The two goal-scorers in this game were not household names in the XXXX League prior to this match, but they are certainly well known now. Such was the importance of this result.

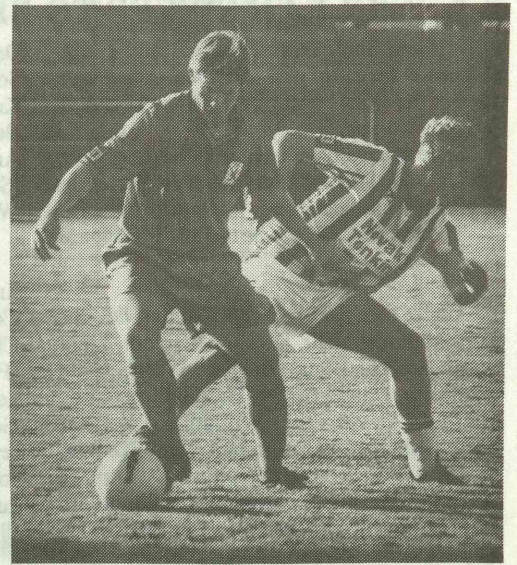

XXXX League battlers Coalstars have forced their way into calculations for the prestigious Queensland Cup, despite their lowly first division ranking.

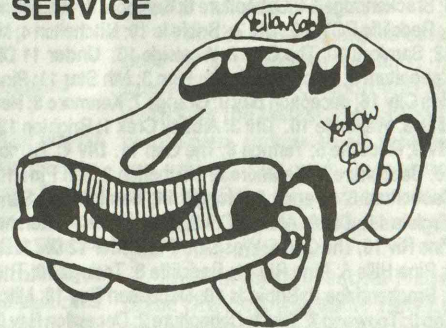
The Queensland Cup replaced the Ampol Cup as soccer's premier State-wide competition. Eastern Suburbs, North Star and Coalstars finished level at the top of the ladder on six points, while goal difference gave Rochedale Rovers the edge over four other teams with four points.

Country sides, Far North Queensland and North Queensland were among those who finished with four competition points, but they were denied a semi-final spot on goal difference. The semi-finals will be played at a mid-week double header later this month with the final set down for Saturday night, August 8, at Perry Park. The semi-finals draw will be announced next week.

SEQ had been one of the form teams of the titles, but the well-drilled city side were consistent all week in scoring 20 goals and conceding none. Brisbane South won five games and drew their sixth during the week-long championships.

South Burnett followers were delighted when the South West Queensland team, which contained three South Burnett players, defeated Central Queensland 1-0 in the play-off for third.

These titles were the largest yet of four undertaken at Kingaroy in the last four years and were run like clockwork, thanks to South Burnett Junior Soccer Association president John Lang, his members and titles co-ordinator Mrs Irene Patterson of the Qld Junior Soccer Council.

QJSC President Bill Frith commended all associated with the running of these titles, after attending the final two days of the event.

include 32 matches, all of them in the evening due to the summer heat and humidity. Some matches will commence as late as 9:30pm local time.

There are a number of sides favoured to win a medal, and while the superpowers of world soccer such as Italy, Spain and Sweden should always be respected, the Olympics and World Youth Cup have a habit of turning the spotlight on to so-called "third world nations".

To this end, teams such as Ghana, Australia, Egypt and South Korea, can all be considered dark horses for the tournament. Parochialism aside, Australian on its recent performances both at the last Olympic Games in 1988, as well as qualifying for this event, must be considered a good chance to get through to the semi-finals. Let us hope popular opinion is right.

With the 1992 Olympics being held in a European country, no guessing as to which sport will sell its tickets the fastest. In football-mad Spain, tickets to all matches are selling fast and it wouldn't surprise if the biggest crowds of the whole Olympics appear at the qualifying matches.

Even in the non-soccer Nation of the USA, crowds at the 1984 Los Angeles Olympics football matches drew the biggest attendance of all sports contested.

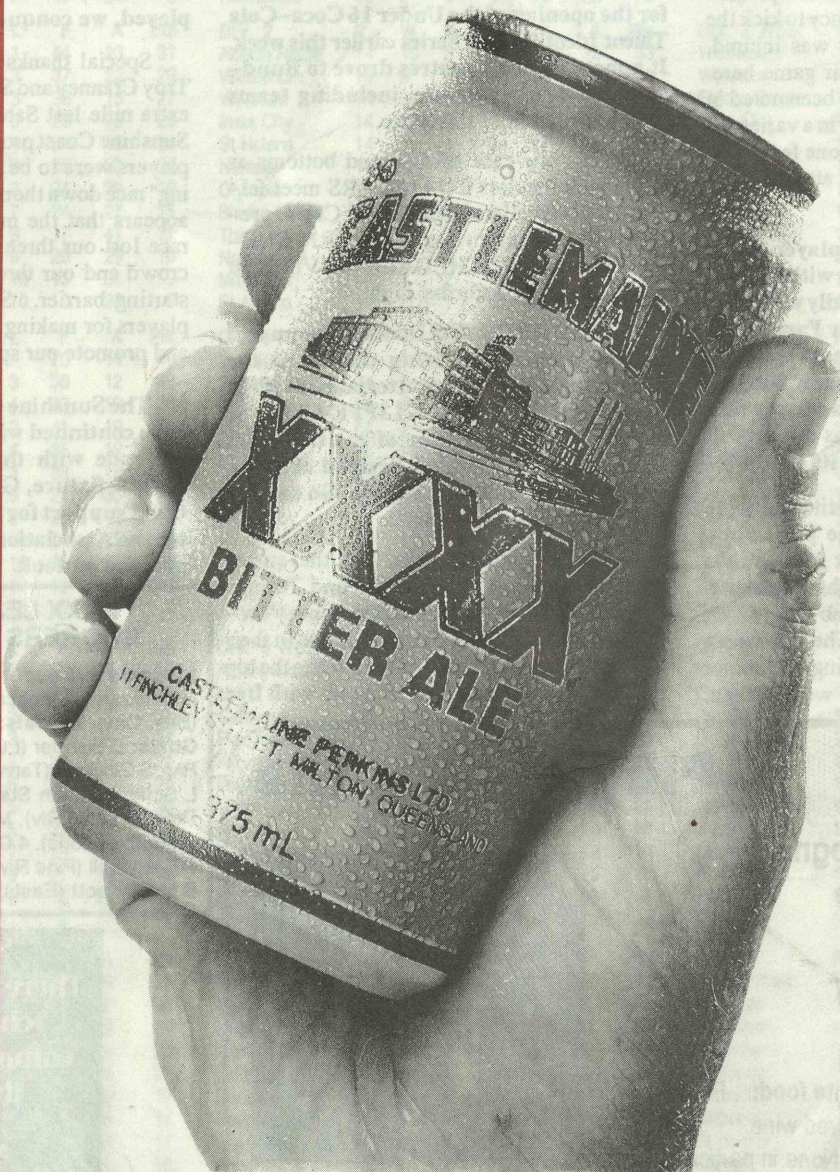
