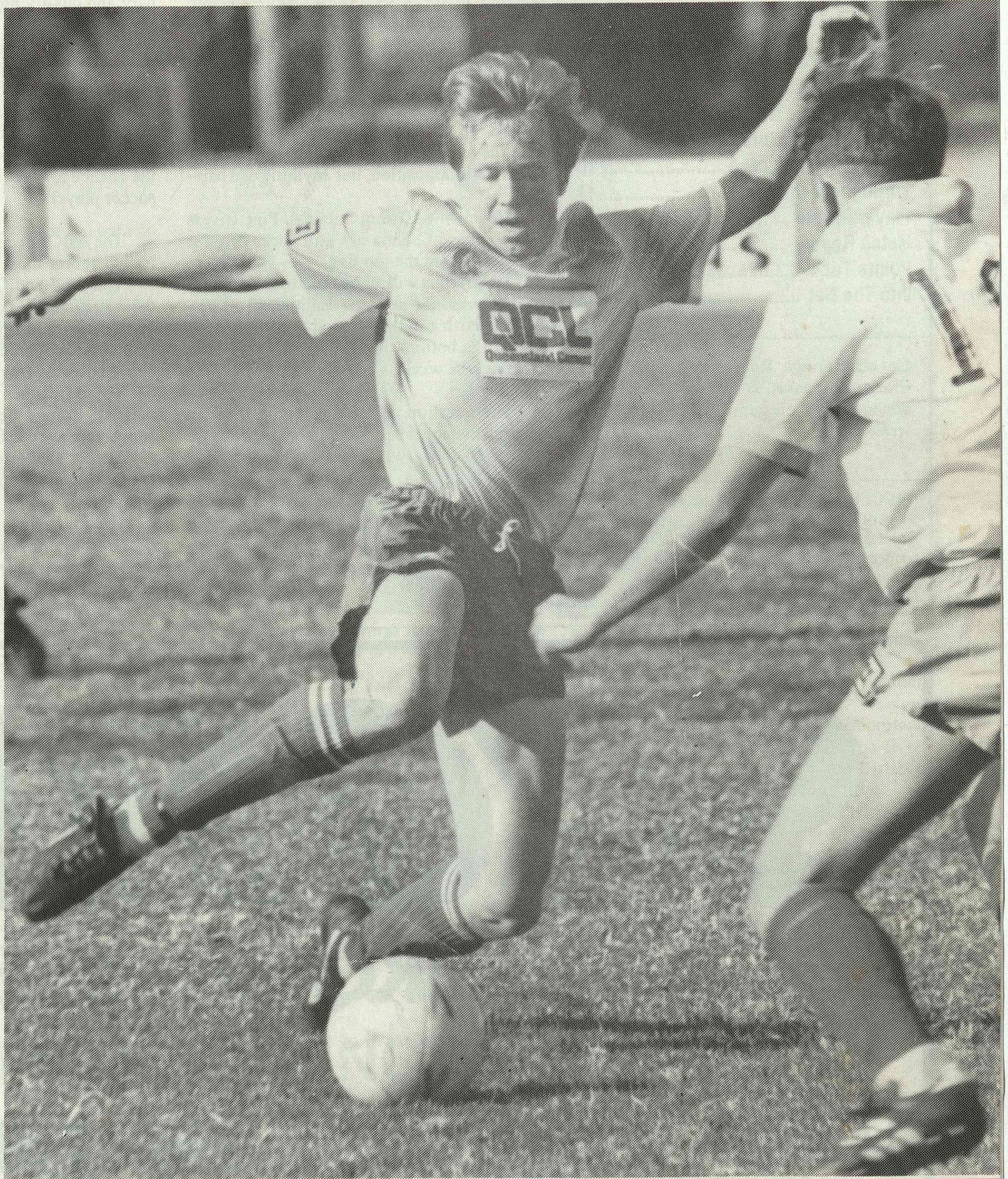

Editorial

The last chapter of the 22 round season will be written this weekend.

By Sunday evening we will know the final placings in the XXXX League premierships race and the results of the equally complicated second division.

In the XXXX League Brisbane Lions need at least a draw to win the premierships.

If North Star defeat Lions and Rochedale Rovers beat Brisbane City, Rochedale will take the honours.

It's all supposition, but anything can happen.

Meanwhile Eastern Suburbs, Pine Rivers and Brisbane Croatia are still jockeying for position within the top five.

These clubs will all be keen to secure third spot to avoid the sudden-death play-off between fourth and fifth placed teams.

At the bottom of the table, Nerang have clinched the wooden spoon and will be relegated.

The question on who will join them in second division will be decided at Jack Spere Park on Sunday when Taringa Rovers play Acacia Ridge.

Grange Thistle are on their way back to the XXXX League in 1992 after finishing first in the second division.

The other team to gain promotion will come from either Lutwyche, Inala City or Olympic United.

Craig Johnston will be at Perry Park on September 8 to officially launch Roo Ball between the XXXX Soccer League preliminary and qualifying semi-finals.

Make sure you are in attendance to see what changes have been made to help the development of junior football.

The aim of Roo Ball is to develop basic skills and technique while placing emphasis on participation and enjoyment.

The day will also allow soccer supporters the chance to meet one of Australia's greatest soccer players.

The ABC's decision not to broadcast Australian soccer must be overturned.

The ASF and QSF have already advised their affiliates and clubs to convey their concerns directly to Prime Minister Bob Hawke, Minister for Sport Ros Kelly and ABC Managing Director David Hill.

Soccer supporters must unite forces because weight of numbers is our most powerful weapon.

If enough pressure could be brought to bear on the policy makers in their ivory towers, then perhaps they will think twice about axing coverage of the largest participation football code in Australia.

Round in Review



The drawn-out relegation battle will be decided in 90 minutes of frantic football at Jack Speare Park this Sunday when Taringa Rovers hosts Acacia Ridge.

Both teams will be playing for their survival in the XXXX Soccer League with the loser to join Nerang in the second division in 1992.

With so much at stake, the match promises to be a pressure cooker situation not to be missed.

Both teams made sure the result would go down to the wire with desperation draws last weekend.

Acacia Ridge scored a last minute equaliser to snatch a draw with Eastern Suburbs and Taringa also came from behind to share the points with Coalstars.

The Ridge have snared some prize scalps to remain undefeated in their past four matches.

They have beaten Rochedale Rovers and had draws with Brisbane Lions, Pine Rivers and Easts, all teams in the top five.

Taringa's draw against Coalstars ended a disastrous six-game losing streak and gave new coach Glenn Davis something to smile about.

Nerang's slim hopes of featuring in a three-way relegation battle were snuffed out by Brisbane Lions's 1-0 win at Glennon Park.

The Gold Coast team will now rejoin the second division after just one season in the top flight.

If the battle for relegation is intriguing, then the promotion raffle in the second division is absolutely absorbing.

Grange Thistle have definitely won return to the XXXX League next season, but the second promotion spot is wide open.

With only one round to go there are three teams which theoretically are in the running.

Lutwyche and Inala City are both on 37 points with Olympic United on 35.

Lutwyche and Inala play each other this weekend with promotion waiting for the winner.

However, should this match be a draw, Olympic could snatch the second promotion spot on goal difference.

While the XXXX League relegation battle has come down to the last round, so too has the race for premiership honors.

It will be fought out between Brisbane Lions and Rochedale Rovers. Lions, the defending premiers, need only a draw in their final match against North Star to take the title.

On the other hand, Rochedale must win their match against Brisbane City and then rely on Lions getting beaten.

Rochedale would then win the premiership on a superior goal difference.

The final round will also carry importance for the remaining three teams in the five - Eastern Suburbs, Pine Rivers and Brisbane Croatia.

The trio will all be trying to finish in third position for the important double finals chance.

Easts are currently third on 37 points, but need to beat Mt Gravatt to retain the position.

Both Rivers and Croatia are on 36 and must win their games against Nerang and Coalstars respectively while also hoping Easts are toppled.

That is 21 goals the fans have seen in just two matches at home. With away goals taken into consideration if the second leg is drawn, Brentford can surely look forward to going into the hat with the First and Second Division clubs for the second round, to be played over two legs on September 23 and October 7.

Charlton Athletic striker Carl Leabum scored his fifth goal in 100 games for the south-east London outfit in the 2-1 defeat of Newcastle United.

However, Carl only manages to find the back of the net when The Valiants (Charlton Athletic) are playing on a Park!

His four goals before last weekend's were scored at St James's Park (Newcastle United), Villa Park (Aston Villa), Ewood Park (Blackburn Rovers) and Selhurst Park (for the past six seasons, the 'home ground' of Charlton).

Charlton made themselves at home at West Ham's Upton Park, where they are playing the first three games of the season while awaiting a return to The Valley.

A further delay which has just come to notice, could well see Charlton remain at Upton Park until mid-October.

That news will please Leaburn, who again found his name on the scoreboard as Charlton beat Fulham 4-2 in their Rumbelows Cup first round, first leg, match on the same ground.

A 38th minute penalty by Steve Bruce was enough for Manchester United to record their second successive League victory.

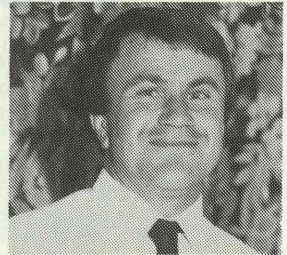
In a night of high passion at Villa Park, the homecoming of Ron Atkinson was spoilt by a determined United outfit.

Alex Ferguson's Soviet winger Andrei Kanchelskis showed few worries about the troubles in his homeland and impressive displays from newcomer Paul Parker and Bryan Robson will make Manchester United a strong contender for the league championship, a trophy they have not won since the 1966-67 season.

Liverpool's \$6.09 million Welsh star, Dean Saunders missed an 82nd minute penalty as Manchester City defeated the Merseysiders 2-1 at Maine Road.

Like Liverpool, last season's League champions Arsenal, are struggling to find the form they showed earlier this year, and it was goals from an old West Ham United combination which left George Graham furious at Goodison Park. Mark Ward bagged two goals and Tony Cottee one as Everton ran out 3-1 winners.

Scottish international Gary McAllister gave Leeds United the perfect start to their delayed season, and it was his 12th minute 12-yard

shot which was enough for Howard Wilkinson's boys to beat Notts Forest 1-0.

A crowd of 14,997 packed into Boundary Park on the occasion of Oldham Athletic's first First Division home game for 68 years, but on this performance by Joe Royle's team, anyone would find it hard to believe that Oldham had been away that long.

On their new grass playing surface, last season's Second Division champions outplayed Chelsea in every aspect to record a 3-0 victory.

Paul Gascoigne was forced to run as 10,000 screaming, stampeding Lazio fans besieged him in an orgy of Gassamania at Rome airport. Such was the frantic effort to get a glimpse of Gazza that fans trampled each other underfoot.

Women and children dived for cover as even Rome's riot police, some with dogs and machine guns, couldn't hold back the rampaging fans. They had waited hours for their 5.5 million pounds (A\$11.55 million) signing to finally set foot on Italian soil after months of on-and-off transfer haggling.

Chelsea has come under fire from Hartlepool over the transfer tribunal's ruling on striker Joe Allon.

The Hartlepool management had valued the 24-year-old player at nearly 1 million pounds (A\$2.1 million), but the tribunal ruled that Chelsea must pay the Third Division club 200,000 pounds (A\$420,000) with another 100,000 pounds (A\$210,000) after Allon makes 25 appearances.

This is surely a blatant case of why it would be a good idea for every transfer deal to be valued by a third party, rather than let the selling or purchasing club make a substantial gain or loss on the transfer of a player, thereby to bring the fees into reality of more clubs!

George is a current member of the Queensland Soccer Federation Management Committee and is chairman of the QSF's Technical and Development Committee.

He is a self-employed businessman with investment and superannuation consultants Major Professional Services (Qld) Pty Ltd.

George had a distinguished playing and coaching career.

He was a former professional footballer with Hearts of Midlothian in the Scottish Premier League.

Since moving to Australia George has been heavily involved in coaching at all levels.

He is a qualified senior accredited coach with the ASF and a former Australian senior selector.

He coached the Queensland senior team for four years and was a former football manager and

football committee chairman at the Grange Thistle Soccer Club.

He also coached at Grange Thistle in 1976, 1981, 1983 and 1988 achieving every honour available under the QSF, including the Inaugural State League Championship.

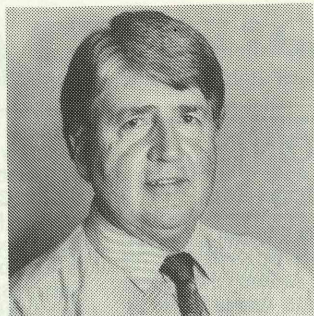
He also coached Brisbane Lions to three successful championships from 1973 to 1975 inclusive.

George has also been heavily involved in junior soccer.

He was a former Australian schoolboys selector and was a Queensland junior coach for 14 years.

He was former Director of Coaching to Australian soccer camps and is currently Managing Director of the Australian Youth Soccer tours to Europe incorporating specialised coaching clinics in Germany.

George has been recently appointed to the board of Brisbane United.



From the Office

The Major Field Sports Committee met with Lord Mayor Mr Jim Soorley last week to discuss a number of matters relating to field sports and the Brisbane City Council.

We received a very warm welcome from the Lord Mayor and he was genuinely interested in our agenda.

On all issues we discussed he advised that he would either give further consideration or ask for inquiries to be made so further dialogue could be encouraged.

The important issue that was resolved at the meeting was the subject of water rates rebate for BCC parks.

The Lord Mayor gave us his assurance that the 25 per cent rebate would now apply to all Council parks that were genuinely open to the public for the majority of time, whether they were fenced or not.

In effect this means that if the public can use the park in daylight hours for passive or physical recreation then the rebate will apply.

This amounts to a great financial saving for many of our clubs, and the Lord Mayor's initiative in this endeavour should be applauded.

In due time, any club not receiving the rebate should advise me in writing so appropriate action can be taken to obtain the rebate.

The Management Committee met with the executives of the Sunshine Coast Association last week to discuss a number of important matters.

It was a very productive meeting and it was great to learn of the wonderful progress being made on the Sunshine Coast.

They are delighted to be included in the 1992 IEA Inter City Series.

From recent inquiries it still appears some clubs are paying twice for public liability insurance cover.

Clubs are reminded that liability cover is provided for in the IEA Insurance scheme and probably (unless there are unique circumstances) should not have to pay extra Public and Liability Insurance.

Additional cover can be arranged with IEA in the event that a club requires an increased amount of coverage.

Both IEA and the QSF will be pleased to receive any queries, because we do not want you to waste valued funds.

We had a letter from the undertaker. He said if the last payment on your grandmother's plot wasn't paid in seven days, up she comes.

RDOC

With finals of junior competition now in progress there are sure to be some exciting, skillful games throughout the age groups.

Success with junior players is measured not by how many trophies are won, but their development – how they have improved in their skills and understanding of soccer.

No one doubts that competition is very healthy at primary school age.

But research by Robertson S.A. (1987) showed what children actually enjoy is not what adults think children enjoy.

Children placed in order of preference.

1. Improving their skill level
2. Playing, using the skills of the sport
3. Having a good relationship with the coach
4. Being selected in the team not on the bench
5. Competing and trying to win
6. having an exciting close game
7. Being with friends
8. Wearing the correct uniform
9. Beating their opponents
10. Receiving medals or trophies

Coaches should try to plan their coaching around the needs of the children.

The greatest reward a coach can receive

from young athletes is "Coach, will you be coaching us again next year?"

Caloundra equalised five minutes from time when Ben Palmer slammed home a 20m thunderbolt.

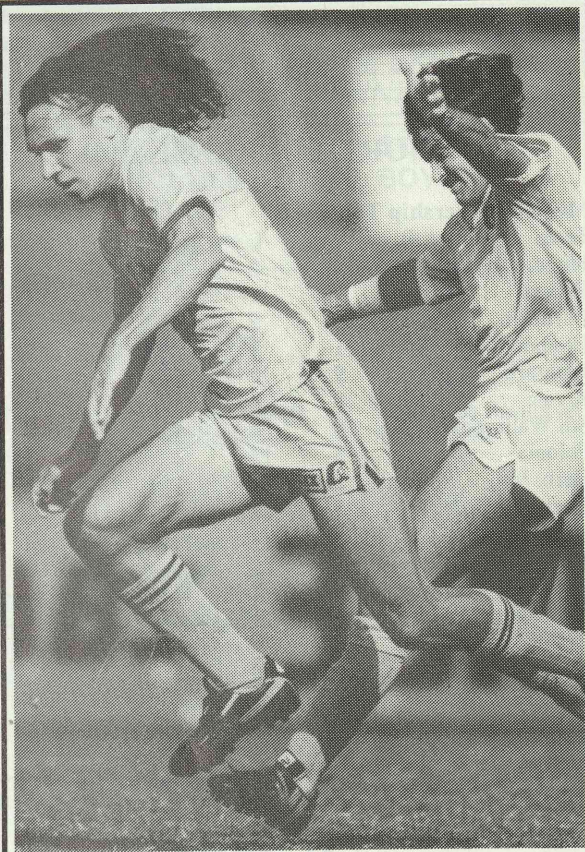

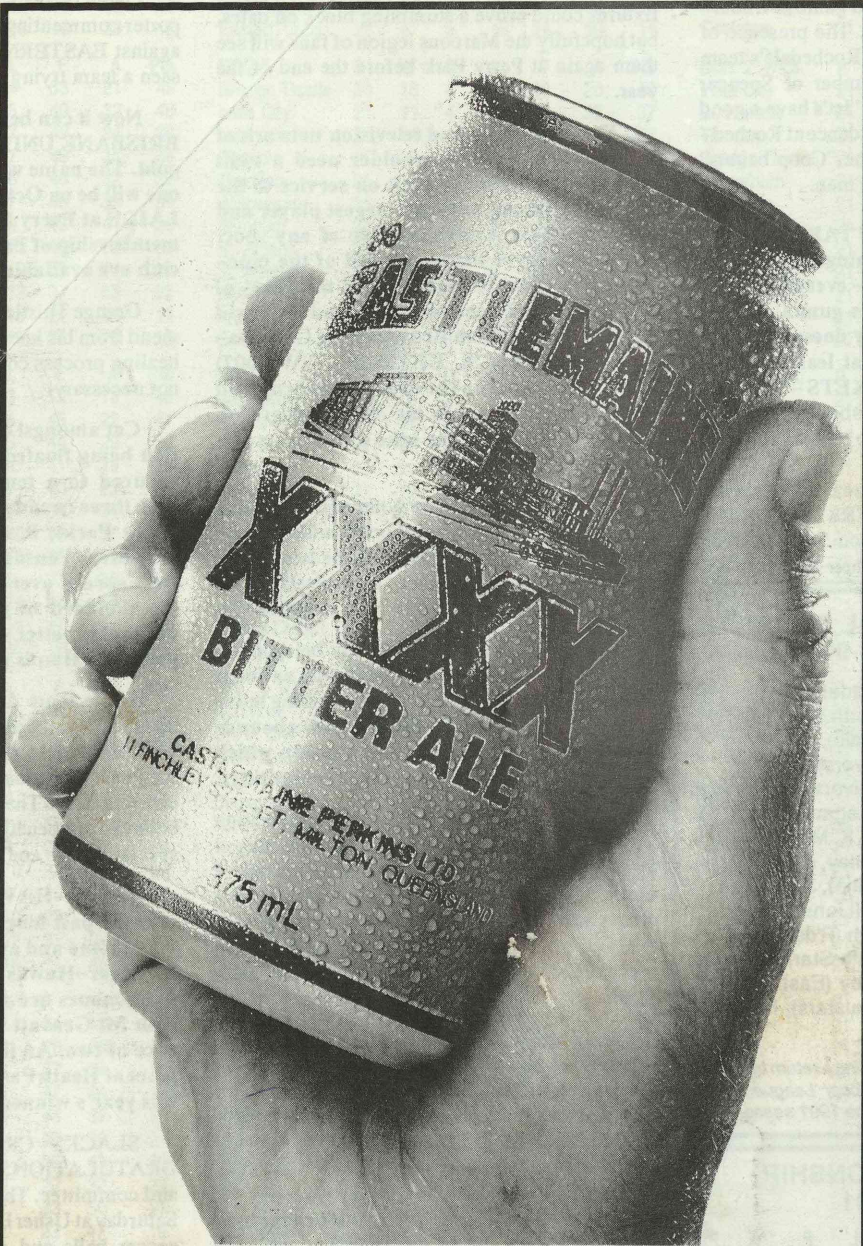
