Sime under fire



Ridge winning streak over

Acacia Ridge's winning streak came to an end last week with a 1-0 loss to Mt Gravatt at Proud Field.

The sending off of Jarrod Austin in the 20th minute failed to deter the Hawks who outplayed their more fancied opponents with a gutsy display of defence and counter-attacking football.

Paul Worroll nearly opened the account for Mt Gravatt in the 20th minute when he latched onto a loose ball after a Fotis Skordou corner.

His powerful shot beat the keeper but was saved off the line by Paul Davidson.

Seconds later Mt Gravatt were down to 10 men when referee Richard Miszczuk sent Austin from the field after a tackle on a Ridge defender.

The send-off was a first for Austin who was bewildered at the decision.

Mt Gravatt officials were incensed at the decision and coach Barry Guyett later said his club would appeal against the decision.

"I've spoken to the President and we will putting in an official complaint," Guyett said.

"It was very disappointing."

Mt Gravatt rallied after the send-off and should have taken the lead before half-time after brilliant lead-up work by David Munn.

The skilful striker worked his way down the left flank before crossing into the box where Alan Prentice and Terry Henry were unmarked.

Either could have scored but it was Prentice who took the shot and he uncharacteristically placed it wide.

Six minutes after the break it was 1-0 after a defensive error by Acacia Ridge fullback Michael Butchard.





The usually reliable youngster lost possession and Munn pounced on the mistake calmly slipping the ball past Tony McVey.

Munn nearly scored again in the 64th minute but his header was brilliantly saved by McVey.

Minutes later he beat McVey but was this time denied by the crossbar.

Acacia Ridge almost capitalised on their oneman advantage through fullback Paul Davidson who was of the Ridge's best.

The stocky defender smashed a drive from 30m that had Mark Haynes beaten but flashed wide of the posts at the last second.

Haynes, playing only his second game for the Hawks, had an outstanding match and withstood plenty of pressure late in the game.

Coach Barry Guyett was happy with the result.

"It was a gutsy win by the boys and I was especially pleased with their commitment," Guyett said.

"To beat one of the top teams after playing with only ten men for most of the match is a special effort.

"We've been creating chances in our last three games but not putting them away so to win this one was great.

"All our players fought hard and I was especially impressed with Mark Haynes," he said.

Acacia Ridge coach David Richardson was gracious in defeat.

"We've been under a lot of pressure and I think it told," Richardson said.

"We gave 100 per cent but it just wasn't good enough on the night."

The Ridge now face Taringa at Speare Park while Mt Gravatt tackle North Star at home

Bad break for Jefferd

Brisbane United's Brenley Jefferd has broken a bone in his foot and will miss the rest of the NSL season after sustaining an injury during his sides 2-0 win over Bundaberg last weekend.

Jefferd, 19, was devastated after receiving the news that he will be in plaster for at least 4 weeks.

"I'm just so annoyed because I was looking forward to playing in the last three games," Jefferd said.

The talented youngster has had a mixed season after being included in the 24-man Young Socceroos squad for the World Youth Championships earlier in the year.

He missed final selection in the squad but was looking forward to a successful end to the NSL season with the 1994 Olympics in Atlanta his next major goal.

United captain Frank Pimblett said Jefferd would be a big loss to the side.

"It's a big blow, not only for Brenley, but for the team as well," Pimblett said.

"I thought he was playing well in the last couple of trial games and I was enjoying playing with him."

He said Jefferd had a big future in the game and hoped he would be a part of that.

"In the few games I've played with him I've

really enjoyed it because we've been developing a terrific understanding.

"I'm not getting any younger but hopefully I will get the chance to play with him again," he said.

Jefferd said he was unsure whether he would play in the XXXX League.

"I don't think I'll play in the XXXX League this year but I'll just wait and see," Jefferd said.

"I might just sit out and get my foot right for next season."

Jefferd's injury is just another tale in a disappointing season for United that has been marred by serious injuries to at least eight of it's top line players.

With plaster from toe to knee, Jefferd said he would see a specialist to get a second opinion.

"At the moment the plaster is very uncomfortable so I'll see a specialist and hopefully get it reduced in size," Jefferd said

Brisbane South coach John Sime has come under fire for the selection of his side for next weeks match against the Gold Coast.

Sime selected no players from second placed XXXX League side Acacia Ridge but picked two Second Division players from Wynnum.

Acacia Ridge President Mark Brigden said he was disappointed with the side.

"We've got the second best attacking record in the league and the best defensive record in the league and not one of our players has been picked," Brigden said.

"We've also got the best keeper in the league in Tony McVey and Jason Eacott has scored in four of the five games so where's the logic."

He said he had nothing against the players in the squad but believed form wasn't the only criteria for selection.

"He's picked two guys from the second division who've only played one game," he said.

Controversy struck just after half—time when referee Gordon Nicholson overlooked what both coaches agreed was a back pass.

Farrar made a great save from a Harry Makridakis drive but failed to hold the ball.

Defender Stu Weston appeared to play the ball back to Farrar but Nicholson waved play on despite the protests.

Half-an-hour later it was protests down the other end of the field after Coalstars defender Alan McFarlane was brought down in the box but was denied a penalty.

Both coaches again agreed it was the wrong decision.

"I guess in the end the decisions cancelled each other out," Liddell said.

Coalstars substitute Darren Frieberg had a chance to steal a result in the final minutes when Aaron Jefferd put him through with a pin-point ball.

Although he added some spark during his time on the field, his first touch let him down on this occasion and the scores remained locked at 0-0

Coalstars latest signing Demetri Dardennis looked good in patches and showed he could be an asset to Wayne Warren for the rest of the season.

LOWER DIVISIONS - REVIEW

Lower divisdions kicked off last week with matches played in all divisions. Eye On Soccer's Divisional expert Jim Gilbert reviews round 1 and looks at this weeks matches.

DIVISION 2

A strong performance from the two Toowoomba Clubs enabled them to set themselves up at the top of the table for the commencement of the 1993 season, Willowburn's away win over a resurgent Olympic being the most notable.

St Albans' home win over Slacks Creek was equally as good when one considers their performance last season. On a little more predictable note, a Thistle and St Helens win was also on the cards as was Wynnum, with Beenleigh playing their first home match under lights also impressive over Nerang.

Preview for this coming weekend:

Willowburn at home to Beenleigh, a tough match but a narrow win to the home side, whilst Wynnum, playing at Heath Park for this weekend, are also tipped to defeat Olympic United.

Two more home wins are on the cards for Sunday, both St Helens and The Gap tipped to take out the points.

The battle of the orange shirts down at Slacks Creek will be most interesting, with the visitors from Grange to take home the points in this one. Down on the Gold Coast, Nerang will certainly not have it their own way against their visitors from St Albans, a score-draw the forecast.

DIVISION 3

"It's a pity because I planned to use Brenley for the last three matches to prepare him next season but now that is lost," he said. Jefferd will spend at least 4 weeks in plaster with Bradley Ditton and Brent Reid expected to fight for his position.


