms and headline grabbing statements — after the event.

And sadly, in relation to the Australian squad just announced, it was too late.

In the past we have heard Brusasco's thoughts on the National League and the restructuring after everyone else had said their bit. And while that may be good politics I don't think it is helping soccer.

And certainly not in relation to getting more Queenslanders into the national squad.

Brusasco has no excuse. He was in the box seat to elect the new national coach and the guidelines which within he would operate. As a member of the World Cup committee Brusasco should have said his piece then and there, not the day after the squad was announced.

All we have now is a slanging match between Queensland and Frank Arok.

While I firmly agree with Brusasco that Arok was wrong in leaving out Kim Wishart, the ASF World Cup committee opted for a part-time coach.

Wishart is a victim of that decision and unfortunately I can't see any amount of papertalk getting him into the squad.

If Ian Brusasco championed our stars like Ron McAuliffe did with Wally Lewis and Mal Melinga before the Australian team was announced — maybe we would get more of the green and gold.

I read with interest an article last week which listed the Australian schools teams from 1977 to 1981. Among the names were many southerners who have now advanced to National League clubs and further. Players like Steve Blair, Tony Pezzano, George Christopoulos, Peter Katholos, Eddie Krncevic, Peter Tredinnick and so the list went on.

Among the names were a number of Queenslanders: Ken and Ross Swan, Brett Beves and Tony Burley aside, whatever happened to Lloyd McLean, Jeff Lowe, Glen Huntley, David Whyte, Greg Pattell, Andy Tighe and others? Why were they not snapped up by NSL clubs like their interstate team-mates? These players must have had ability to make the Australian All Schools side. It is a shame they never got the same opportunity to show it as did the southern boys.

## SOCCERWORLD



Ian Rush is the choice of his fellow professionals as their 1983 English Football League "Player of the Year".

The Welsh international striker finished well clear of his Liverpool captain, Graeme Souness, and third-placed England and Manchester United skipper Bryan Robson.

Rush was voted "Young Player of the Year" in 1982. That award stays with the goalscorers for 1983 as Luton's Paul Walsh topped the poll ahead of Steve Nicol and Steven Hodge, from Nottingham Forest.

Rush becomes the third Liverpool player to win the award since its introduction in 1973. Terry McDermott won in 1979 and Kenny Dalglish last year.

Coventry manager Bobby Gould has dropped goalkeeper Raddy Avramovic to the reserves for the remainder of the season after blaming him for a recent defeat by Stoke. Gould in the same week also slapped curfews on six apprentice professionals and fined them two weeks' wages. The apprentices, all aged 17, had been suspended by a local education college for "unpunctuality, disobedience and disrespect." The six also have been banned from using the daily team bus for the five-mile trip to the club's training camp.

Johnny Arnold, one of a small band to have played cricket and soccer for England, has died in a Southampton hospital. He was 76.

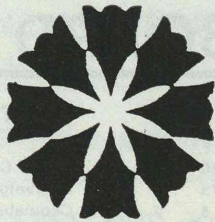
