Croatia posted their third consecutive victory with a 5-0 whitewash over Acacia Ridge at the Croatian Sports Centre.


The win has stamped Croatia, promoted from second division this season, as one of the teams to beat in the XXXX League this year.



Last Sunday saw the completion of the Atlanta Cup Competition at Atlanta Field, Geebung.

A total of nine games, including six semifinals and three finals were played.

Maroons salvage 2-2 draw with late goal

Queensland began their representative season with a 2-2 draw against New Zealand provincial champions Canterbury at Perry Park last Friday night.

The Maroons equalized late in injury time after a freakish goal put Canterbury ahead in

the 80th minute of the match.

The game was an open affair with both teams endeavouring to play an attacking style of football.

Queensland had plenty of scoring chances, but bad finishing prevented them from winning the game.

Canterbury, however, showed they were worthy opposition by almost stealing the match.

The 1000 strong crowd had to wait until the 40th minute before the first goal was scored.

Lead-up

It came when Queensland midfielder Nick Meredith made one of his characteristic aggressive runs before turning the ball back for Frank Mengotti to calmly slot past the 'keeper.

Canterbury answered soon after the restart following some good lead-up work by Kevin Calder.

Calder sped down the left flank before delivering a pin-point cross to Paul Nichols to volley home inside the box.

Canterbury then silenced the crowd with their second goal which followed a Queensland defensive error.

A bad goal kick by Stu Woodruffe saw Canterbury catch the Queensland defense napping.

Canterbury's Alan Carville raced through a gaping hole and his contest with Woodruffe, who came off his line, saw the ball deflect into the net. Queensland then threw everything at Canterbury resulting in a superb goal from Nick Meredith.

The move began with Mark Geritz, who crossed the ball to Chris Slater. Slater headed on to Jim McDonagh, who chested the ball down for a stinging left foot shot from Meredith.

Canterbury coach Terry Conley said a draw was probably a fair result for the match.

Queensland coach Juan Cutillas was happy with his team's performance, but said they should have won the game.

"It was good to see the boys did not give up once Canterbury scored their second goal," Cutillas said.

"But we were unlucky not to have scored another two or three goals in the match."

Cutillas had added five players to his squad for this week's representative game against Victoria.

Taringa's Glenn Gwynne, Sean Cranney and Steve Glockner, North Star's Lee Scriggins and Brisbane City's Ibro Cahut have received State call-ups.
