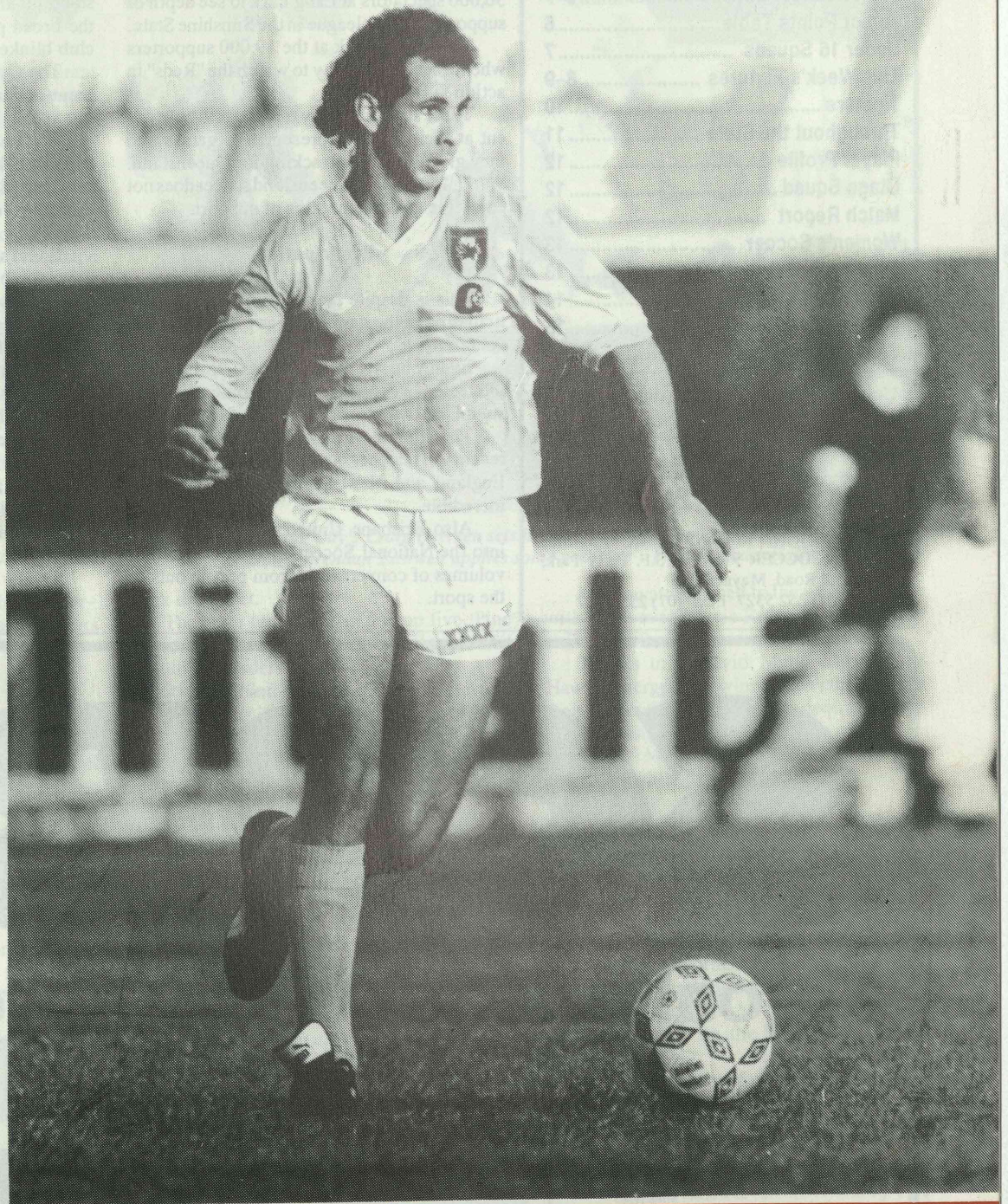

Participation

This is despite having more people participating in the game than any other football code.

Even non soccer fans seem to be more interested in our game's development than the so-called dedicated followers of the sport.

The amount of public comment after the recent test matches between the Socceroos and England and New Zealand has been quite incredible.

Also Brisbane United's impending entry into the National Soccer League has created volumes of conversation from people outside the sport.

If the general sports followers are interested in our sport, perhaps it is time we all had a look at our own backyard and did something positive about it all.

It's time Queensland soccer supporters stood up and were counted. We must look at the broad picture of our sport, not keep our club blinkers on.

The Queensland team's profile development is paramount to the future exposure of our sport.

We have two more chances to swing our support behind the Queensland side.

The Maroons are due to play Otago on Saturday June 29 and Auckland on Sunday, July 28.

So let's get behind the Maroons and show other football codes what we are really made of.

The Otago squad, announced this week, is a combination of youth and experience, including nine players who have played in the New Zealand National League

Otago held the coveted New Zealand Provincial title in 1988 and should provide worthy opposition for the Juan Cutillas led Queensland team.

Round in Review



Brisbane Lions looms as the biggest threat to the premiership hopes of current league leaders Brisbane Croatia and Rochedale Rovers.

After a slow start to the season Lions have hit a purple patch winning six of their past seven games.

The reigning premiers, are placed third on the points table, but look to be in the best shape of any in the leading bunch.

They are within easy reach of Croatia and Rochedale, the early runaway leaders and have a mountain of depth at the club.

Their reserves team is on top of the ladder and first team spots are a week to week proposition.

Such is the case that coach John Sime can afford the luxury of using players the calibre of Russell Stewart and Scott Playle off the bench.

In contrast Croatia has been hit by a string of injuries and suspensions in recent weeks.

While they are still winning games - cracks are starting to appear in the paint work.

This was highlighted by their loss to Taringa Rovers last week at the Croatian Sports Centre.

Direction

Croatia coach Peter Bannon was forced to reshuffle his line-up to cover for a number of injuries and the suspension of key midfielder Frazier Cuba.

As a result Croatia lacked drive and direction with Taringa emerging deserved 2-0 victors.

Rochedale meanwhile have been lucky with injuries and enjoyed a 3-0 victory over the luckless Coalstars.

Kieran Cooper returned to form to score twice with Arthur McHugh also finding the

back of the net.

The other two teams in the top five, Pine Rivers and North Star, are also ready to pounce should the leaders falter.

Right behind these two sides is Eastern Suburbs, who if given the chance, will slip easily into the five.

Lions showed their class last week to score a 1-0 victory over arch rivals Brisbane City at Spencer Park.

Midfielder Chris Slater scored the only goal of the match which was played at a frantic pace throughout.

Although losing the match, City were not disgraced and if they continue to play the same standard of football can expect to win plenty of games before season's end.

Mt Gravatt returned to the winner's circle with a win over Acacia Ridge in a local derby at Dittmer Park.

Thanks to a David Munn hat-trick, the Hawks emerged 4-1 winners over the Ridge in their first outing under newly appointed coach Davy Richardson.

Phillip Makridakis bagged Mt Gravatt's other goal while Adrian Thompson scored late for the visitors.

A first half goal by busy Pine Rivers midfielder John Schiavo was enough to give his side a 1-0 victory over North Star at O'Callaghan Park.

Both teams played entertaining football for the large crowd, but Rivers was able hang on for the three points.

Nerang found themselves in front 1-0 at the half time interval of their game against Eastern Suburbs on the Gold Coast before finally losing 2-1.

Gary Stone scored for Nerang while Chris Fegan and Billy McDermott made the scoresheet for Easts.

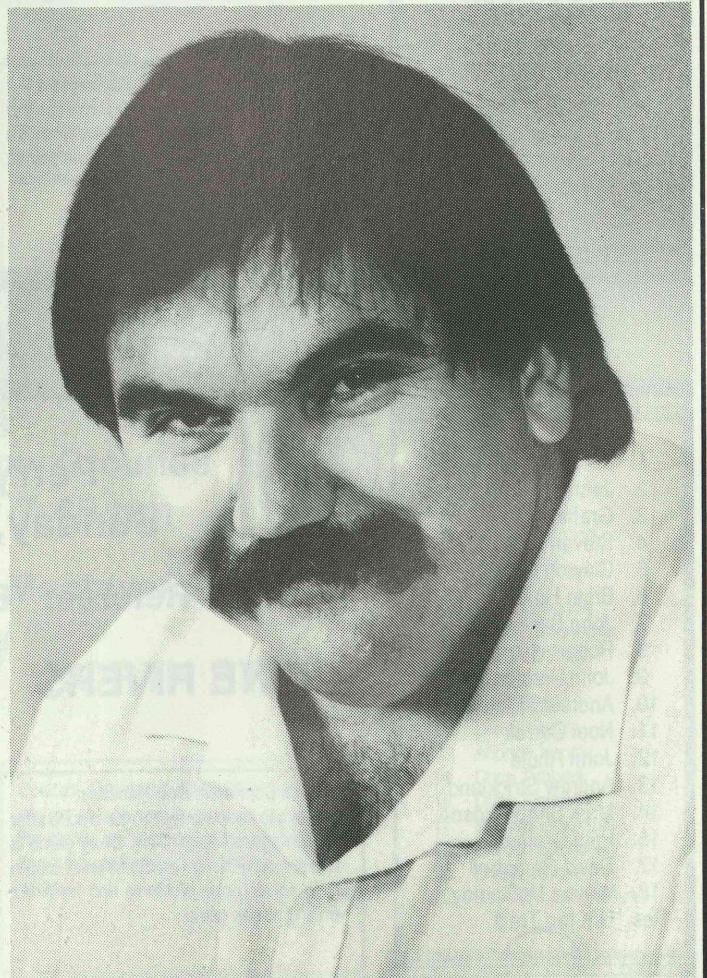

She lives in Ipswich and works for the Ipswich City Council. Her job included looking after a zoo and plant nursery.

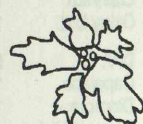

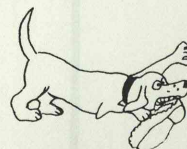

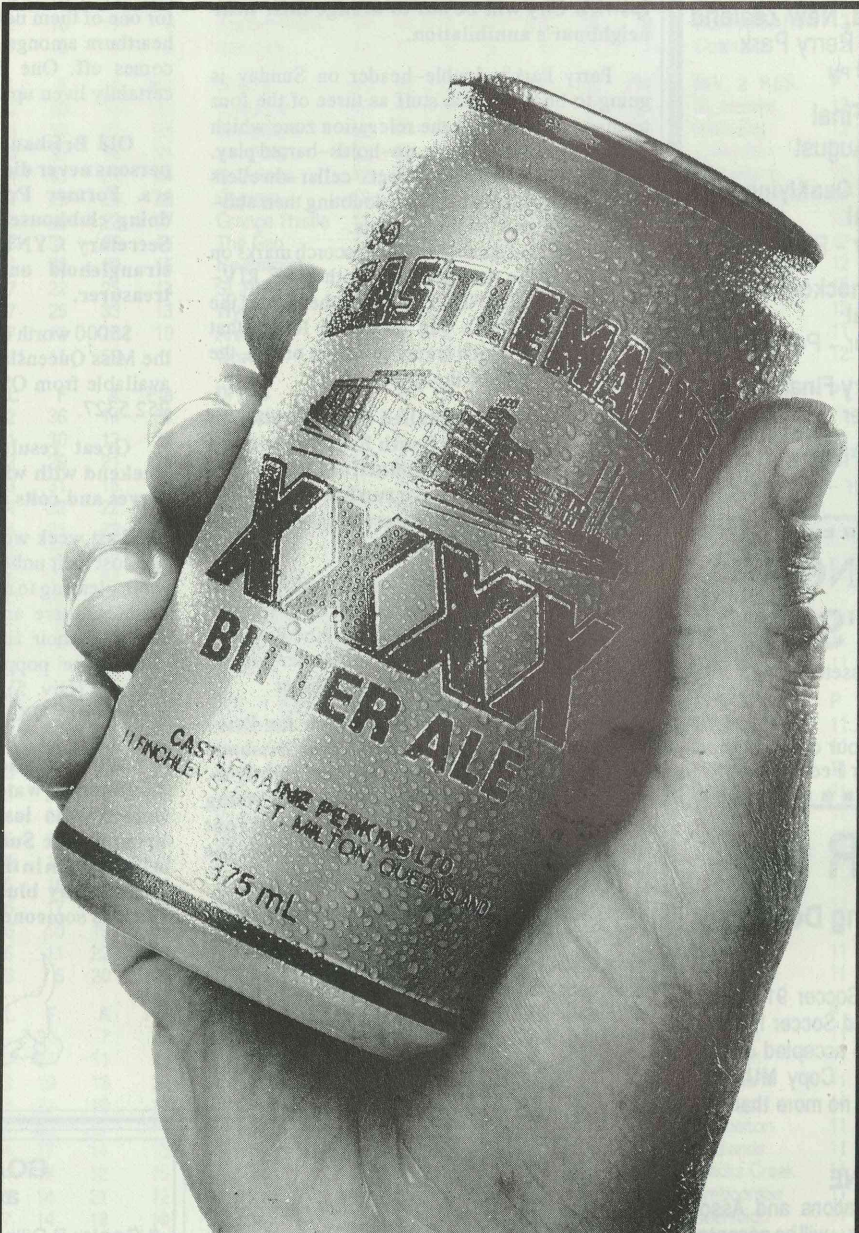
