Queensland soccer experienced a changing of the guard last week with the appointment a new State coach.

It was the end of an era as Juan Cutillas was handed the reins of the Queensland team for its 1991 representative campaign following the shock resignation of long serving coach Bruce Stowell

Stowell, who remains the State Director of Coaching, has been at the helm of the Maroons for the past eight years.

His record speaks for itself – seven wins, six loses and eight draws in 21 matches against interstate and international teams.

Stowell's loss cannot be measured, but Juan Cutillas is more than a worthy replacement.

Cutillas will also have at his disposal the experience of Joe Gilroy and Gordon Arrowsmith, two coaches appointed as assistants by the QSF Management Committee.

Together the trio have the job of preparing the Maroons for their six representative games this season.

They will be expected to maintain the excellent record of previous Queensland teams.

The 1991 season has certainly got away to a very competitive start.

This augurs well for remainder of the

season as the results of all games will not be cut and dried.

The two teams promoted to the XXXX League, Nerang and Brisbane Croatia, have both experienced challenging starts to the season.

Nerang, although they are yet to win a game, will not be league easybeats and any team travelling to the coast will have a hard match ahead of them.

Brisbane Croatia have already shown they are not be taken lightly this year with victory over the big spending Rochedale Rovers last Sunday.


No team is guaranteed of a top five finish, and all will have to work very hard if they expect there come September.

SOCCER SAFETY

Most on-field soccer injuries can be prevented off-field, according to a medical expert.

Australian Sports Medicine Association (ASMF) Queensland branch Executive Director Mike Knowles said proper pre-match preparation and exercises as well as trained medical back-up on the sidelines could help prevent most soccer injuries.

"Soccer rates as one of the State's safest team sports," Knowles said.

"Yet soccer still allows the untrained trainer to treat injured players.

"Rugby League regulations now require a Level 1 Sports Trainer Course to be completed by all trainers.

"Without an expert medical eye, injured players who would normally be taken off the field, are allowed to stay on and risk further damage."

Knowles, a former Grange Thistle player, said players themselves could minimise the risk of injury by using the prevention is the best cure theory.

"A few minutes spent warming up before the game instead of during the game is the first preventive step," he said.

"Spend 15 minutes before the game warming up all the muscles in your body from neck to toe, with an emphasis on the thigh, groin, quadriceps and calves muscles.

"Due to the multi-directional facet of the game which requires players to turn quickly in opposing directions, pressure is placed on the body's most vulnerable joints – the knee and ankle. "Injuries to both the ankle and knee rate as soccer's most common sporting injury."

ANKLE INJURIES

In addition to the prescribed warm-ups, ankle injuries can be reduced through proper taping.

But Mike warms "don't tape the ankle yourself, someone else, preferably a qualified trainer should tape your ankle for you." "If you tape your ankle yourself, you might as well not bother". Use the ICE technique for the treatment of soft-tissue injuries (muscles, tendons and ligaments).

KNEE INJURIES

"The Knee is the worst designed joint in the body. It is also the most difficult to protect and therefore the most susceptible to injury," Knowles said.

"Protecting the knee from injury involves a combination of warm-ups before the game and also weight training between games to build up the thigh muscle and other surrounding protective muscles.

"The traditional measures of taping and bandaging are not effective."

If a knee injury does occur use the ICE technique.

CORKED THIGHS AND PULLED MUSCLES

"Players must also aim to prevent corked thighs and pulled muscles, as a knee-cap strike or accidental kick will always occur during play," Knowles said.

"Do not attempt to massage the injury, do not play on or attempt to apply heat afterwards.

"Stop play and use the ICE technique."

Knowles said continuing to play can cause the bone itself to bruise which will lead to internal bleeding and calcification.

HEAD INJURIES

"Head injuries caused by clash of heads, is a rare but dangerous occurrence," Knowles

Identifiable signs of a serious head injury requiring immediate attention include: a loss of consciousness, loss of coordination, uneven dilation of pupils, headache and memory loss.

Do not continue to play, drink or drive home.

Effects of head clashes can lead to internal bleeding and pressure on the brain to areas that control body temperature, breathing and blood pressure.

In extreme cases, head-injured players can fall asleep before lapsing into a coma.

Accreditation of coaches and the provision for qualified trainers is essential to the future of soccer and more importantly to its players.





And they hope to continue that success by adding a premiership flag come September.


To celebrate the club's 10th anniversary, Easts recently held a special presentation evening at their Heath Park den.


