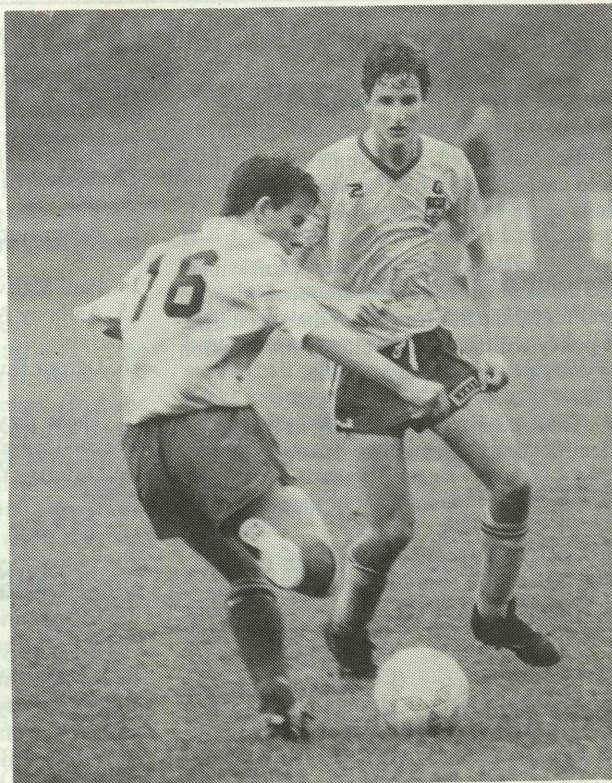
Taringa Rovers 4 v North Star 0

Consistency, an activity that no club has attained this season in the XXXX League.

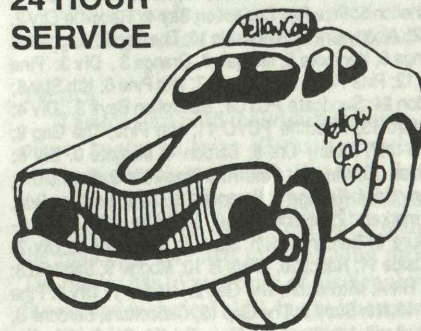

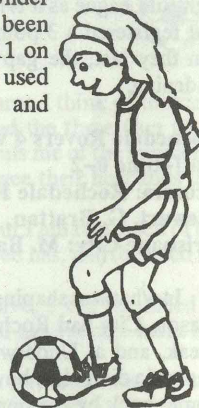

Women's Soccer



All is in readiness for the State Titles to be held next weekend at the Gold Coast. While this will be the 15th State Titles, it will be the first under the auspices of Women's Soccer Queensland - being truly representative of the entire state.

No fixtures will be held this coming weekend in Brisbane and this should enable many players to take a drive to the coast to see the top performers in action.

From the State Titles the Queensland Junior Team will be announced. This team will compete in the National Titles in Renmark in South Australia in the first week of July. After seeing some of the young talent in last year's State Titles, I'm sure Mr Bob White, the Junior Coach, will have a hard time deciding just who will make this team. It's great to see the

abundance of talent coming through the junior ranks.

Also selected at the State Titles will be the Youth and Open Queensland Squads, who will begin training for final selection in these teams some time in August. The Youth team will compete in the National Titles in Hobart from 6 to 12 September and the National Open Titles will be held in Brisbane, at Atlanta Field, from 20 to 26 September.

Brisbane Fixtures

On the local scene, the race to the top of the 1st Division ladder is on, with Brisbane City and Coalstars putting in their claims. Brisbane City drew 2-2 with Eastern Suburbs on the weekend and Coalstars defeated Wynnum 8-0. Acacia Ridge seem to have their mind back on track with a strong 7-1 win over Newmarket after losses to Easts and Coalstars, while Lions defeated Tiwiwarren 3-1. All in all, I think this year's competition is going to be a lot closer than it has been for a long time.

Night fixtures have begun at Capalaba with the Juniors (under 16) competing against 2nd Division. Brisbane City, Souths and North Star are finding it hard to keep up to this young junior side. Youth games against 1st Division will commence also at Capalaba within a few weeks after the squad has been selected at the State Titles.

METHODS OF COACHING SOCCER

In order to make progress in soccer, it is necessary that training practice is closely related to match play. Training and the match have a reciprocal effect: the match indicates what we should practise, and during training we practise what we need for the match. Thus, methodical coaching is built on the requirements of match play, and through repetitive training we obtain improved match play.

The best instrument of instruction is the match itself, which shows us better than anything else how we should practise, in which way and to which extent. The coach who bases his teaching on the situations which the players meet in a match will eventually succeed in reaching improvement.

Physical Fitness

Each kind of sport has its specific requirements concerning fitness. The fitness required of the soccer player is different from that required in other sports, e.g. baseball or swimming. In soccer, fitness is not everything. Nevertheless the game is nothing without the components of soccer fitness:

- a. endurance or stamina
- b. quickness or speed
- c. strength and power
- d. mobility, flexibility (gymnastically inclined)

Technique

To be physically fit is only one step on the way to becoming a good footballer. Much more important is the ability to control the ball in every situation, at maximum speed and under the pressure of opponents. Technical skill can be improved by three stages:

- a. Standing position or slow motion; 50% strength and power
- b. Whilst running, until top-speed
- c. Under pressure of an opponent/head up

Tactics

Tactics start with individual training. The player begins to learn all that is required to obtain possession of the ball, and to keep it away from his opponent. Through tactics, the physical encounter of two opposing teams in the match is elevated to a thinking process. The player has to make use of his/her physical fitness and technical skill, but he/she must add the thinking that leads to combinations with the players' colleagues. Tactical exercises are combined exercises which improve fitness, skill and teamwork. The tactics listed below are the most important factors in soccer training.

- a. Individual tactics
- b. Group tactics
- c. Team tactics

Last week, Alan Bleasdale recounted in his story (reproduced from The Times, England) the formation of his school team, Huyton Boys, in their quest to win the prestigious English schools' trophy.

One of the players in his squad was Peter Reid, now player-manager of Manchester City. The other player who stood out, is now here in Brisbane. Reprinted below is Part II of this most interesting story.

"There was however, Frank Pimblett. He played mid-field alongside Peter (Reid). And Peter will be the first to tell you that Frank was the most notable schoolboy footballer he has ever seen. Scouts and managers from football league clubs compared him favourably to Duncan Edwards, the great and tragic Busby Babes prodigy of the '50s. He was powerful, tireless, two-footed, strutting and combative. A clear leader. However, Frank was a year younger than everyone else in the squad.

Nobody had ever heard of the expression "peer-group pressure" 20 years ago, but we all knew what it meant in reality. It would have been fine for a 23-year old to captain a team of 24-year-olds, but it had rarely, if ever, been known in schoolboy football for a 13-year old to be the captain of a team whose members were all a year older.

Frank was, for me, the obvious captain, but how would the rest of the team, who off-field kidded him about being the runt of their

litter, take to being led on to the field by a boy not only a year younger, but also, once the boots were off, almost as unassuming and modest as Peter?

The only pressures, inevitably, came from my peer group. Fellow schoolmasters and football coaches raised eyebrows and objections and questioned my sanity, while the rest of the team simply raised their game under Frank's leadership. It had been plain to them for some time that he had the stature to overcome his age.

The year after he captained Huyton Boys, Frank went on to play for England Boys throughout the season. He was signed by Aston Villa amid strong rumours of thousands and thousands of under-the-counter pounds being offered for his services by almost every major league club in the land. At the age of 17 he made his debut for Aston Villa in the League Cup, the FA Cup and the Football League, all within the space of seven days.

Before he was 18, Frank was finished with the game. Actually, the game had finished with him. There were rumours, but on this occasion they were of indiscipline and drink and hasty marriage.

Today, from what I hear, the very best of his generation, still only 34, is making a loose attempt at a kind of living in Australia. I can barely type these words without tears, for I lost a very special brother when Frank chose to lose himself, but more importantly, the sporting world missed the fulfilment of a colossal talent."

Frank Pimblett, whilst unaware the story was being told, and reproduced in the Times was fully in favour of its second reproduction in this magazine.

He makes it quite clear that he is always willing to offer guidance, and any assistance, to up-and-coming young players, something he sorely missed in his early years of involvement in the code.

Frank was, and still is, one of the gentlemen of the code and a player many should strive to emulate through his dedication and subsequent improvement in skill to the point where even at the "ripe" age of 35, Frank is still dominating every playing field he graces. We hope you have enjoyed the story of the Huyton Boys team, and we thank Bobby Ford for his assistance in preparing this story.

DID YOU KNOW?

Australia's first entry as a soccer team into the Games was in 1956 when Melbourne played host? Australia played two matches, defeating Japan 2-0 (with local Graham McMillan one of the scorers) and losing to India 2-4.


Queensland had five representatives in the first Australian Olympic team, Graham McMillan, Col Kitching, Al Warren, Brian Vogler and Cliff Sander.

One of Australia's opponents in Group D is Ghana, a relative unknown at this level. But given the upsurge in both interest and development in soccer in all African Nations, they certainly won't be easy. In fact, out of the three qualifiers from Africa, Egypt and Morocco being the others, Ghana is strongly favoured to be among the medals. A large number of their players already play for clubs in Belgium, Italy and Germany. Emmanuel Duah (Torino) was the scorer of the winning goal in the Under 17 World Cup final last year.

Great to see the front page of The Australian last Thursday, where Aussie skipper Ned Zelic was pictured with five-year-old sister Lucy. A big story completed the recognition for our Olympic team. Zelic, 20, is one of only four of the team who will be touring North and South America over the next four weeks with the senior Socceroos. The others are keeper John Filan and defenders Milan Blagojevic and Tony Vidmar. After such a strenuous tour with matches against the US, Argentina and Chile, they will be well and truly sharpened up for the Games which commence in late July. JG

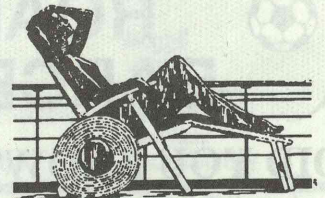

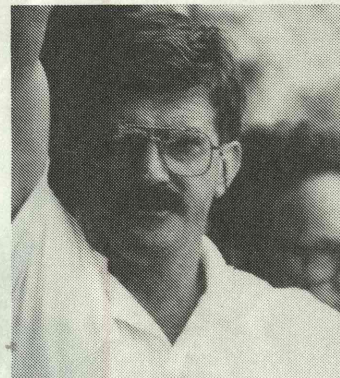

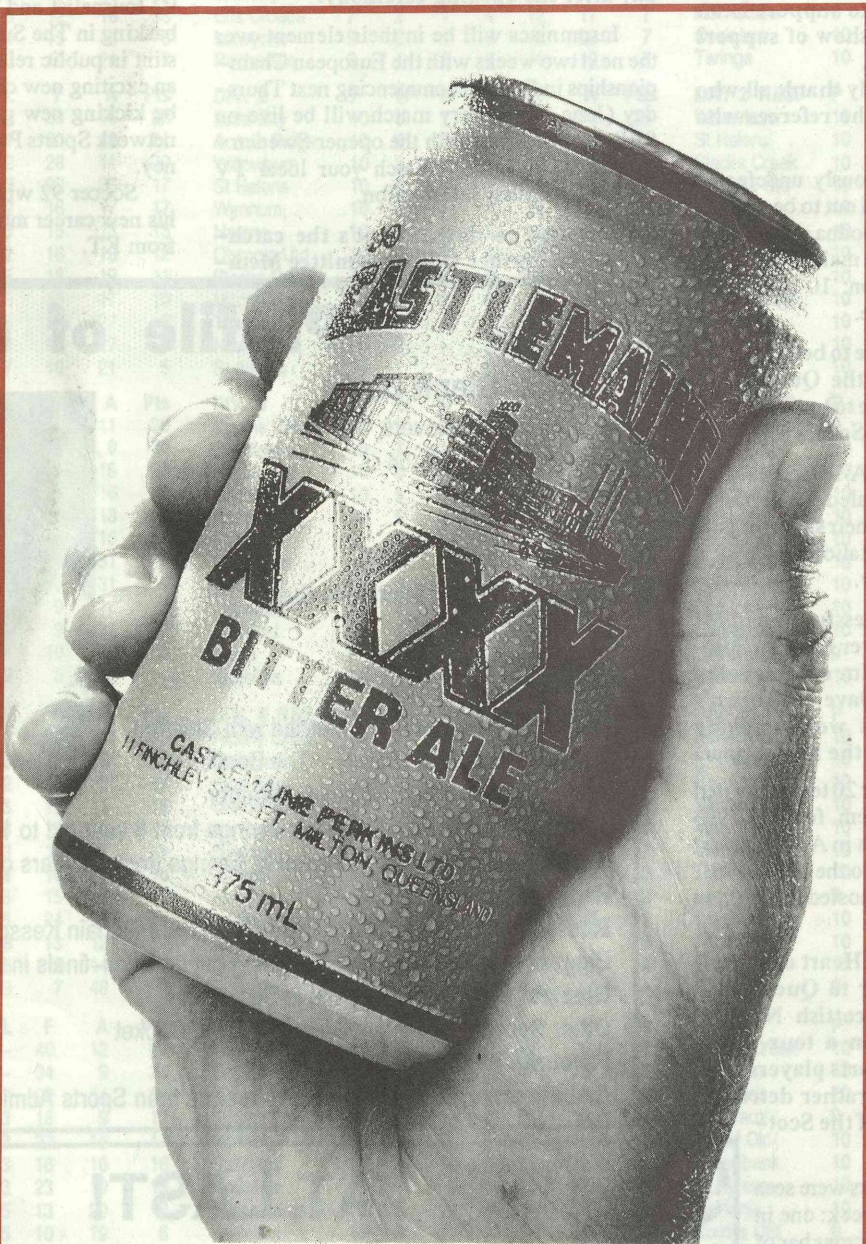
