Rovers' lead under threat

Development officer Keiran Cooper confirmed during the week that Rochedale would field a depleted side against North Brisbane in their upcoming Queensland Cup quarter final.

They are sure to be without Damian Harris, Rod Vasquez and Nigel McClure who are suspended.

Also in doubt are Demetri Theochari and Frank Cole who are struggling with injuries.

John Weatherby could also be unavailable due to a points suspension.

"With games against North Brisbane and Taringa ahead of us it will be tough but we'll just take it one game at a time and see how it goes," Cooper said.

Rochedale's depth is certainly being tested and added to that is the fact that everybody is out to beat them.

Co-league leaders Taringa are the side that has caught Rochedale and they have now firmied as a strong chance to take the premiership.

With critics tipping a walk in premiership to Rochedale earlier in the season, things can certainly change fast. One shining light at the club has been Cooper's performance.

Blues ready to fire

NSW Captain Robert Wheatley believes names will count for nothing when they meet Queensland in the State of Origin clash at Perry Park on Saturday night.

The former Socceroo was non-committal about his sides chances but said there would be plenty of pride at stake in this all important match.

"We're probably under prepared because we haven't even had a game together yet," Wheatley said.

"Individually we have a very good side but the question is how we can come together as a team.

"I can't really say how we will go," he said.

The NSW squad boasts 11 players who have played for Australia at either Youth, Olympic or Senior level and also contains four state league players.

Wheatley said he was expecting a tough encounter.

"We always find it hard to play in Queensland," he said.

"They always put out a good, tough side and the travelling and climate change doesn't help either.

"There is a real rivalry there and a lot of pride on the line so it should be a great match," Wheatley said.

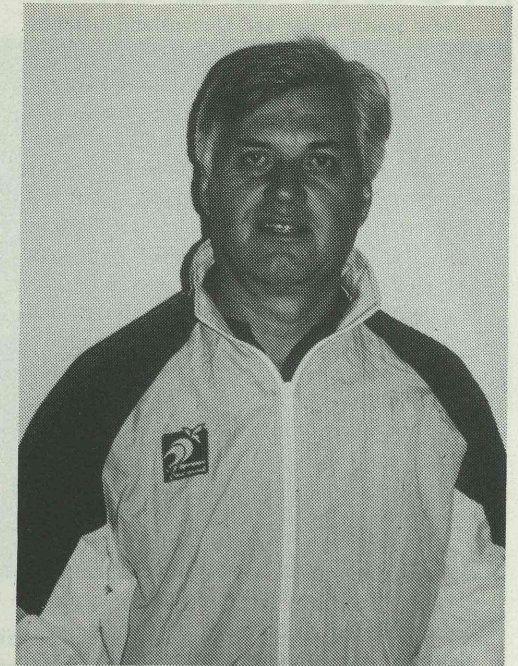
"We come to Queensland as professionals and I'm sure we will play that way."

Parramatta Eagles' coach Rale Rasic is in charge of the Blues.

Rasic is one of Australia's most respected and influential coaches and will always be remembered as the man who led Australia into their only World Cup Finals appearance in Germany in 1974.

The biggest surprise with Rasic's squad is the inclusion of Steve Berry, Damon Langan, Wayne Pierce and Frank Gigliotti.

Wheatley said the idea was a good one.

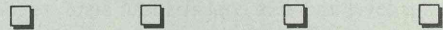
Coach Juan Cutillas, who led Queensland to that great victory over the Blues in 1991, has again done an excellent job and the players are ready to go.

North Star show true grit

North Star returned to their winning ways last week with an emphatic 4-1 victory over Acacia Ridge at O'Callaghan Park.

Playing without suspended striker Lee Scriggins, the northsiders scored three first half goals to firmly cement their place in the top five.

Unlike their 6-1 thrashing at the hands of Brisbane Lions the previous week, North Star played with grit and determination and thoroughly deserved the win.

They now trail leaders Rochedale and Taringa by only five points and are still a chance of retaining the premiership they won last season.

Their biggest problem will be consistency. Already this season they have conceded 26 goals in 14 games, with 14 of those coming in just two games.

Ken Swan got Stars off to a dream start in the 12th minute with a powerful 25m drive that gave Ridge keeper Tony McVey no chance.

Three minutes later it should have been 2-0 after Michael Brockwell and Jim McDonagh combined to put Phil Mulvey into the clear.

Mulvey blasted a low shot from close range but was denied by a great save from McVey.

On the half hour Mulvey made amends for the miss with a curling right foot shot that hit the right hand upright and cannoned into the net.

Just before the break Ian Hutchison made it 3-0 after McVey had done well to repel a Brockwell shot.

With McVey stranded, the talented midfielder smashed the ball into the roof of the empty net.

The second half proved similar for North Star who, but for poor finishing, could have won by at least six.

Brockwell was the biggest culprit five minutes after the break when he stole the ball just inside the opposition's half.

Travelling 25m with the ball he neatly rounded McVey but put the ball wide with the goal at his mercy.

Minutes later it Ken Swan who was the culprit, blasting over after good leadup work by McDonagh and Brockwell.

The pair combined again soon after with Brockwell finding Hutchison in the Ridge box with a pin point cross.

Hutchison, who has had little playing time this season, coolly controlled the ball before driving a shot that flashed past McVey to make it 4-0.

A scare was thrown into the North star camp in the 68th minute when midfielder Ken Swan was stretchered off the field with an ankle injury.

Team trainer Peter Parker later confirmed that Swan had suffered a badly twisted ankle and not a break as was first suspected.

Ridge defender Alan Spiers, who was without a doubt their best player, scored a consolation goal with minutes remaining.

Receiving the ball 30m out, Spiers evaded two defenders before neatly slipping the ball past the advancing Jason Parks.

For North Star Michael Mulvey, Brockwell, Hutchison and McDonagh stood out while Paul Davidson, Michael Butchard, Spiers and McVey were the best for the Ridge.

Mulvey's performance was especially good considering it was his first game back in the XXXX League after recovering from a broken leg.

His return to the side will be a timely boost to coach Peter Bannon for the run into the finals.

Both teams will rest for two weeks with North Star clashing with Easts on June 26 and Acacia Ridge facing North Brisbane on June 27.

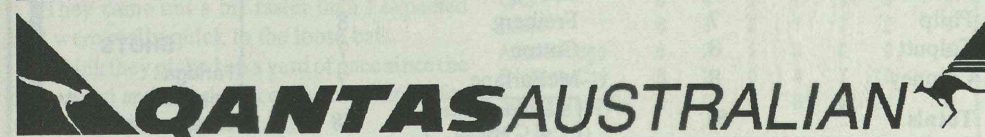

Revenge is sweet for QAS

The win was sweet revenge for the QAS girls who were beaten 1-0 by Coalstars in the opening match of the season.

The loss, their first of the season, failed to dislodge Coalstars from the top of the competition which they still lead by a point.

Tanya Corbett and former Coalstar Kim Revell scored for the QAS in a fast paced first half which was dominated by the away side.

Coalstars found some rhythm after the break and equalised through Georgette Leake who scored with 15 minutes remaining.

QAS coaching director Jim Selby said his side had played well but was quick to praise a determined Coalstars' outfit.

"They put us under a lot of pressure in the last 15 minutes," Selby said.

"But we have to be pleased because we haven't done much work together lately."

"The QAS actually surprised me in the first half," Smith said.

"They came out a bit faster than I expected and were really quick to the loose ball."

"I think they picked up a yard of pace since the first round and our defence was in disarray for the first 35 minutes," he said.

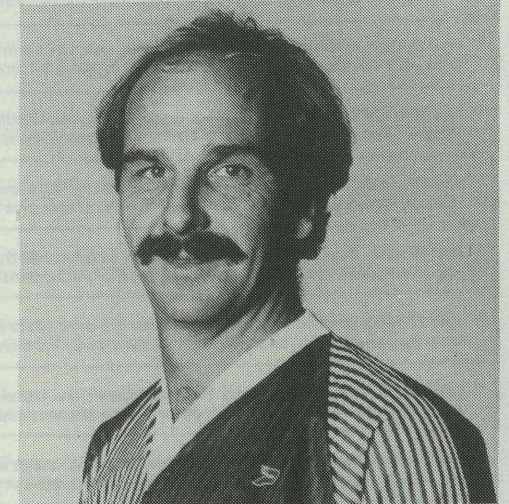
With an outstanding performance under his belt, many believe he could keep Wade out of the starting line up for the AC Milan series.

The minor semi-final placings could still come from any number of up to four or five sides. Relegation now appears to be a real possibility for two of the three clubs still in single figures. Their games in the next few weeks are anything but easy.

DIVISION 3

Even this early in the season, it would now appear likely that the promoted clubs to Division 2 will be any two of the current top four, as Mitchelton (4th place) are now seven points clear of the chasing pack.

Newmarket now join Annerley on top spot and take out pole position on goal difference.

Last weekend I was able to enjoy two top third Division games, with the match at Elder Oval the match of the round, and what a match it was.

This was one of the best matches that I have been able to watch this year for sheer enjoyment, and end to end football.

Both sides totally committed to the playing of the match, both sides totally committed to securing the three points but all within the Laws of the

game.

Referee Gordon Nicholson, whilst keeping a firm hand on proceedings, possibly had one of the easiest matches he has had all season to look after, fouls were minimal, dissent was minimal, but there was action aplenty.

All in all this was a most enjoyable match and top marks go to the coaches and players from both sides.

That evening a visit to Teralba Park where one of the other aspiring promoted clubs were hosting South Star, a club on the upsurge.

This was a match of contrasting skills and fortunes, as at one stage the homeside were comfortably enjoying a 3 - 0 lead. The final score-sheet shows a win of 3 - 2.

Mitchelton played with a lot of finesse early in the game and deservedly went ahead and remained always in front for the majority of the game.

However after appearing to be comfortably in the driving seat to a 3 - 0 lead, their defence inexplicably seemed to lose concentration and almost fell apart as the two late goals by South Star are testament.

Mitchelton will certainly be pushing for promotion back to Division 2, whilst for South Star the dynamic coaching duo of Messrs May and Addison are now back with the South American side. I'm sure they will be making life difficult for all teams yet to play them in the second round.

The middle of the table in this Division is now horribly congested, and there are no certainties as to who will finish up in the dreaded bottom relegated positions.

It is far too early to predict relegation and semi-finalists, promotion candidates are possibly a little easier to predict.

DIVISION 8

Going into the two week recess, Olympic now only have a three point lead over St Helens, and with Newmarket playing their postponed match against Annerley this Sunday, they are quite likely to be only one point further behind the Saints. University and possibly Wynnum could take the fourth semi placing, however Bethania and Greenbank will be doing their darndest to ensure they are in fourth place at the end of the season themselves.

Outside of Jimboomba and Latrobe, who both look like they will remain in those placings for the rest of the season, the rest of the teams probably will now just enjoy themselves during the remainder of the season.

DIVISION 9

Taringa's six point buffer at the top of this table, looks as if it will remain in place for the rest of the season, judging by recent performances.

A surprise team now in second place are the cricketers from Wynnum, with North Star having suffered a further set-back by losing to mid-table Rochedale last weekend. It is no lay down misere as to the semi-final placings in this Division and it is still far too tight to make any firm predictions, but is fairly clear that the four placings will only come from five teams. That is unless Rochedale's good fortunes continue and they make a late second round run to the top, stranger things have happened, but it is a little unlikely.

New clubs Mooroondu and Park Ridge are enjoying very mixed fortunes, with Mooroondu in seventh place, but with a healthy plus goals difference. Their opposite number however, are not enjoying the best of fortunes, still they should do enough to provide enthusiasm and possibly an increase in club membership to continue their status as a QSF member for 1994 ■

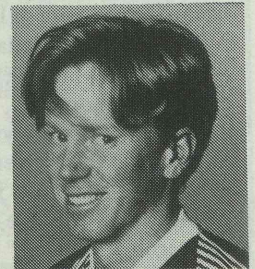
Taringa midfielder Troy Cranney swept all before him winning an unprecedented three awards at the Brisbane United presentation dinner last Friday Night.

"Basically my girlfriend has family here and we had had enough of Europe," Kruids said.

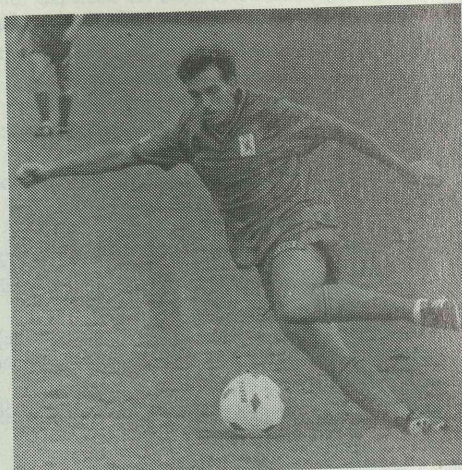
While he was in Holland, De Graafschap had mixed fortunes playing in both the Premier and Second Divisions.

Doctors have order Makridakis to stay in plaster for 6 weeks, effectively ending his season.

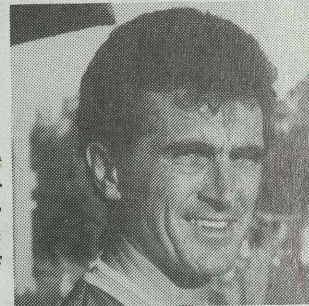
"It's going to help us a lot having Mark," Liddell said.

CSC are currently on 17 points, four outside the five, and Liddell believes a win this weekend could be just the tonic they need for a push to the finals.

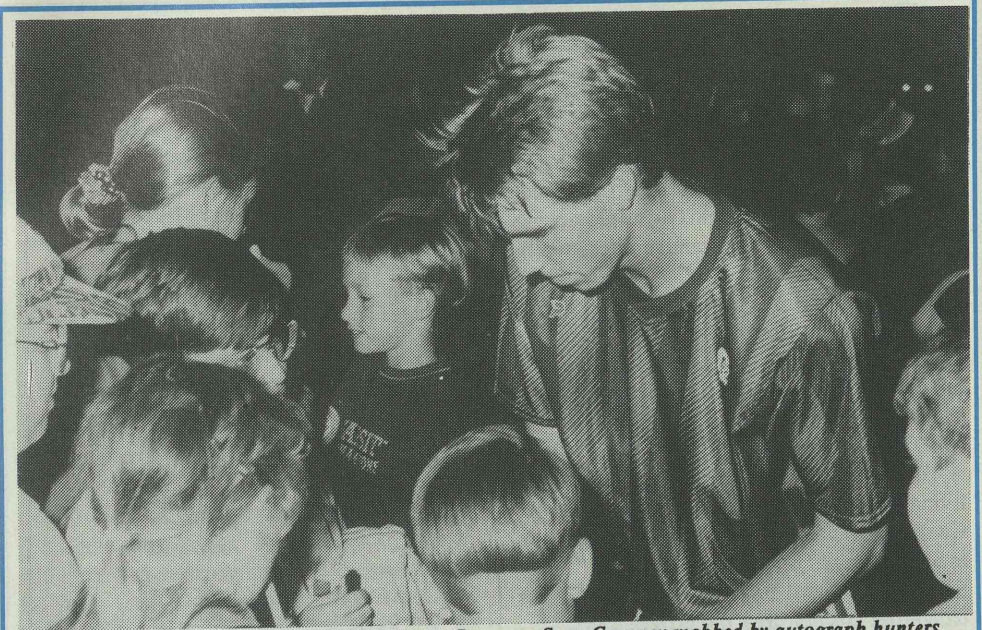
"If we can get a win this weekend and then get a few results in upcoming weeks then we've got a chance to make the five," Liddell said.
