STOWELL KEEN ON By Go Soccer Editor QUEENSLAND TOUR **GEOFF STEAD** Although the format still remains a mystery, it now seems certain that there

Queensland coach Bruce Stowell has reacted enthusiastically to speculation that the Maroons could play in the Merlion Cup in Singapore in October.

"I don't think we would let anyone down," Stowell said this week after hearing reports that Queensland Soccer Federation President Ian Brusasco was investigating the possibility of an overseas tour.

Brusasco, the ASF senior Vice-President and a member of the World Cup Committee, suggested last week that the Queensland team be sent to Singapore if the Australian Soccer Federation did not want to send a national side to defend the Cup, which the Socceroos have won for the past two years.

He intends to raise his suggestion at the QSF Executive meeting in Sydney this week.

The full-strength Australian team is unable to accept this year's invitation from Singapore because the tournament almost overlaps the departure date for the Socceroos world tour.

The Merlion Cup runs from October 14 to 28 while the Socceroos are expected to leave for China on October 30.

Although at this stage there seems only a slight chance Queensland will get the opportunity to fill the void if the ASF declines the Singapore invitation, Stowell believes the idea has merit.

"Such a tour is the natural extension to the interstate games and an obvious step in any preparations to reverse the result against New South Wales next year," he said.

"There definitely has to be more State games and I think by playing on an overseas tour some of our players finally might be able to attract the attention of Frank Arok.

"At the moment he just doesn't want to know about us."

Stowell said that if Brusasco's proposal had any chance of succeeding, he would want to start training an 18-man squad immediately.

"I would want to get them in at least once a week and start playing some trial games," Stowell said. And the State director of coaching

revealed his squad could be somewhat different to that he chose for the May match against the Blues.

"In the light of what happened in the interstate game, I would have to look closer at some of the selection," Stowell said. And after further questioning he admitted: "Yes, there would have to be changes in the striking department."

Stowell said that in picking a squad for such an overseas tour, he could not see himself selecting any more than about three or four Premier League players. "Last week I watched Lions play all over what was supposed to be the best of the Premier League (Ipswich United). If that is the standard of the competition, then I just can't pick any more than about three players.

And it

The problem is though, neither club will go any better unless it starts getting support locally, from other clubs officials and spectators.

Those that have been predicting and pushing for the return of the two NSL clubs should realise that it is not on. for the moment. These people should begin channelling their energies to promoting the National League and making a success of what is reality, rather than dreaming on speculation.

Queensland soccer will gain little benefit, or win any new friends, if it is seen that City and Lions have come back to the Premier League after being tossed out of the NSL by the southern clubs.

Most officials at both clubs generally agree the two sides will eventually return. But if they can return as successful NSL sides, then and only then, will local soccer be on a winner .



One hopes Brisbane City has a comprehensive fund-raising scheme outside of gate money to run the club. The club's NSL team last played at Spencer Park on May 27-that's 6 weeks ago. How the club is expected to maintain support is something that can only be answered by those whos formulated such a bizarre draw.

Watch for young Lions midfielder Rich Bassingthwaigte to play a prominent part in the Young Socceroos next bid to win a place in the world youth championship finals. Bassingthwaigte had a very good tour of Europe with the AIS team recently and reportedly is very much in the plans of Youth coach Jim Shoulder.

The forgotten man of Brisbane NSL football, Lions fullback Bob McSkimming, may not be on the outer for too much longer now Gordon Arrowsmith has taken over. "Bob must be one of the fittest players in Brisbane. His attitude

is good and he is definitely pushing for a place," Arrowsmith said recently. Eut Bob also faces one of the most difficult tasks in Brisbane, ousting the ever-consistent Steve Jackson at rightback in the Lions NSL side.

Brisbane South Junior officials are delighted with the form shown by their rep. team at the recent under 15 championships in Cairns. The side came back strongly after an initial loss and South officials are heralding the system of playing the rep. team in their fixtures as an outstanding success.

What has happened to the local derby? I cannot remember a poorer promotion or turnout for a match between City and Lions than what I saw out at Richlands a week ago.

And what was even more mysterious was that the ingredients were there for both clubs to generate massive interest

Lions changed coaches four days before the game, City had Frank Pimblett suspended, Frank Liddell on the transfer list and were set to gamble with two unknowns.

Yet no-one seemed to get excited.

I don't think it was the media's fault because they had plenty of news to write about. What they probably needed was a few "we'll murder da bums" quotes from either camp.

But I guess the two sides have that many derbies now, it is hard to keep getting excited.

Driving to Richlands last week I started thinking about the "old times" (and even not so long ago). Then, I can remember driving along Ipswich Road and seeing carloads of Azzurri supporters, or half a dozen piled into the bacck of a worker's truck, heading out to see a clash between Hollandia and Azzurri. But these days no-one bothers to drive that far. I suppose Lions can't be blamed for moving away from Perry Park. They gambled on good local support. But the gamble has not paid off. But why do they continue to flog a deadhorse? If the club was smart it would start playing some of its NSL matches in regional centres, say on the Gold and Sunshine Coast and leave Brisbane for its Intermediate League side. At times, they're better to watch anyway.

If City and Lions ever come back to the local competition, I don't think they should worry so much about losing players to Sydney clubs rather than to local Premier League sides.

I could see the likes of Russell and John Stewart going back to Mount Gravatt, Robbie Farrow returning to the Ridge, Ken Swan teaming back up with his brother at North Star, Stephen Glockner looking for a southside club and Calvin Daunt returning "home" to Taringa Rovers, to speculate on but a few.

Last week's special general meeting proved what a senseless lot soccer officials can be. Less than six months ago we had confrontation, deadlock and even walkout over the restructuring proposals. The furore gained wide coverage in all forms of the media, publicity the game could have done without. Yet last week, without hardly a mention, the clubs took less than half an hour to decide the changes were for the better. Mr. Brusasco and his restructuring committee undoubtedly have had the last laugh.

A LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Sir,

Recent events in our NSL clubs have caused me to take pen to paper and put forward views that need to be aired.

Firstly, the credibility of Queensland soccer must be at an all-time low in the eyes of the rest of Australia. With our two NSL clubs changing coaches every few months and committee members playing silly games with local clubs that result in young players giving up the game.

Whether we like it or not, we are judged nationally by our NSL clubs and they have failed to show the best of Queensland soccer to the rest of Australia.

In all aspects of the game, they have

huge problems. There are administrators, coaches and fund-raisers at local levels who are performing better.

So all these things considered, it's about time the two clubs gave it away and returned to the local soccer competition, which they could probably handle.



Coalstars problem has been eased in recent weeks by the arrival of Dave Wheeler and if the Englishman is at his tricky best, he could give the visitors an edge.


The Ridge's defence has been fairly sound, although the team has undergone one or two changes in recent weeks and could take some time to settle again.
