

New centres coming on stream are the Sunshine Coast Federation, Bundaberg and Mt Isa


The aim for Soccer 92 is to turn the magazine into a truly statewide publication.

Kerry Cranney, father of NSL and State players Sean and Troy, passed away suddenly earlier this month after a short illness. His sudden death at a relatively young age has left much sadness in the sporting community.

The sympathies of all in Queensland soccer goes to the families of these "greats" of our code.







# **COMMUNITY AWARENESS**Contact Sports and Infections

Athletes involved in contact sports or sports which may involve body contact must be aware of the risks involved in the voluntary transfer of body fluids, especially blood. This happens if an athlete has a bleeding injury. It is possible that a small amount of blood could be transferred from one player to another.

The two important infections when considering this are AIDS and HEPATITIS B. Players may have these infections and not be aware of them

Unfortunately, AIDS infection cannot be prevented by immunisation; but Hepatitis B infection can be. It is strongly recommended that players, coaches, umpires/referees, trainers and first-aid personnel are immunised against Hepatitis B. It is hoped that sporting associations and Clubs will accept the responsibility of encouraging their athletes to be immunised.


