A week ago, Australia's Olyroos were struggling, and seemed certain to miss out on a quarter-final berth in the Olympic Tournament.

A 3-1 defeat at the hands of tournament favourites Ghana, and a 1-1 draw with Mexico had left the Olyroos with the task of beating Denmark 3-0 and hoping Ghana would defeat, or at least draw with, Mexico.

Remembering that in their previous match Ghana could only manage a draw against Denmark – the task seemed impossible.

But as we saw when Ned Zelic scored in the last minute against the Netherlands to send the Olyroos to Barcelona, our boys never give up and are ready to achieve the impossible. A 1-1 draw between Ghana and Mexico gave the Olyroos the inch they needed, and they took a mile, stamping their authority on the tournament with an emphatic 3-0 victory over the Danes.

The win set up a quarter-final showdown with the much fancied Swedes but our boys were again dominant and won the match 2-1.

Victory over Sweden places the Olyroos in the top four Under 23 teams in the world, with their semi-final against Poland being played after Soccer 92 went to print.

Whether they win or not, we can all be proud of their achievements. The ramifications of their showing in Barcelona are immense. Australia has certainly arrived on the

International Soccer scene, and the profile of soccer in this country with it.

In the space of 2 years, Australia has finished equal third at the World Youth Championships in Portugal and in the top 4 at Under 23 Level.

This augurs well for the future of soccer in Australia and is a boost in confidence for the Coca-Cola National Soccer League which is producing so many good players.

Australia's goals must now be to succeed at next year's World Youth Cup in Australia and to qualify for the 1994 World Cup in America.

It seems the revival of Australian soccer is well on its way and the sky's the limit.

## CAPALABA TO CROWN 20 YEARS OF ACHIEVEMENT

One of Brisbane South's shining lights, Capalaba Soccer and Recreation Club, will notch a major milestone on Saturday, when it celebrates 20 years of progress.

The club kicked off in 1972 with just four teams. Now 48 sides line up for competition each week, including a remarkable number of youngsters who make this the biggest junior

club in Queensland, and the women's team which was formed in 1978.

Capalaba has produced many junior representative players, some of whom have gone on to play in the XXXX League.

The success of the juniors has put pressure on the senior teams to perform.

Capalaba is fighting hard to overcome its biggest disappointment, of dropping out of Second Division, and the seniors plan to be playing XXXX League within four years.

The forward-looking approach of the club was emphasised by the installation of high-quality lights, which was one of the biggest projects of this 20th year.

The clubhouse extensions will be officially opened on Saturday.

With strong support from Redland Shire Council, two of the main fields will be redeveloped under a three-year program.

The new facilities are a far cry from the days when a truck—mounted generator provided power for the drinks fridge in a tin shed.




