A big welcome to the Otago representative team from New Zealand who arrived in Brisbane on Monday in preparation for their match against Queensland this Saturday night at Perry Park.

Otago will provide stiff opposition for the Maroons who have already played three representative encounters this year.

Queensland have drawn 2-2 with Canterbury, lost 3-2 to Victoria and beaten NSW 2-0.

Otago is a very proud sporting province in New Zealand and their soccer team is here to do the business.

Otago Football Association was founded in 1889, making it the second oldest soccer associations in New Zealand.

One of its affiliate clubs, Northern, is the oldest club in the southern hemisphere to have operated consistently throughout its history.

In many ways Otago is similar to Queensland when it comes to soccer's place in the sporting marketplace.

Otago is currently endeavouring to regain its position in New Zealand's new summer National Soccer League.

Queensland, through Brisbane United, has successfully gained a position in Australia's re-structured National Soccer League.

highly competitive marketplace.

Up to this point the only opposition to soccer in the Shaky Isles has been rugby union.

However, the proposed expansion of Sydney Rugby League into the New Zealand will make soccer's job harder than ever.

We in Queensland are certainly realise the difficulties involved in promoting our sport against the dominance currently enjoyed by the other professional football codes.

Its obvious the Kiwis will have a good look at how the fight for soccer exposure is fought in Queensland while on their tour.

While the young Socceroos have been strutting their stuff on the world stage, Queensland's top juniors have been competing in their own version of a World Cup.

The under-12 and under-13 zone representative teams have just completed their State carnivals while the under-16 talent identification series will wind up on Saturday.

Although these tournaments are a far cry from the World Youth Championships in Portugal, they are certainly a stepping stone towards representing your country.

There is no doubt that youth development is where the future of sport lies, thus highlighting the importance these carnivals play.

Congratulations to all those juniors who participated and may the experience gained help you achieve your sporting goals.

For Acacia Ridge Mark Flemington converted from the penalty spot and Adrian Thompson scored after a nice individual effort.

Nerang picked up premiership points for the second consecutive week when they held Mt Gravatt to a 1-1 draw on the Gold Coast.

The Nerang outfit seems to be growing in confidence after their win over Acacia Ridge a fortnight ago.

After being thrashed 6-0 last weekend Brisbane City installed some lost pride with a 1-1 draw with Eastern Suburbs at Spencer Park. A late penalty by Ibro Cahut allowed City to share the points after an own goal had put Easts ahead.

Coalstars gave themselves a sniff at the top five with a morale-boosting victory over Pine Rivers at The Eric Evans soccer Reserve.

The coal miners made some positional changes with lanky back man Mark Gilbert switching to a forward role.

The move came up trumps with Gilbert scoring the only goal of the match.

Lions were too good for Brisbane Croatia in their match at the Croatian Sports Centre.

They ran in three goals to one in a physical encounter to give them outright second place in the premiership race.

For Croatia it was their third straight loss after a brilliant start to the season.

Rochedale Rovers can take a giant step towards securing the 1991 premiership flag with a win over Brisbane Lions this Sunday.

The two teams play in a top-of-the-table clash at Richlands Stadium with the result likely to help decide this year's XXXX League champions.

If Rochedale can win they will take a handy six point lead over second placed Lions with a game still in hand.

However a victory to the reigning premiers will put them a step closer to winning back-to-back premierships.

With so much at stake, the match is expected to attract a bumper crowd.

However much of the spectacle may be lost with a number of players from both sides having to back up after the Queensland team's representative match against Otago on Saturday night.

Four Lions players and two Rochedale players are in Juan Cutillas' squad to play the New Zealand province.

Rob Farrow, Frank Mengotti, Chris Slater and Andrew Stowell will have to back up for Lions while Kieran Cooper and Lee Howells will do the same for Rochedale.

All six players are vitals cogs in their respective teams, but it may be asking too much of them to be fired up for Sunday's club game.

Rochedale continued its sterling form of late to defeat Taringa Rovers last Saturday night at Underwood Park.

In a dominant display, Rochedale ran in four goals with Cooper, Paddy Dillon, Arthur McHugh and John Stewart making the

scoresheet. Taringa's only reply came from the penalty spot through the boot of captain Steve Glockner.

North Star bounced back from a recent form slump to beat Acacia Ridge 4-2 at O'Callaghan Park.

However the victory came at a high price with young midfield/defender Nick Seeley breaking his arm after falling awkwardly in the second half.

Veteran North Star striker Jim McDonagh celebrated his 36th birthday in fine style with two goals while Mark Gilroy and Lee Scriggins each added to their team's total.

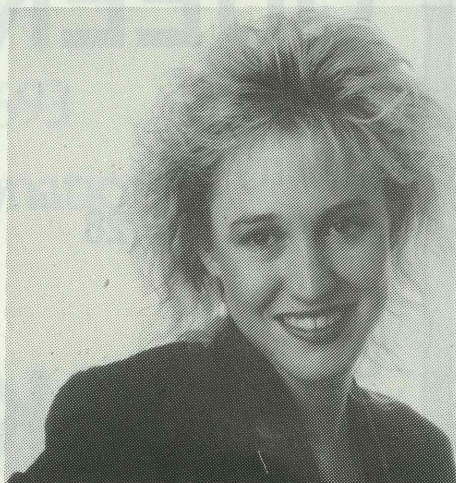

# From the Office . . .

During the past 12 months the Major Fields Sports Committee, of which the QSF is an active participant, has presented a strong case to the Brisbane City Council for a substantial reduction in water rates for outdoor sporting facilities.

Moreover, they also negotiated with the Labor Mayoral candidate prior to the council elections with a view to obtaining a reduction in water rates consumption charges.

As a result of negotiations, Jim Soorley was pleased to include a promise of reducing water rates in his policy document.

When the Lord Mayor announced his 1991/92 council budget

last week, he was able to make some concessions.

In summary they are:

The council will grant a 25 per cent (91/92 financial year) rebate on water consumption charges on the following conditions; that the ground is a Bris-

bane City Council Park and that the ground is open to the public (eg: not fenced).

The criteria for eligibility will be determined by the Brisbane City Council Recreation and Health Department.

Clubs should assess their position and feel free to discuss the concessions on offer with their local representatives.

I am confident the Major Fields Sports Committee will once again reopen discussions to have the eligibility guidelines enlarged.

At the last meeting of the Management Committee a decision was made to appoint Gold

Coast Regional Coaching Director Jim Selby as the under-17 State coach for the October National Titles.

Also, to provide selection continuity, Jim was appointed selector for the Bundaberg under-16 talent identification titles with a brief to adopt a wide consultative process with all other regional directors.

The position of State Director of Coaching will be advertised in both interstate and intrastate with an invitation extended to Queensland regional coaching directors to apply.

Judging by the initial response, it certainly appears that it will be a strongly contested position.

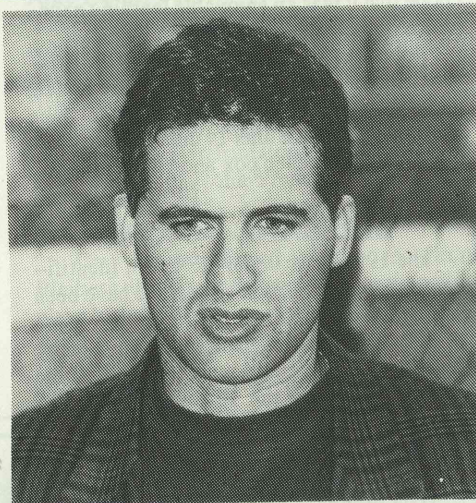

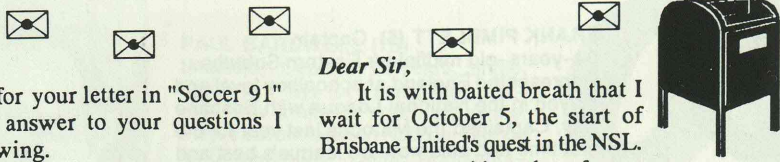

Thank you for your letter in "Soccer 91" V2 No. 15. In answer to your questions I advise the following.

Yes Brisbane United will have an apprenticeship scheme commencing in 1991.

In the first year we will only be taking two or three young lads of exceptional talent.

Selections will be made with the assistance of the Regional Directors of Coaching and by my attendance at the State under-16 Championships in Bundaberg and with Brisbane United represented at the National Under-17 championships to be held in October 1991 in Sydney.

We will select two or three to join Brisbane United. They will be provided with a foster family, assistance with education, finances and follow a specially designed training program.

All arrangements will be made in consultation with parents and clubs, and young players will be made available to participating clubs in a draft type format (yet to be finalized).

They will also train with the Brisbane United squad. Each year onwards the number of apprenticeships on offer will be increased.

In answer to your other questions, I can state that many plans are being formulated for junior involvement programs etc.

In our first year we will be forming an under-20 side to play from January '92 onwards. Each year after that we will add another age group e.g. 92/93 under-18, 1993/94 under-16.

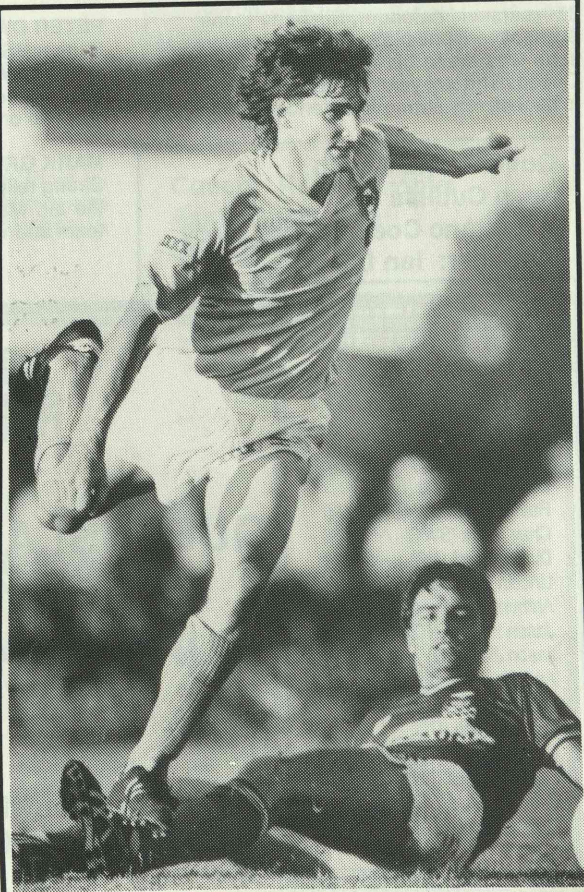

They are determined to prove to Miron Bleiberg that Pine Rivers has many quality players.

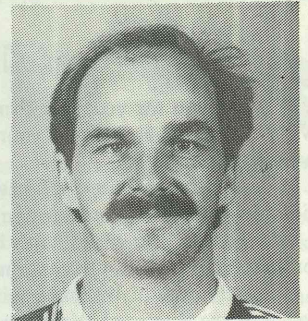

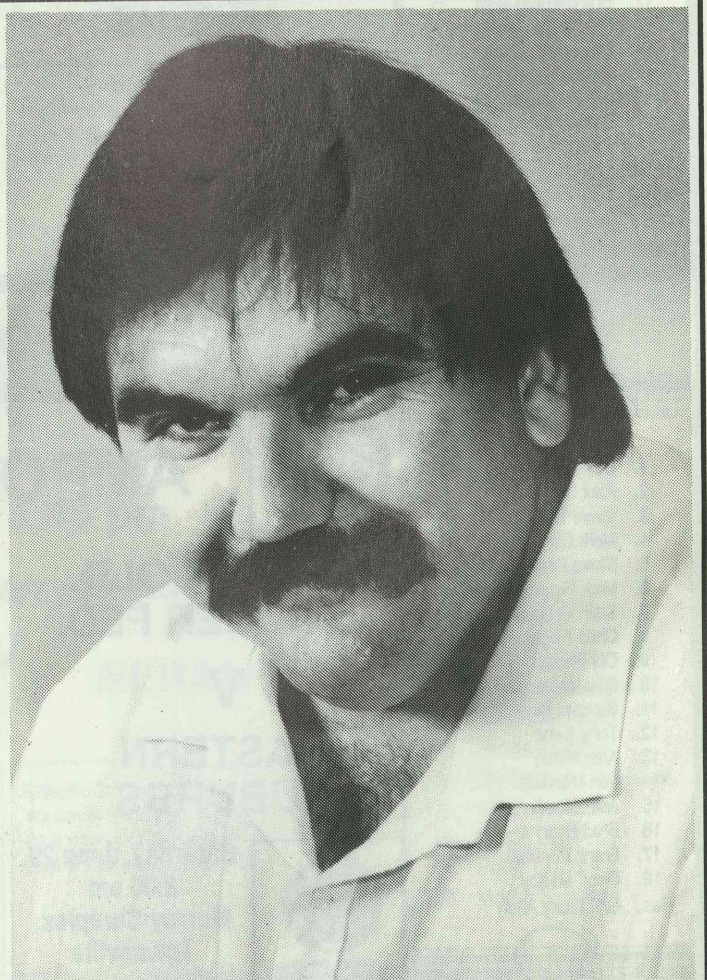

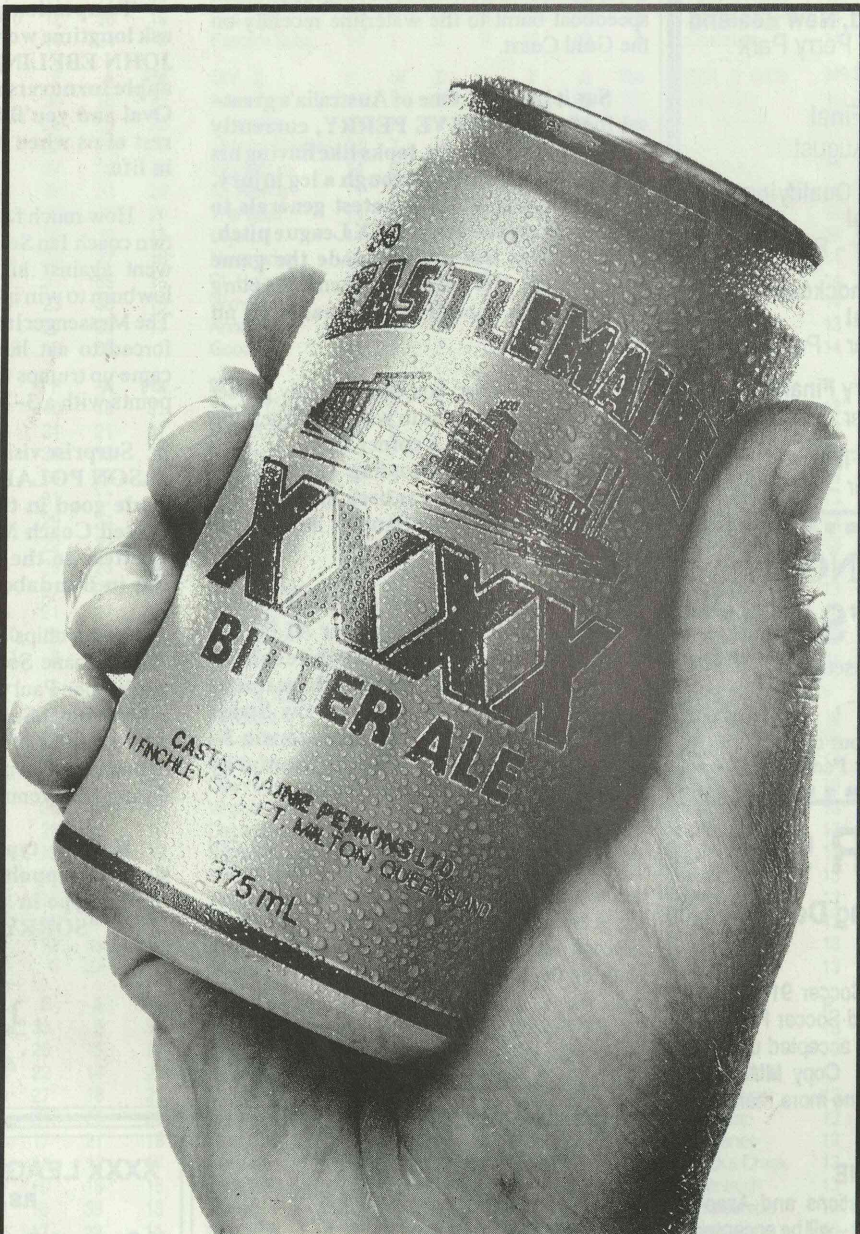
