Brisbane's XXXX League clubs will also venture beyond the city limits to promote the game in towns such as Cairns, Townsville, Bundaberg, Mackay, Rockhampton and the Gold Coast. All these steps are geared to take the soccer well and truly into the entertainment market place.

## EASTS TAKE PRE-SEASON

Eastern Suburbs clinched its inaugural XXXX Pre-Season trophy last Wednesday night with a 1-0 victory over Brisbane Lions.

The Tigers scored early and then defended grimly to win the final under lights at Perry Park.

It was a great start to the year for the club, top five finishers in the premiership race last year.

East's goal came against the run of play in the 15th minute when stocky striker Col Phelan scored in a goal mouth scramble.

Phelan pounced on a Chris Fegan header before slotting the ball past Lions' keeper Robbie Farrow.

Lions pushed forward in search of the equaliser in the second half and came close a number of times.

Their best chance came in late in the match when Defender Frank Mengotti found himself in the open via a Brendan Eastwell pass.

With only the East's keeper Dave Mewburn to beat Mengotti unleashed a rifling right foot shot.

However Mewburn was able to get both hands to the ball, with Mengotti sending the rebound wide of the far post.

Mewburn was later named player of the finals' series.

He did not let a goal through in all of East's pre-season matches and thoroughly deserved his award.

East's defeated Brisbane City 2-0 in their semi-final while Brisbane Lions accounted for Rochedale Rovers 2-0 to reach the final.

Best players for East's were Frank Pimblett with a commanding display in the midfield and also sweeper Steve Perry.

For Lions Frank Mengotti tried hard all night and Chris Slater always looked dangerous.

With some new players in some of these divisions, players changing teams or being catapulted up two grades, coaches need a little time to ensure that what looks right on paper works as well on the field.

This is the third year of grading the competitive ages and is proving immensely popular.

No longer does one team dominate an age group.

Last year most premierships winners were unknown till all games were played in their division.

Non-competitive grades have gone straight into normal play.

One of this year's new features for this group has been the provision of referees.

The larger games have always had first priority for referees leaving this group to fend for themselves with coaches, managers or parents fulfilling the task.

The Association is requesting its representative players to assist by refereeing no more than one game a week.

At present there isn't sufficient games for those players willing to referee.

Parents and coaches are learning the role also and, if properly treated, there will be a ready pool of referees available.

The SNQ Under-14 and Under-15 teams continue their final preparations for the forthcoming Easter State Championships.

Both teams concluded weekend training with games against the Mackay Youth Squad and put in creditable performances.

## COACHING CLINICS

The Pre-season coaching clinics conducted by the Brisbane Junior Associations were recently held at Annerley and Mitchelton.

Both mornings were a tremendous success with over 450 juniors attending.

Stewart Holmes, Brisbane Regional Director of Coaching, said the clinics could not have been conducted without the help of a number of people.

# Round in Review

The 1991 XXXX Soccer League kicked-off last weekend with results indicating supporters and spectators are in for a very interesting season.

A double header at Perry Park celebrated the opening of the season on Saturday night.

In the first match Eastern Suburbs continued their good pre-season form to down Nerang 1-0.

Easts last Wednesday night won their inaugural XXXX Pre-season grand final defeating Brisbane Lions 1-0.

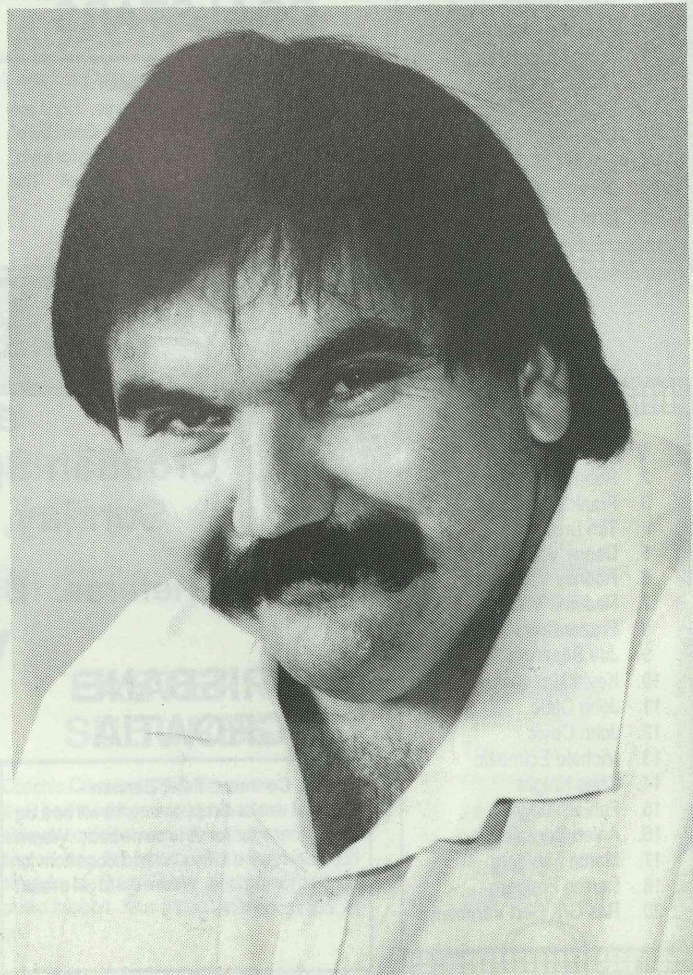

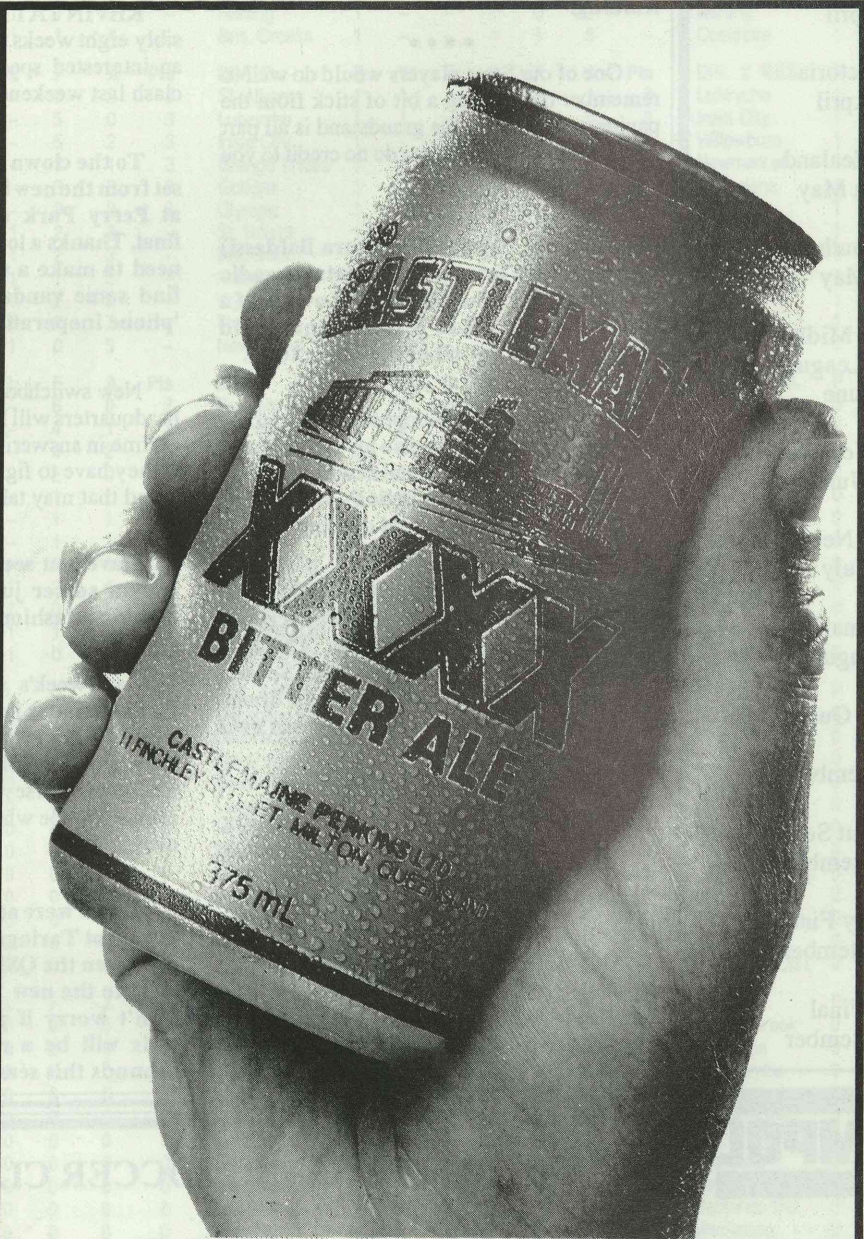
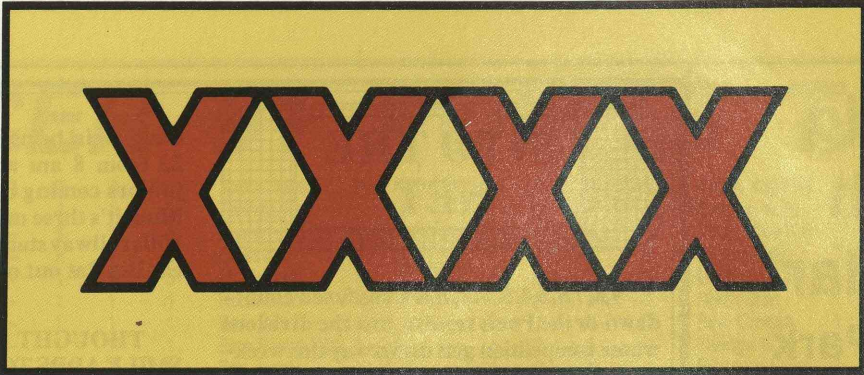
