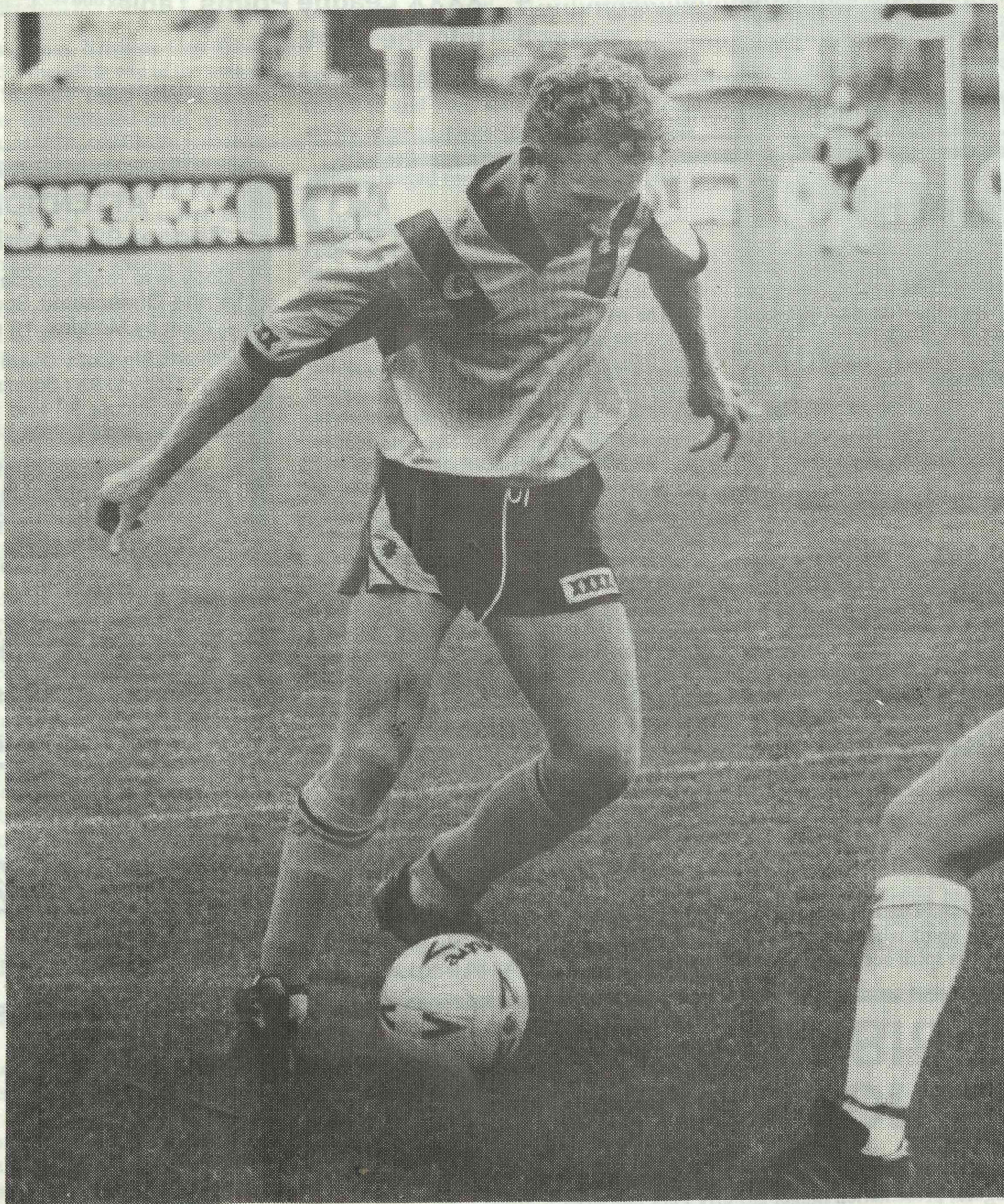

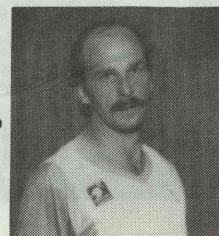

Congratulations to all recipients.

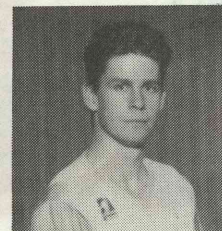
Comper Eric Summons kept the crowd thoroughly entertained.

The Rockhampton team were certainly not disgraced. They had a number of young players on show and we will see a lot more of these lads in the future.

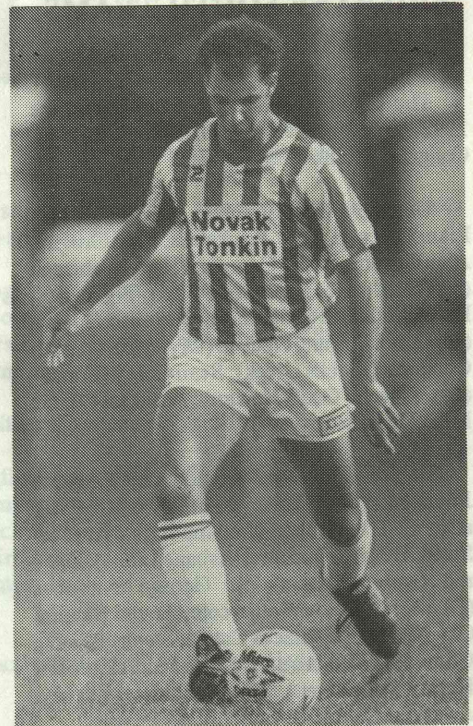
Bundaberg 1 v Eastern Suburbs 3

TEST YOUR KNOWLEDGE

QUESTIONS

Q34. If, at a goal-kick, when the ball has travelled the distance of its circumference towards leaving the penalty-area, an opponent then enters the penalty-area and is intentionally fouled by a defending player, can a penalty-kick be awarded?

Q35. If a player who enters or returns to the field of play without receiving a signal from the referee to do so, and who, apart from this, commits another more serious infringement, e.g. handles the ball or strikes an opponent, how should he be penalised?

Q36. What is the decision if a player, after receiving the approval of the referee to leave the field of play because of a slight injury or other cause, places himself near the touch line and puts his foot into the field causing an opponent to fall?

Q37. If a player takes a free-kick and then intentionally handles the ball before it has been played by another player, should the referee punish the more serious offence and if so, how?

ANSWERS

A34. No, because the ball was not in play at the time the offence was committed. The offending player shall be cautioned or ordered off, according to the nature of the offence, and the goal-kick re-taken.

If the ball has passed outside the penalty-area before the game is stopped, a goal-kick should still be re-taken as the player of the attacking side has entered the penalty-area before the ball was in play.

A 35 (i) The referee shall caution the player for entering or returning to the field of play without having received a signal from the referee.

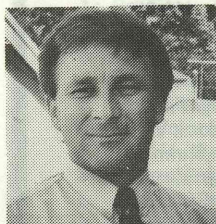
A35 (ii) The referee shall furthermore punish the more serious infringement.

A36. The player should be cautioned and the game re-started by a direct free kick because of offence occurred within the field of play.

A37. Yes, by a direct free-kick or by a penalty-kick if the offence took place in the penalty area.

What is Soccer Fitness? Selby Says

Jim Selby - State Director of Coaching



This is part one of a two-part series which seeks to answer this difficult question.

Soccer fitness is hard to define because of the different jobs a player performs, in relation to:

- * individual style/skill level
- * coach's playing system/tactics
- * Level of competition
- * environmental conditions
- * age/growth development

Academic definition: The ability to be able to physiologically perform specific tasks at a competent level throughout a specific period.

Coach's definition: The fitness to do all that is required at a competent level throughout the whole game.

If a player or team's fitness is poor, in relation to the level of competition at which he/she is competing, then a combination of physiological and mental factors may affect performance.

These include:

- Concentration fades - player ball watches
- Anticipation is reduced - player does not read the cues
- Skills decrease - unable to perform to ability
- Work rate down - does not support team mates
- Commitment fades - "I'm not chasing him/her"

You can divide soccer fitness into two groups: general soccer fitness and position-specific fitness.

Soccer's physiological activities: As a coach we require an understanding of the physiological activities a player performs in a game, so that our fitness training, like skill training, can include similar characteristics of game performance.

Physiological Activities of soccer players include:

- * running at different speeds and distances of varied duration.
- * a variety of movements patterns, running, jumping, kicking, sideways, backwards.
- * changes in direction.
- * changes in intensities.
- * etc.

These general activities need to be included in the training program.

COMMUNITY AWARENESS

Contact Sports and Infections

Athletes involved in contact sports or sports which may involve body contact must be aware of the risks involved in the voluntary transfer of body fluids, especially blood. This happens if an athlete has a bleeding injury. It is possible that a small amount of blood could be transferred from one player to another.

The two important infections when considering this are AIDS and HEPATITIS B. Players may have these infections and not be aware of them.

Unfortunately, AIDS infection cannot be prevented by immunisation; but Hepatitis B infection can be. It is strongly recommended that players, coaches, umpires/referees, trainers and first-aid personnel are immunised against Hepatitis B. It is hoped that sporting associations and Clubs will accept the responsibility of encouraging their athletes to be immunised.

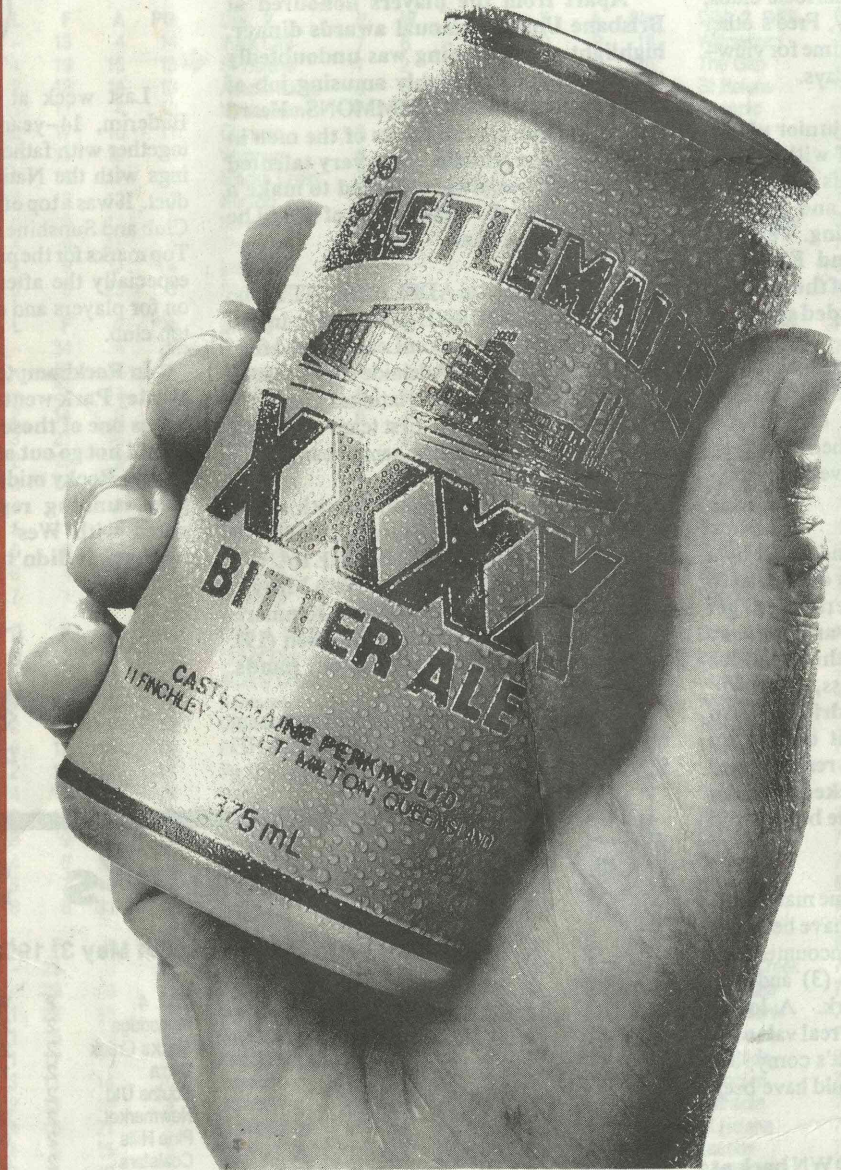
