

All first division coaches and administrators would be wise to include these playing dates in their diaries.

If you can, get out to North Star's ground and have a look at the quality of soccer skills displayed by these young ambassadors of the game.

Within all sports we often speak of the "fallout years" between the ages of 16 and 19.

It is not a problem confined to soccer, but one which continually dogs all sports.

It's hard to pinpoint the problem, but young people leaving school, usually becomes the unlikely catalyst.

Senior soccer administrators must create an atmosphere that they are genuinely interested in young players' future welfare.

FRANKLY SPEAKING

LAST weekend's fixtures washout was very frustrating with not one XXXX Soccer League match being able to be completed.

Coaches and players motivate themselves all week at training to build themselves up for the weekend's games.

To have the match cancelled at the last minute is cruel.

But an even bigger problem now looms.

With the Inter-city games also being cancelled due to inclement weather the previous week, there is going to be a build up of fixtures which have to be played somewhere along the line before the season's end.

Looking at the already congested season, we might be looking at playing three or four games a week if the bad weather continues to intervene.

This weekend will feature the big derby game between Brisbane Lions and Brisbane City at Spencer Park.

Already this promises to be a very hard and exciting affair.

The same fixture last season produced a lot of good football and seven goals, as well as a good size crowd.

Both teams have scored seven goals and lost only one in previous matches, so the game could well depend on defence.

The Second Division is already proving to be a very tight race with just three points separating the top five teams.

However, the two favourites on paper at the moment

look to be Brisbane Croatia and Inala City.

They have the most experienced coaches in the division.

Bobby May, who coached Brisbane Croatia last year, is at Inala's helm while Brian Styles and Peter Bannon are looking to steer Croatia through the fire.

Brian won the grand final series with Ipswich last year, so that experience is sure to be translated into his new team.

The National Soccer League, in its first summer season, has been a great success.

The league has sponsorship and plenty of media and TV coverage.

The NSL soccer program on Channel 2 is good viewing and shows the standard of play in the league is getting better every year.

The other main point is they are attracting big crowds to most games and this was one of the main reasons for the switch to summer soccer.





WILLOWBURN Sports Club has the distinction of being Toowoomba's oldest soccer institution and the only survivor to remain out of the four original founding clubs.

The club was founded in 1959 as the Willowburn Soccer Club, and along with Cawdor, Blue Stars and Valleys, formed the Toowoomba Soccer

Association.

Willowburn has continually competed in the Toowoomba Soccer Federation competition ever since.

Some of the players in that first year include Tom Doherty, Jack Craig, Col Williamson, Len Dwyer, Kev Caswell, Merv Seaniger, George Bett and Dave Craig.

The club has also competed in the Queensland Soccer Federation (QSF) since 1966, with the exception of 1979-

81 inclusive.

40th Anniversary

In 1989, Willowburn Soccer Club celebrated its 40th anniversary.

The club has a proud record and is one of the few which has been able to remain financially stable since its foundation.

It has also never been in danger of folding due to mismanagement.

The club is presently based at the Bridge Street Soccer Oval, which it

leases from the Toowoomba City Council

A clubhouse, dressing rooms and floodlights have been constructed by the club at the grounds.

At present, grounds and facilities are being improved to bring amenities up to QSF Second Division standard requirements.

The future of the club is also secure with more than 127 junior players registered.

Willowburn fields teams from Under-7 through to Under-14 and also boasts a ladies and colts teams.

The club re-entered the QSF Brisbane competition in 1982 in Seventh Division and since has never failed to win promotion, the exception being the 1985 season.



In 1987, the club was required to field a reserve grade side as well as a Fourth Division team.

Remarkably these two teams finished third and second respectively, and the club was again promoted to the QSF Third Division in 1988.

Part of Willowburn's success in their rise through the ranks of Queensland Soccer in more recent times can be attributed to Bernie Cronin.

Cronin, a former semi-professional player with Birmingham, Watford and Crewe in England, signed with the club in 1988.

His presence at the club as a player and coach has been inspirational to the younger members.

Last year Willowburn created soccer history in Toowoomba (something which the club has a habit of doing) when it was promoted to the QSF's Second Division.

This is the highest level a Toowoomba club has achieved in the tougher Brisbane competition.

The Second Division team has retained its position in the 1990 competition and is looking forward to another successful season.

There seems only one thing left for the club to achieve - to win promotion to the prestigious XXXX Soccer League.



PRESIDENT'S VIEWPOINT!!!

THE Queensland Soccer Federation will host a landmark tour by English First Division Club CHARLTON ATHLETIC in May this year.

It has been a long time since the Queensland soccer public has had the chance to see a quality overseas team in

action.

Even in earlier years when tours were a fairly frequent occurrence, a single game in Brisbane was the best we could expect from any club which visited Australia.

The coming Charlton Athletic tour represents an entirely different concept.

It is essentially a Queensland venture designed to help promote the game of soccer in major centres throughout the State.

To this end, the tour itinerary provides for Charlton to play the following four matches in Queensland - Sunday May 20 versus Queensland in Brisbane, Tuesday May 22 versus Bundaberg in Bundaberg, Thursday May 24 versus Central Queensland in Rockhampton and Saturday May 26 versus North Queensland in Townsville.

To add to the attraction of these matches, The Australian Soccer Federa-

tion has been requested to make a small contingent of Socceroos available to play for the home sides.

The Bundaberg, Rockhampton and North Queensland Soccer Federations readily accepted the opportunity to stage a game in their respective regions and agreed to meet the financial commitment necessary to enable the tour to proceed.

These Federations are to be congratulated for their enterprise and confidence in the future of the game.

The Charlton team will also play one game in Canberra prior to their arrival in the Sunshine State. The additional game was negotiated with the ACT Soccer Federation to improve the financial viability of the tour.

I believe the Charlton tour has the potential to open up new horizons for Queensland Soccer and that it deserves the full support of the soccer public.

If that support is forthcoming, other tours will follow in the years ahead and the soccer public will be the real winners

Ian Brusasco has served the Australian Soccer Federation with distinction, in many different capacities, over a long period of years.

Few would be aware of the full extent of his involvement in national soccer affairs. As far back as 1968, he was elected a life member of the ASF in recognition of his services.

In 1988, after a further 20 years of work for soccer, Ian became the first Queenslander to occupy the position of Chairman of the Australian Soccer Fed-

He had reached the pinnacle of his adopted sport, but he had inherited an organisation beset with severe financial difficulties and other major problems.

It was his task not only to make the unpalatable decisions, but to convince the States of the wisdom of his actions.

At the very least, his efforts should have earned him a second term of office and the opportunity to see his policies through to fruition.

It is now history that, at the ASF Annual General Meeting held recently in Sydney, certain State delegations cast their votes to deny Ian a second term

It was a sad and bitterly disappointing moment and a poor reward for Ian's hard work and dedication.

Whatever the future might bring, there is little doubt Ian's departure from the national scene will be Queensland's gain.





JUNIORS IN THE LIMELIGHT

QLD JUNIOR SOCCER COUNCIL

The commencement of the 1990 soccer season has started in Queensland.

Queensland Junior Secretary John Trew says the State of Queensland has the second highest number of registered players in Australia.

From 10 affiliated zones in Queensland, some 24,000 junior players from 230 clubs will be playing their fixtures.

Players in the age groups from Under-13 to Under-15 will be striving for representative duties in their zone teams.

At the State Championships they will also be striving for representative honours in the Queensland Teams for the National Titles.

This year the Under-15 State Titles, being held at the North Star Soccer Club from April 15 to 21, are earlier than usual.

The reason for this is that the Under-15 nationals are to be held from July 7 to 15.

From this an Australian Under-16 side will be picked for the Oceania Titles to be played in Auckland, New Zealand in January, 1991.

The winner of the Oceania will play in the Under-16 World Cup to be played in Ecuador in 1991.

Central Queensland has named their Under-15 team for the Under-15 State Titles.

QLD STATE SECONDARY SCHOOL SOCCER

1989 saw The Queensland State Secondary School's Soccer association gain the Sunday Mail/Theiss Contractors Soccer scholarship which allows the "Player of the State Championship" to travel to a coaching clinic in Germany with a tour led by Mr George Pagan.

Andy Brayshaw from Gold Coast Gamblers won the 1989 award and gave up a trip with the Australian Schoolboys to the U.S. and the U.K so he could concentrate on this trip.

We were very pleased to be put in a position whereby one of our players could experience the atmosphere of European Soccer, learn some more about the game and see what openings were available, if any.

The Queensland Secondary Schoolboys side, under coach Richard Shortman, won the National Championship for the first time since its inception and beat NSW for the second time in that period.

Five of those boys were finally selected in the Australian Schoolboys side.

Glenn Gwynn and Steven Corica, from the Peninsula Region (Frank Farina country), Geoff Philp from the Darling Downs Region and Chris Tribbek and Dimitri Theochari both from Brisbane North Region.

Chris and Dimitri were shadow players called in when others dropped out, but both acquitted themselves well.

In fact Chris won the coaches' vote for player of the series.

Glenn Gwynn was the players' player of the series.

Chris is currently playing at North Star and Glenn has come down to play for Taringa Rovers. These are two players to watch for on the Fourex circuit.

Geoff Philp might make an appearance in an inter-city game in the near future.

For those in the Under-15 age group, we have the "Bill Turner/Commonwealth Bank" knockout competition which runs Australia wide and has been running since 1979 when 34 teams competed for the first cup.

We came into it in 1989 when over 400 schools competed and the Queensland winners were Alexandra Hills who defeated Shalom College from Bundaberg.

There are 45 schools listed in the 1990 draw.

For the information of clubs I am going to list all of our 1990 commitments which will involve schoolboy players who are involved in seniors, colts and ladies competition.

State Championships - Boys and Girls, July 12 to 15, Boys in Cairns, Girls at Mt Gravatt.

Girls, September 8 to 14. Both in Melbourne.

Despite the obvious inconvenience these fixtures cause many clubs, most have been supportive of schools soccer in the past, and I would like to thank those clubs who not only encouraged their players to compete but helped them financially when selected in the State teams to compete in the National Championships.

One or two individual coaches have made it quite clear to players that our competition means nothing to them and that representing the State at this level has no value.

One or two boys would have missed the opportunity to represent Australia at school-boy level if they had believed this.

Schoolboy soccer has made some contribution to the careers of a number of Queensland players who are currently playing in the National League and to the career of

Frank Farina.

I only ask that club coaches keep an open mind on the subject and consider the benefits to those young players rather than the problems their absence might cause.

The above also applies to our girls, who now also can represent Australia at this



I might add that last year Mrs Elaine Watson and the Queensland Women's Association gave us every support and every encouragement to involve as many of the girls as possible.

The players must be allowed to make the choice to be available for State selection or not without the pressure of threats to be dropped if they play at the State Championship or the National Championship.

PLAYING THE GAME RIGHT

TODAY we continue our series on "Support Play" with a third drill for players to try at training.

PREPARATION

Make the area as large as possible to allow the game to breathe.

Add goals with goalkeepers if you have them and if you don't, have a small cone goal.

PROCEDURE

The players now play a normal attacking game but with both teams passing in numerical sequence.

Goalkeepers, if any, are not numbered and any player can shoot for goal because goals are paramount in this

If the player passes back to the goalkeeper, the ball must be distributed to the next player in the sequence.

If the goalkeeper saves a shot, the ball can be distributed on merit, but thereafter the sequence must be resumed.

Players successfully tackling or intercepting a ball must call out their number and wait for information from the next player in the team's sequence.

NOTES:

- 1) The nature of the game means players become "all purpose" with the exception of the goalkeepers. Consequently it is pointless for player 4 to be lurking in defence when player 3 is on the opponent's goal line ready to cross.
- 2) Information other than simply calling out numbers is essential. For example if a player has got "lost" behind a team mate who has the ball, there will obviously be a need to call "hold it" as well as a number until the player is in a position to pass. This may prove to be a good point at which to pause and have some discussion on calling. So many players only call when they want the ball so it would be useful to remind them of the positive reasons for making oneself heard on the field.

For example:

- A) "Man on" is the usual call when there is a challenge on the blind side of the player with the ball.
- B) Any advice on alternatives open to the player with the ball.
- C) General encouragement to lift spirits when things "go quiet".




3) Only the team in possession is

allowed to call. Stamp hard on cheating by the opposition.

Checklist

- * Allow at least fifteen vards between yourself and the passer. Don't take another player's space.
- * Move around, think ahead, look for spaces.
- * Information: Don't call for the ball, help other players as much as possible.

WOMEN'S SOCCER

Due to the inclement weather, the finals of the Atlanta Cup pre-season competition had to be cancelled last weekend. These games will be held at a later date during the year. At least we got the round robin competition all in without a hitch and the finals can be slotted in during the year's calendar.

These games, besides giving teams lots of pre-season match practice, have enabled the Executive to be assisted with the grading of all divisions for the coming season of fixtures.

With the completion of this pre-season competition, the Atlanta Cup, we find women's soccer is able to field 40 teams in fixture competition this year.

We will have 5 divisions, each consisting of 8 teams. Fixtures will begin on Sunday, April 22.

First Division will be extremely hard fought this year, with teams, Easts, Redlands, Coalstars, Nerang, Brighton, Newmarket, Tiwiwarren and Grange being more equal in ability than previous years.

With First Division and some of Second Division, the women's fixture controller is aiming to have at least one of the home games coinciding with the men's top Division in that club. We are hoping for more support and interest within clubs themselves and if supporters can see their top men's and women's teams



play at home on the same day, it will be an advantage to all concerned.

The club must benefit financially, the teams must benefit with more supporters and it should bring a closer club contact between both men and women players at each club.

It is encouraging to see so many younger players this year. Quite a few of the girls have been playing soccer at school the past two years and now have joined clubs in their area, hence the increase in the number of teams being fielded.

There are four representative teams currently training for the State Titles.

We believe South Burnett, who are staging the State Titles this year, have had enquiries from Gladstone, Maryborough, and Wide Bay, all of whom are affiliated with the South Queensland Women's Soccer Association, but who have not participated in State Titles for many years.

We are hoping that this renewed interest is a State-wide trend and that women's soccer is enjoying the beginnings of a rebirth.

Women's soccer continues to thrive on the Sunshine Coast and recently received an added boost when Caloundra's Michelle Henderson and Bee Gees Anna Minchev were selected in the Queensland under-19 training squad.

Nambour Reds have put out a last minute cry for more ladies for their women's team.

They only need another couple to fill the side, if you are interested phone Jocelyn on (071) 416 751.

REFEREEING INTO THE 90's with DES MILES

Both Sides of the Coin by Peter Hulme.

A few weeks ago I had a top XXXX league match.

It was one of those matches when a generous helping of good fortune from the sporting gods, enabled me to have what is known as a "good game".

It was not faultless - I have never had one of those.

But within context, my performance during the game was one which gave me a good deal of satisfaction.

Both coaches thanked me warmly as I left the field and I was pleased to see I had been given good marks.

I was more than a little flattered to read the remarks on the report and receive good comments.

But the only thing both coaches and inspectors were doing was acknowledging the contribution I had made to the game.

The memory of this happy occasion goes a long way to offsetting comments made by another coach last season - "a good game spoilt by a bad referee".

I accept this comment was based on a careful study of my handling of the game.

I don't believe it was coloured by the fact I dismissed one of his team, cautioned two others and gave them one penalty which they failed to convert.

Matters were not helped by the teams losing either. But there seems to be a simple explanation as to why at times referees do not receive the appreciation they merit.

This might be attributed to the pressure club coaches are subjected to on match day.

Consider the amount of time coaches have to spend preparing their teams for example.

He has to wait for his players to assemble before he can pick a side, has to pay the match fee, wait until after the game before he can take down the nets and collect his team's strip and wait until everyone has left before he can clean the dressing room.

Then during the game he will probably run the line and act as the bucket and sponge man.

So it is perhaps not to be wondered at, that the part played by the man in the middle is sometimes overlooked.

I'm not saying all coaches are lumbered with all of these duties or that I have never come across one who was less than diligent.

However I will say that occasionally I have encountered the odd individual for whom I have entertained a cordial dislike for.

But like the referee, the club coach seldom gets his just recognition, but without him the grass roots of our game would wither and die.

Perhaps there is a moral in this story which players, coaches, supporters and referees should all take notice of.

Here's an interesting true story about a linesman who shall remain unnamed to save him from embarrassment.

While officiating at a recent country game, he came under a lot of criticism from a large and loud-mouthed woman on the touchline.

Towards the end of the game, following sufficient outbursts of abuse, he said to a player who happened to be running along beside him "God, fancy being married to that". The player answered "I am".

This game was highlighted by two debutantes, Nathan Everleigh and Steve Liddy as a referee.


Goodna went to the break leading 1-0 after John O'Halloran volleyed in a cross from Nathan Everleigh.




