



Eastern Suburbs buried the disappointment of last year with an emphatic 6-1 victory over Acacia Ridge in the Women's first division grand final at Atlanta Field, last Sunday.

Easts, who lost to Redlands in last year's grand final, ran away with the match in the first 20 minutes and went to the break leading

Nadia Toffetti opened the scoring for Easts in the first minute after an error by an Acacia Ridge defender

The busy midfielder squeezed her shot between the keeper and the post, scoring what must have been the fastest goal of the season.


