Qld's latest hot shot

Queensland's latest hottest property could soon be another one of Australia's high profile youngsters.

Former Brisbane Lions defender Darren Sime, who recently played in the Under 17 Australia side that qualified for the World Championships in Japan, said he was looking forward to the next couple of years.

The Australian side heads for Japan in August where they will play in Group B of the Championships against South American against Argentina, Nigeria and Canada.

Eye on Soccer caught up with Sime earlier in the week as he spent a rare week away from Canberra, where he is based at the Australian Institute of Sport.

"I managed to get a week off school so I'm just enjoying it at the moment," Sime said.

"I haven't been home for 5 months so it's good to be back."

He said Australia's chances at the Championships were as good as any and cited the South Americans as their biggest hurdle.

"It's going to be tough," Sime said.

"I don't know too much about any of the sides but from past performances at Under 17 level I'd have to say Argentina will be our toughest opponents in the group.

"But in saying that no game will be easy," he said.

Australia qualified for the Championships with a tough campaign in the Solomon Islands last month.

"The hardest thing in the Solomons was playing against the crowd," Sime said.

"But we got through okay so it was good."

With time running out until the Championships, Sime said the Joeys would soon be back into training.

"In three or four weeks we could be going back into camp and we might be going on a tour," Sime said.

"I'm not sure where yet, nothing's been decided."

Whether the Joey's succeed or not, Sime has big plans for the future.

"I think after my scholarship at the Institute is over I'll head overseas," he said.

"I'm not sure where at the moment but I think probably the UK."

The talented youngster admitted he had a lot of hard work ahead of him but was eager to take up the challenge.

The other qualifiers for the World Championships are:

Group A: Japan, Ghana, Italy, Mexico.

Group C: Columbia, Qatar, USA, R.C.S.

Group D: Chile, China PR, Tunisia, Poland.

Maroon interstate boost

Queensland looks set to receive at least two interstate players for this years State of Origin series with the possibility of at least two more.

Newcastle Breakers' Nick Meredith and Heidelberg United's Brian McNicol have confirmed their availability for the matches and will play in the opener at Perry Park on June 12.

Socceroos Stephen Corica and Jason Polak have indicated they are also keen to be involved but their availability will be subject to their Socceroo commitments and their fitness.

Meredith, who is a proven performer for the Maroons, said he was keen to avenge last years series loss to the Blues.

Queensland drew the first match at Perry Park 1-1 but lost the decider in Lismore 4-1.

Meredith said he was hoping to make amends for his own performances last season.

The talented midfielder performed well but believes his fitness level was not at its best.

"Last year I didn't play for 10 weeks before the series but this time I've learnt from that," Meredith said.

"I've signed with a local club called Western and I will be ready this time."

He said the series would be as tough as ever.

"The series should be good," Meredith said.

"New South Wales will be a very competitive side but I believe we can beat them.

"They've picked three or four State League players which is interesting but they'll still be a reasonably strong side," he said.

Coach Juan Cutillas is expected to start training the squad next week but Meredith said he was unsure when he would join the squad.

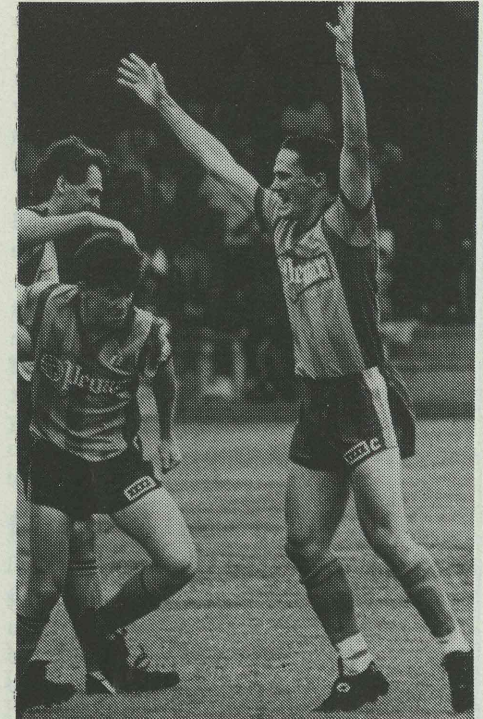
"I haven't been told of the flight details yet but I'm looking forward to playing for Queensland," he said.

The Maroons will also play two matches in New Zealand against Canterbury on July 2 and Auckland on July 6.

Meredith said he was definitely interested in the possibility of touring.

"I'd like to go to New Zealand but I'm not sure as to whether I'll be available," he said.

"I'm just waiting to see what date they need me

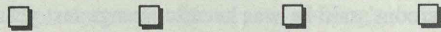
Eastern Suburbs, North Brisbane and Brisbane CSC all have a chance to make the five but must kick on from here on in.

As we are members of an affiliated club of the Queensland Soccer Federation, our team members do purchase the magazine through our club, as do many others. I trust you will give this proper consideration.

Debbie, thank-you for your letter.

When I joined the magazine my aim was to make it something you could sit down and read, something

interesting. I wanted to try to avoid it becoming a magazine full of tables. Instead I have tried to bring you soccer news, match reports, profiles and features. So far, I believe the magazine has done that.

Unfortunately, as the juniors will give testimony to, there is not enough space to publish full tables for all grades. We will always publish the women's weekends results and condensed tables. As in the past, match reports, features and profiles will also be published from time to time. It is not a question of discrimination, it is simply numbers. Last year 25,000 boys and 8,000 men were registered to play soccer in Queensland. Women, in comparison, have only 8,000 registered members in Australia, of which about 25 per cent are believed to be in Queensland.

On the issue of points tables for lower divisions, I am more than happy to suggest that each club could have an A4 sheet with the women's full tables posted on their club noticeboard, thus solving the problem. In the mean time, Eye on Soccer will continue to keep you up to date with news on women's soccer. Ed.

Aussies ready to rumble

The Socceroo Dream team left for New Zealand earlier in the week, determined to kick their World Cup campaign into top gear.

Coach Eddie Thomson has put together what is believed to be the best Socceroo outfit ever assembled.

With an estimated value of more than \$15 million, the squad includes Ned Zelic (Borussia Dortmund), Frank Farina (RC Strasbourg), Graham Arnold (FCLiege), Robbie Slater (Lens), Aurelio Vidmar (Waregem), Mark Bosnich (Aston Villa), and Jason van Blerk (Go Ahead Eagles).

The first leg of the qualifier will be played this Sunday at Mount Smart Stadium in Auckland and will be televised on SBS at 12:30pm (AEST).

Thomson believes the New Zealand side will play a very physical brand of football.

"They'll bash us for sure, you can bet your boots on it," Thomson said.

"They're New Zealand, there are no secrets with them, they'll knock us about.

"But that's their style and we're not exactly angels ourselves," he said.

Australians will remember the Socceroo's last World Cup campaign when a 2-0 loss to New Zealand cost them a place in the World Cup finals in Italy.

Brisbane United midfielder Danny Halligan, who is part of the New Zealand side, is expected

Stars favour boosts Rovers

North Star handed Taringa Rovers the biggest gift of the season last week when they whitewashed XXXX League leaders Rochedale Rovers 3-1 at O'Callaghan Park.

The win lifted North Star into outright third place and reduced Rochedale's lead over Taringa to just four points as the Blue Machine got the better of Brisbane CSC winning 3-1 at Perry Park.

A hat trick from star striker Jim McDonagh sealed Rochedale's fate, loosening their stranglehold on the 1993 season.

At Perry Park it was a dazzling first half performance from Darren Hillier that did the damage. The talented midfielder dominated from start to finish in the opening 45 minutes scoring one goal and laying on another.

It was defender Cameron Pearse who started the dominance, skilfully volleying home a pin point Hillier cross in the 12th minute.

A quarter of an hour later it was 2-0 as Brisbane United defender Glenn Gwynne carved through a devastated CSC defence.

Starting deep inside his own half, Gwynne played a neat one-two with his brother Colin before crossing to striker Steve Glockner who found space just outside the near post.

With Hobbs to beat, he coolly controlled before slamming home from a tight angle.

Just before halftime it was Hillier who sealed the result, chiming onto a good through ball from midfield partner Eddie Lees.

With Hobbs advancing, he made no mistake, neatly placing the ball in the bottom right hand corner.

After the break it was a different story with Taringa sitting back on their lead and CSC starting to make inroads.

Perhaps the highlight of a somewhat mediocre match was the tussle between Taringa defender Andrew Philp and CSC striker Frazer Cuba.

With both receiving yellow cards during the match it was a tough encounter with Cuba possibly slightly ahead on points.

He created many of CSC's limited chances and worked tirelessly all over the field for the

entire match.

It was a Cuba cross that gave CSC some chance of winning the match in the 59th minute.

"We were leading 3-0 and they didn't want to do the hard work in the second half.

"I don't know how many chances we missed," he said.

CSC coach Frank Liddell was again left to watch his side throw away a match in the first half.

"They went to sleep," Liddell said.

"I thought we'd learned that lesson from the game against North Star but obviously not."

He cited loose marking as his sides first half downfall.

"You can't give a side three first half goals and expect to win the game - it's as simple as that," Liddell said ■

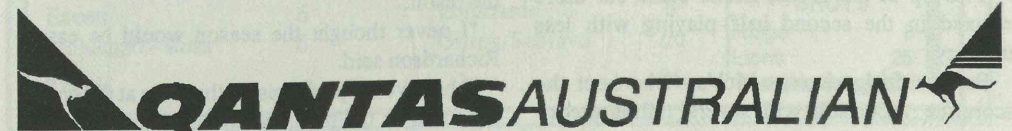

Injury-hit Ridge struggle

An injury depleted Acacia Ridge lost their second match in as many weeks and slipped to fourth on the XXXX League ladder after a humiliating 4-0 loss to Brisbane Lions at Perry Park last Saturday.

Playing without six key players, the Ridge's depth was well and truly tested with coach David Richardson echoing his preseason prediction.

"This game tested our depth," Richardson said.

"I've got no money, I've got no depth - it's as simple as that."

The Ridge were certain to start the match without defenders Alan Spiers and Neville Gooding who were suspended after the Round 11 clash with Rochedale.

Jorge Ibanez-Formas, Fred Stone and striker Michael McCarthy, were all forced out through injury during the week with goalkeeper Brett Wass withdrawing only hours before kick off due to a neck injury.

"If you count Michael Butchard who went off in the 6th minute with a knee injury, we were without seven regulars which is simply too many to replace," Richardson said.

Lions opened their account in the 19th minute after a wayward Richardson pass was toed behind the Ridge defence by Lions' striker Warren Allen.

Outpacing the defence, Allen was the first to ball, neatly rounding Tony McVey before slamming into an open net.

Five minutes later it was 2-0 with Allen scoring in the same fashion as the first.

This time he picked up the ball after a Frank Mengotti tackle, again evading McVey to slip the ball home.

Craig Priddy could have made it 3-0 just before the break after good lead up work by team mate Mark Gilroy.

The talented winger found Priddy unmarked in the box but the youngster blasted wide with only McVey to beat.

Two up at the break, Lions came out more relaxed in the second half playing with less urgency.

For the Ridge it was McVey who kept the scoreline respectable with several telling saves.

However he could do nothing in the 78th minute after Allen found new signing Fred Kruys with a neat through ball.

With a tight angle, Kruys blasted a low shot that gave the keeper no chance.

Substitute John Schiavo, who came on for Gilroy, put the nail in the coffin in the 89th minute with a classic diving header after Kruys had made inroads down the left.

Once again it was Mengotti who dominated the midfield with Andrew Stowell and Jeff Lombardo outstanding in the defence.

Allen was the pick of the strikers showing two much pace for a reshuffled Ridge defence.

Coach John Sime said he was delighted with the result but heaped praised on Acacia Ridge.

"A lot of people have bagged the Ridge but they're in the top five because they deserve to be there," Sime said.

"This game was very important for us and unfortunately for them they were depleted with injuries.

"We played well though and I thought we deserved to win," he said.

Richardson said he wasn't too disappointed with the result.

"I never thought the season would be easy," Richardson said.

"I believe the positions on the table at the end of June will be the finals positions for the year." ■

Milan Head Down Under

Italian giants AC Milan, currently regarded as the number one club side in the world, are heading Down Under and will play two matches against the Coca-Cola Socceroos.

As part of the deal, Milan are expected to bring their full squad, which is worth more than \$200 million and boasts 18 Italian internationals and six foreign internationals.

The matches will be played on June 16 and 17 in Sydney and Melbourne respectively with sell out crowds expected.

Dutch trio Marco Van Basten, Frank Rijkaard and Ruud Gullit, French World Cup captain Jean Pierre-Papin, Croatia's Zvonimir Boban and Red Star Belgrade's Dejan Savicevic make up Milan's six foreign internationals.

Franko Baresi, Paolo Maldini, Antonio Donadoni and Gianluigi Lentini are the pick of the Italian internationals.

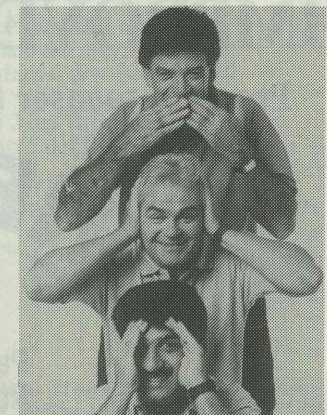
ASF Chairman Mr John Constantine said the matches were a great opportunity to promote soccer in Australia.

"Australia is proud to be hosting a tour by such an eminent club. To have them here is an indication of Australia's improved position in world football," Mr Constantine said.

"Our normal policy is for the Coca-Cola Socceroos not to compete against club teams but with AC Milan boasting 24 internationals we had no hesitation in accepting the challenge."

The matches will be covered by Australia's number one soccer station SBS, with the three wise monkeys Andy Paschalidis, Les Murray and Johnny Warren again at the helm.

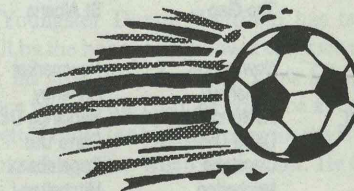
