

JUST WHEN IS 'CALLING' A CRIME

"Leave it!"
"Give it here!"
"My ball, Bob!"
Peep!

"Wassamatter ref? You didn't bother when they called ... and they didn't call a name like I did?"

"Your shout put an opponent off but theirs didn't."

And thereby hangs a tale of misunderstanding. For nowhere in the Laws of the Game is "calling" mentioned: with or without a name being part of it. So why do players demand a free kick when an opponent shouts such phrases as those above? Why do referees award an indirect free kick for the "offence". Indeed, if "calling" isn't mentioned in the Laws, then what right have they to penalise?

In general, referees will award an indirect free kick for "calling" if they feel that an opponent's concentration has been materially affected by the shout.

I once had an incident where a player reacted to calls of "leave it Pete" or "right wing, Pete" and doing exactly as instructed. He'd played with these same lads every Sunday for a couple of years. The trouble was, this was Saturday afternoon and today they were his opponents. As soon as I realised what was happening, I gave an indirect free kick. "But I called a name – Pete" said the opponent, a little tongue in cheek.

So, what was I penalising? Ungentlemanly conduct, which is covered by Law 12. Indeed, under the Laws I should also have cautioned him, but here I applied Law 19. (Incidently, for those of you who don't know,

there are only 18 Laws in Football. The oft-quoted Law 19 is simple "use common sense".)

I have heard some referees penalise "calling" as "verbal obstruction", but obstruction is defined as "running between the opponent and the ball or interposing the body so as to form an obstacle to an opponent". "Ungentlemanly conduct" is not defined in the Laws, but International Board decision 11 says "Any player...whose conduct is ungentlemanly...is guilty of an offence, and shall be dealt with according to the nature of the offence committed." International Board Decisions, incidentally, do not apply only to Internationals, but to all matches, and are as much a part of the Laws of the Game as the main 18.

Too many teams are relying on one or two players to deliver the goods. There is simply not enough team spirit in some sides to take the responsibility of shooting for goal.


Will these teams be found out, when their strikers do take a holiday for whatever reason? Only time will tell.

KELLYS CORNER

An Anatomy of a Good Coach



As we watch each World Cup come and go, we notice the game is changing. As coaches, we must adapt to those changes, especially if you are involved with young players Under 7 to Under 19.

Coaches have a responsibility to give these youngsters the very best chance of making it to the top level.

Soccer coaching is an art and the art of coaching must first begin with the knowledge level of the coach as from this everything else stems.

The best players do not always make good coaches and not all the best coaches have outstanding playing records.

Pictured left is some artwork showing the anatomy of a good coach. You will also notice that knowledge of growth and development is the first one listed.

As a coach, whether club, city, zone, State or national you are a development coach to players right up to the age of 19 years.

It must be understood that the development of players and teams, into players and teams which are capable of playing soccer correctly and having sound techniques and good understanding of implementation of principles, is the most important thing and that winning is placed as a secondary importance. Don't get me wrong, all teams go out to win. But it should be within the confines of playing good soccer and putting into practice what they have learned.

Too many times during training sessions, coaches will work with their players on different aspects of the game, only to revert to a "win at all costs" attitude when match day comes around.

One of the main reasons for this is the fact that the coach's ego is damaged if his team loses. Let's stop judging a coach on his position in the table and look at whether his players are developing technically and tactically. Let's leave our egos at home and start understanding that development is the name of the game.

THE LIFE AND TIMES OF A LOGAL HERO:

Part

Today, in the first of two articles, we reprint a story published in the prestigious English newspaper, The Times. The author, Alan Bleasdale, recalls how a schools team he once coached, Huyton Boys, came from virtually nowhere to win the English schools' football trophy.

In his squad were two very familiar names: one very high on the prestige listing in the English First Division, the other, a very popular and talented player, now playing here in

Brisbane.

The story runs over two pages of the Times, but has been edited to cover the section relevant to the Queensland connection.

"At the start of their final year, I knew that Huyton Boys were a good team. They had already won a tournament involving all the town and city teams in south-west Lanca-shire. But privately I knew that, to have any chance in the English Schools' Trophy, we desperately needed two defenders and a centre forward of the highest calibre.

Whereupon one of those happy accidents occurred. Until the start of that year, the local grammar school had always deemed its stu-

dents to be above and beyond the rough and tumble associated with being among the town's secondary modern schools. A more enlightened headmaster arrived at the school, and three grammar school boys arrived at training one night. I can vividly recall being told the news that lunchtime and making a silent prayer to the patron saint of blackboards that this wise educationalist, if not God, would send me two centre halves and a centre forward.

The only other contribution I would want to take credit for was the appointment of the team captain. It was clear throughout their first year together that there was no individual in that age group who was an obvious leader.

Ironically, there was a boy in the squad who would later develop into an outstanding, aggressive and inspirational leader of men – Peter Reid, the former Everton and England star, now manager of Manchester City. But in his childhood, brilliant prospect though he was, he was too shy and reserved to stamp his authority other than on the opposition."




