

Editorial

Brisbane United's much talked about application to join the National Soccer League in 1991 has been duly submitted to the ASF commissioners.

We should all know the outcome by the end of the current NSL season when the ASF announces the teams that will make up the revamped competition.

The QSF has beat the recession by offering soccer supporters a great ticket package for Queensland's representative season matches.

For the bargain basement price of \$60 two adults and two children will be able to see ALL SIX of the Maroons representative games against interstate and international teams.

This is a massive saving of \$91, however, the offer will only be available for a short time.

Ticket packages are available from your clubs or the QSF's offices at Perry Park.

Let's get behind the Maroons by supporting them as they take on allcomers in a bumper representative season.

The kick-off of the big representative season is now only two weeks away with the first fixture between Queensland and New Zealand provincial side Canterbury.

The match will be played under lights at Perry Park on Friday April 19.

It will give the Queensland soccer team the opportunity to square the sporting ledger after the State's all-powerful "Reds" rugby union side was defeated by Canterbury last weekend in Christchurch.

Canterbury, who won the coveted New Zealand provincial soccer title last season, has named a well-credentialed team for the outing against the Maroons.

As part of the QSFs campaign to take representative football to the country areas, Canterbury will also play a match against a Toowoomba team.

This will be a prelude to the Queensland game and will be played at Athletic Oval, Toowoomba Rugby League headquarters, on April 17.

It will be the biggest representative fixture the Toowoomba Soccer Federation has hosted.

Other Queensland centres will also host representative matches this season.

In June New Zealand side Otaga will play the Gold Coast Gamblers while Townsville and Cairns have been included on Scottish team Hearts of Midlothians' Queensland tour.

These matches will certainly give country players a chance to display their talent.

The third round of fixtures was highlighted by the return to form of Rochedale Rovers

Rovers supporters will be breathing a little easier this week after their side's 5-1 demolition job of Taringa Rovers.

As most would know Rochedale spent big in the off-season acquiring some big name players, who up until now have not performed.

That all changed in two hours on a sunny afternoon last Sunday at Jack Speare Park.

Kieran Cooper silenced his critics the only way he knows how - by scoring goals. The lanky striker landed a hat trick while his partner Paddy Dillon netted twice.

Rochedale paid pricely sums for both Cooper and Dillon, formerly of Brisbane City, but it seems money well spent.

Taringa were never in the game, but did manage to score through Colin Gywnne.

A late Mt Gravatt goal prevented Nerang from notching their first win of the season at Dittmer Park on Saturday night.

Nerang were leading 2-1 when Mt Gravatt replacement Andrew Armitage slammed a free kick which took a deflection off defender Fred Stone before going into the net.

The goal came late in the game and ensured the two teams shared the points.

Nerang started the same in a flourish with in a goal to Vinnie Defazio after a searching cross from Paul Cockbain found him wide open at the far post.

Mt Gravatt's reply was almost immediate with Phillip Makridakis scoring in a goal mouth scramble when Nerang's 'keeper failed to take a ball clearly.

Nerang's second goal came via a Fred Stone through ball which found Cockbain in space for a nice first time left foot shot.

The second half was largely unimpressive,

the only highlight being Armitage's goal to square the scores.

The start of the North Star/Acacia Ridge game was delayed almost 30 minutes while lines were re-marked (or should we say painted) on the field.

When referee John Contoudios did eventually blow his whistle to start the game it was greeted by cheers from the crowd.

If North Star were worried about the late start they didn't show it, scoring in second minute through new signing Mark Gilroy.

This however, only stung the Ridge into action and they equalised five minutes later through the individual efforts of Adrian Thompson who rounded two defenders before unleashing a 20m right foot drive.

The game settled down after that with both teams playing attacking and open football.

North Star's second goal came just before half time when an unmarked Geoff Maltby was able to sneak one past Ridge 'keeper Adrian Hill.

The turning point of the game came in the 62nd minute when a bad defensive mistake allowed North Star's Ken Swan the easiest of

Ironically Ridge scored soon afterwards from a corner which found Andrew Butchard open at the far post for a low header.

North Star wrapped up the match in the 85th minute when Lee Scriggins blasted home a ball from well outside the penalty box following a free kick.

Coalstars ventured to Wendy Allison Park on Saturday night to play Pine Rivers and came away with a deserved 1-0 win.

In a scrappy game Coalstars were a bit more committed than Pine Rivers, who seem to have lacked spark in the early rounds of the season.

THROUGHOUT THE STATE

SOUTH BURNETT

1990 First Division league champions Wests, will meet 1990 premiers Easts in the final of the South Burnett Knock-Out Cup this Saturday.

While both teams have had to overcome determined opposition to make the final, Easts showed teamwork, skill, commitment and early season fitness, to beat Wondai and Nanango, with Wests struggling to roll Murgon 1–0. As a result Easts must be favoured.

In the second division final Easts seconds will give a good account of themselves, despite a lack of match practice.

The final is a repeat of last year's inaugural second division final, won 2-0 by Wests.

Although Wests seconds made the final with a narrow 3-1 win over Murgon on penalties after extra time, they cannot be too confident of holding their cup on that showing.

The women's final will see Wondai, the most successful team in all South Burnett Soccer, trying to defend their cup.

This year they meet a strong Murgon 11 who will field a settled and experienced combination which coach Alan Eagleson has kept together for two seasons.

Murgon have their best opportunity ever to upset the league champs who will still be smarting from their shock 1990 grand final loss to Nanango.

With the change to a four reserves interchange format as well as playing the competition before the premiership rounds, the opportunities to assess team performances have been limited.

Easts seconds for example have not had a run this season due to the inability of Nanango to enter a team, while Wests firsts made the final from one narrow win and the luck of the draw.

In these cup finals players have an opportunity to impress selectors for inclusion in South Burnett "Boars" squads for the revamped Ampol Cup competition.

The women will also be watched for selection at the State Championships.




