



REDLANDS UNITED SOCCER CLUB

The Redlands United Soccer Club was originally formed under the name of the "Cleveland Rovers" in 1918 in the Redlands District.

The "Rovers" name eventuated due to the long distances travelled by the early English and German settlers.

Players travelled from Redland Bay in the south to Capalaba in the north and Wellington Point in the east.

The original ground was located directly opposite the old Grand View Hotel which these days is the prestigious Raby Bay development.

It is not known when Redlands moved to Cleveland Point, where it remained for many years, before relocating to the Showground Complex in 1970.

The Redlands United clubhouse was officially opened on January 28, 1973.

The earliest history of the club dates back to 1922 when the club was runner up in the B Division.

They went on to win the second grade

premiership in 1923 as well as the Herald and Nissen Cup competitions.

That team comprised of T O'Sea, E Trotter, J Voelker, D Spears, J Routledge, A Bengston, R Webster, J Ross, R Routledge, A Marshall, J Back, W Pervis, C Walker, C Sayers, L Routledge, W Blackburn.

Redlands remained in the lower divisions of the Queensland Soccer Federation but was eventually promoted to the First Division in 1976.

The club experienced their most successful year a year later in 1977 when they finished fourth in the premiership and went on to win the grand final against Southside Eagles.

Many names synonymous with Queensland Soccer at the time represented this team including Ron Millman, Barry Kelso, Trevor and Gary Catchpole, Eric Pattison, Graeme Meagher and Alan Morris.

Over the years there has also been a



number of people responsible for maintaining a relatively successful club including George Roberts, Ray Despot, Bill Helmhold, Ken Rohrig, John Downie Snr, Arthur and Alan Morris, Dick Karreman and the late Barbara Golding.

These people form the heart of the Redlands United Soccer Club and several of their sons and daughters are still playing for the "Red Devils".

Redlands were relegated to the Second Division in 1980 and some of their achievements in this Division include Second Divison Reserves premiers and grand finalists (1982 and 1983) and Second Division grand finalists (1983).

United was inducted into the revised XXXX Soccer League in 1987, but struggled and were relegated back to Second Division this year.

The club's only near success in recent times was in 1987 when they were runners up to Brisbane Lions in the XXXX Pre-Season Cup.

Redlands United has three senior men's teams comprising of Second Division, Second Division Reserves and Second Division Thirds.

The club also has one senior ladies team in the South Queensland Women's Soccer Association.

It has been the ladies which have been out leading light in recent times having won the premiership in 1988 and runners up and grand finalists in 1989.

Several members of this team including Sharon Wass, Sue Clayton, Raeanne Dower, Tanya Corbett, Kim Ketter, Danielle Burns and Vicki Turnbull have also represented their State and country.

Throughout the years many juniors from the club have also attained representative honours and continued on into the senior ranks.

Although United are experiencing difficult times at the moment, the junior contingent of the club will provide a formidable base for which to build on.

In fact the club is currently going through a rebuilding process with a great deal of activity taking place at the club.

All this augers well for the Redlands United Soccer Club to once again be a force in the not too distant future.



1977 Grand Final Team





This week we continue our series on defending with a look at the "Tackling Practice" and "Player for Player Marking Game".

TACKLING PRACTICE:



PREPARATION:

Mark out a pitch. Five of the eight players have a ball (adjust these proportions to suit the abilities of your players).

PROCEDURE:


The object is to be in possession of a ball when the whistle blows. Anyone without a ball when the whistle blows pays the penalty.

NOTES:

1) This is a very demanding exercise so one minute will probably be enough to start with.

2) More stigma is attached to failure in this practice than any other so be prepared for bitching. 3) Vary the length of each burst of competition. You will find some of the players hold back towards the end of the period before getting possession. Catch them out by blowing the whistle early.

PLAYER FOR PLAYER MARKING GAME:



PREPARATION:

Mark out a pitch with three zones in proportions shown. Put a goalkeeper (or a small goal) and one defender in each of the end zones and the remainder of the players in competing pairs in the centre zone.

PROCEDURE:

The goalkeeper of the side winning the toss distributes the ball. Once players have beaten a marker they can move unopposed into the end zone and take on the covering defender and goalkeeper.

No other players may challenge them.

Meanwhile the beaten player has to do a penalty run and get back quickly or the opposition will be free to take a pass and move into the end zone unopposed.

No other player except the one in possession may go into the end zone without the ball.

NOTES:

1) The emphasis in this game is on defensive play, so don't pay much attention to the quality of the attacking.


Having said that, however, this practice does provide the opportunity for dribbling and running with the ball.

2) Watch the positioning of the covering defenders. Encourage them to mirror the movement of the ball.

CHECKLIST:

- * Aim to be first to the ball.
- * If not prevent your opponent from
- *Stay on your feet. Go to ground only as a last resort to stop a cross or a shot.
- * Stay close enough to keep your opponent's eyes on the ball.
- * Try to make your opponent pass sideways or backwards.
- * Give information to other defenders as the opposition attacks.
