Soccer's entry into the illustrious circles of the QAS will allow the coaching staff of the Queensland Soccer Federation to comb the State looking for young talent which can be placed within future development programs to guide their progress.

The first intake of youngsters will be in the 15-18 years age bracket, although this bracket will be extended in years to come.

The Academy is all about bigger and better achievement, all of which will give Queensland soccer a real professional approach to identifying young talent for the world's greatest game.

We must thank the State Government's Department of Sport, Tourism and Racing for recognising the QSF proposal to be included into the Queensland Academy of Sport.

Soccer was one of a select band of just

three sports (the others being cricket and rugby union) to get the call-up.

Acceptance into the QAS has not come without a lot of hard work and planning by the State Director of Coaching, Jim Selby, and his assistant Peter Kelly.

Through their joint efforts, the Queensland Soccer Federation has now adopted a very positive direction on coaching throughout the State.

Now might also be an appropriate time to peruse the fertile playing fields of secondary schools where other sports have set up Schools of Excellence, with the help of the Department of Education.

These are the specialty schools which provide excellence in facilities and coaching for youngsters to pursue excellence in sports such as golf, tennis, Australian football, gymnastics, rugby league and rugby union.

Why not soccer?

It's something which certainly bears thinking about.

XXXX LEAGUE ROUND TO DECIDE CUP QUALIFIERS

This weekend's XXXX Soccer League fixtures double as the final qualifying matches in the 1992 Queensland Cup Series, involving 18 teams.

Six provincial centres - Cairns, Townsville, Rockhampton, Maryborough, Bundaberg and Gold Coast - together with the 12 XXXX League teams will have played two matches each to determine who qualifies for the semi-finals in July.

Each of the six country centres has hosted two different XXXX League teams with mixed results. Round 14 of the XXXX League will double as the second qualifying match for the XXXX League clubs.

In the event the XXXX fixture ends in a draw, penalties will then be taken to determine Cup qualifiers.

Teams will still share a point each towards their XXXX League Premiership.

The first match for newly appointed coach Bobby Hamilton saw his team pick up a point against visitors Eastern Suburbs.

This one point gave hope that a resurgence of form and confidence was around the corner, but more importantly enabled City to edge one point further up from neighbours Thistle. Easts' goal-scoring problem has still yet to be rectified.

Rochdale were better able to keep their mind on football, and the result was a convincing win over bottom-placed Thistle.

The Rovers forward line really clicked into gear in the second half with the Irish duo, together with State player Darren Hillier all netting. Thistle's goal came from the much travelled former junior from Lanham Park, Jeffery Jasch.

Thistle's woes continue, and their lack of adequate finishers is more apparent in every match.

Another heartbreak for Coalstars when, for their second successive away match, they were defeated right on the siren. A scramble in the goal mouth ended with Kevin Meacock prodding home to give Brisbane Croatia the three points and leave Coalstars pointless once again.

The best goal of the match was scored by the losing side, two minutes before half-time, when a 45 metre cross-field ball from left fullback Mark Gilbert found Mark Brusasco diving full length past Croatia keeper Bobby Harrison. Their joy was short lived, as Brisbane Croatia came back strongly in the second half to have one-time Coalstars striker Harry Makridakis equalising 20 minutes in, and Meacock later ensuring the three points went back to Rocklea.

This leaves Coalstars stranded in 10th place, but can Brisbane Croatia be consistent and apply pressure on the top teams?

football played. Indeed there were some flashes of brilliance from both sides, and mid-fields were dominant. However both sides fell away when it came to the strike zones.

John Brown scored as early as the fourth minute on a breakaway, and his second was seven minutes from the end when he capitalised on a sloppy back pass. It was 2-0 to Mt Gravatt before North Star put their name on the score sheet through a Glen Archer penalty when Steve Bullock was allegedly fouled in the box.

Not an entirely convincing performance from either side. North Star's strikers are strangely deficient in their hunger for goal, and as for Mt Gravatt: if John Brown is unable to play for any reason, they could also be in trouble.

Few chances came City's way, but one of the few that did, was duly put away by Chris Hardie.

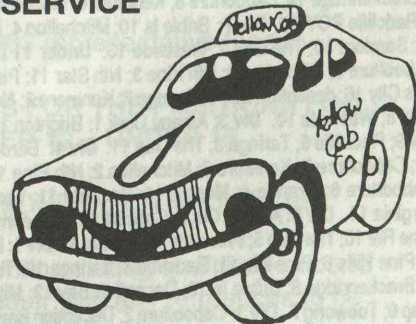
Two matches, two goals. For the Tigers, the two goal scorers from last week gave a carbon copy performance. This time however their opposition also put away the same number of goals to finish all square.

Divisional Review

Division 4

The composition of this Division is currently in three distinct groups, - two teams starting to breakaway - a very compacted and congested middle - and two at the bottom.

At the top, are two clubs just recently relegated from Division 3, Albany Creek last year, and University the previous year.

After a moderate start to the season, University now currently lead, a position they have alternated with the ambitious Albany Creek Club. On form and potential these two probably will regain their Third Division status.

Pine Hills and Clairvaux, third and fourth respectively are, at present, inconsistent, their next two to three matches will determine if they are indeed a real threat for promotion.

Neighbours Kenmore Rangers and Moggill are currently mid-table, with the progressive Kenmore favoured to finish the highest in

the table and possibly a Semi-Final place.

For the next three clubs, Virginia, Deception Bay and neighbours Brighton, results must be morale-sapping for their supporters, all three clubs were riding high a few weeks ago, and then came a form slump. This area of the table appears to be a permanent one for the clubs this year.

Southside Eagles, a club with limited player-drawing potential, had a disastrous start to the season, and now appears to be heading for safety, which is the only thing they can aim for, this season at least.

Another very progressive club with good facilities, North Pine looks to be in trouble, their next two games are against the leaders, they could well be stranded, if they are unsuccessful in gaining at least a point in each match.

For Brothers United, who came 12th in Division 3 in 1991, that would appear to be their final position in Division 4 in 1992 come September.

Division 7

A Division comprising only one team that is the senior team for a Club, and that is Bethania Rams, currently in second position and looking to be in Division 6 next year.

The Gap, comprising some stars of yesteryear, is currently 5 points clear and is also looking to sew up promotion yet again. A rare tussle is going on for the Semi-Final placings from Mitchelton, Souths United, Salisbury and Ipswich City, all of whom will fight this out to the end of the year.

For Redcliffe, Wynnum and Loganholme, safety will be their main aim, and for the latter club, the hopes that their senior team in Division 6 will gain promotion and a higher status for this relatively new Club.

The bottom three, Oxley, Annerley and Leichhardt Eagles, all teams struggling for players, survival seems only a forlorn hope. At least one of these teams could well disappear next year, if 1992 results are a pointer.

STATE YOUTH SQUAD

When selecting the Youth squad at the recent State Titles, coach Guenter Pfuhl stated that he had never before had the choice of such a large number of talented players. He said coaches in country areas were to be congratulated on the rising standard of play, especially among the Youth and Junior players. 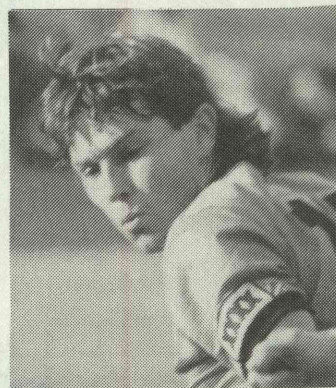

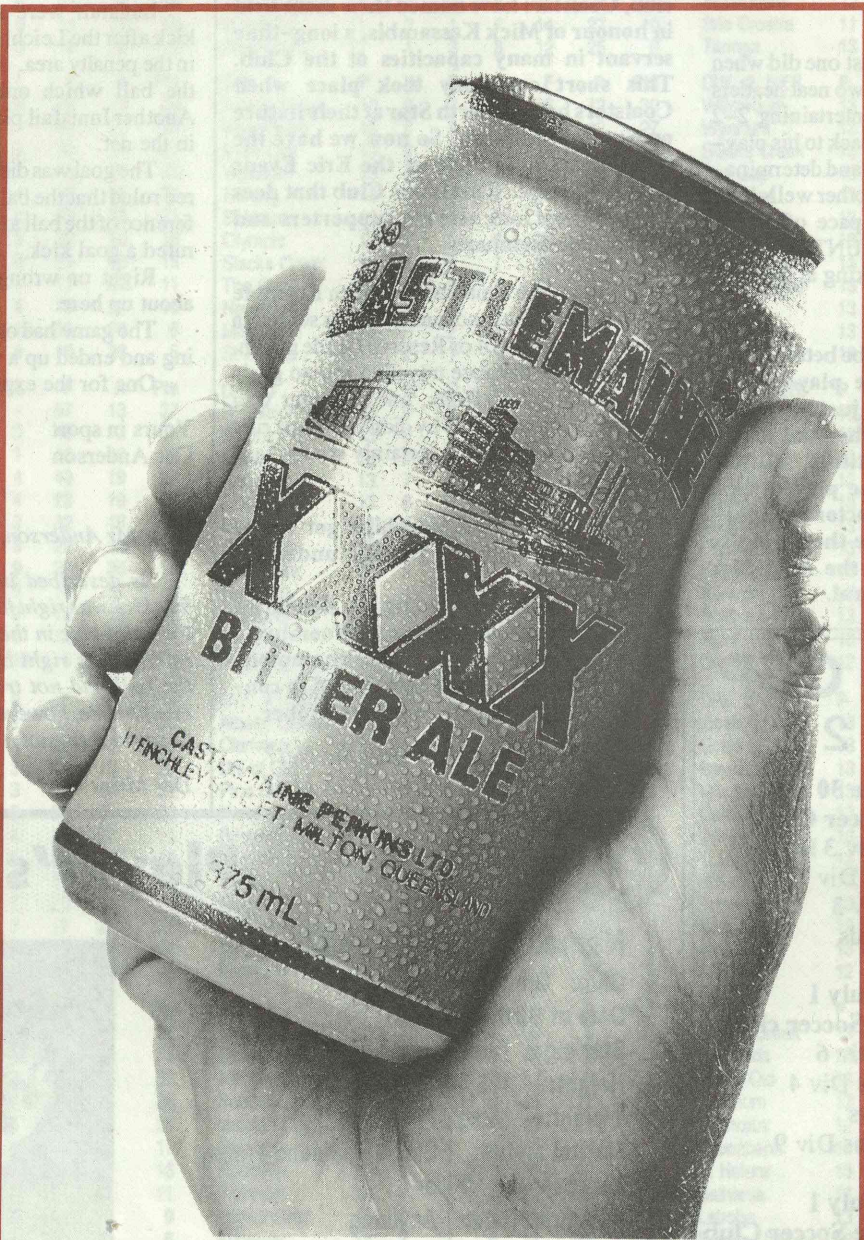
