High drama at Speare Park

Referee Peter Murray was at the centre of controversy last week as Rochedale defeated Taringa 2-1 in a night of high drama at Speare Park.

Murray was forced to hand out seven yellow cards, one red card and 41 free-kicks.

He also sent Taringa coach Juan Cutillas from the field in a match that promised much but never delivered after Taringa were reduced to ten men in the 41st minute.

Taringa looked the better side early with Darren Hillier, Eddie Lees and Michael Collicoat dominating the midfield.

Steve Glockner also looked dangerous and nearly gave the home side the lead in the 19th minute beating Rochedale keeper Graham Ross to a John Ogden free-kick.

The skilful striker could only watch as Rochedale defender Damian Harris cleared with a header off the line.

Twenty minutes later he did find the net after Hillier caught the Rochedale defence napping with a neat through ball.

Glockner rode Russell Stewart's tackle before calmly driving his shot past the advancing Ross.

But it was the controversy four minutes later that decided the result with Murray sending Collicoat from the field for ungentlemanly conduct.

Collicoat, who had been booked earlier, appeared to be fouled and fell to the ground but was dismissed for diving.

Rochedale made full use of the man advantage in the second half scoring two goals but Taringa only had poor finishing to blame.

Defender Cameron Pearse could have made it 2-0 midway through the second half after Glockner put him through with only the keeper to beat.

Ross, who charged off his line, was equal to the task and denied what looked a certain scoring chance.

Former Mackay striker Willie Carter also had a chance to bury Rochedale.

The wiry striker strode past their defence and was left with only Ross to beat but miscued his shot putting it out for a throw in.

An unlucky Frank Cole almost equalised for Rochedale with a powerful shot that beat Tatton but thundered off the crossbar.

A minute later it was 1-1 courtesy of an own goal following a goalmouth scramble.

Debutante Taringa defender Rohan Tollenare was the unlucky culprit with the ball rebounding off his leg and past the stranded Tatton.

Soon after Juan Cutillas was sent from the field after making comments from the sideline.


Demetri Theochari sealed the result in the 86th minute after meeting a Stuart Hart cross with a spectacular diving header.

But it was an incident before the goal that sparked concern with Rochedale keeper Graham Ross accepting what appeared to be a back pass from a defender.

The referee waved play on and Ross cleared down field where the goal was eventually scored.

Taringa coach Juan Cutillas said he was disappointed with the outcome but happy with the way his side played.

"That back pass was a huge turning point - if it had happened anywhere else in the world it would have been a free-kick, it's as simple as that," Cutillas said.

"I'm very happy with the performance of the boys but we had our chances.

"With 11 men we were controlling the game but as soon as we had 10 they took control, but that's natural," he said.

"But take nothing away from them they are a good, physical side."

Rochedale captain Russell Stewart was reserved about his sides victory.

"I thought on chances they should have beaten us," Stewart said.

"They tried to shut up shop after half-time but experience told in the end".

Taringa now take on Brisbane Lions while Rochedale meet Inala City ■

Gautier also says "Perhaps, it's time to declare Queensland a lost Soccer cause and shift to the golden west..".

Someone should remind Lou of the facts.

Fact 1: Average supporters per city: Sydney 26,400 - Melbourne 12,700 - Brisbane 9,500 - Adelaide 9,500 - Canberra 4,600.

Fact 2: Sydney, who had Australia for all three group matches, and Melbourne have more than twice the number of residents than Brisbane does.

Fact 3: In terms of numbers, Brisbane had more people (18,000) to our quarter-final than in any other city.

Fact 4: Young Soccerroo striker Paul Agostino said after the match "We didn't know what to expect from the crowd. Most of us had never played here before and we have had huge crowds in Sydney. But Brisbane really got behind us. It lifted us and we just wanted to win."

FIFA coaching course in town

Queensland soccer will witness a rare treat next week when Brisbane hosts the FIFA Advanced Coaching Course at Perry Park.

Former German Bundesliga coach Erich Rutemoller will conduct the course as the official FIFA Instructor, in association with the ASF, the QSF, the Australian Institute of Sport and the Queensland Academy of Sport.

Rutemoller played for Germanside F.C. Koln from 1970 to 1973 and has also coached that side and FC Hansa Rostock.

QSF State Director of Coaching Jim Selby said the course was for high performance and senior accredited coaches and would cover the presentation of modern coaching trends.

The course runs from March 22-26 and will have two open sessions where anyone can attend.

"This is the first course like this that I know of that's been held in Australia," Selby said.

"Obviously it's only for selected coaches but the two open sessions will provide a great opportunity for local coaches to come along and have a look."

Participants on the course include National team coaches, high performance coaches, ASF staff coaches, State team coaches, NSL coaches and players and QAS players.

The Open nights are Tuesday March 23rd from 7.00pm to 9.00pm and Thursday March 25th also 7.00pm to 9.00pm ■

LOWER DIVISIONS – PREVIEW

A talented group of players have made their way to Richlands from Townsville and Toowoomba and could herald a new beginning for the club in their search for more glory.

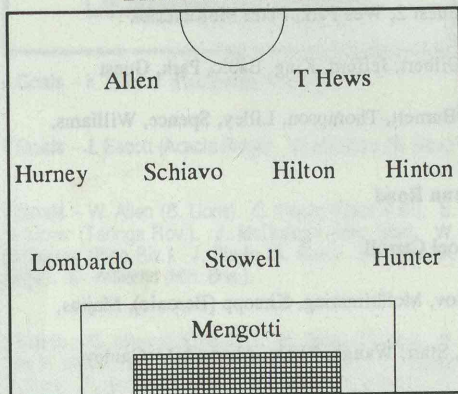

Two ex-Willowburn players fill the strikers roles and of the clubs six goals, Allen has three. His partner is Troy Hews and between them they put defences under pressure with their pace and shooting ability. Both players must use their pace better and know when to go and when to stop.

Looking through their reserves Joe Gilroy's prodigal son Mark has returned again and keeps scoring goals and I like their elegant sweeper who could be pressing for first team selection soon.

A solid outfit and I would expect them to finish in the top five, possibly the top three ■

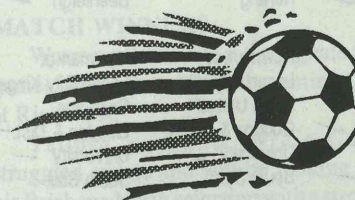
