# Editorial

It is good to hear positive discussion is taking place concerning next year's Inter-City Soccer Series.

This is an important series for the Queensland coach to gauge players' form early in the season.

What is being proposed is that Brisbane be divided into a north and south region and the Sunshine Coast be included in the competition.

Maybe future consideration could be given to having a team from the fastest growing region in Queensland, Logan City, competing in the series.

The changes to the format are a result of concerns over the past couple years that the Brisbane team have had an unfair advantage.

It has been said that Brisbane has had more quality players from which to choose compared to the other competing teams Ipswich, Toowoomba and the Gold Coast.

This has resulted in Brisbane often dominating the competition, detracting from the spectacle of the series.

However, should the new changes be adopted, which seems likely, the standard should improve and the competition become more competitive.

This would in turn make the series more entertaining for spectators while allowing more players to press their claims for State selection.

The XXXX League competition is certainly hotting up as the 12 clubs jockey for position on the premiership ladder.

It is still unknown which teams will make the final five and which two teams will be relegated to the Second Division.

However, the answers to these questions are becoming clearer each week as the results unfold.

It all makes for an interesting climax to the season and some good football for spectators.

It looks like we will have a chance to put the media's playing skills under the microscope when they take part in a celebrity soccer match on July 28.

The match is scheduled as one of the curtain raisers to the Queensland and Auckland representative game at Perry Park.

Players and coaches will no doubt relish the opportunity to analyse and criticise the journos' on-field performances.

On a serious note, the Queensland/Auck-land match looks like being a cracker with the New Zealanders naming a powerful squad including nine full internationals.

The match represents another chance for Queensland spectators to watch and support the Maroons.



# Round in Review

Five straight losses have put the skids on Brisbane Croatia's 1991 XXXX Soccer League campaign.

Croatia's disastrous slide has seen them tumble from the top of the ladder to fifth spot in just four weeks.

A month ago they were considered almost certainties for a finals spot, but reality is they may now struggle to make the five.

The promoted club, the surprise-packets of this year's competition, have lost all confidence after a cracking start to the year.

They were thumped 4-1 by Taringa Rovers in their opening game of the season before winning six of their next seven games.

However since then they have won only two of their past eight games as the wheels proceeded to fall off.

A spate of injuries and suspensions has not helped the club's cause and wrecked the cohesion which made them such a dangerous force early in the year.

The situation reached crisis point earlier this week when the Croatia committee sacked coach Peter Bannon.

Bannon, who has done a sterling job for the club this season, seems an unlucky scapegoat for Croatia's recent bad run.

He has been replaced by former coach Zelko Bambic, who helped coach the club into the XXXX League in 1987.

The true test will be whether Croatia can bounce back in the remaining games of the season.

Croatia has an easier run home than many teams and will play Acacia Ridge, Mt Gravatt, Nerang, North Star, Brisbane City and Coalstars. They cannot afford to lose too many of these matches with the battle for finals positions beginning to intensify.

Last week Croatia went down at home to

the much improved Eastern Suburbs, one of the teams making their presence felt just outside the five.

Easts have now won five and drawn two of past seven games after an indifferent start to the season following their success in the XXXX Pre-season Competition.

Brisbane Lions and Rochedale Rovers both continue to slog it out at the top of the table with both teams enjoying good wins last week.

Rochedale, who have a game in hand, defeated Pine Rivers 2-1 at Perry Park, while Lions downed Taringa Rovers 1-0 at Richlands stadium

The premiership looks destined to be fought out between the two gladiators, who are eight points clear of the third place Pine Rivers.

The battle is also hotting up at the bottom of the table as each passing game becomes more and more important in the relegation raffle.

Acacia Ridge and Nerang occupy the bottom two spots and both clubs had draws last weekend.

The Ridge held Coalstars to a 0-0 result at the Eric Evans Soccer Reserve and Nerang played inspired football to score a 1-1 draw with North Star at O'Callaghan Park.

Just one point clear of those clubs is Brisbane City, who suffered a 3-0 loss to the improving Mt Gravatt at Perry Park.

City are by no means clear of the danger zone and have taken steps to ensure their survival by bringing experienced NSW defender Jean Paul De Marigny up for the rest of the season.

De Marigny had an auspicious debut at Perry Park when he was booked in the first 15 minutes of play.

Mt Gravatt on the other hand hold slim hopes of making the five, but will need to win most of their remaining games to do so.

Both Coalstars and Taringa will also have to watch their step in the closing weeks of the season to be assured of a place in next year's line-up.



Atkinson has been labelled "judas" by Sheffield Wednesday supporters after quitting the Yorkshire club only days after pledging his alliance.

He will be in line for a hostile reception when he returns with his Aston Villa outfit to take on the newly promoted Sheffield Wednesday.

Wednesday supporters damaged Atkinson's car and scrawled slogans outside Hillsborough after he joined Villa, days after announcing he had rejected the offer.

Second division champions Oldham Athletic are away to the mighty Liverpool for their first game in the top flight for 68 years, runners—up West Ham United have a home clash with Luton Town and Notts County take on Manchester United at Old Trafford.
