Rivers announce lucrative sponsorship deal

Winds of change for North Brisbane



Rivers Announce Deal

Managing Director of Hallmark Home Improvements Mr Alan Brownbill has announced a 5-year \$200,000 sponsorship deal for Pine Rivers Soccer Club and says there is more to come.

Brownbill, who played at Pine Rivers under Ian Steele, Fred Robins and Dave Scriggins, said he was pleased to give something back to the club that gave him so much.

"I used to play with Jason Polak and John Kochwhenthey were at Rivers but unfortunately we couldn't afford to keep them," Brownbill said.

He said he would also pay the club royalties on business made through the club and hoped to increase the sponsorship to \$60,000 per year, making the deal worth more than a quarter of a million in total.

"Pine Rivers is now a professional club that can pay it's players and we are looking at it from a business point of view," Brownbill said.

"We want to take the clubhouse, the ground and the facilities to a professional level."

"They've got the plans, I've got the money," he said.

Hallmark is the largest vinyl siding company in Australia and has several offices in Queensland and four in New South Wales.

"I was looking to put something back into soccer because I want to see it succeed," he said.

"John(Doyle) has been pestering me for a year to sponsor the club and I think Queensland soccer as a whole will benefit."

Although money doesn't guarantee success, Pine Rivers have set out a plan which they believe will see the club as a real force in Queensland soccer.

And with Pine Rivers recently named as the fifth largest growing Shire in Australia, the potential for success is there.

But while Strathpine is Brownbill's target, soccer in general is his vision.

"Pine Rivers is in full support of clubs who want to take soccer to its potential," he said.

"Look at Rochedale, they are going places and we are going along the same lines.

"Hopefully other sponsors will come in and clubs will thrive – that's what I want."

According to Brownbill, Brisbane United captain Frank Pimblett is the flagship for the whole transformation.

"Frank was instrumental in the whole plan – eventually he will take over," Brownbill said.

"The boys love Frank and he has indicated he will be here full-time."

Current coach John Doyle said he would be delighted to hand the reigns over to Pimblett when his Brisbane United commitments had ended.

"I'm 150 per cent for that," Doyle said.

"Frank is a high profile player and he generates enthusiasm everywhere he goes.

"You have to look to the future. Frank is highly respected and he will steer us in the right direction." he said.

Pimblett's ability and love for the game are unquestionable and it seems he could see out his days at the Strathpine club.

"I would never vacate the position for Frank unless I checked him out and knew how much he loves Rivers," Doyle said.

With that in mind Rivers have signalled their intentions for XXXX League glory.

"We want the XXXX League," Brownbill said.

"We lost a lot of good young kids and now we can offer the players better remuneration and

Brownbill also said he has no problems with the current Brisbane United set-up.

"We are happy to have a good relationship with Brisbane United," he said.

"We want to be the feeding ground for the National League."

Whether they take the title or not, it is a great boost for soccer to see another club on the way up.

Winds of Change

Queensland soccer is changing. The demise of the big clubs such as Brisbane City, and to a lesser extent Brisbane Lions, has seen a new approach to the game. An approach based on planning, organising and financial caution.

But there's one quality that stands out among the handful of clubs who are going ahead in the XXXX League and North Brisbane President Gabriel Sciaretta sums it up.

"It takes a lot of hard work and a lot of planning in the beginning," Sciaretta says.

North Brisbane take on Rochedale Rovers this Sunday is what is without a doubt the match of the round. Talk around town is that this could be a dress rehearsal for the Grand Final.

Although that may be taking things a little bit too far at this stage of the season, the potential is

If someone had said six years ago that North Brisbane would be playing in the XXXX League you probably would have laughed.

The club has had a meteoric rise to prominence since 1986 moving from the Fifth Division to the XXXX League.

"We were fortunate that Paul Novak came in and sponsored us when we were in the Fifth Division," Sciaretta said.

"He said he was interested in sponsoring us if we were interested in going forward and we worked on from there.

"Our aim was the XXXX League. We didn't set a time limit and to make it this soon was more a long term thing for sure," he said. than we expected," he said.

The club brought Brisbane United's Alan Hunter and Craig Williams to the club last year and has added to that this season signing Wayne Evans, Craig Collins, Kevin Meacock and Danny

"Our aim is to make the top five series and see where we go from there," Sciaretta said.

"With regards to winning the Championship you have to be consistent. There are a lot of teams out there that are very strong and they will be a force to be reckoned with so we're not aiming too high."

North Brisbane is also breaking new ground with their club house which is under construction

at Everton Park. They are the only XXXX League club with their club house away from their ground.

"Because soccer doesn't guarantee enough money to run a club we need to have some sort of business or vehicle by which we can subsidise the playing side of things and the club house can do that," Sciaretta said.

"The idea of having the club away from the ground is purely financial.

"It's in the middle of where all the people are - it's a shopping centre and a densely populated area so from that point of view its a much better location," he said.

As in the past, the club has a new vision and the NSL is part of that vision.

"Once we reached the XXXX League we had to reassess our goals and the next logical step is the NSL," Sciaretta said.

'We haven't set a time limit on it - we're only in our second year in the XXXX League.

"We don't want to run before we can walk - it's

One thing that is impressive about Sciaretta, is his down to earth, positive approach.

And it's that approach that could see his club as one of the most popular throughout the state.

"As far as were concerned we're not dreamers." he said.

"What we want to do is consolidate our position and improve over the years.

"And if we do get to a stage where we are regarded as one of the top clubs in the state, then we will be very happy about that - for us it will be an honour.

North Brisbane have a big day planned for their first home game which includes a pipe band and various other activities.

Rivers Revival

Pine Rivers grabbed the points and showed signs of things to come with a resilient 2-1 win over Mt Gravatt at Allison Park last weekend.

The northsiders did it tough coming back from a goal down after a classic strike in the 35th minute from Mt Gravatt's David Munn.

The game was played at a furious pace with Mt Gravatt dominating early before a determined comeback by Rivers.

Mark Greer nearly gave the home side the early lead after latching onto a Damien Waugh corner in the 3rd minute.

The towering defender's header looked goalbound but was brilliantly saved by Robbie Harrison who tipped the ball wide of the post.

Minutes later Munn was denied what looked like a certain penalty after Greer pulled him down inside the box

Mt Gravatt midfielder Alan Prentice was instrumental early and paved the way for his sides early dominance.

Dave Campbell should have given Rivers the lead in the 27th minute when he blasted over after the ball fell at his feet inside the Mt Gravatt penalty box.

Minutes later it was 1-0 to Mt Gravatt after youngster Stuart Collins played a brilliant through to Munn.

The skilful striker finished clinically putting his acute angled shot into the top left corner giving Peter Underhill no chance.

Rivers fought back and equalised right on half-time after midfielder Dene Almond dispossessed Prentice inside his own half.

Almond beat one defender before releasing a through-ball to Preston who was undoubtably the man-of-the-match.

The young striker fired off a shot which Harrison could only parry and Wayne McGauley did the rest with a neat chip into an open net.

Preston sealed the match in the 66th minute with a miscued cross that caught Harrison out of position.

"I must admit it was a cross but I'm just glad it went in," a jubilant Preston said.

Preston, who will shoulder most of the attacking responsibilities in the absence Clayton Koch, said he was happy with his side early form.

"We miss Clayton but our midfield and defence are playing well and that certainly takes the pressure off me," he said.

Mt Gravatt could have stolen a draw in the dying minutes when Jarrod Austin found himself unmarked on the penalty spot with only Underhill to beat.

The usually reliable striker blasted over and with the ball went Mt Gravatt's chances.

Pine Rivers coach John Doyle was happy with the result.

"You're always a bit rusty at the start of the season but I was pleasantly surprised with the way things went," Doyle said.

"We went a goal down but to their credit the boys kept their composure and stuck to the game plan and we got two goals back."

Youngster Damien Waugh, who played 18 XXXX League games at the age of 17 last year, had an outstanding match.

"The boy is a class act," Doyle said.

"I purposely protected him a bit last year but he's come on well and has big future in the game," he said.

Rivers take on Taringa Rovers at Speare Park on Friday night in what should be one of the games of the round.

Divisional Review



With the XXXX League commencing a month before all other divisions, Eye on Soccer has invited QSF secretary Jim Gilbert to take an inside look at the lower divisions and the season ahead.

Division 2

Newly promoted Beenleigh are in the second division for the first time in history after taking the Division 3 title last year. With excellent playing strength, the Steve Dolan coached side will be a big threat to all sides. The new floodlights at Beenleigh will also provide an impetus for this club to do well, especially at home.

Brisbane City, who were relegated from the XXXX League last season, have shown impressive pre-season form and will be a threat to all those who play them, especially at Spencer Park. Player movements to and from the club have been minimal but pride should be a big motivating factor in their bid for promotion.

For near-neighbours Grange Thistle, relegation to Division 2 is not an uncommon thing, as they have experienced it a few times in the past. This should not detract from the fact that, by tradition, they are a strong club and will almost certainly be there in August.

The team from the Gold Coast, Nerang, have already experienced the heady heights of XXXX League, and struggled. There appears to be a few players that have been enticed away, through the lure of representative football to other Gold Coast clubs, so this is a club that again could struggle in '93.

The new flood lighting and new enthusiasm that has been engendered out at Yeronga, will give Olympic United a big push for promotion. They have a number of new players, together with a new coach and they can well put their poor efforts of 1992 right behind them.

Slacks Creek also have a new coach in Stewart Holmes, and could well be strong enough

to get into the final five this year, although promotion could be beyond them. Near neighbours Souths United are playing in Division 2 for the first time, they also may struggle in the first half of the season. Player movements appear to be light—on at this progressive club, however the brand of football they played in '92, could well give them the edge over the more direct style of other clubs. One of the Toowoomba Clubs that struggled last year, St Albans, have strengthened themselves considerably, and with pride being the great motivator, will do everything in their power to ensure they finish on top of their cross—city rivals.

For St Helens, this will be the make or break year for them to get back into the XXXX League, alongside their close rivals Coalstars. If Pre—Season form is any guide they could well be a big showing for promotion placing.

An almost perpetual mid-table side from the western suburbs, The Gap, again doesn't show any significant player movements, although they, like a number of other Division 2 Clubs, also have a new coach. A mid-table position is on the cards for them.

The other Toowoomba Club Willowburn, at one stage strongly favoured for promotion in '92, wilted towards the end and even missed out on the Finals Series. Again, local pride will be the big motivator and with a new coach at the helm, they may well improve on last year's placings.

The last club in the alphabetical listing for Division 2, Wynnum, would have to be a big favourite for promotion to the XXXX League, going by the exceedingly strong first team squad this Bayside Club has acquired. The influx of players together with the movement, lock, stock and barrel, to a new ground at Tingalpa, could well see a new surge of interest from the Wynnum District. This could be enough to give them the impetus to go to the top.

Albany Creek have been promoted yet again to this Division, there is great enthusiasm amongst their committee members, although not a great deal can be said on the player movements. They will probably be a mid-table prospect, yet again.

For Annerley supporters they must be sad to see their club languishing in Division 3, when in the past, they were a perpetual placement in the top Division in Brisbane. A club that continually struggles for both support and finance, this again could be a mid-table proposition. Capalaba is another progressive club that have poured a vast amount of resources into their facilities, both on the ground and in their club house. They are also now attempting to push the same resources into the playing staff. This progressive club will be a threat to all who play them down.

A club that is quite often dwarfed by their near neighbours in the XXXX League, Darra United, again appear to be only a mid-table proposition, judging by the progress off the field.

Ipswich has always had a reputation for producing a fighting spirit on the field, and in 1993 this will be no exception at the other big Ipswich Club – Goodna. This most progressive club on the fringes of the Ipswich City area, are quite confident that 1993 will be their year to go back into Division 2. They will be most difficult to beat at home, and are fully expected to pick up many points away.

Latrobe Valley at one stage in 1992 looked a certainty for promotion, they could not sustain their early season impetus however and merely finished up as a final four team, could 1993 be any different?

Another very progressive club in the Logan City area and with a superb complex, Logan City Kings are quietly confident that they too, will win promotion in 1993. There has been a

large influx of players to the club, and they are fully confident of being a big threat to all who play them this year, especially at Meakin Park.

Two clubs that have been deadly rivals for a number of years, but unfortunately both received relegation in the same season, are Mitchelton and Newmarket. And what contrasting fortune's these club's have experienced in recent years. At Mitchelton their new flood-lighting did not quite lift their players enough to remain in Division 2 and they struggled all year, to be relegated for the second time in two seasons. At Newmarket, however, this team has received fluctuating fortunes in previous years, by being on the fringe of the final five one year, and fighting relegation the next. These two clubs will undoubtedly provide stiff opposition for all who come up against them this year.

The perennial enigma in the Redlands Shire. is their local soccer club, playing in the XXXX League not too many seasons ago and have been on a downward slide ever since. Redlands United at one stage were moving to a brand new complex provided by the Redlands Shire, this alas, also fell by the wayside, as did many other promises the club have had put to them. 1993 may well be another struggle. By virtue of their nationality, one of the quite entrancing ball playing sides in this Division is South Star, they also will be hard to beat. The South American's style of football, relying mainly on possession and short-passing, has proved to be difficult to combat for many of their opposition teams over past seasons -this year will be no different.

The other newly promoted club from Division 4, the students from University, will undoubtedly provide a big test for all who meet them at St Lucia. By virtue of their large playing membership and almost transient membership, many good players appear for the University Club one year, and disappear the next. This again will be a difficult team to play against.

GERMAN TOUR SUCCESS

Nineteen of Queenslands finest youngsters gained a jump start on the rest of the field for the 1995 World Youth Cup following a successful 25-day tour of Germany in the off-season.

Led by Bundaberg Director of Coaching Tony Buesnel, the side won all five of their matches including games against two of Germany's top youth outfits, Bayer Leverkusen and F.C. Koln.

The tour is an annual event and players are selected from the Coca-Cola U/16 Talent Identification Series and invited to tour.

"It used to be that anyone could tour so long as they had the \$4000," Buesnel said.

"Now players must be playing in the U/16 series and be selected to tour."

Although the cost is high, support from clubs, associations and sponsors means the boys play little, if anything, to tour. Buesnel said the tour was vital for the development of the players in relation to future national selection.

"The best thing that came out of the tour was how the players were given an opportunity to compare themselves with some of Europe's best young players and know they compare favourably," Buesnel said.

"Both mentally and psychologically it has probably put anything up to a year in maturity and belief in ones own ability on the players."

"They can now see a way ahead of them in the game that maybe was a bit vague in the past," he said.

The successful touring squad with Brisbane United's Sean Cranney at the airport.

"There were 2 or 3 players that were told over there that they could stay.

"There were also a couple of others that they were very impressed with so the future looks good."

The players were joined on the tour by Lee Pashley of the Gold Coast who is playing with Leeds United in England.

Buesnel said he performed well on the four and ended up playing three reserve grade matches on his return to the club.

The tour, organised by the Queensland Socoar Federation, began with an eight day home stay with T.S.V Hochst(German club) before moving on to Hennef for the final two weeks.

"It was a cultural experience where the players lived with a German family and were well looked after before moving onto Hennef for the serious part of the tour," Buesnel said.

He said the tour confirmed that the coaching techniques used in Australia were similar to those used overseas.

"What is being done at a good level here is the same as what they're doing in the top European countries," he said.

"From the players point of view it has confirmed in their minds that what they are given here is of good quality."

Local XXXX league clubs have shown a lot of interest in the players since their return with

several making their debut last

"Nearly all the lads that aren't in the country or at university have now been signed by XXXX League clubs," Buesnel said.

"Ty Bannister, Darren Stachowicz and Stuart Collins are at Mt Gravatt, Clint Dal Santo is at Taringa, Shane Garven is at North Star, Michael Beer is at Easts and Stuart Hodges and Clifford Tuck are at Brisbane Lions."

The tour will head to Germany again this year with the Coca-Cola Identification Series again the prerequisite to selection.

Born in Liverpool, England, Evuns moved to New Zealand when he was five and has had a steady rise to fame, culminating in All White selection in February last year.


He moved to Australia this month after the collapse of the New Zealand National League but played here in 1991 when Queensland drew 2-2 with Canterbury.
