## COMMENT

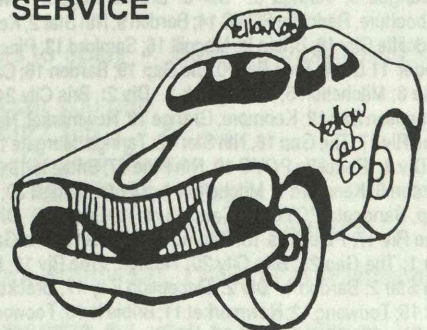

# World Soccer



## EUROPE

After the recently completed European 1992 Championships, UEFA announced a disbursement of profits to the participating nations. A total \$12.08 million will go to each country, with some being paid immediately. The CIS will have to wait, however until the Union of States advises how it will be distributed. Yugoslavia who were banned from participating will still receive approximately \$750,000 to cover their preparation costs.

## YUGOSLAVIA

Former champion club Red Star Belgrade have been decimated by a defection of their star players to other countries. Almost a full team of players have now left, mainly to Italy.

With no European Cups to now participate in, it will be hard for Yugoslavian clubs to now hold on to these players, there are just no incentives for them in the foreseeable future.

## GERMANY

Borussia Dortmund is in the news again, this time for its acquisition of Swede Mats Gren from Swiss club, Grasshoppers. Gren toured Australia earlier this year with the Swedish National team in its three-match series against the Socceroos.

## SPAIN

Due to huge financial problems, the new season could see the farcical situation of the 1992 Cup Winners Atletico Madrid being relegated to Division 2. The Spanish League has set a deadline for all their football clubs to raise a specified amount of capital, in order to stop the perpetual indebtedness of most of the clubs. This capitalisation plan was backed by all Spanish Division 1 and 2 clubs in 1988, but now the day of reckoning has arrived, and more than a few are a long way short of their target. An example: Atletico Madrid were to raise \$275 million and have raised less than 10 per cent of that figure!!

## SOUTH AMERICA

With the World Youth Cup finals less than six months away, the South American countries are only now getting under way with their Championships.

Group A consists of: Argentina, Bolivia, Chile, Colombia, Peru.

Group B consists of: Brazil, Uruguay, Ecuador, Paraguay, Venezuela.

Although Argentina are suspended by FIFA and will not participate in the finals, even if they qualify.

Two teams from the above groups and the qualifying round robin will then compete in Australia next March.

Brisbane, in its 1981 hosting, had Uruguay as one of its participating nations.

## MEXICO

A healthy crowd of 50,000 spectators turned up at the Azteca Stadium the other week. So what, that's not a particularly large crowd for a football match. Only they didn't turn up for a game, but to welcome Hugo Sanchez who has spent the last eight seasons in Spain, mainly with Real Madrid. Sanchez will now play for the America Club, and his return to his home country has been well received by all the fanatical Mexican supporters.

# LAW S OF THE GAME



## Refereeing

with Des Miles

In this column (Vol 3 No.20), it was stated that these laws must be enforced as from July 25. Error, error, malfunction and many apologies. These Laws will only come into effect in October for the National Soccer League competition and thereafter for all other State League competitions from January 1, 1993. Once again very sorry for the panic caused.

### LAW XIII (Free kick)

**Present Text:**

Notwithstanding any other reference in these Laws to the point from which a free kick is to be taken:

1. Any free kick awarded to the defending team, within its own goal area, may be taken from any point within the half of the goal area in which the free kick has been awarded.

2. Any indirect free kick awarded to the attacking team within its opponent's goal area shall be taken from the part of the goal area line which runs parallel to the goal line at the point nearest to where the offence was committed.

**Punishment:**

If the kicker, after taking the free kick, plays the ball a second time before it has been touched or played by another player, an indirect free kick shall be taken by a player of the opposing team from the spot where the infringement occurred. Unless the offence is committed by a player in his opponent's goal area, in which case, the free kick shall be taken from a point anywhere within that half of the goal area in which the offence occurred.

**New Text:**

Notwithstanding any other reference in these Laws to the point from which a free kick is to be taken:

1. Any free kick awarded to the defending team, within its own goal area, may be taken from any point within the goal area.

2. Any indirect free-kick awarded to the attacking team within

its opponents' goal area shall be taken from the part of the goal area line which runs parallel to the goal line, at the point nearest to where the offence was committed.

**Punishment:**

If the kicker, after taking the free kick, plays the ball a second time before it has been touched or played by another player, an indirect free kick shall be taken by a player of the opposing team from the spot where the infringement occurred, unless the offence is committed by a player in his opponent's goal area, in which case, the free kick shall be taken from any point within the goal area.

**Reason:**

This change will help to reduce time wasting and is consistent with the amendment to Law XVI.

### LAW XVI (Goal kick)

**Present text:**

When the whole of the ball passes over the goal-line excluding that portion between the goal-posts, either in the air or on the ground, having last been played by one of the attacking team, it shall be kicked direct into play beyond the penalty-area from a point within that half of the goal-area from a point within that half of the goal-area nearest to where it crossed the line, by a player of the defending team.

(The rest of the Law remains unchanged)

**New text:**

When the whole of the ball passes over the goal-line excluding that portion between the goal-posts, either in the air or on the ground, having last been played by one of the attacking team, it shall be kicked direct into play beyond the penalty area from any point within the goal area by a player of the defending team.

**Reason:**

It is felt that this simplification of the goal-kick rule eliminates one of the common timewasting tactics.
