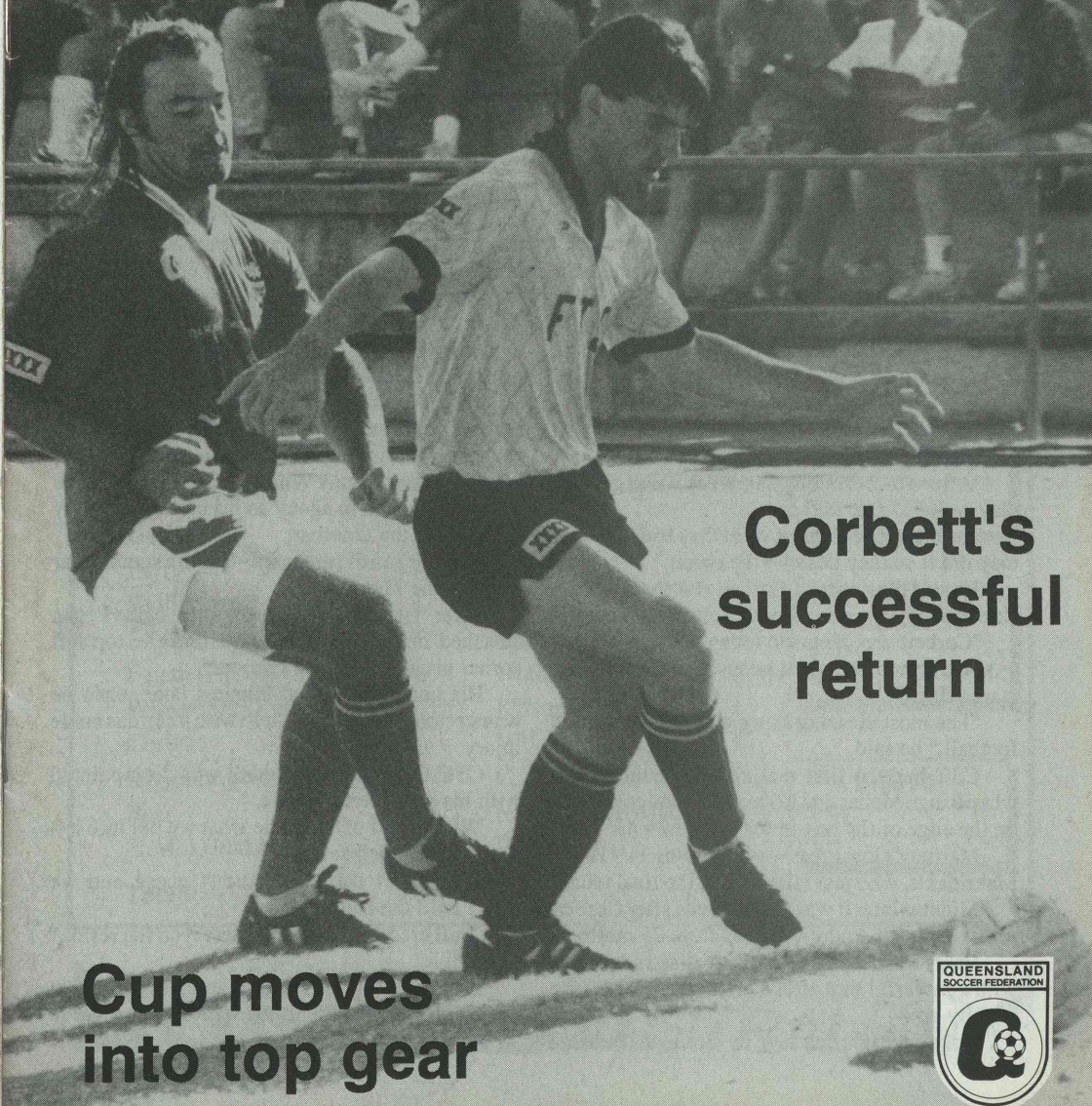

Corbett's comeback

Wayne Corbett celebrated his return to Heath Park last weekend with two goals and a stand-out performance as Easts steamrolled Brisbane CSC 3-0.

The powerhouse striker struck in the 27th and 46th minutes in a match he will not soon forget.

He returned to the field last week after serving out a two match suspension after he was sent-off in round 22 last season.

The former Lions striker was transfer listed at the end of 1992 and said he had given up hope of playing in the XXXX League this year.

"Lions didn't want me - they put me on the transfer list," Corbett said.

"I got a call from Easts who told me I was eligible to train with them.

"Calvin Daunt said he needed some experience so I decided to play and I'm glad I did," he said.

"I'm very happy to score two goals in my first game back."

The match was played at a furious pace early with the windy conditions causing both sides plenty of trouble.

CSC looked the better side early on but gave away too much possession against an Easts side that stuck to their game plan.

Coach Calvin Daunt said he was pleased with the result.

"After a 6-2 drubbing last week it was good to play well," Daunt said.

"I told them at training what they had to do and they did it so they deserve the credit."

He said the return of Corbett was the boost the side needed after a mediocre start to the season.

"Corbett was fantastic today," Daunt said.

"He scored two great goals but it was a good team effort."

"The most pleasing thing was that we played football," he said.

CSC had the first real chance of the match when Ringo Mejias and Robert Marinov combined on the edge of the box in the 22nd minute.

Marinov's low cross was almost met by Harry Makridakis, who just failed to get the final touch.

Minutes later it was 1-0 to Easts after Corbett neatly chipped Andrew Hobbs from 25 metres.

Harry Makridakis almost equalised soon after with a powerful shot after a great solo run into the penalty box.

Only a great reflex save by Brendan Damsma

kept the tigers in the lead. But it was Corbett who put the match beyond doubt a minute after the break with a 30 metre volley that oozed class.

The gifted striker turned blind and struck a powerful shot that caught Hobbs off his line.

He could have made it 3-0 minutes later after he rounded Hobbs on the edge of the penalty box.

With a tight angle and an open net Corbett elected to cross instead of shooting but only succeeded in finding Hobbs.

Youngster Danny Whitfield also had a chance but had to watch in agony as his acrobatic volley crashed off the crossbar.

Chris Fegan did make it 3-0 with a spectacular drive in the 71st minute.

After latching onto a through ball, Fegan smashed his unstoppable drive into the top left corner giving Hobbs no chance.

His goal was soured minutes later when he was stretched from the field with a serious ankle injury.

CSC Coach Frank Liddell was disappointed with his sides performance.

"We got out of the game what we put into it - nothing," Liddell said.

"We didn't battle, we didn't chase and we didn't hold the ball up.

"Full credit to them they deserved the result," he said.

Easts now take on North Star while CSC meet Pine Rivers in a match they will be desperate to win ■

Cranney Sparks Aussie Win

Australia is through to quarter-finals of the World Youth Championships after an inspiring 3-1 win over Russia at the Sydney Football Stadium.

Ante Milicic and Paul Agostino provided the winners for Australia after the sides went to the break locked at 1-1. But it was Queensland's Sean Cranney and Craig Moore who set up the foundation for the win with inspiring performances in the first half.

Cranney showed plenty of resilience to comeback from a mediocre performance in the first match and can take all the credit for the first goal.

The gifted youngster latched onto a ball from Ante Moric, heading onto the Russian crossbar.

His quick thinking and solid challenge forced

the goal, with a miscued clearance from a Russian defender ending up in the net.

Unfortunately for the youngster, he was injured in the clash and had to be replaced five minutes later.

Word from the Australian camp is that he injured his knee but is expected to be fit for the quarter-final.

Craig Moore again had an outstanding match, his only blemish a yellow card that will see him sit out Thursday's match against Cameroon.

Skilful midfielder Mark Wingell will also miss the match after suffering a recurrence of his shin splints.

Brisbane fans will have to wait until after Thursday night to find out whether the Young Socceroos will play at Lang Park ■

Cup moves into top gear

Round 1 of the World Youth championships for the FIFA Coca-Cola Cup was highlighted by a number of major upsets.

Perhaps the biggest boilover came in Group C where 50-1 shots USA, trounced reigning European Cup champions Turkey, 6-0.

American striker, Chris Faklaris, scored the first hat-trick of the tournament in front of a 16,000 strong crowd at Hindmarsh stadium.

In Group B, an 89th minute goal from German striker Carsten Jancker gave his side a surprise victory over defending champions Portugal.

Jancker's goal was the solitary high-point in a game that will be remembered more for its foul play than its quality football.

A total of 6 yellow cards were handed out by French referee Remy Harrel; one of which was for a tackle on German midfielder Guido Jorres who was later taken to hospital with a broken leg and ankle.

While on the subject of foul play, it has been quite noticeable that the referees are taking a very tough line on offending players.

Four players - one each from Turkey, Russia, Brazil and Uruguay - have been given the misfortune of taking an early shower. And in the Australia/Colombia match, no less than 10 players received yellow cards for a variety of infringements.

The referees should watch they do not get to whistle happy as it is preferable that they take a back seat to the players.

In Group D action, Brazil had a disappointing first round draw with Saudi Arabia in a match they were expected to win, while Mexico started their campaign well with an emphatic 3-0 victory over Norway.

By far the most entertaining match of the championship in round 1 was the one-all draw between Uruguay and Ghana.

Uruguayan Captain and goal scorer, Fernando Correa, was most impressive, showing a good mixture of skill, strength and pace.

But it was the boys from Africa who stole the show at Lang Park, with a unique blend of

talent, showmanship and downright cheekiness.

And their were none better than the much talked about multi-million dollar man, Nii Lamptey.

Lamptey is the general of the Ghana side. His previous big match experience - Nii plays for Belgium First division team Anderlecht - is a real on-field asset.

He has every skill imaginable and the confidence to back those skills up, and like the majority of football scribes around the world I would concur that this boy is destined for great things.

Finally, a brief note on Australia's victory over Colombia. I was very impressed with the way the Australian's stuck to their task, even when they fell behind shortly before half time.

Two great goals from Ante Milicic and Captain Kevin Muscat gave the boys a hard fought and well-deserved victory.

Queenslander Craig Moore was nothing short of outstanding at the back, but I would keep an eye out for Brisbane United youngster Sean Cranney during the rest of the tournament.

Sean would be the first to admit that he didn't set the stadium alight last Friday night, but in my humble opinion there is not a finer athlete in the Australian side and I'm sure will bounce back ■

LOWER DIVISIONS – PREVIEW

In Divisions 6 – 9 inclusive, there are only a hand-full of clubs that have their first teams participating in these Divisions, therefore in keeping with our previous policy, only those clubs will be previewed, with respect to their potential for 1993.

DIVISION 6

Bethania Rams, a relatively new affiliate Club of the QSF, came second in Division 7 last year, with over a hundred goals scored. This very forward-looking Club in a developing area, is expected to do almost as well again in the higher league.

Another relatively new Club in a similar area of development, Jimboomba, had mixed fortunes in the 1992. However looking on the bright side, Jimboomba are again one of the more progressive clubs, and whilst a surge up the table is not fully likely, a better end-of-year position is fully on the cards for them.

The only other first team club in this Division, is Woodridge. They were similar to Jimboomba in their 1992 outings, however for Woodridge they remained bottom of the table for a considerable amount of time before climbing to safety in a second half of the season burst. Woodridge could be a big surprise this year.

DIVISION 7

"A couple of years to rebuild" was Easts coach Calvin Daunt's reply when asked about his clubs prospects for the year.

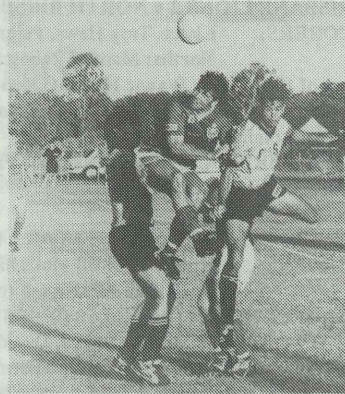
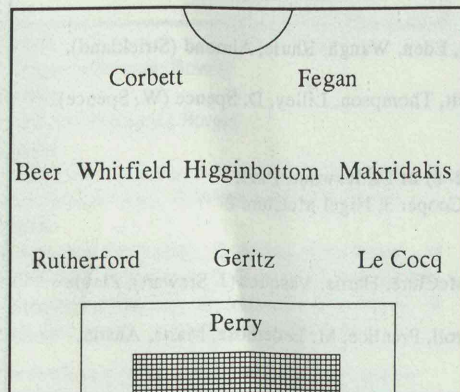
"We will take anything that comes along," he said, obviously knowing the tough times he faced as a striker in the NSL and the XXXX League will stand him good stead for a season of pressure coaching in the first division.

With their sponsors Forktruck Services again with them, they have made a solid start to the season. After being out of the top five last year (the first time in 5 years) Easts will be pushing to re-assert their dominance in the XXXX League.

Easts play a basic 4-4-2 system and while they don't seem to score a great number of goals, their defence is always solid.

In charge of the middle of the defence is Steve Perry in his testimonial year. Perry, a former Queensland and Australian player, calls all the shots and is aiming to go out in a big way.

Their goalkeeper is Brendan Damsma who many are tipping to have a bright future. Robert Le Cocq and Mark Geritz fill the right back and stopper positions while the gangly Jim Rutherford plays at left back. Built more like a rugby union line-out jumper, Rutherford, boasts a booming long ball as well as a long throw, but silly mistakes could be his undoing.

Their midfielders, although a little on the short side, work hard with Mick Higginbottom, Danny Whitfield, Phil Makridakis and Michael Beer all combining well together. Higginbottom outplayed Martin Kirsopp last week and looks in good form.

Up front, the return of Wayne Corbett to partner Chris Fegan should be a strong pairing. Corbett in his first game of the year last week scored two classic goals and showed some deft touches, while Fegan ripped the net with a stunning 20 metre drive. While not to mobile, they will cause problems to many defences.

The big question is, what is their reserve strength like? This could be a problem for Daunt. While the likes Perry, Geritz, Corbett and Fegan are on the park, Easts will remain a force during the year. But any injuries will cause trouble.

Overall, a spot near the top 5 is not beyond them ■

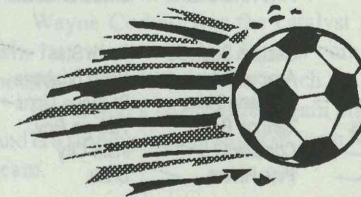
