# Liddell sends out SOS

CSC coach Frank Liddell has sent out an SOS for a striker after losing his main target man last week.

Striker Harry Makridakis has broken his ankle and could be out for at least six weeks leaving CSC with no front man.

According to Liddell, Ringo Mejias, CSC's only other striker, has left the club to team up with Third Division club South Star.

"Harry's loss is a big blow," Liddell said.

"With Ringo gone it effectively leaves me without a recognised striker."

CSC beat Inala City 3-0 last weekend and are now only four points outside the top five.

Liddell pushed defender Martin Fehlberg up front last against Inala and said he was pleased with the youngsters' efforts.

"I put Marty up front last week and he did a good job for me," Liddell said.

Former CSC striker Joe Stipancic, who signed with Brisbane United last season, is the only recognised striker not currently playing in the XXXX League and could be an option for Liddell.

But with CSC not part of Brisbane United and Stipancic in the middle of a three month break, it is doubtful he would make a move back to Dunn Road.

Despite the loss of Makridakis, Liddell has

# Top two out of State Side

Queensland have received a major set-back for the upcoming State of Origin Series opener with the loss of outstanding Young Socceroo Craig Moore and dynamic Socceroo midfielder Stephen Corica.

Moore, who was one of the stars at the World Youth Championships in March, declared his availability after returning from a trial with Scottish giants Glasgow Rangers but was forced to change his plans after agreeing to return to Scotland during the week.

Corica fractured a rib during preparation for Australia's World Cup campaign and could be out for up to three weeks.

He will miss Sunday's clash with New Zealand and faces a race against the clock to be ready for their clash with AC Milan on June 16.

Coach Juan Cutillas added Moore to the squad after watching the talented youngster strut his stuff for the QAS against the Victorian Institute of Sport.


"To lose both Craig and Steve is very unfortunate," Cutillas said.

"The loss is tremendous and it's just a shame that out of all the Australians in the squad Corica was the one to get injured.

"It's unbelievable," he said. Cutillas was forced to make two changes in all after several players declared they were unavailable.

Out go Alan Hunter and Danny Wright (personal commitments), and Alan Prentice (injury) and in come Graham Eden (Pine Rivers), and Stein Grodum (Easts).

A question mark also exists over Taringa and Brisbane United defender Glenn Gwynne who

returned to Mossman last week to take a well earned two month rest.

Cutillas said he was keen to fly Gwynne back for the matches and was currently awaiting word on his availability.

Gwynne has been a revelation in Queensland since Cutillas picked the youngster back in April 1991 and will be sorely missed if unavailable.

With Hunter out and Steve Jackson and Mark Greerstruggling with calf injuries, Cutillas said he was concerned with the Maroon defence.

"Hopefully we will be able to get Glenn back," Cutillas said.

"I don't see any problems and I am 99 per cent sure we will have him on June 12."

With the squad expected to be announced later this week, selection will certainly pose problems for Cutillas.

The midfield will be his toughest task with youngsters Brad Ditton, Darren Hillier and Craig Collins all vying for selection.

With Frank Pimblett, Nick Meredith, Jason Polak and Brian McNicol all expected to play, one of these youngsters could miss out.

The Maroons take on the blues at 7pm at Perry Park on June 12 in what should be one of the best ever State of Origin clashes

Brisbane South are the IEA Inter-City Champions after a thrilling penalty shoot-out win over rivals Brisbane North last week.

Swan made amends for the collision minutes later with his deflected 20m drive sending Farrow the wrong way.


Controversy struck seconds after the restart when referee Barry Power awarded a dubious goal to Lions.



### 14 LOWER DIVISIONS MID YEAR REVIEW



#### **DIVISION 2**

At the turn-around three teams are now well placed at the top each only one point apart, second placed Willowburn still have a match in hand.

Living in Toowoomba, Allen makes the trip to Lions Stadium twice a week with team mates Troy and Chay Hews and has no qualms about the travelling.


"Troy and I take turns and John (Sime) is pretty good," Allen said.

"I've got no regrets. I love it here and the club are really looking after me," he said.


Lions are currently in fourth place with the second best attacking record in the league with Allen and Frank Mengotti leading the charge for a successful run into the finals.
