Aces deal with Rochedale

Defending champions Rochedale Rovers were bundled out of the Queensland Cup by the North Brisbane Aces at Perry Park on Sunday.

The Aces played a near perfect second half, scoring two goals and creating several chances, to advance to the semi-finals.

However poor finishing and good keeping by Graham Ross had Aces player/coach Alan Hunter wondering whether it was going to one of those days.

Darren Stewart, playing his second XXXX League match, eventually broke the deadlock in the 80th minute and Kevin Meacock scored North Brisbane's second just before full time.

Despite the heat the match began at an incredible pace with both teams having early opportunities.

Rochedale's best chance fell to Kieran Cooper midway through the first half. His 20m driven shot was blocked by Wayne Evans.

At the other end Chris Slater found room at the far post but forced the header wide after good lead up work from Kevin Meacock.

Rochedale, who went into the match without playmakers Demetri Theochari (injured), Nigel McClure and Rod Vasquez (suspended), seemed to lack creativity once inside their opponent's territory.

The second half was dominated by North Brisbane with Rochedale having trouble getting out of their own half.

Rochedale player/coach John Stewart almost put North Brisbane ahead after Meacock drove the ball across the goal.

The ball deflected from Stewart towards the

goal however he was able to recovere in time to clear the ball off the line.

Darren Bender and Meacock were then denied by some great keeping by Ross after good lead up work by Slater on both occasions.

Hunter also joined in and beat three defenders before hitting a right foot shot which took a deflection onto the post.

Ross was outstanding in the Rochedale goal however could do nothing about Darren Stewart's 25m shot which curled into the top corner.

Stewart, who has only recently arrived in Brisbane from Scotland, was suffering fatigue from the heat and was replaced almost immediately after scoring.

Meacock gave the Aces a 2-0 lead soon after when he found space behind the Rovers defence to tap home a Slater cross.

Aces coach Alan Hunter was delighted with the effort put in by his team.

"We had a game plan and we stuck to it," he said.

"I was extremely happy with our commitment and discipline. If we keep it up hopefully we can get a trophy out of it."

Rover's coach John Stewart, despite the loss, was happy with the performance of his inexperienced team who were without five regular first-team players

Lions roar as Hawks die

A10-man Brisbane Lions flexed some XXXX two goals inside the final five minutes. League muscle with a powerful 4-1 win over Mt Gravatt at Lions Stadium last weekend.

Leading 1-0 after a classic Craig Priddy goal, Lions were sent into shock with referee Barry Power's dismissal of Ian Simpson.

The lanky defender can only blame lack of discipline after receiving yellow cards in the 24th and 3.1st minutes.

The first came after he deliberately handled the ball and the second following a late challenge on Mt Gravatt's John Brown.

But the loss of Simpson made little difference as coach John Sime pushed his side into overdrive at the break.

Priddy and Queensland striker Warren Allen were the pick in the second half with Mt Gravatt's Brad Ditton outstanding in a side that played well below par.

At 1-0 down the Hawks were still in the match but tragically went behind in the 53rd minute after a costly error.

Goalkeeper Rob Harrison was the culprit, fumbling a tame 30m freekick from Fred Kruys which allowed a sliding Allen to guide the ball into the net.

Lions added salt to the Hawks' wounds scoring

The first was a classic strike from midfielder John Schiavo after good lead up work from Priddy.

After a neat one-two, Schiavo rifled his 25m drive into the top right hand corner giving Harrison no chance.

Allen completed the rout with seconds to go, evading a defender before driving a low shot under Harrison.

The Hawk's only goal came from substitute Ian Powells who latched onto a cross from Seiko.

Mt Gravatt coach Col Bennett was disappointed with his side's performance and admitted things looked bleak for the club.

"To be honest we just haven't got the players,"

"The players lack a lot of discipline and we just don't have any depth.

"We've lost our leaders in Jarrod Austin and Alan Prentice and we're doing it tough," he said.

Lions coach John Sime was philosophical after the win.

"We lost our shape but we reorganised ourselves at the break and did the job," Sime said.

"At this stage of the season the result is obviously more important than the performance but I thought we played very well."

The first was titled "Sweet Revenge for Stars (with an accompanying photo of Coalstars' Tamara Kitching) and the second was titled "Revenge Sweet for QAS".

The photos used in all stories were supplied and paid for by the QAS. Surprise! Surprise! Due to lack of resources, these are the only photos we have of women's soccer. 
