

Kids should be left alone. Please help us to protect you or your son from poaching coaches.

The reports on the last Talent Identification Series will be debated at the October meeting of the QJSC. Your delegate, City and Country, should be able to canvass suggestions for any improvements on the last Series. It is doubtful if the Bundaberg trip could have been better for some Zone players however. Even so, you may have some suggestion for improvement so let your club secretary know

ENGLAND

French International Eric Cantona scored a hat trick for Leeds United in their 4–3 win over Liverpool in last week's Charity Shield at Wembley Stadium. The match, Leeds' first at Wembley in 18 years was a tremendous pipe-opener to the English season. No fan, be they from Leeds or Liverpool, left Wembley disappointed. Cantona, incidentally, will now almost certainly retire from international football now that his mentor Michel Platini has resigned as National team boss.

AMERICA

The MISL, or Major Indoor Soccer League to use its full formal title, looks like folding, with the departure of yet another two centres in Tacoma and St Louis. This will now leave the USA very much behind the eight ball in development of the code, with the World Cup a mere two years away. Queensland has an affinity with the MISL through their five-match tour in the summer of '89 taking in centres such as Tacoma, St Louis, Dallas, Wichita and Kansas City.

Does the name Antonio Carbajal ring a bell? If you are a World Cup addict, it should. He was the goal-keeper for Mexico's national team and played in a number of World Cups. Nothing unusual in that except Antonio Carbajal played in World Cups in:

1950 – 1954 – 1958 – 1962 – 1966, a record for any player. FIFA have suitably recognised his achievements with an award to celebrate his longevity in the top echelon of football.

DIVISION 9

LAWS OF THE GAME

Continuing from last week's "Laws of the Game", further decisions and instructions were made by FIFA which will impact on the game world-wide.

The FIFA Board also took the following decisions, which are mandatory:

- If a player is sent off for a second cautionable offence in a match, the referee is required to show both the yellow and the red card simultaneously (so that it is obvious that the player is being sent off for the second cautionable offence and not for an offence requiring expulsion).
- 2. The Notes to the Laws of the Game have been slightly amended so as to allow veterans' football (over 35 years of age) to benefit from modifications to the Laws already granted to players under 16 years of age and to women players. The Notes now read as follows:

"Subject to the agreement of the National Association concerned and provided the principles of these Laws are maintained, the Laws may be modified in their application for matches for players of under 16 years of age, for women's football and for veterans' football (over 35 years).

Any or all of the following modifications are permissible:

- a. size of the field of play;
- b. size, weight and material of the ball;
- c. width between the goalposts and height of the cross-bar from the ground;
- d. the duration of the periods of play;
- e. number of substitutions.

Further modifications are only possible with the consent of the International Football Association Board".

FURTHER SPECIFIC INSTRUCTIONS TO THE REFEREES

- A. The Board once more insisted that referees be much stricter when dealing with time-wasting tactics, particularly in the following five situations:
 - 1. The referee must react strictly if the ball is kicked away or carried away with the hands after a free-kick has been given against a player. The guilty player must be cautioned and shown the yellow card.
 - The referee must caution and show the yellow card to any player(s) encroaching from the defensive wall.
 - 3. A player who stands in front of the ball when a free-kick has been given against his team, in order to waste time and to allow his team to organise the defensive wall, must be cautioned and shown the yellow card.
 - 4. The Board insisted that decision 17 to Law XII, introduced in 1991 (control of the ball by the goalkeeper), must be strictly implemented by referees. Some referees have shown a tendency

to avoid its correct application – a situation which can no longer be accepted.

- 5. The Board also insisted that referees strictly enforce Law XII, 5(a) in relation to the number of steps taken by the goalkeepers when they have control of the ball in their hands.
- B. The Board also emphasised that the present situation regarding thermopants (cycling shorts) was unsatisfactory because referees were not enforcing the necessary measures. This instruction, originally issued last year, is therefore reproduced below:

"The International F.A. Board took the decision that visible undergarments such as thermopants (cycling shorts) are authorised. They must, however, be of the same colour as the shorts of the team of the player wearing them and not extend beyond the top of the knee".

It was furthermore pointed out that if a team wore multicolored shorts, the undergarments must be of the same colour as of the predominant colour.


