With the loss of The Sun newspaper, the sport must do something to fill the void and keep our Queensland supporters informed.

A recent survey found that most federations throughout the state do not have a weekly magazine to provide spectators with information as they arrive at the ground. The expansion of Soccer 92's circulation will fill the gap for spectators Queensland-wide.

The Strike Force Coaching Clinics get underway on Monday and will run until Friday. Unfortunately, if you haven't nominated by now it is too late for these school holidays.

But make sure you make arrangements nice and early for the next school holiday break in June.

Young players can certainly learn a great deal at these Queensland Soccer Federation-run coaching clinics, and as they say: "No matter what knowledge it is, it is never a real load to carry through life".

With the talent on display, both centres will be a force to be reckoned with over the next five years. This can only be a great bonus for soccer throughout Queensland.

Queensland soccer has lost a number of outstanding soccer identities this year with the passing of former State captain Dan Roderick, player Gyula Vinzce and Kerry Cranney.

Dan, an Ipswich identity not only captained Queensland, but also went on to play for Australia.

Hungarian-born Gyula played with distinction during the 1960s, for such great clubs as Hellenic, St George Souths and Merton Rovers, displaying all the flair of a European player.

He turned to coaching and imparted his knowledge to many thousands of players, both junior and senior through club coaching and his involvement with the Queensland Soccer Coaches Association.

Kerry Cranney, father of NSL and State players Sean and Troy, passed away suddenly earlier this month after a short illness. His sudden death at a relatively young age has left much sadness in the sporting community.

The sympathies of all in Queensland soccer goes to the families of these "greats" of our code.

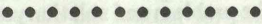


Rochedale Rovers 3 V Eastern Suburbs 2



Brisbane (north) had to overcome an early lack of cohesion, after an interrupted preparation.

Ipswich keeper Graham Ross pulled off a number of saves from Steve Glockner, Lee Scriggins and Noel Carroll, while a rather subdued Ipswich, had only lone striker Peter Vogler making any real impression up front.

After a scoreless first half, Scriggins opened the score with a header from a corner, 15 minutes into the second period. Vogler equalised with only seven minutes remaining, but substitute Marty Kirsopp waltzed through some slack defence to restore Brisbane's one-goal advantage.

Gold Coast wasted no time in putting their stamp on the late match and had Toowoomba down 2-0 through an Andrew

Lees double after just 15 minutes.

But the Downsmen hit back to go to the break leading 3-2, after goals by Craig McConnell, Eddie Balareso and Mick Turvey.

Turvey's magnificent net-finder came after a 45 metre diagonal cross on to his chest. From there it was one touch on to the floor and the next thing, Des Gallacher was picking the ball out of the net.

On the hour, Garry French equalised for the Coast and they went ahead through a stunning 35 metre power drive from Lee Hosier, with French again netting from a 90th minute penalty.

State coach Juan Cutillas would have been impressed with the talent on show from both teams. Standout performers were Toowoomba's Craig McConnell, David Jones and Gavin Freier, along with Gold Coasters French, Lees and Hosier.

Congratulations to the two new regional coaches on their attacking attitude with these teams. They were a treat to watch.

COMMUNITY AWARENESS

Contact Sports and Infections

Athletes involved in contact sports or sports which may involve body contact must be aware of the risks involved in the voluntary transfer of body fluids, especially blood. This happens if an athlete has a bleeding injury. It is possible that a small amount of blood could be transferred from one player to another.

The two important infections when considering this are AIDS and HEPATITIS B. Players may have these infections and not be aware of them.

Unfortunately, AIDS infection cannot be prevented by immunisation; but Hepatitis B infection can be. It is strongly recommended that players, coaches, umpires/referees, trainers and first-aid personnel are immunised against Hepatitis B. It is hoped that sporting associations and Clubs will accept the responsibility of encouraging their athletes to be immunised.

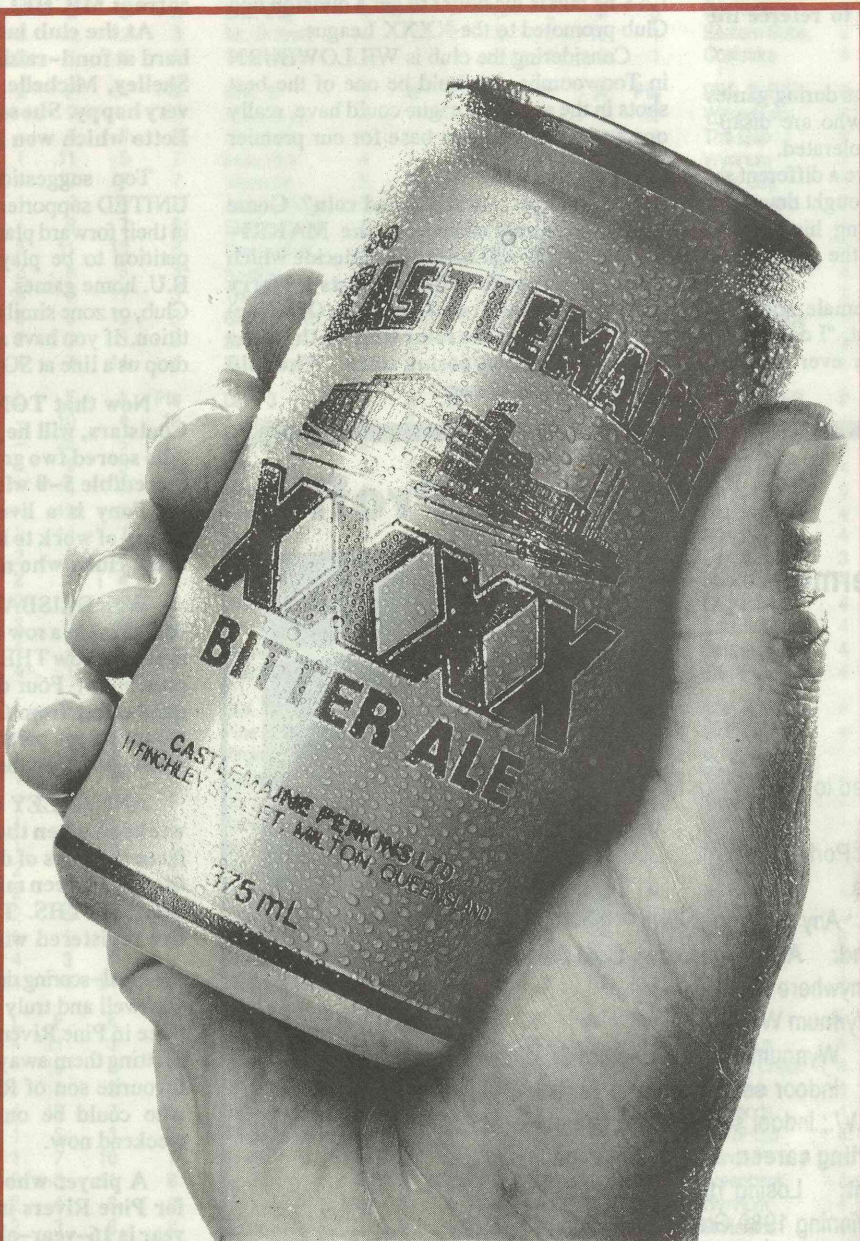
