The joint leaders of the XXXX League started full of enthusiasm and hunger for goals, and opened the scoring in only the sixth minute. Michael Brockwell struck a stunning opening goal for the Stars, and while his team ended up losing the match, he can have the consolation of knowing it was the goal of the game. Easts came back quickly and with only 15 minutes gone were 2-1 in the lead. Captain McDermott's near-post header in the second half sewed up a finals berth for the Tigers, and left North Star with the premiership to be their main priority for this season.

After two good warm-up matches, both in results and in style of play, against other Olympic teams, the Aussies lost their opening qualifying match 1-3 to medal favourites Ghana.

Australia defeated Group A side Kuwait 4-2, and Group B's Paraguay 2-0, before the Games started.

Down 0-1 at half-time the Aussies poured forward in the second half to try to equalise, leaving the inevitable holes at the back. Ghana eventually took advantage and with one of their rare breakaways, made it 0-2.

While the score was disappointing, there were many positive things to come out of the match. The Aussies maintained their composure and ball control. Milan Blagojevic and Dominic Longo were a revelation at the back and were always prepared to come forward. However, a couple of unlucky bounces and deflections was all it took for Ghana to assert themselves.

FIFA puts great store in its "fair play" competitions that are conducted in their World events, such as the World Cup and Olympic Games. Already two nations are disqualified from the current one: host country Spain and Colombia. In their bitter Group B match, four players were sent off and a number of cautions issued.

Some heavy tackling throughout the tournament, particularly one potential ankle-breaking double-foot tackle by a Ghana player on Australia's Shaun Murphy, has highlighted what players all over the world already knew. Referees are inconsistent in their application of the Laws of the Game.

It is to be hoped that FIFA'S new crackdown does not make a mockery of the Olympic soccer tournament, as it did with the 1990 World Cup.

On current viewing, it would appear the referees are yet to come to grips with their new directions.

LAWS OF THE GAME

The International Football Association Board has made a number of amendments to the Laws of the Game and the relevant decisions. All the following amendments reproduced below must be enforced as from July 25, 1992. More amendments to the Laws next week.

LAW IV (Players' Equipment) Present Text: Punishment:

For any infringement of this Law, the player at fault shall be sent off the field of play to adjust his equipment and he shall not return without first reporting to the referee, who shall satisfy himself that the player's equipment is in order; the player shall only re-enter the game at a moment when the ball has ceased to be in play.

New Text: - Punishment:

For any infringement of this Law, the player at fault shall be instructed to leave the field of play by the referee, to adjust his equipment or obtain any missing equipment, when the ball next ceases to be in play, unless by then the player has already corrected his equipment. Play shall not be stopped immediately for an infringement of this Law. A player who is instructed to leave the field to adjust his equipment or obtain missing equipment shall not return without first reporting to the referee, who shall satisfy himself that the player's equipment is in order. The player shall only re-enter the game at a moment when the ball has ceased to be in play.

Reason: This change has been introduced to assist referees in the application of the Law.

LAW V (Referees) - Present Text:

e) From the time he enters the field of play, caution any player guilty of misconduct or ungentlemanly behaviour and, if he persists suspend him from further participation in the game. In such cases the referee shall send the name of the offender to the competent authority, within the stipulated time, and in accordance with the

h) Send off the field of play any player who, in his opinion, is guilty of violent conduct, serious foul play, or the use of foul or abusive language.

New Text:

- e) From the time he enters the field of play, caution and show a yellow card to any player guilty of misconduct or ungentlemanly behaviour. In such cases the referee shall send the name of the offender to the competent authority, within the stipulated time, and in accordance with the provisions set up by the National Association under whose jurisdiction the match was played. Reports will be deemed to be made when received in the ordinary course of post.
- h) Send off the field of play and show a red card to any player who, in his opinion, is guilty of violent conduct, serious foul play, the use of foul or abusive language or who persists in misconduct after having received a caution.

Reason: It was felt necessary to make a specific reference in the Laws of the Game to the yellow and red cards. Therefore, these cards will be mandatory at all levels.

LAW XII (Fouls and misconduct)

(Insert the following new paragraph prior to the second-last para-graph):

On any occasion when a player deliberately kicks the ball to his own goalkeeper, the goalkeeper is not permitted to touch it with his hands, If, however, the goalkeeper does touch the ball with his hands, he shall be penalised by the award of an indirect free kick to be taken by the opposing team from the place where the infringement occurred, subject to the overriding conditions of Law XIII.

A player shall be....

Reason: This change will help to eliminate common time-wasting tactics.

The Board wishes to add the following explanations:

- 1. The word "kicks" in the foregoing text refers only to circumstances where a player plays the ball with the foot or feet.
- Similarly, a deflection with the foot or feet is permitted in circumstances where it is not intentional (involuntary deflection or miskick from a team mate).
- 3. In situations where the ball is deliberately kicked by a team mate away from the goalkeeper (e.g. to the side of the goal), but with the intention that the goalkeeper may collect it, the spirit of the Law is that this would be regarded as an intentional pass to the goalkeeper. Therefore, if in such situations, the goalkeeper touches the ball with his hands, an indirect free kick must be awarded.

SBS WINS WORLD YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIP RIGHTS

The Australian Soccer Federation's National Organising Committee last week announced that Special Broadcasting Service will be the host broadcaster for the 1993 World Youth Championship in Australia next March.

Under the agreement, SBS will telecast all 32 games of the tournament to an estimated international viewing audience of more than 2 billion.

Some 70 countries are expected to take SBS's exclusive coverage during the three-week tournament for the FIFA/Coca-Cola Cup.

In making the announcement, ASF Chairman John Constantine said: "Furthermore, SBS's long-term commitment to soccer, including their extensive coverage of the World Cup, European Championships and last year's FIFA/Coca-Cola Cup in Portugal, their technical experience and on-camera staff were also major contributing factors in the final decision".

This continues the huge amount of air—time given to the code by SBS who also have the rights to cover the World Cup (until 1998), the European Champion's Cup (until 1994), The European Cup Winner's Cup (until 1994), the FA Cup (until 1994), the Scottish Cup (until 1994), as well as, the top leagues from around the world.

The network also has a firm commitment to Australian soccer with a six-year agreement to cover the Coca-Cola Soccer League and Socceroo games while also working in co-operation with the ASF to organise a series of international tournaments in Australia.

As part of the arrangement, SBS has offered the ABC full regional coverage, free of charge.


