

Round in Review

Rochedale Rovers' 4-0 demolition job of Brisbane Lions in the XXXX League last weekend has everybody talking.

What was supposed to be the match of the fourth round sadly turned out to be a very one-sided affair.

The loss has also brought out the knockers who are beginning to ask questions about Lions, last season's premiers, and their ability to remain a force in the league this year.

On paper Lions have one of the strongest teams in the competition, however looking at their results to date you wouldn't know it.

Apart from their first up victory over Brisbane City, the boys from Richlands have struggled.

They have been plagued by an inability to score goals and have found the net only three times in four games.

Coach John Sime must be scratching his head trying to find the answers to his team's problems following Saturday night's game.

Lions were totally outplayed in every facet of the game in front of a large crowd at Underwood Park.

It was an impressive display by Rochedale who ran in four goals with Kieran Cooper netting twice and Paddy Dillon and Lee Howells snaring one each.

Ironically Rochedale acquired all three of those players from Brisbane City during a big-spending off-season.

The win puts Rochedale into the top three just behind North Star, who enjoyed a 3-1 victory over Mt Gravatt at O'Callaghan Park.

Early results indicate both these teams

will be extremely hard to beat on their respective home grounds this season.

North Star never really gave Mt Gravatt a chance with Lee Scriggins, Mark Gilroy and Jim McDonagh getting amongst the goals. Gilroy, who transferred from Taringa Rovers a fortnight ago, has now scored in both matches he has played.

Mt Gravatt's goal came late in the match from replacement player Mark Hairsine.

The other major upset of the round was Brisbane Croatia's 3-0 drubbing of Pine Rivers in the first match of a double header at Perry Park last Sunday.

Croatia, newcomers to the XXXX league, have shown they will not be easybeats this

They played without striker Kevin Meacock who arrived late, but still had too much firepower for Rivers.

Not even the return of National League player Clayton Koch to River's line-up could prevent the loss.

Joe Stipancic revelled in the freedom up front to score twice with backman Tim Brown also getting his name on the scorer's sheet.

In the second match at soccer headquarters
Coalstars and Eastern Suburbs played a dour

1-1 draw.

The match was highlighted by a last minute goal by Colin Phelan to ensure Easts shared the points.

According to most reports the match deserved a draw, however Coalstars have a right to feel robbed with the equaliser coming well into extra time.

Brisbane City must be starting to feel the pressure after losing their fourth straight game last Sunday at Spencer Park.

City, boosted by the return of National League player Ibro Cahut, lost 1–0 to Acacia Ridge who now move into the top five.

Ridge, who are playing confidently under coach Eric Thompson, scored through Darren Spence.

They are now seven points clear of City, who are yet to register a point on the premier—ship table.

Nerang also made sure they kept above City with a 2-1 victory over Taringa Rovers.

The win proves the Eagles will be hard to beat on their home ground, Glennon Park, on the Gold Coast.

Nerang's goals came from Paul Cockbain and Peter Curtis while Colin Gwynne replied for Taringa.

Spanish soccer maestro to make Maroon magic

No-one can doubt the qualifications of Queensland's new soccer coach Juan Cutillas.

Born in Barcelona in 1952, Cutillas was National coach of the Phillipine soccer team, a former first division player and was once on the short list for the Socceroo coaching position.

Off the field, Cutillas is a qualified doctor and a former professor of physical education.

He gained his golden coaching reputation by leading the Phillipines out the soccer wilderness.

During his debut as a football coach in 1968, he sent the Phillipine youth team to the Asian Football Championship in South Korea – for the first and only time in history.

Long considered the "doormat of Asian football", Cutillas masterminded the Filipino's recovery into international football with wins or draws against Asian heavyweights China, Thailand, Singapore, Indonesia and Sri-Lanka.

The highlight of Cutillas' coaching career was when he "guested" for Real Madrid under Yugoslavian guru Miljac Miljanic.

He is also credited for setting up a soccer school for children aged 4 to 14 in the Phillipines, the only one of its kind in the country.

However it was his love for the game which eventually forced him to leave the Phillipines.

He became impatient with the lack of progress for soccer in comparison to other sports, especially the game's lack of facilities and sponsorship support.

Since arriving in Australia, Cutillas has been busy as head coach of Brisbane Lions in the National Soccer League, and coaching first division sides Brisbane City and Olympic United.

Hopefully Cutillas can weave the same magic on Queensland as they face their most demanding representative season ever.

The Maroons are due to play matches against Scottish champions Heart of Midlothian, New Zealand sides Canterbury, Otago, Auckland and interstate rivals New South

Wales and Victoria.

The first test will come next Friday, April 19, under lights at Perry Park when Queensland plays Canterbury, the New Zealand provincial champions.

Queensland fans will be treated to entertaining soccer as Cutillas places a strong emphasis on scientific training techniques, tight defensive plays and hustling and exciting attack.

Good luck Juan and go for it Queensland.
