TEST YOUR KNOWLEDGE QUESTIONS

(b) The colleague to whom the ball is passed is not in an off-side position when it is kicked. (c) The penalty-kick is taken in normal time and the requirements of the Law are satisfied. A42. DEVELOPMENT PLAN ASSURES THE SOUTHSIDE'S FUTURE

With the Brisbane Southern Districts threeyear Development Plan firmly in place, the future of the game on the South Side looks assured.

The plan, devised by the Brisbane Southern Districts Director of Coaching and Assistant State DOC, Peter Kelly, will incorporate clubs, representative teams and schools. The plan will be fully operational by the end of 1992.

"My aim is to ensure all clubs are serviced and equipped to handle the changing requirements of the game," Mr Kelly said.

"I want to establish a network of trained personnel to ensure that players and coaches develop at a rate which matches their requirements and abilities."

Despite their slow start to the premiership, Brisbane Croatia are now consolidating in the top four and pose a threat for opponents in coming weeks.

His counterpart Stuart Woodruffe had everything thrown at him in the second half, but he held firm and the Rivers strikers again had nothing to show for their efforts.


This result alters the table substantially with Mt Gravatt now going into a more accustomed mid-table. But for Pine Rivers. the slide continues.


There are definitely no runaways in the XXXX League at present, too many teams are erratic in their weekly form. North Star appear to have an edge at

What is Soccer Fitness? Selby Says

(Part II)



What fitness level do our players require?

General fitness requirements will be related to the level of competition the team is playing in.

Top National League player average -

11,500 metres-plus.

There is no advantage in being at World Cup fitness levels, or more importantly spending the time and effort trying to reach World

Cup fitness, if you are going to play local soccer.

Our players only need to be 10 per cent fitter than the top team they will play against.

How do we know what that fitness level is?

Guess, give an objective opinion.

- Use other people's data, which may or may not be relevant.
- Call on our previous experience, or Conduct a "match analysis".

Record distances that players cover in a game.

Match analysis provides us with relatively accurate and specific information on our team.

It gives us fact, not uncertain opinion. These are recorded facts that players can't argue with.

Running analysis data can be recorded by using film, video, cassette recorders, recorded commentary or pencil and paper

Where and how do we start?

- Determine the players'/team's fitness requirements
- Evaluate the players' current fitness level
- Understand how to improve the different energy systems so that the desired fitness level is achieved
- Prepare the season's program

Jim Selby - State Director of Coaching

We can evaluate players' current fitness level by:

Guessing

Looking at the player

Asking "What has he/she been doing in the off season"

Playing a small side game or

Conducting a simple battery of tests which will evaluate the components of soccer fitness (endurance, strength, power, speed, flexibility, agility).

Remember at this stage in the season, we are only looking at evaluating a player's "starting point" for the commencement of running fitness activities.

As coaches we may use these results to:

- Evaluate the training program
- Organise efficient training groups
- Assess player profile: strengths/weaknesses
- Assess capabilities in playing position: systems/tactics

Motivate players

Tests should be conducted several times throughout the season, using the same procedure and distances each time.

Players should also be aware that their physiological condition

before the test should be similar each time.

It is important that factors affecting the accuracy or validity of the test should always be monitored and taken into consideration when the tests are interpreted. For example, environmental conditions such as wind, rain and heat should be considered, as should players' condition - pre-season, coming back after injury, sickness, cold, motivation.

Always look at test results in a positive and useful manner. Use the test result as a "tool" to maintain or achieve desirable performances. Players should always benefit from being assessed.

NOTE: Test results must be collated with the player's match performance to obtain a fair and accurate assessment.




