Editorial

We are all keenly awaiting the announcement of the Queensland squad to play NSW in the State of Origin double-header on the Queen's Birthday weekend in June.

The stage is perfectly set for Queensland to steal a march over the Blues on the series opener at Perry Park on Saturday night, June 6.

June 6 just happens to be Queensland Day and with the Perry Park crowd behind them, the Queenslanders are destined to produce their very best.

The psychological advantage of a first-up win will be very important, as the second match is set down for Monday, June 8, across the border at Lismore.

Looking back through the interstate matches played between the two States, you have to go back to season 1962 to find where Queensland had multiple cracks at New South Wales.

The 1962 showdown was played over three matches which saw NSW make a clean sweep

of the series 3-1 in Brisbane, 3-2 and 4-3 in Sydney.

Queensland did however salvage some pride in the season of '62 by outpointing both Victoria and South Australia.

This time round Queensland will strike a NSW outfit still licking the wounds inflicted during last season's 2-0 defeat.

They will be out to square the ledger at any cost. But if the Queenslanders can reproduce the local pride displayed by Brisbane United in the NSL, our chances look good in the Origin series.

Q50. If a player who has taken a goal kick properly, intentionally plays the ball with the hand when the ball has left the penalty-area but before it has been touched by another player, what is the decision?

Q51. If a referee cautions a player who in turn apologises for his misconduct, can the referee omit to report the incident?

ANSWERS

A44. No. **A (i)45** He asks for another ball and re-starts the game by dropping the ball. **(ii)45** If the penalty-kick is being taken in extended time (see Universal Guide-Law XIV, decision 8) and the ball strikes the goalpost and/or crossbar the game ends. **A46.** After having taken the appropriate action in relation to the offence the referee should drop the ball. If the misconduct took place inside the penalty area he must not award a penalty-kick because the ball was not in play at the time the offence was committed. **A47.** Yes. **A48.** He should caution the player or order him off the field and re-start the game by a throw-in. **A49.** The

referee should award a corner kick provided that, in the case of the free kick in the penalty area, the ball has already gone into play, otherwise the free kick inside the penalty area must be re-taken **A50.** A direct free-kick should be awarded to the opposite side. **A51.** No, all cautions must be reported.

COMMENT

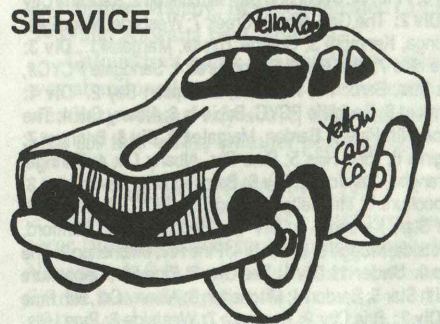

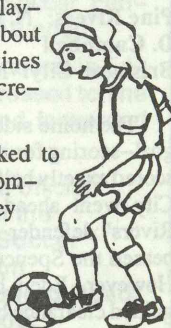

QUEENSLAND SECONDARY SCHOOLS SOCCER FEDERATION

With many private secondary schools getting into the act, the Queensland Secondary Schools Soccer Federation has dropped the word "State" from its title.

The 1992 QSSS championships will be held from July 22-25 — the boys in Toowoomba (Wanderers club) and the girls at Ipswich (Coalstars).

Queensland has produced some fine talent and many national junior representatives.

Queensland supplied eight of the undefeated Australian secondary schools girls side which remained undefeated on their tour of the UK and Ireland during the Christmas break.

The boys managed just one representative — Glenn Waddingham from Cairns — in the boys side which won two of their three internationals.

The Commonwealth Bank Bill Turner Cup is back, with 72 teams from Queensland in the draw — more than rugby league's Commonwealth Bank Cup. But, like soccer everywhere in this country, we do not yet have the

profile to attract the big dollars league gets.

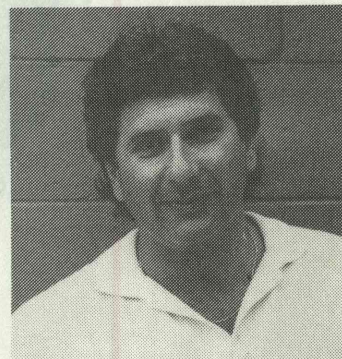

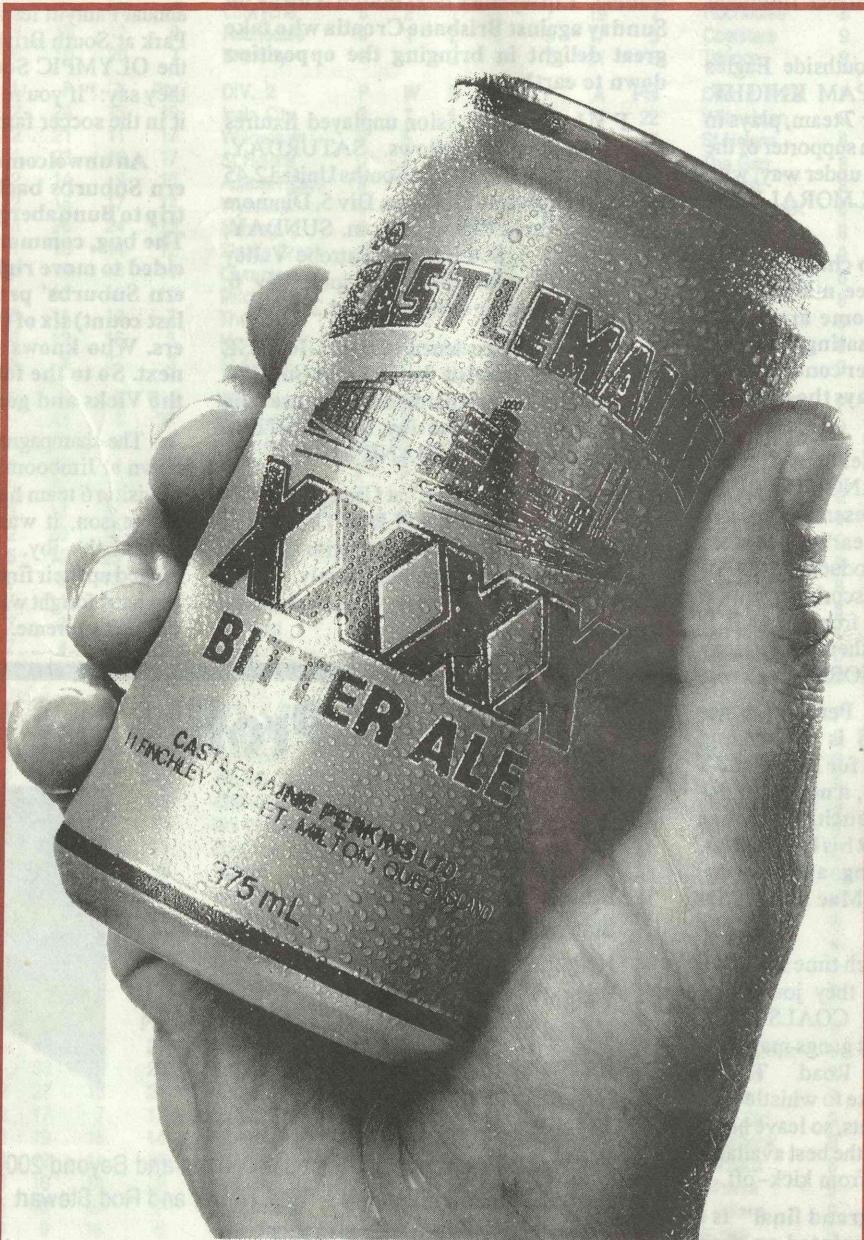
