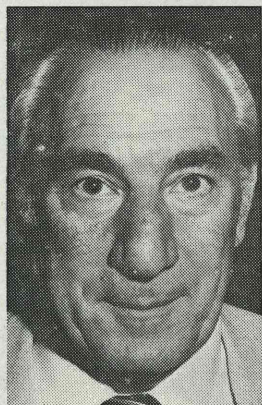

We are taking this game very seriously and intend to improve on our last performance and avenge our 3-0 loss to the Maroons at Perry Park last season.

The New South Wales Soccer Federation attaches great importance and prestige to interstate clashes, particularly with Queensland, and we are keen to see a revival of the interest and tradition of interstate matches in the past.

For New South Wales, and indeed, Australian soccer, this year's clash is very important as it will allow the national coach to see the better players from both states performing in a top level match.

We are delighted to again be the guests of the Queensland Soccer Federation and extend an invitation to the Queensland team for a return match in Sydney some time in the future.

AND JUST FOR THE RECORD

Today's match will be the 72nd encounter between Queensland and New South Wales since the two states clashed for the first time in Sydney in 1880.

New South Wales has by far the better record, having won 44 matches to Queensland's 18. Nine games have been drawn.

Queensland is gaining on New South Wales in the goalscoring tally, and last year's three brought the Maroons' total to 141 goals — fractionally behind New South Wales which has netted 150 times.

Last year's 3-0 victory was Queensland's first since 1957 when the Maroons won 3-1 in Brisbane and the fourth

biggest winning margin by a Queensland team since 1880.

Queensland's most capped player is Graham McMillan, who played for the state 23 times. The player with most caps in recent times is former Merton, Southside Eagles, Lions and now Ipswich striker Ron Millman who has worked the Maroon 13 times.

If Brisbane city fullback Steve Perry takes the field today he will be in line for his 10 state cap, the most of any player in this year's squad.

MORE GAMES AHEAD FOR OUR MAROONS

Queensland Soccer Federation president, Ald. Ian Brusasco, is to push for an increased interstate soccer schedule that could see the state side play up to four or five matches a year at Perry Park.

Ald. Brusasco, a long-time and staunch supporter of interstate football, believes Queensland soccer has an attractive and promotable product in its state team which should be utilised to its full extent.

"We must take note of the example set by the Queensland Rugby Union which has sought to expose its successful state team as much as possible.

"We proved last year that we can beat the best interstate opposition and our past record against touring sides has been good. The feedback from the players is that they want more representative matches and the games are obviously well received by the public. We have a product people want to watch so we should be giving it to them as much as possible," Ald. Brusasco said.

Ald. Brusasco said he had hoped to schedule more matches for the Queensland team but the state side had become "a victim of circumstance".

"With the big international program and the National League there were no dates available. But we will be getting in early for next season," he said.

Ald. Brusasco said the QSF almost certainly would be accepting an invitation from New South Wales Soccer Federation president John Constantine to play in Sydney next season (See presidents' messages on page 2).

"NSW are our traditional rivals. I am interested in promoting matches against them anywhere, anytime," Ald. Brusasco said.

Today's game is set to be a real thriller, with so many things at stake.

Queensland is out to prove last season's 3-0 win was no fluke, while NSW are smarting from that defeat.

The NSW squad is packed with Socceroos or Australian squad representatives. Those players must assert their dominance to make sure of places in the national team to play in the forthcoming international tournament.

BATTLE OF THE BENCH

The battle of the bench will be as interesting today as the tussle on the field.

NSW and Australian coach Frank Arok and Queensland's Bruce Stowell have clashed several times in recent weeks over the make-up of the national squad.

Today is when they both can do the real talking.

Both coaches have impressive pasts. Stowell is in his second year as Queensland coach after a distinguished playing and coaching career in NSW that included spells with Pan Hellenic and Wests.

Arok, a Hungarian-born former player, was picked as national coach this season after guiding St. George to an NSL championship last year. As part-time coach, Arok guided Australia to its best result ever against England last year.

LAST YEAR IT WAS A LONG AWAITED VICTORY FOR QLD.

Few would have expected Queensland to win last season's centenary interstate clash by such a convincing margin — it had, in fact, been 27 years since the Maroons had scored a victory over the Blues.

But from the starting whistle to the final kick, there was never any doubt who was in control. The Queensland squad gave one of the most committed, big-hearted performances ever seen at Perry Park.

Against all odds, the home side's tigerish tackling and incisive passing crushed a New South Wales team which contained seven Soccerroo squad members.

Queensland drew first blood in the 32nd minute, NSW central defender, and former Brisbane City player, David Ratcliffe handled the ball in the penalty area and Stewart made no mistake as he slammed home the kick.

Four minutes later, Queensland hit again. Alan Niven hammered a free-kick into a wall of defenders and Wright reacted smartly as the ball deflected to dash clear and slide in an angled shot past NSW keeper Greg Woodhouse.

But the Maroons wrapped up the match just after the break when Bobby Hamilton slid the ball into the net after a scramble in the NSW goalmouth.

Another opportunity fell later for Pimblett but Woodhouse saved brilliantly then it was Wishart's turn to make the save of the day as he denied Phil O'Connor a breakaway opportunity.

Stowell said after the match that he considered at least five Queensland players should have won berths in the national squad on their performances, but that was not to be as Frank Arok,

who watched the match, selected only Wishart for his Australian squad for the series against England.

"Although it was an excellent win for Queensland, NSW were dreadful. The team was badly put together. Four better NSW sides could have been put on the park," Arok said.

MEET THE MAROON MEN

Here are pen pictures of the players in the Queensland squad for today's interstate clash against New South Wales.

Goalkeepers:

KIM WISHART: Age, 27. Club, Brisbane City. A former Ipswich player who made his first team debut for St. Helen's at 16 years. Has been a regular in Queensland squads and was picked in the Australian squad last season for the series against England.

STUART WOODRUFFE: Age, 20. Club Mount Gravatt. A one-club man who made his first team debut for the Hawks in 1981. Was selected in his first Queensland team (under 16's) as a striker but later moved in goals where he has stamped himself as one of the hottest prospects in the state.

Defenders:

STEVE PERRY: Age, 29. Club, Brisbane City. Has played for Australia 25 times and won 12 full caps. Born in Sydney and played for Sutherland and Wests before coming to Queensland in 1978 for a \$6000 transfer fee. Always consistent.

STEVE JACKSON: Age, 19. Club, Brisbane Lions. Born in Sydney, where he played for Engleburn. Came to Queensland in 1974 and played for Capalaba, Oxley and Acacia Ridge before moving to Lions. Made NSL debut in 1982 and played in Queensland Youth teams.

ALAN HUNTER: Age, 19. Club, Brisbane Lions: Former member of the successful Queensland Youth team and fast becoming one of the toughest defenders in the NSL. A former Acacia Ridge player with a skilful left foot.

FRANK LIDDELL: Age, 30. Club, Brisbane City. Former Stirling, Alloa and Herts player who since coming to Australia has established himself as one of the most consistent players in the National League. An aggressive player who dominates in the air.

ALAN NIVEN: Age, 27. Club, Brisbane Lions. A former Soccerroo with eight national caps and five Queensland appearances. A former Wolves player who came to Australia in 1976. Has a brilliant left foot.

Midfielders:

RUSSELL STEWART: Age, 20. Club, Brisbane Lions. A key player in the Young Soccerroos side. A confident player with a high workrate, a good tackle and explosive shot.

FRANK PIMBLETT: Age, 27. Club, Brisbane City. One of the most underrated players outside of Queensland but recognised here as a fine passer of the ball and excellent reader of the game. The likely Queensland captain and a key player in the side.

JOHN STEWART: Age, 24. Club, Brisbane Lions. Played his junior football at Mount Gravatt before going to England where he had spells with Bristol City and Cheltenham. Played top soccer in Brisbane as a 15-year-old. Joined Lions on his return to Australia last year.

JOHN OGDEN: Age, 24. Club, Brisbane Lions. A former St. Helen's and Lions junior who made his NSL debut in 1977. Came on as substitute for Queensland against AC Milan. Dangerous on set moves.

Forwards:

CALVIN DAUNT: Age, 22. Club, Brisbane Lions. A former Australian Youth team player. First played with Oxley then moved to Taringa before transferring to Lions. Played in Queensland under 16 and under 19 sides.

BOB MOUNTFORD: Age, 31. Club, Brisbane City. Has played for a host of clubs in Britain including Port Vale, Rochdale, Huddersfield, Halifax and Stockport. Had two seasons with Newcastle United in the NSL and transferred to Brisbane City this season. Scored 80 League goals in England.

JIM McDONAGH: Age, 24. Club, Brisbane Lions. A former Albion Rovers and Airdrie player in Scotland before coming to Australia in April last year. Was dogged by injury last season but now fully fit is one of the leading scorers in Queensland this season.

Goalkeepers—

TERRY GREEDY: Age: 28. Club: St. George. A former Melita Eagles player who came to prominence last year when he played in goal for Australia against England. Has come out of retirement this year to play again.

TONY PEZZANO. Age: 23. Club: Sydney City. Played with Brisbane City two years ago. A former Canterbury Junior whose form in recent months has earned him Australian squad selection.

Defenders—

GRAHAM JENNINGS. Age: 24. Club: Sydney Olympic. Has played 10 times for Australia including last year's England series. A former Adamstown (Newcastle) player noted for his overlapping runs.

DAVID RATCLIFFE. Age: 27. Club: St. George. A former Bradford City (England) player who had several seasons with Brisbane City before transferring to Sydney. Powerful in the air and a crunch tackler. Has 13 national team appearances.

ALEC ROBERTSON. Age: 29. Club: Sydney City. One of the most experienced players in the NSW squad. A former Dunfermline (Scotland) player who reads the game well.

STEVE O'CONNOR. Age: 29. Club: Sydney City. A product of the Hakoah junior club. Made his national team debut in 1979 against Wisla Krakow and was a key player against England last year. One of the toughest defenders in the NSL.

JIM CANT. Age: 30. Club: Sydney City. A former Marconi player who featured in the series against England last season and the Merlion tournament in Singapore. A tough tackler.

Midfielders—

PETER RASKOPOULOS: Age: 22. Club: Sydney Olympic. Has played 17 Youth internationals and won four full caps. A dangerous, free-scoring player with a high work-rate. One to watch.

TOM McCULLOCH. Age: 20. Club: Marconi. Played previously for Auburn and was captain of last season's Young Socceroos. Has 21 Youth appearances, including 15 full internationals, to his credit. Can also play sweeper.

IAN GRAY. Age: 20. Club: Leichhardt. An Apia juniors product whose hard work in midfield often rewards him with goals. One of his club's leading scorers this season.

Forwards—

JOE WATSON. Age: 32. Club: Sydney City. Has eight full international caps. A former Forfar Athletic (Scotland) player who since coming to Australia has been one of the most consistent scorers in the National League.

MARSHALL SOPER. Age: 23. Club: Sydney Olympic. Previously played for Leichhardt and has worn the green and gold twice. An unpredictable player who always seems to get among the goals.

JOHN KOSMINA. Age: 27. Club: Sydney City. Australia's most capped player still playing in the NSL. Has scored 16 goals in 38 full appearances. A former West Adelaide striker who is the most feared finisher in the country.

ROBBIE SLATER. Age: 19. Club: St. George. Played seven times, including four full internationals for the Australian Youth team. Was offered a playing contract with Nottingham Forest last year. Has lots of speed.
