Cutillas guides Qld to victory

Queensland grabbed the advantage in the XXXX State of Origin series with a rousing 1-0 victory over NSW on Saturday night.

Almost 4000 fans at Perry Park rose as one when a Warren Allen header rebounded from the post onto NSW captain Rob Wheatley and into the back of the net.

The goal set the crowd alight and the Queensland chant gained momentum around the ground for a nail-biting final 30 minutes.

After the game Queensland coach Juan Cutillas could only express delight with his teams performance.

"It was a tough assignment, but the boys passed the examination with flying colours - they were unbelievable," Cutillas said.

A tough assignment indeed. Of the 13 NSW players to take the field 10 had played for Australia at various levels.

"The players knew we faced some obstacles," Cutillas said.

"We have had a lot of injuries and people who said these players should not be playing for Queensland, and these fellows took the challenge," he said.

Queensland's first half challenge began confidently with Brian McNicol, Chris Slater and Nick Meredith all having shots on goal.

NSW's first real attack brought the save of the match from keeper Rob Farrow.

Striker Zlatko Arambasic turned two defenders but was denied by the legs of the advancing Farrow.

NSW continued to pressure the Maroon goal with the best attempt coming from left midfielder Mike Smith whose 30m dipping shot struck the cross bar.

At the other end, McNicol was causing the NSW defence plenty of headaches and could have bagged a couple of goals had it not been for some wayward finishing.

The second half began as the first had finished with both teams playing open football and pushing players forward in attack whenever possible.

Lions' striker Warren Allen, making his debut, was introduced into the game at half time. Allen

began nervously with his first two passes finding the feet of New South Welshmen.

His third touch, which led to the goal, more than made up for the earlier mistakes.

Queensland's captain, Frank Pimblett worked a short corner with midfielder Troy Cranney whose right foot cross was met by a glancing header from Allen.

Replays seemed to indicate that Wheatley thought the ball was going wide and he could only lunge desperately as the ball ricocheted from the post onto his leg and into the net.

NSW stepped up a gear and pressured Queensland in the final 15 minutes however the defence and keeper Farrow were able to confidently thwart any attack.

Unlike his Queensland counterpart, NSW coach Rale Rasic did not have much comment to offer after the game.

Queensland captain Frank Pimblett, playing in his last State of Origin series, while happy with the win stressed that the job was only half done.

"It is always nice to beat NSW but it is a two legged affair and it is going to be tough down there.

Pimblett also paid tribute to the young players, three of whom were making their state debuts.

"They were brilliant, Brad Ditton, Craig Collins, Warren Allen, all played well.

"Considering it was their first game they were not fazed by the atmosphere, they just played their own game and were outstanding," he said ■

Bundy to mix it with Stars

Bundaberg will go into Sunday's all important Queensland Cup clash with Coalstars under prepared but confident of a good result, according to coach Tony Buesnel.

Buesnel headed north in 1989 and has enjoyed his five years in the sugar city as Regional Director of Coaching.

He said he believed his side was one of the better ones he had had since taking over as coach of the representative side.

"This is probably the best balanced side we've had in the last few years," Buesnel said.

"The only thing that will stop us is lack of preparation.

"With all the mid-week games in the last month I haven't been able to get the side together as much as I would have liked," he said.

With all his commitments with juniors and the like, he said he still had time have a look at his opponents in recent weeks.

"I saw Coalstars play Taringa a few weeks ago and they played very well," Buesnel said.

"They ran all day and played like typical Coalstars sides do. They are very tough and never stop trying," he said.

According to Buesnel, height could definitely be a disadvantage.

Coalstars will go into the match with Pat Boyle, Alan McFarlane and Mark Gilbert at the back, all of whom are above the 6 foot mark.

"We haven't got the height to cause them problems so obviously we will try to play it around on the deck," Buesnel said.

"We're optimistically confident we'll do a good job and do justice to ourselves," he said.

And with Perry Park an ideal ground for playing football, the stage is set for what should be a classic, tough encounter ■

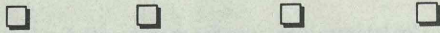

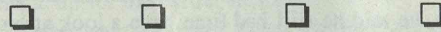
EDITORIAL.....

Country teams out of Cup

Taringa Rovers and Brisbane Lions have advanced to the semi-finals of the Queensland Cup after solid wins at Perry Park last Monday.

Brothers Eddie and Andy Lees scored in the early match as Taringa proved too strong for a determined Toowoomba winning 2-0.

A 25m drive from Eddie in the 25th minute and some skilful finishing from Andy in the 36th killed off the match that never really reached any great heights.

With Taringa content to sit on their lead in the second half, Toowoomba can only blame poor finishing for the one-sided scoreline.

It was a similar story in the late match with Lions scoring first half goals and Far North Queensland having to play catch up football.

Dutchman Fred Kruys scored Lions' first in the 42nd minute after good lead up work from Troy Hews.

Three minutes later it was 2-0 after defender Ian Simpson found Mark Gilroy with a pin point 40m ball. The talented striker neatly lobbed the ball over a defender before calmly curling the ball into the roof of the net.

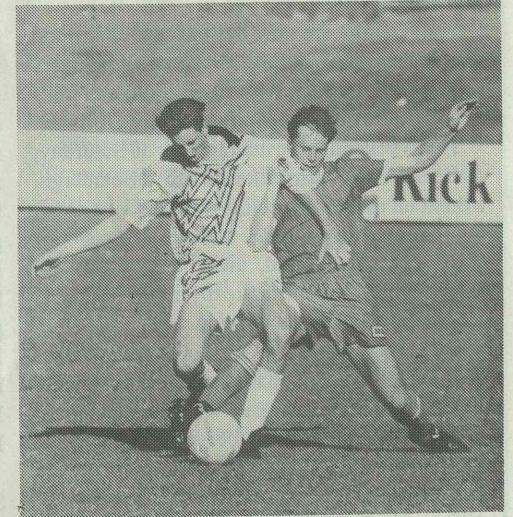
Far North Queensland also had chances in the first half but were denied by some brilliant keeping from Rob Farrow who was backing up from the State game two days earlier.

Lions almost went 3-0 up two minutes after the break when Kruys drove a shot that shaved the left hand upright.

Frank Pozzebon made it 2-1 soon after, latching onto a cross from midfielder Michael Corica.

With FNQ pushing forward, gaps began to open in their defence and it was Lions' playmaker Frank Mengotti who took full advantage.

The former State representative made several telling runs, causing plenty of problems for his opposition.

It was Mengotti who beat keeper Steve Franchetto to a Kruys cross, skilfully laying the ball back for Craig Priddy.

With the goal open, Priddy smashed the ball goalwards but was denied by a great goal line clearance from defender Peter Farrell.

With time running out, FNQ coach Brian Stopford brought defender Shaun Casson into play and the move almost reaped the rewards.

Well into injury time, Farrell played a long ball into the box that was met by Casson and keeper Farrow. With the players clashing, the ball fell at the feet of Stacey Fittock who blasted over with the goal, and the game, at his mercy.

Both winning coaches were pleased with the result but not the performance.

Taringa coach Juan Cutillas said his boys played well but slackened off in the second half.

Lions coach John Sime was more concerned with injuries to two key players.

Midfielder Wayne Hinton (ankle) and striker Troy Hews (calf) are in doubt for this weeks clash with Mt Gravatt.

Taringa will not play but will meet fellow XXXX League leaders Rochedale in a much awaited clash on June 27 ■

DIVISION 2

Toowoomba are now out of the Queensland Cup so the Willowburn and St Albans postponed fixtures will be played in August, and will have a vital bearing on the standings in this Division.

This weekend three matches are on Saturday, leaders Willowburn make the trip to Beenleigh, a difficult match and could well end up a draw. Second placed Wynnum are away to out-of-sorts Olympic United, away win. Also the same night St Helens make the trip to Runcorn, where the visitors should win.

On Sunday Brisbane City and The Gap meet at Spencer Park. City have suffered poor results of late, and the break may well do them some good, The Gap will not be easy - draw. 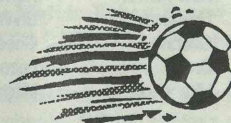

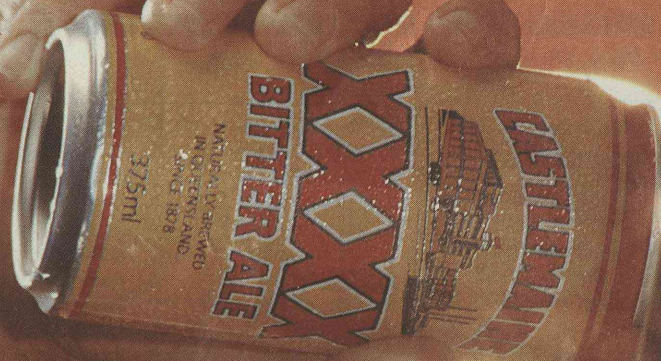
