XXXX Soccer League Grand Final

Brisbane Lions v Rochedale Rovers

The 1991 XXXX Soccer League grand final is shaping as a classic showdown between two great teams.

The combatants, Brisbane Lions and Rochedale Rovers, will face each other at Perry Park on Sunday.

Both teams deserve to win for different reasons, however only one will emerge victorious.

Lions will be trying to shed the "bridesmaids" tag which has seen them lose consecutive grand finals.

They started favourites last year after a runaway premiership victory, but lost to Brisbane City in the grand final.

And in 1989 Lions went down to an inspirational Eastern Suburbs who came from fifth place to take championship honors.

Ironically Lions' current coach, John Sime, was at the helm of the Easts outfit which defied the odds.

Sime is determined that Lions will not finish second again.

Icing

Sunday's game also signals Rochedale's first grand final appearance since joining the XXXX League in 1987.

The club would dearly love to win it, putting the icing on what has already been a great season.

Rochedale defeated Brisbane Croatia to win the President's Cup, played between the two leading teams at the end of the first round, were runners-up in the Ampol Cup behind Mt

Gravatt and finished second in the premiership race behind Lions.

Most observers agree Lions and Rochedale were the two best teams in the competition in 1991.

Both teams boast star-studded line-ups making the grand final an even more engrossing affair.

Rochedale made their way to the final after defeating Brisbane Croatia 3-1 in last week-end's preliminary final.

Lions earned the traditional week's break after defeating Rochedale 3-2 in the major semi-final a fortnight ago.

Question marks have been raised over Lions' match fitness and Rochedale's ability to play in the strength sapping daylight hours.

However, control of the midfield shapes as the biggest key for both sides.

With star striker Kieran Cooper ruled out of the final through suspension, Rochedale is likely to rely heavily on midfielders Lee Howells and Arthur McHugh.

Howells was magnificent in last week's game and has proved he is a match winner when firing.

Rochedale player/coach John Stewart is also set to play a major role, depending on whether he lines up in the centre of the park or in the sweeper position.

Lions have one of the strongest midfields in the competition with a number of capable players, including Darren Hillier, Chris Slater and Craig Collins, at Sime's disposal.

They also have one of the best defences in the league, led by classy sweeper Frank Mengotti and the underrated Tony Duffy and Andrew Stowell.

JUNIOR SOCCER

QSSSSF 1991 SUMMARY

1991 has again been a busy year for our association.

We have run two State Championships (boys & girls open), the Queensland draw of the Commonwealth Bank Bill Turner Cup, Metropolitan Finals and the Australian Secondary Schools National boys and girls open championships.

Ten regions competed in Rockhampton in the open boys State championships in July, while seven regions competed in Kinyaroy in the girls championship.

The ASRF organised referees for both venues and, as usual, the standard was quite good.

In the boys championship South Coast emerged victors over the Sunshine Coast in the final, while in the girls' final the reverse happened with Sunshine Coast defeating the South Coast.

The two State teams selected at these Championships competed in the National Championships in Brisbane from September 8 to 13.

The competition was very fierce with the girls' winner being

decided mid-week when Queensland met NSW with NSW emerging 1-0 winners in one of the best games of the championship.

This put Queensland in second place for the fifth year in a row and NSW first for the fifth time.

The boys started badly with a 1-0 loss to WA and the story continued that way all week with the only bright spot being a 3-0 win over Northern Territory.

Queensland finished a disappointing sixth, our worst performance in five years in which time we have jointly held the title with the ACT and been runners-up several times.

The disappointing performance of the championship was the ACT which had 10 AIS players (including Queenslanders Brad Ditton and Danny Stowers).

There was never any doubt from day one that NSW was going to win which they did convincingly scoring 11 out of 12 possible points. During the week we were visited by Ron Smith and Tom Sermani from the Institute, Jim Selby and Peter Kelly (RD's from the South Coast and South

West Queensland), Gunter Pfule from the Queensland Women's Association and a number of officials from QSF including Wallace Dann, George Pagan and Ross Melville.

At the end of the championships two Australian sides were announced and for the first time in quite a few years not one Queensland boy was selected in the first 16. Glen Waddingham from Trinity Bay in Cairns was selected in the Shadow squad.

However Queensland had seven in the girls first 16 and another four named in the shadow squad. Those selected were: Jacqui Page (GK), Kim Revell, Katie Smith, Louise McMurtrie, Mia Thompson, Tracey Little and Corinne Curry.

The Australian teams will tour the UK in January playing internationals in England Ireland and Wales.

This year 58 teams started in the Commonwealth Bank Bill Turner Cup.

Out of the pack Shailer Park SHS and Kepnock SHS (Bundaberg) emerged as the two finalists in our draw with Shailer Park

winning the State final 2-1.

They then travelled to Lismore where they defeated Kadina High School in the national quarter final 1-0.

This advanced them to the semi-final and final play-offs in Newcastle on September 3 and 4.

Shailer Park won their semi-final 6-1 against St Dominics of Penrith but were beaten 3-1 in the final by Westfields Sports High School.

Nethertheless it was a remarkable feat to finish second in a competition which boasts 477 competing schools.

Shailer Park also went one step further than Sunnybank did last year when they finished third.

We still need more Brisbane schools to enter the competition to boost our numbers so that one day the Queensland final will be a national quarter-final.

Our thanks to all the clubs who have assisted this season from use of facilities to releasing players for our competitions, to the QSF for its continued support and to the ASRF for its continued support of both State and National Championships.

The General Manager of the Queensland Soccer Federation Mr Ross Melville has announced the following appointments. State Director of Coaching:

Jim Selby, Regional Director of the Gold Coast and Albert Soccer Federation will be appointed to the important position of Queensland State Director of Coaching.

Selby was selected from an extensive list of quality applicants. He has an outstanding professional coaching and administrative record extending over more than 10 years of full time employment with the Queensland Soccer Federation.

Selby is one of Australia's most highly qualified and respected coaches and has regularly worked as an Australian Soccer Federation Staff Coach and FIFA Youth Academy Coach.

He has the distinguished record of being the first Australian to be appointed full time under the ASF National Coaching Scheme.

For a period of eight years, he was the Australian National Women's Coach and for many years he has coached representative men and youth teams with outstanding success.

Selby's strong administrative capabilities combined with a vision

Peter Kelly, now employed as South West Queensland Regional Coaching Director will be appointed to the position of Assistant State Director of Coaching.

Cutillas' many years of international experience as a professional national coach adds another dimension to Queensland coaching.

He has a keen desire to play attacking football and develop talented young players so that they can blossom as regular players in the Queensland senior representative side in 1992 and onwards.

Stewart strikes gold in annual medal count

Rochedale Rovers' John Stewart this week became the first player/coach to win the Queensland Soccer Federation's coveted Gold Medal award.

Stewart was presented with his award, as the season's "best and fairest player", at a glittering function at Perry Park on Monday night.

The 32-year-old midfielder finished with 26 points after the referee's votes were tallied. He was one clear of Brisbane Croatia striker Joe Stipancic. Mt Gravatt midfielder Martin Kirsopp was third with 20 points.

Referees allocate points on a 3-2-1 basis during each of the season's XXXX League matches to decide the Gold Medal winner.

Stewart caught the referees' eyes to poll votes consistently throughout the season. He had 10 points after nine rounds, but trailed early leader Martin Kirsopp on 13.

Stipancic moved to the top of the leaderboard after 13 rounds had been counted with 16 points. However Stewart had charged his way into the lead by the end of round 17 to lead with 20 points, one clear of Stipancic. He was then able to hold off Stipancic in the final rounds to win the Gold Medal.

Stewart joins a prestigious list of players to have won the Gold Medal including Kevin Caldwell, Ron Millman, Ken Swan, Frank Pimblett, Andy Ogden, Craig Low and Steve Dolan.

Stewart also collected the "coach of the year" trophy as part of the media's awards. Under his guidance Rochedale won the President's Cup, were runners-up in the Ampol Cup, finished second in the premiership race and will contest today's grand final at Perry Park against Brisbane Lions.

Despite missing a number of games during the season, Pine Rivers striker Clayton Koch was voted the media's "player of the year".

It was the second time in succession Koch had won the award.

Peter Hulme won the "referee of the year award" and Coalstars teenager Brenley Jefferd took out the "rookie of the year" award.

WOMEN'S SOCCER

SQWSA

The 1991 season has ended with quite a few changes taking place. SQWSA had over 1200 women and girl players registered for the 1991 season.

For the first time in approximately 10 years, North Queensland and Far North Queensland were affiliated with us.

The affiliation has provided their players with the opportunity to compete in the Queensland State Titles and the national Titles. Other

areas affiliated include Rockhampton, Mackay, South Burnett, Sunshine Coast, Toowoomba and Gold Coast & Albert.

With these affiliations we now hope to have all registered players throughout Queensland on computer by the end of the year.

It was decided at the last country affiliates meeting to hold a meeting prior to the commencement of each season at that year's venue for the State Titles.

This will enable everyone to view the facilities, accommoda-

tion etc. offered prior to the titles. All affiliates will be advised of the meeting date in the near future.

The Queensland Open Womens team also triumphed in their National Titles in Canberra recently.

The team went through the tournament undefeated and defeated NSW, for the second time during the championships, in the final.

Four teams also competed in an under-15's competition. A number of clubs have already expressed interest in the under-15's competition for next year, so it looks very promising for 1992.

Woombye keeper, Sarah Chatburn, turned in a very courageous performance with Jodie Brook and Lisa Dau also turning in top games.

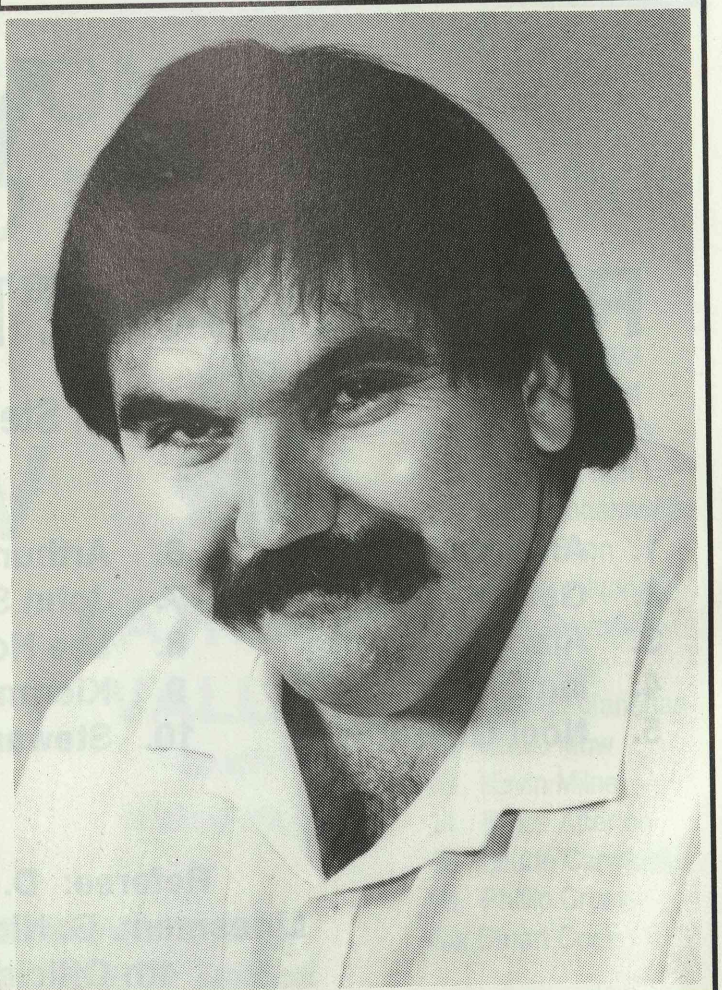

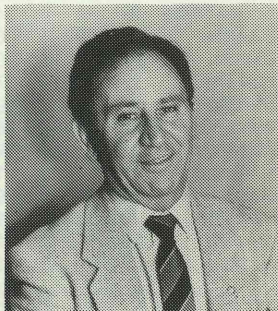

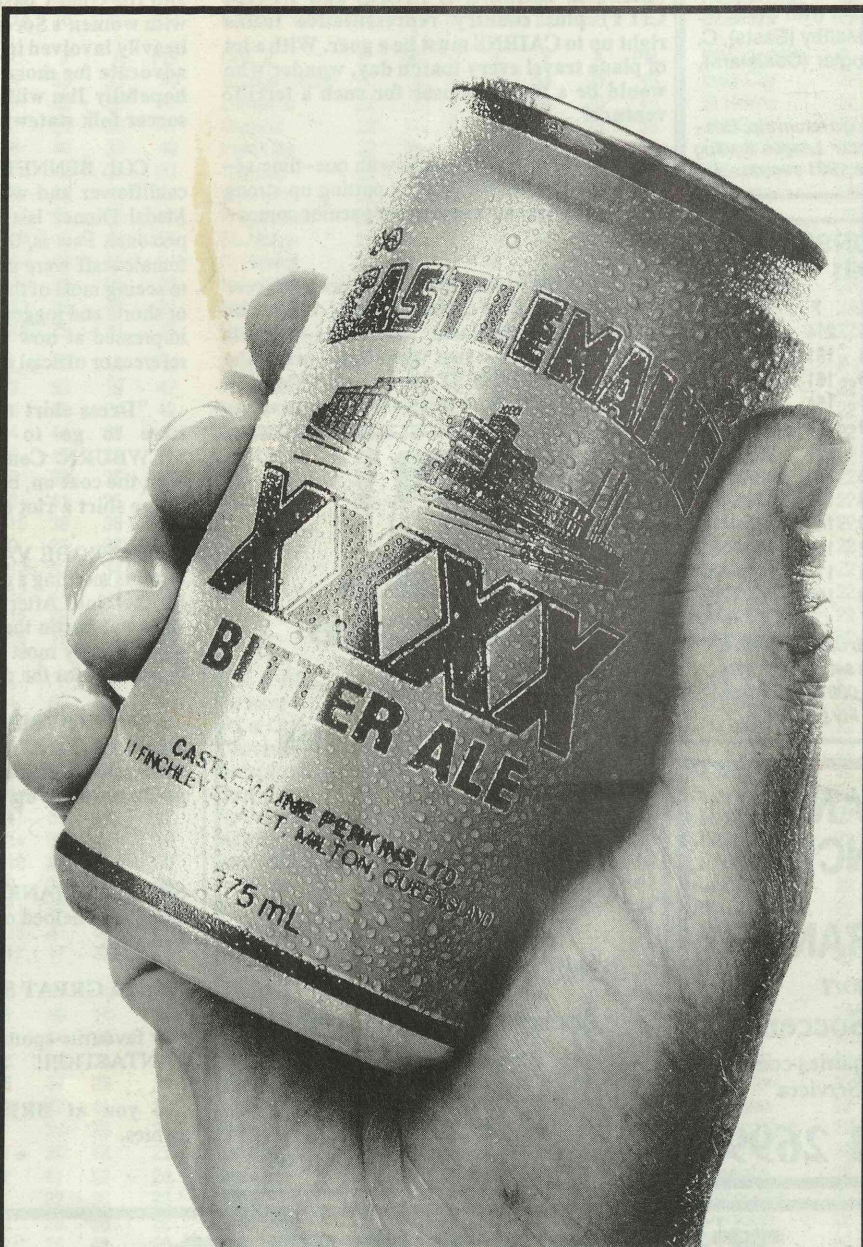
