The Queensland Soccer Federation (QSF) extends a warm welcome to the visiting Canterbury team from New Zealand.

It also signals the first time Canterbury, the current New Zealand provincial champions, have played outside the Shaky Isles.

Visits such as this can only help foster and develop soccer, and for that reason should be fully supported.

It features the Queensland team members, juniors and game footage and is set to the "Soccer It's Hot" theme song.

The ad, however, is only one part of the overall campaign to lift soccer's image.

The new theme song "Soccer it's Hot" has been extremely well accepted since being released.

The cassette is currently on sale at your local club for the price of \$3.

Also beginning to circulate are the "Big Match" calendars with some important dates to remember.

And they will be followed shortly by new colourful bumper stickers. Also keep watching your Sunday Sun, Courier Mail and Sunday Mail for more colour posters.

It's an absolute disgrace that some Brisbane junior and senior clubs have snubbed the QSF's proposed under-16 talent identification program.

Only seven clubs have chosen to nominate players for the program.

Country centres, meanwhile, have jumped at the opportunity to feature their young talent.

The talent identification program was launched by State Director of Coaching Bruce Stowell this year.

It aims to identify promising juniors and provide specialised training and coaching for them.

The program will culminate with an Under-16 Talent Identification Series to be held in Bundaberg from June 23 to 29.

A Queensland squad will then be selected to compete in the National Under-16 Talent Identification Series later in the year.

Round in Review

Brisbane Croatia continue to be the giant-killers of the XXXX League following their away win over Eastern Suburbs at Heath Park last Sunday.

The victory moves Croatia into the top three on the premiership ladder, one point behind outright leaders North Star.

Croatia, promoted to the XXXX League this season, have enjoyed wins over Rochedale, Pine Rivers and Easts and also a draw against Brisbane Lions.

Once again it was their potent attack which paved the way for their win against Easts.

After a scoreless first half Croatia ran in three goals in the second half with Rado Vidotic, Frazier Cuba and Kevin Meacock each netting.

Round five, which also counted as the first round of the re-vamped Ampol Cup, also saw Pine Rivers and Taringa Rovers bounce back to form.

Pine Rivers shared the points with the in-form Rochedale Rovers at Wendy Allison Park with a 3-3 draw.

Rivers, on the end of a 3-0 hammering by Croatia the week before, made changes to their line-up for the match.

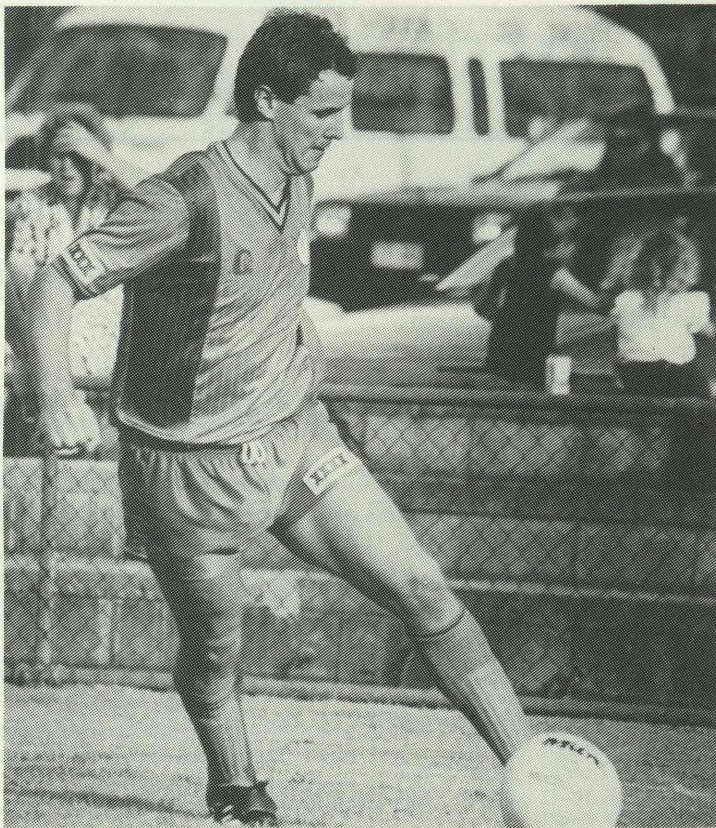
The move paid dividends with Clayton Koch scoring twice and John Preston chipping in as well.

For Rochedale, Paddy Dillon added two more to his season tally while Arthur McHugh scored a rare goal.

It was the second loss in succession for last season's premiers, who are slowly slipping down the ladder.

In an interesting move Lions coach John Sime used Meredith up front with Justin Playle and revitalised striker John Lowey.

It was then left to midfielder Demetri Theochari to stamp his class on the match with a late goal to secure a win for his team.

Nerang, playing at home on the Gold Coast, almost toppled North Star after leading 2-1 at half time thanks to two fine goals from Michael Leake.

North Star, however, came back to equalise in the second half with their goals surprisingly coming via two backmen Nick Seeley and captain/coach Billy Williamson.

Brisbane City's terrible start to the season continued in their bottom-of-the-table clash

with Mt Gravatt at Dittmer Park.

City, who are yet to win a premiership game, went down to the Hawks 2-1 in a dour encounter.

Mt Gravatt led 2-0 at the break thanks to early goals from Paul Worroll and Martin Kirsopp in the first 20 minutes.

City gave themselves a chance when they scored soon after the break through Mark Battistin, but could not find the net a second time. Coalstars also sneaked into outright fourth place in the league when they defeated Acacia Ridge 2-1 at Proud Oval.

After a slow start to the season, the coal miners are slowly starting to hit their straps.

Harry Makridakis and Kevin Caldwell got their name on the score sheet for Coalstars while Marc Flemmington answered for Acacia Ridge.

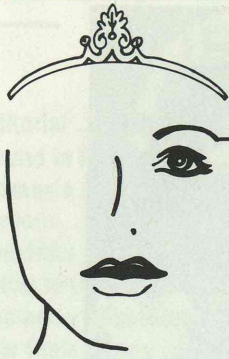

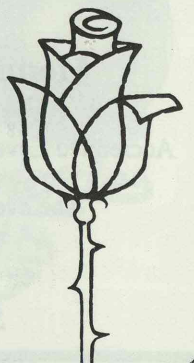

RDOC Critizes Brisbane Clubs

Pitiful is how Stewart Holmes described the response of Brisbane clubs to the QSF's proposed Under-16 talent identification program.

Holmes, Brisbane Regional Director of Coaching, said he was bitterly disappointed that most clubs had disregarded requests for nominations.

"A letter was sent out to all clubs, senior and junior, about nominations for the under-16 talent identification program," Holmes said.

"Only seven clubs bothered to reply and from them we have received 35 nominations."

Holmes said Brisbane North and Brisbane South talent identification squads would have to be chosen from the nominations.

"There are players out there within the Brisbane area who were simply not aware that they could have been eligible to make Brisbane North and Brisbane South squads," he said.

Holmes said State Director of Coaching Bruce Stowell has designed the program.

He said country areas were behind the plan to identify and foster young talent.

He said the program would also incorporate the Under-16 Talent Identification Series in Bundaberg in June.

Canterbury's Queensland visit an historic first

Canterbury Football Association was formed 85 years ago and has been one of the stronger Provinces in New Zealand throughout the years.

The Provincial team has an excellent record against visiting touring teams, especially in the '70s when matches were played against British Professional sides such as Middlesbrough, Glasgow Rangers, Bristol Rovers, Blackburn Rovers and the National team of Iran.

Currently the Canterbury Provincial team holds the National Championship title after beating Auckland last November in the Winfield Cup final.

Canterbury's team management comprises of two coaches of national acclaim.

Ian Marshall, who also coaches the "All Whites", and Terry Conley who until recently was the NZFA Technical Director.

The team has a reputation of playing attacking style football and clearly enjoys its matches.

They are never afraid to go forward and have proven to possess considerable "character".

The team mainly consists of players from Christchurch United AFC who have performed consistently well in the New Zealand National

League having won that competition five times in its 18-year history.

A number of players have also played for or are knocking on the door of the "All Whites" National team.

However, the only player currently in the team is red headed midfielder Danny Halligan.

Canterbury also has a policy of bringing talented young players through the grades by way of "schools of excellence".

This policy has paid dividends and a number of very talented young players are now starting to make their mark.

A young team, Canterbury has some older players in Keith Braithwaite (captain) and Johan Verweij, the centre back.

Canterbury FA boasts about 1,000 senior players in its regular Saturday competitions with a further 500 women, 500 Sunday League players (men) and approx 5,000 junior players.

The visit to Queensland is an historic first for the Canterbury FA. Never before has the team travelled overseas and the players and management are keenly looking forward to their two matches in the Sunshine State.

The Association is administered by a Management Committee of 15 people who are

elected at the AGM.

Its administration is mainly computerized and extremely efficient.

Canterbury's traditional home ground is English Park in Christchurch which holds approx 8,000 spectators.

During the past 18 months the ground has been totally resurfaced complete with inground sprinklers and it should be in use again before the end of this season.

Ambitious plans have been drawn up to make this venue the best soccer ground in New Zealand and it is already the only floodlit ground in the South Island.



Cutillas unveils new State squad

New Queensland soccer coach Juan Cutillas unveiled his State squad last week.

The squad includes four new Queensland caps in Dave Mewburn, Mark Geritz (Eastern Suburbs), Kevin Meacock (Brisbane Croatia) and Lee Howells (Rosedale Rovers).

With the big representative season ahead Cutillas said players' performances on the field would be the criteria for remaining in the Queensland side.

Cutillas has urged players who missed selection in the squad not to give up hope.

The Queensland team will play their first representative match this Friday, April 19 against New Zealand Provincial champions Canterbury.

This is the first time a representative fixture has been played at Perry Park on a Friday evening.

The Queensland team will also play another five representative matches against New Zealand, Scottish and interstate teams.

Their next match will be against Victoria on Sunday, April 28, followed by the State of Origin clash with New South Wales on May 19.

The highlight of the season, however, will be on Sunday, June 2 when the Maroons take on Scottish team Heart of Midlothian.

To round off the representative season Queensland plays Otago and Auckland on June 29th and July 28th respectively.

1. STUART WOODRUFFE

27-years-old goalkeeper - Mt Gravatt
Has only had two clubs in his senior playing career in Brisbane. Is consistent between the sticks, but is yet to be selected as the State's number one 'keeper.

3. FRANK PIMBLETT

34-years-old midfielder - Eastern Suburbs
Represented England at schoolboy level and played in the National League with Brisbane City. Captained the Maroons last year for the first time and also won the league's best and fairest award, the QFM Gold Medal.

2. MARK GERITZ

21-years-old defender - Eastern Suburbs
Queensland product from Maryborough who has previously represented the State at under-16, 18 and 19 levels and now gets his chance in the open side. A solid defender with a good turn of pace.

16. FRANK MENGOTTI

28-years-old defender - Brisbane Lions
One of the few players still playing in the XXXX League who has had stints with Brisbane Lions and Brisbane City in the NSL. A versatile player equally at home in the midfield or in defence. Comes from a very famous footballing family and continues in their fine tradition.

7. STEIN GRODUM

26-years-old defender - Eastern Suburbs
Has played all his senior football with Eastern Suburbs, but really only came to the fore in the 1988 season. He made his first appearance for Queensland in that year and has never been far from the side since.

8. KEN SWAN

30-years-old midfielder - North Star
Veteran midfielder who won back-to-back Rothmans' "best and fairest" gold medals in 1982/83. Has been out of the Maroons team since their Sunshine Shooters tour of America in 1989.

9. JIM McDONAGH

33-years-old striker - North Star
A Scottish-born player who played with two first division clubs before migrating to Australia. Played with Brisbane Lions in the NSL before switching to North Star. A prolific scorer of goals who is lethal once inside the opponent's penalty area.

10. KEVIN MEACOCK

27-years-old Striker - Brisbane Croatia
A cunning striker who transferred from New Zealand national league team Mount Man-guanui to Brisbane Croatia this season. Has plenty of speed and likes to run with the ball.

12. KIERAN COOPER

28-years-old striker - Rochedale Rovers
Stylish right-foot striker who last represented Queensland in 1989 and will relish his call-up this time. Leading goal scorer in Brisbane during 1988 and 89 who has been in devastating form this season.

13. CHRIS SLATER

21-years-old midfielder - Brisbane Lions
Hopes to celebrate his 21st birthday this week with a win against Canterbury. An exciting and skilful midfield player who loves to take on the defence. Always gives 120 per cent effort on the field.

14. NICK MEREDITH

23-years-old midfielder - Brisbane Lions
Aggressive player who can score goals from any position, but whose strongest attribute is attacking down the left flank. Has represented Queensland at all junior and youth levels and is a player that keeps all opposition on their toes.

15. LEE HOWELLS

22-years-old midfielder - Rochedale Rovers
Elegant midfielder and one of four new caps in the State side. Australian-born but played most of his junior football in England. Is enjoying a good season with new club Rochedale Rovers in 1991.

6. ANDREW STOWELL

27-years-old defender - Brisbane Lions
A Brisbane Lions player for the past five seasons who made his representative debut for Queensland last year. A good team player who is deceptively strong in defence or attack.

20. DAVE MEWBURN

30-years-old goalkeeper - Eastern Suburbs
Giant goalkeeper, nicknamed "Frank" by team mates. Came through Brisbane's local junior system and making his Queensland debut after showing solid form during the pre-season and early rounds of the competition.

17. ALAN HUNTER

Defender. Parramatta Melita Eagles
Former Socceroo now playing in the National Soccer League. Rugged central defender whose speciality is set pieces and penalties. Is looking forward to playing in front of home crowd.

1. Alan Stroud (28) Height 183cm. School teacher. Top rated goalkeeper who previously played with Dunedin City. Played in Christchurch since 1985. Otago and Canterbury senior rep. NZ Universities and NZ representative CFA Goalkeeper of the year 1987, 1988 and 1990.

2. Johan Verweij (34) Height 190 cm. Central Defender. Squad veteran with vast experience in National League. Previous clubs include New Brighton, and Dutch Clubs Sparta and Feyenoord. Had a spell in Australia before joining Christchurch United in 1982. Canty Junior, Youth and Senior and New Zealand Senior Representative.

3. Kevin Calder (25) Height 177 cm. Fullback. Bank Officer. One club player through junior and early senior career with Shamrock, stepped up to National League when moving to Christchurch United in 1985. Canty Junior, youth and senior representative.

4. Michael Boomer (21) Height 177 cm. Midfield. Estates officer. Junior playing days with Dunedin Technical before moving to Christchurch and joining Burndale United. Transferred to Christchurch United in 1988. Junior Youth and Senior Representative.

5. Ian Chamberlain (22) Height 177 cm. Brought into the side at the last moment because of injured Andrew McDermott. Ian has played for Canterbury Rep. teams since he

began playing soccer and is currently a regular squad member of the National League team, Christchurch United.

6. Alun Evans (20) Height 178 cm. Midfielder. Apprentice Carpenter. Represented Canterbury throughout the grades before making his National League debut for Christchurch United this year. Very promising young player with devastating 'left peg'.

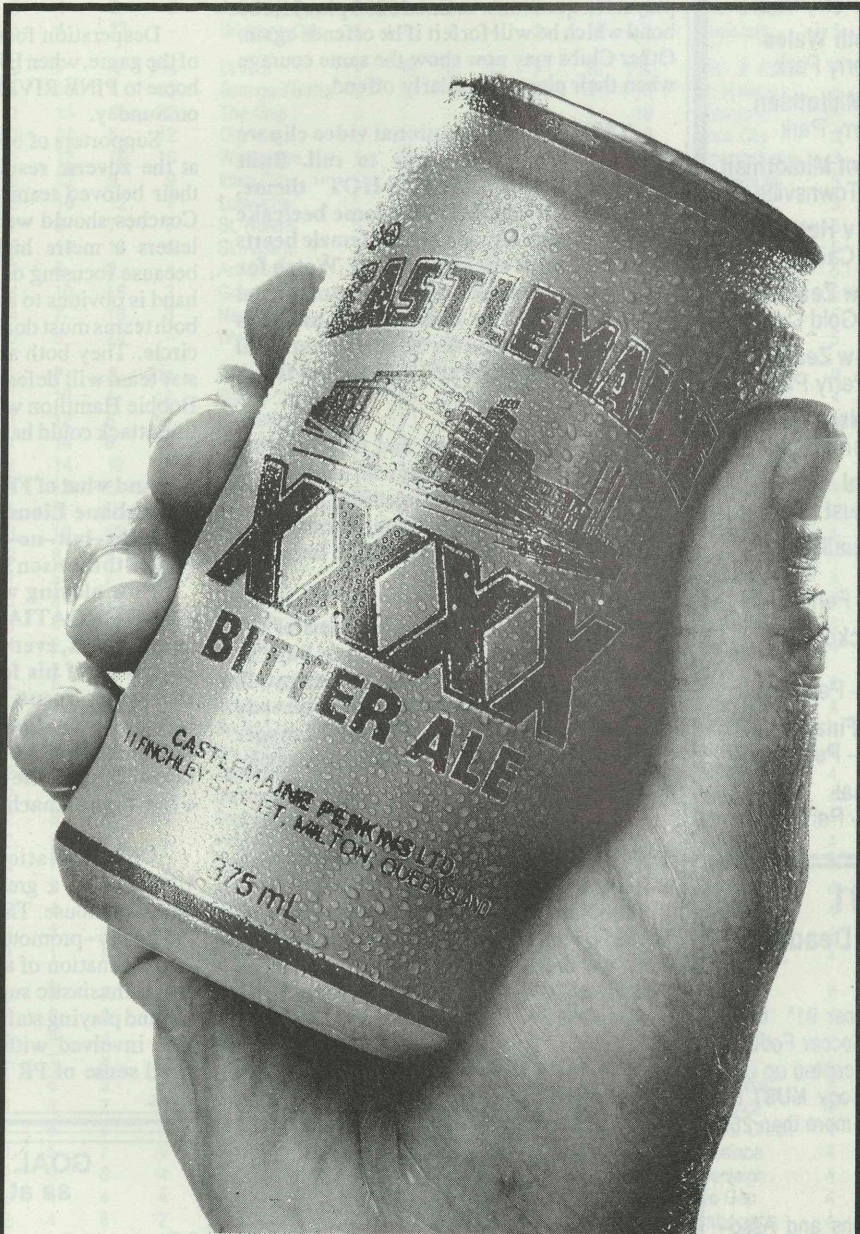
