Wynnum on the move

Wynnum will play their first match at their new premises next weekend following their move from Maramba Stadium in the off-season.

The Wolves have moved three-and-a-half minutes down the road to the Boundary St sports complex which is currently being used by the Wynnum & District Cricket Club.

Club President Wayne Gracey said the club had sold Maramba Stadium for \$180,000 and received a further \$100,000 in a grant from the Federal Government.

He said the cricket and soccer clubs would combine together to form a multi-sports club.

"The complex already has a \$200,000 clubhouse but we will be upgrading it," Gracey said.

"We'll use the money we already have and will borrow a further \$300,000 (with the cricket club) to make a multi-sports complex."

With 6 senior and 33 junior teams, Gracey said the move would enable the whole club to play at the same premises for the first time.

"It's been a long time ambition of our Junior Chairman Richard Turnawski to have all the teams together and it's finally happening," Gracey said.

He said matches would be played on a temporary field until the main pitch is ready for competition.

"We've had working bees every weekend since October," Gracey said.

"We've had to move the turf, the top soil, the fence and the lights from Maramba and it's been an enormous amount of work.

"It was a sad decision to leave Maramba but it would have been even sadder to stay.

"We've been talking to the cricket club for two years and we felt the longer we stayed at Maramba the further behind we would get," he said.

"This move to Boundary Street is a long term thing, we plan to stay there for forever and a day."

He said the club was going all out to win promotion to the XXXX League this season.

"Our ambition at the club has always been to play in the XXXX League but we've never had the financial reserves," Gracey said.

Wynnum's Billy McDermott in his days at Easts - he will play a major role in the Wolves' promotion chances.



"The whole thing revolves around money, that's the reason we made the move - to try and improve our financial position.

"We've been in and out of the XXXX League before because we haven't had the financial stability but this time, if we get there, we hope to stay," he said.

And if their off-season recruiting drive is any indication, they will definitely be in the XXXX League next season.

"We beat Acacia Ridge 5-3 in the final last year and have retained the entire squad plus added Billy McDermott, Geoff Maltby and Dave Mewburn from the XXXX League," Gracey said.

"The difference Billy and Geoff have made to the squad is enormous, they are two of the most sought after players in Brisbane. And with the addition of Dave (Mewburn) as well, we now have a lot of depth and we're quietly confident, but it's always going to be a tough fight in the Second Division," he said.

And with two wins from their first two matches, Gracey feels sure team work is the key.

"We are a very close nit club and people are very loyal. The only reason Billy and the boys left was to further their careers. Most of the players have grown up together and get along fantastically," he said.

But despite their progress, the people at Wynnum are realistic about their chances.

"The enthusiasm at the club is fantastic but we're also realistic that the changes won't automatically make us a success - we know it will take a lot of work, on and off the field."

Wynnum take on Willowburn in Toowoomba this weekend in the match of the round.

Rivers ready for Rochedale

Pine Rivers set-up a top-of-the-table clash with Rochedale Rovers this weekend with a tradesman-like 3-1 win over Coalstars at Wendy Allison Park last Saturday.

With Rochedale managing a draw against Brisbane CSC, Rivers are now only one point behind them, setting up what should be the match of the season.

Coalstars midfielder David Guest had the first real chance in the opening minutes of last weeks match but his shot was well saved by Peter Underhill.

Minutes later it was 1-0 to Rivers after good lead-up work Noel Carroll.

The powerhouse striker played a deep ball to the far post that found Dene Almond who made no mistake.

Damien Waugh almost made it 2-0 in the 20th minute after beating two defenders but he wasted the effort, ballooning his shot over the bar.

With the score unchanged at the break, the Coalminers came out firing and equalised through a Michael Babic penalty after Graham Eden bundled over Guest in the penalty area.

With the scores locked at 1-1, it was Rivers who came out on top with Almond scoring in the 68th minute after latching onto another ball at the far post.

But while Almond did the damage on the scoresheet, it was John Preston who dominated the match.

The solid striker showed great control and vision for his side and provided the steadying influence needed when under pressure.

Noel Carroll made it 3-1 two minutes before full-time with an unchallenged header at the far post.

Pine Rivers coach John Doyle said he was pleased with the result and was looking forward to the clash with Rochedale.

"We played some nice football which was pleasing because we haven't been playing pretty football in some of our earlier matches," Doyle said.

"It was a tough match but all matches are getting to be that way with us.

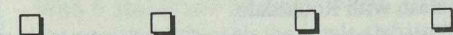

FIFA COURSE A SUCCESS

Australian Institute of Sport Head Soccer Coach Ron Smith has hailed the FIFA Advanced Coaching Course held at Perry Park last week a success.

Smith was a guest presenter at the course which was headed by FIFA's Erich Rutmoller.

"Basically the course was aimed at trying to bring some overseas influence into Australia," Smith said.

"It's not everyday of the week that you get someone from FIFA to instruct on coaching courses so it has been a unique opportunity."

He said the recent World Youth Championships which were held in Australia provided the opportunity for the course.

"Many of the top coaches from around the world go to these types of tournaments so it is a good opportunity to run something like this," he said.

While some believe Australia is behind other countries in terms of coaching, Smith said this was not the case.

"I don't think we would be any different in philosophy to what they are overseas," Smith said.

"Our performances at these Championships have proven that."

Much of the week-long course was spent analysing the Championships, which provided Australians with a unique opportunity to see overseas techniques first-hand.

Smith said while Australia had consistently done well on the world stage at the youth level, they must now look to improve on their fourth place finish.

"In my opinion we need to identify what is going to take us from where we are now to where the tournament winners are," Smith said.

"I believe there are two things we need to change, starting with our basic philosophy of the game.

"If you watch our guys play we tend to stay away from the player with the ball but the Brazilians and Ghanaians tend to stay a lot closer," he said.

"The second thing we need to do is keep possession of the ball more - the successful teams don't give the ball away too often."

He said he hoped all Australian coaches would begin working towards that goal.

"We won't be making big changes in the short term but we will be making changes in how the game is played," Smith said.

"The biggest problem is transferring what we see off the pitch and making it work on the pitch - that takes a period of time."

Another pleasing factor for Smith was the performances of his AIS players who were in the Young Socceroos side.

"In essence there were 12 kids in the squad that have had the benefit of the AIS so it was pleasing to see them do so well," he said.

The AIS is currently regarded as the breeding ground for Australia's top talent, with graduates like Ned Zelic and Frank Farina now commanding top dollars on the world stage.

And while the occasional quality player may miss out on the AIS, Smith believes the overall coaching system in Australia is working.

"We have the State and National Championships plus our Director of Coaching Scheme and the State Academies, so we're



A birds eye view with Col Bennett

Col Bennet looks at former League leaders Acacia Ridge this week. The Ridge won their first four matches but have struggled of late losing their last two, with a 3-1 loss to Taringa Rovers last weekend. This week they take on their old rivals Inala City in what should be a titanic struggle.

"Has the bubble burst?", "Will they be relegated?", and "They are a poor side". These are the questions and remarks Acacia Ridge President Mark Brigden and Player/Coach David Richardson are hearing despite winning their first four games.

Richardson will have to look at his defence very closely as maybe some positional changes might be more effective.

In Jim Kelly, the Ridge have a midfielder of endless talents but they must use him more. Kelly himself must take control "a la Pimblett" if his side is to match opponents. His vision and passes to front men must be a necessity.

Richardson must also get himself fit and back to playing as soon as possible. Roy Smythe and Jorge Ibanez-Formas, the other midfielders, are

basically getting a look at everyone," Smith said.

"I also have people that come to Canberra from all over the country requesting trials so there's that avenue as well."

He said a lot of the emphasis at the AIS had now shifted to technology, giving a much clearer picture as to what brings success at the highest level.

"Over the last five years we've been looking at what sort of athlete succeeds on the soccer field and it's clear that the better players are the better athletes," Smith said.

"Obviously there are some exceptions."

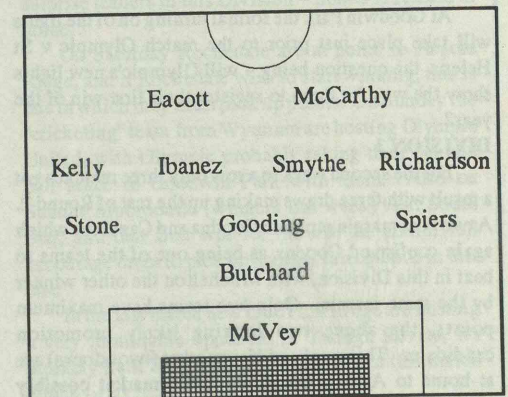
going to struggle all year.

LOWER DIVISIONS - REVIEW

Lots of goals were scored in the second round of fixtures last weekend, with just on 50 being scored in Division 2 alone.

DIVISION 2

The highest scoring match of the round last weekend, with Wynnum's 4-3 defeat of Olympic United, was most surprising - in that all seven goals were scored in the first half of the match. This says a lot for Wynnum's attacking capabilities, which also shows that Olympic are very quickly coming back to the form that they wish to retain for the remainder of the year.

St Albans currently in second place, went to the Gold Coast and put four past Nerang, which puts the Saints narrowly in front of their fierce rivals Willowburn, who themselves attained a narrow 1-0 win over Beenleigh.

The battle of the Tangerines at Slacks Creek went in favour of the visitors by a fairly one sided margin, and is now opening up a substantial gap at the top of the table, with four teams on maximum points. Only two fixtures have been played, but the signs are already there!

This weekend all games are on Sunday with a top of the table clash between Willowburn and Wynnum, very much the match of the day, hard to predict a result - maybe a score-draw.

Grange are at home to Nerang, with this result looking probably a little bit more predictable. At Spencer Park Brisbane City are home to Slacks Creek - can the Creek pick themselves up after last weeks result, form dictates that they probably can't.

Down at Runcorn Souths United are at home to The Gap with Souths having picked up a surprise point up at Ebbw Vale last week - home win.

Another clash of the giants takes place at Beenleigh with their visitors being second placed St Albans. An excellent game in prospect with Beenleigh possibly coming home at the whistle.

At Goodwin Park the formal turning on of the lights will take place just prior to the match Olympic v St Helens, the question being - will Olympic's new lights show the way for them to register their first win of the year?

DIVISION 3

For the second week in a row only three matches got a result with three draws making up the rest of Round 2. A two goal margin separate Goodna and Capalaba which again confirmed Goodna as being one of the teams to beat in this Division, with Mitchelton the other winner by the same margin. Only two teams have maximum points, the above two looking likely promotion candidates. This weekend Newmarket (two-draws) are at home to Albany Creek, with Newmarket possibly

getting up for their first win of the season.

At the Cleveland Showgrounds, Redlands United host Annerley with this being a little bit tougher to predict, a score-draw is highly likely. The other Saturday match is the unbeaten University at home to Capalaba, the students are likely to take this one out.

On Sunday surprise packet Darra United (two-draws) are at home to equal leaders Mitchelton, hard to see the home side picking up a first win in this game. Up at Ipswich the current leaders Goodna are at home to unbeaten Latrobe Valley, with a distinct possibility of this match finishing up a draw.

The last match of the weekend is bottom placed South Star at home to 11th placed Logan City - the flair of South Star could pull off a home win in this game.

DIVISION 4

Well over 50 goals were scored in Round 2 in this Division, it is highly unlikely it will be continued each week. Nine goals were scored in the home match out at Bellbowrie - seven goals at Dakabin with a further five down at Deception Bay. Already four teams are vying for top position, however this is a highly unpredictable Division in terms of both results and potential promotion.

On Saturday Oxley United are at home to Brighton, with the home side yet to register a point, difficult to see them picking up any in this game. On the Jinker Track, Pine Hills are at home to North Pine - with these teams first and third respectively in the tables, it all points to a home win. The last of the Saturday matches shows Virginia hosting Kenmore with Virginia on four points against a pointless Kenmore, difficult to see the Rangers picking up any points to take home with them.

On Sunday a resurgent Redcliffe City host Ipswich, with Redcliffe hot to continue their current form, and keep the three points on the Peninsula. Also on Sunday Clairvaux, completely belying their 1992 form, are at home to Deception Bay, with neither team having scored more than one goal in their two outings. It all points to a low scoring draw. The last of the matches is Samford at home to Moggill United, with Samford already having a 100% record and highly likely to keep it in this weekend's game.

DIVISION 5

Again, a lot of goals were scored in Round 2 in this Division, and it may well take another two to three rounds of fixtures before a true top, middle and bottom starts to show up.

The first of the matches is on Friday night, with

Slacks Creek at home to Annerley. The home side to take the points in this game.

On Sunday Southside Eagles, eager to get back to Division 4, will probably retain the points against Toowong who played their first fixture last week and showed that they will not be easy beats. The other Saturday match is newly promoted University at home to Leichhardt Eagles, with University sharing an unaccustomed second placing against Leichhardt, with University probably keeping the points at home. On Sunday Loganholme make the trip down to Bayside with Loganholme on two wins and Bayside on two losses - visitors to win.

Goodna play Brothers United in the morning game on Sunday with these two teams fairly closely matched (on paper at least) a score-draw the prediction.

The last of the games on Sunday is Western Suburbs at home to Capalaba with both of these two teams languishing at the bottom, a draw is a highly likely result.

DIVISION 6

Already in this Division there appears to be a middle and a bottom with some fairly distinct goal differences separating the two groups.

On Friday night 12th placed Mitchelton plays 11th placed Brisbane City, maybe the teams should toss for a result. On Saturday The Gap play Souths United with a home win the forecast, also on Saturday Jimboomba are at home to Bethania with the visitors determined to continue their surge up the table - score-draw.

On Sunday, leaders Logan City Kings host Grange Thistle, it's unlikely if Logan City Kings will still be the leaders at 4:30pm. Two other teams yet to register a point Darra at home to Olympic, with Darra probably tipped to take the points in this game. The last Sunday game is Woodridge, with two wins to their credit, playing hosts to near neighbours Beenleigh - a narrow win to the home side.

DIVISION 7

Two matches last weekend finished up with double figure score-lines, which means that predictions in this Division are unlikely to be accurate for a few weeks, until more matches have been played and it moves into a more settled composition.

This weekend Slacks Creek and Annerley meet on Friday night, both having only played one match, so a prediction is very difficult to make - points probably to stay at home. On Sunday newcomers Western Suburbs are at home to Loganholme with Loganholme to take the points away with them. Clairvaux are home

to Greenbank with the visitors probably taking the points back with them also.

Also on Sunday leaders Albany Creek visit the Showgrounds at Redlands with Albany Creek also expected to take the points home with them. Also on Sunday a fairly one-sided match is the prediction for the home side when Browns Plains look after their visitors - Souths United.

DIVISION 8

Predicting results in Divisions 7, 8 and 9 is always a dangerous move, with the everchanging composition of players in these teams leading to some, at times, peculiar results.

Newmarket play near neighbours Latrobe Valley with Latrobe probably remaining pointless once again. Newcomers to this Division - Annerley, play at home to Greenbank with the Blues expected to also retain the points. Good matches in prospect when Wynnum entertain Olympic United with a score-draw quite possibly the end result. Beenleigh make the long trip up to Ebbw Vale and it could well be a fruitless journey for them. Similarly the students from the University heading down to Browns Plains, may have a long and unrewarding trip home. Just for a change, visitors Bethania are when making the trip to Jimboomba are fully expected to take the points home with them to complete the Rams successful weekend.

DIVISION 9

Coalstars make the short trip down the road to Richlands on Friday night, and should have a good weekend taking the three points home with them. Also on Friday night two unbeaten teams meet when North Star visit Kenmore Rangers - Kenmore being surprise leaders in this Division - points to remain at home.

On Saturday Rochedale are at home to Acacia Ridge, and if Rochedale wish to start winning, this is one in which they must pick up points. On Sunday the "cricketing" team from Wynnum are hosting Olympic United, with Olympic probably taking their bat and ball home to Goodwin Park with them. Also on Sunday Mooroondu (winners last week) visit South Star, and that first win for the visitors could well encourage them to pick up another three points in this one.

In the last match new club Park Ridge are hosting a very formidable opponent in Taringa Rovers, it's unlikely Park Ridge will have any joy in this match either.



One on one with Scheinflug

Les Scheinflug is without a doubt one of the premier coaches in Australia and the World.

The former Australian representative has been with the Young Socceroos for a record seven World Youth Championships and has also coached the Socceroos.

Earlier this week, Eye on Soccer caught up with the round ball guru who was in town for the FIFA Advanced Coaching Course being held at Perry Park.

Scheinflug was enjoying the peace and quiet at Queensland's State headquarters after a month on the run with the World Youth Championships.

Australia finished a credible fourth in the Championships and has now gained respect from all countries as a force in world soccer, especially at youth level.

"To finish fourth two years in succession is a tremendous effort and there's not too many countries in the world who can boast to that," Scheinflug said.

"Our consistency since 1981, with boys who are unknown, is unmatched."

He said he was honoured to be recognised throughout the world as a good coach.

"Eddie Thomson and myself are both recognised by FIFA and I don't think you can get a better honour than that," Scheinflug said.

"In the past few weeks I had the Brazilian coach come up to me and say that I got more out of my boys than was there to get and that was very pleasing.

"We know we can go to any country in the world and they will open their door to us," he said.

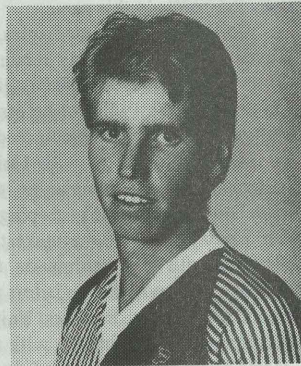
The Young Socceroos reached the semi-finals of the Championships but were disappointing in that match losing to eventual winners Brazil 2-0.

"Mentally the boys were sure they could beat Brazil but the pressure told in the end," Scheinflug said.

"They smelt the Cup but I think negative thoughts got in their heads and we lost."

He said many of the Young Socceroos would go on to represent Australia at senior level and believed it was only a matter of time before Australia qualified for the World Cup.

"I think we will qualify very soon but our national competition has to get stronger," he said.

"We are also playing a lot of international fixtures now which is what must be done if we are to be competitive."

He said the Young Socceroos preparation had a lot to do with the performances.

"If we hadn't prepared as well as we did we wouldn't have got as far as we did.

"Our boys are only semi-professionals while most of their opposition were full-time players," he said.

While Scheinflug gained glowing praise for his efforts at the end of the tournament, it was before it started where the pressure began.

"I've been under a lot of pressure for the last seven weeks," he said.

"I had a lot of knockers before the tournament about the tour to Saudia Arabia and whether it was the right preparation.

"But I've been a National team player, a Socceroos coach and have had the Young Socceroo for the past 12 years and I know what is required to get these boys fit," he said.

Queensland's Sean Cranney, who had an early exit from the tournament due to a knee injury, received a special mention from Scheinflug.

"When Cranney was ruled out I felt sick," Scheinflug said.

"He was such an important part of our side.

"I can't prove it, but if I had him fit I would have gone very close to winning that trophy - he was my only true wide midfielder," he said.

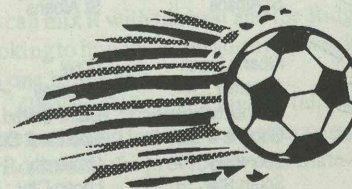

Wayne Corbett hasn't scored since netting two on debut three weeks ago. With Easts struggling to find the net in recent matches, he must take more responsibility.

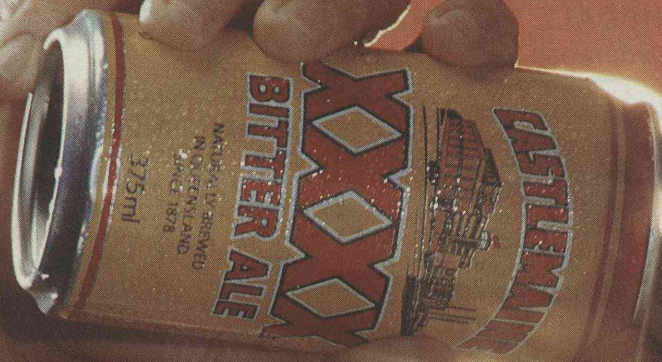
Coalstars striker Demetri Dardennis is another who is struggling to find the net. With Brendan Eastwell waiting in the wings, Dardennis must start producing the goods.
