

Editorial

Through the highly successful Strike Force clinics, the QSF has been investing in our youngsters who are the game's long-term future.

And with the revamped Queensland Cup kicking off this weekend, we are witnessing a very sound investment in the short-term future of our great game.

The Strike Force clinics, so ably run by State Director of Coaching Jim Selby and his trusty lieutenants during the Easter holidays, attracted more than 300 juniors throughout Brisbane and the Gold Coast.

All of the young people — both boys and girls — who took part, had the opportunity to improve their skills and learn from some of the finest coaches Oueensland soccer has to offer.

Plans are well in hand to increase the number of coaching clinics run each year and to take them to every corner of the State.

The QSF considers this a gilt-edged investment and intends to vigorously promote these clinics, perhaps as a live-in situation.

The Queensland Cup promises to yield more immediate dividends by exposing the precious reserves of raw talent we all know is out there in our country regions.



The scorelines in last season's Ampol Cup competition prove that our country cousins are competitive and that the city slickers do not have a mortgage on football talent.

The country federations are rightly proud of their representative teams and are keen to inflict defeat on the city-slickers.

A lot of great talent has come from Queensland Country in our sport, and some will be returning to their stomping grounds this season as much bigger names than when they left.

Take for example Glenn and Colin Gwynne who will be star attractions in the Taringa Rovers line-up when they travel to Far North Queensland to take on the local representative side.

Far North Queensland players can take great heart from the Gwynnes' success and aspire to reach similar heights in the not too distant future.

And judging from the standard of play at Intra-State Junior Championships, there are a lot more names ready to explode on to the scene just a little further down the track.

All sportspeople in their prime love to prove themselves against a higher standard of opposition. Soccer players are no different.

We must press on to give all our players the opportunity to play representative football.


Rochedale Rovers 1 v Taringa Rovers 1 Half Time 1-0 Scorers: Rochedale: K Cooper Taringa: S Glockner

BUNDY JUNIORS RETAIN CRYSTAL GEM TROPHY

The Bundaberg junior teams returned from Toowoomba last weekend with the prestigious Crystal Gem Trophy in their keeping.

Despite the six-hour trip to the Darling Downs, Bundaberg performed very well in all four age groups on Day One, winning three games and establishing a four-point advantage on the competition table.

Sunday's first game saw this lead extended

to six points.

With only three games remaining, Toowoomba needed to turn around some big defeats in the under 13 and under 14 games, and pick up a considerable goal difference.

The home sides did manage to avenge Saturday's results, winning by the odd goal in both games and by two goals in the under 15 game.

But this left them still eight goals short of their target.

Bundaberg's second Under 12 side, which included several Under 11 players, performed well throughout. This team played friendly games with Toowoomba representative players with no points allocated to the trophy.

The Under 12 side, playing for points,

performed best of all sides, going through undefeated.

south and people must realize travel will be incurred to some extent to get players to a central point. Capalaba have been generous to a fault over the last seven or eight years by providing their lights, at no expense, for women's soccer representative teams and apart from Redlands Soccer club, who have done the same for rep. games, no other Club has come forth with a similar offer.

What disappoints me most is the lack of enthusiasm of players to want to play for their city, their State, or eventually their country. Let's hope some of the players of the future will be keen enough to strive for that honour.
